## **Scottsville News & Events**

**Town Elections** – With a light turnout on Tuesday, May 1st, Mayor Nancy Gill was returned to office for a second two year term. Council members Laura Mellusi, Zack Bullock, Dan Gritsko and Josh Peck retained their positions. Newcomers Eddie Payne and Stuart Munson will fill the two remaining seats. As is the usual procedure, the candidate receiving the most votes is named vice mayor. Mellusi will assume that position for the next term.

**Planning Commission** – A public hearing was held on Monday, May 7th, to discuss a rezoning of 590 Valley Street from residential to commercial. The applicant, Mr. Jianwang Xing, came before the commission requesting the zoning change so that he could operate a restaurant at that location. Comments from the public, both pro and con, were made and the commission voted to recommend to council that the

request be denied.





**Barefoot Country Store** – There has been some work at the store's location, 635 Valley Street, that may have violated

both town ordinances and FEMA regulations, according to Town Manager Matt Lawless. The work that was done -- retaining walls and gravel for a parking area along Mink Creek which borders the rear of the property – may need permission of the town or FEMA. FEMA requires a professional engineering study to determine environmental impact when any type of work is done within a flood



plain or along a creek or river. The work that has been done lies in the flood plain. Also, it was noted that there may be some issues with a second building on the property regarding concerns the Architectural Review Board has that the structure differs substantially from the plans that were presented to that body. The ARB approved the original submission and issued its approval based on that submission.



A fire broke out May 3 around 1:30 p.m. on an unoccupied pontoon boat moored at the boat dock adjacent to Lake Monticello's Beach 4. The fire spread to five other

boats, sending huge plumes of black smoke into the air.

No one was injured, and the cause of the initial fire is not yet known.

Lake Monticello Fire Chief Ritchie Constantino said the intensity of the fire caused it to spread from boat to boat and to the docks.

Multiple explosions – possibly caused by exploding gas tanks on the boats – were

Lake Monticello residents and pontoon boat owners Ken and Nancy Quantock were working on their boat several slips away when the fire started. The Quantocks quickly alerted the young children playing on Beach 4 to leave the beach and stay out of harm's way. Nancy Quantock said, "I have never been so scared in my life."

Multiple 911 calls were made by Lake Monticello residents, and the fire department and the police were quickly on the scene.

Several of the docks to which the boats were tied were melted. Lake Monticello General Manager Steven Hurwitz was also on the scene and he noted that the docks would have to be replaced. Most, though not all, boat owners have insurance.

Constantino said that the lake is being checked to ensure that there is no contamination from gasoline or oil, which may have been consumed in the intense

Beach 4 is closed until further notice, Hurwitz said in an email sent to residents on Monday. "Please exercise caution if underway in Jackson Cove. Our Emergency Management Team is meeting daily and we will update the community as new information becomes available," he said.

He said that there was excellent cooperation between the several fire depart-

ments, police departments and Lake marina staff that responded.
