Cow Chip Bingo details to follow, but there is so much more this year.


Old Farm Day started as a way to show off John May's collection of antique farm equipment.

The Fluvanna Historical Society's Museum Committee began planning a museum to house the treasures and Old Farm Day photos from 2017

showcase traditional farming techniques. It's been in the works for so long, many wondered if it would ever happen.

But builders broke ground in March and it's well under way. Visitors get to see the progress and see some of May's collection.

The "bingo board" is an arena that has been marked out with 200, 2-foot squares," Hernandez said. "Deeds" are sold at \$10 for each square prior to game time on the day of Old Farm Day. The game begins at 2 p.m. and runs until both chips drop or until 4 p.m."

Kim May, the County Extension Office 4-H director, is bringing Bessie and her calf Babe. The pair will be let out into the arena/bingo board to do what they do best – drop plops of doodoo, or cow pies, or cow chips -- whatever.

The owner of the square Bessie plops on wins a YETI cooler worth \$300.

Babe's chip earns the owner a smaller version.

If the cooler winners want to be magnanimous, they can donate their prize back to 4-H and they'll auction them off at the county fair. No pressure. If businesses want a chance to advertise just pay \$100 for a square and you'll get your sign up along the fencing.

Aqua Virginia abandons rate increase, will study outdoor use Infrastructure charge of up to 7 percent still in play

In a surprise move, Aqua Virginia has abandoned its proposed rate increase and says it will refund customers for the increased rates paid over the past three months.

Aqua had already significantly reduced its request for a rate hike after the passage of the Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017.

Because the new tax laws dramatically reduce corporate tax rates, the State Corporation Commission (SCC) ordered Aqua and other utilities with pending rate cases to re-submit rates "to ensure that customers...receive the benefits of the corporate tax cut." In response, Aqua dropped its proposed 11 percent wastewater increase and halved a 5.4 percent water increase. In a town hall meeting in March, Aqua Virginia President John J. Aulbach said most customers would see an average \$2.86 increase in their monthly bill.

This week, in a proposal worked out between Aqua Virginia and the parties representing customers across the state, Aqua will end the

interim billing rates by May 31 and will refund the interim rates within 60 days. Among other stipulations, the agreement also states that Aqua Virginia will make a good-faith effort to study "Lake Monticello's proposal(s) regarding wastewater rates for water consumed outside"

before its next base rate proceeding. Charging customers for outdoor usage was a major point of contention between Aqua and Lake Monticello. In his testimony at the public hearing earlier this month, LMOA Board President Richard Barringer argued it lowered the community's property values by forcing people to abandon landscaping in an effort to lower their monthly water bills.

While any relief from Aqua's water rates is welcome news for Lake Monticello residents, one thing Aqua isn't giving up is its bid for a water and wastewater infrastructure service charge (WWISC). Approval of a WWISC would add a monthly charge of up to 7 percent to each customer's bill.

This week's proposal still has to be approved by the SCC before it can go into effect. A decision on the WWISC is expected sometime later this year.



FUMA cadet arrested for threatening school violence

A 17-year-old Fork Union Military Academy cadet was arrested Thursday for threatening to shoot up the school.

FUMA officials notified the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office on Tuesday (April 24) that a threatening message had been written on a bathroom wall at the school. The message stated, "I'm shoot FUMA up on April 27th during chapel," according to a press release from the sheriff's office.

Extra security measures were put into place while the incident was investigated. FUMA officials were able to identify a suspect who was then arrested by deputies.

The juvenile was charged with "threats to commit serious bodily harm to persons on school property," according to the release. A detention order was issued and the juvenile was taken to the Blue Ridge Detention Center in Charlottesville.

"As this case involves a juvenile and is pending court, no further information will be released," the press release stated.

Sheriff's office hosts "Stop the Bleed" program

At the start of a talk hosted by the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office on Wednesday night (April 25), EMT Kyle Alexander warned the audience that he was about to show some graphic photos. "So if anyone feels faint," he encouraged, "it's okay to step out into the hall."


Fortunately, the two dozen participants assembled at the Fluvanna Library resource room remained upright through the hour-long presentation led by Alexander, fellow Charlottesville Albemarle EMT Vikram Gupta, and staff from the University of Virginia Medical Center.

"Stop the Bleed" is a nationwide program that evolved out of a set of initiatives developed after the Sandy Hook school shooting in 2012.

With mass casualty events on the rise, the goal of "Stop the Bleed" is to train citizens to be "immediate responders," able to give aid to victims before first responders arrive at the scene.

Liz Cochran, injury prevention coordinator at U.Va. Medical Center, said they've been presenting the free program to groups and private classes around Charlottesville and were working their way out to the wider region.

Life-threatening bleeding, be it from a mass shooting, a car accident, or an accident in the home or workplace, can kill a victim in three to five minutes.

"I don't live out here," said Gupta, "but I presume it takes more five than minutes to get EMTs to you." Rapid action can make the difference between life and death for thousands of Americans each year. The instructors touched

on the "ABC's of bleeding control: Alert emergency responders, identify the source of the bleeding, and compress the wound using direct pressure, wound packing, or a tourniquet.

Participants took turns applying tourniquets to each others' arms and legs and practiced wound packing and direct pressure on simulated wounds.

In the confines of a quiet conference room, absent real blood and conscious victims, it seems straightforward, but instructors warn that in the field, it's an intense process.

Tourniquets, for example, are painful, but "that doesn't mean you're doing it wrong," said Alexander. Direct pressure, where the responder puts all their weight on the wound, can also cause severe pain.

Once a bleeding control treatment is applied, "do not let go until you are relieved by emergency responders," Gupta added.

The also recommended that people forget previous first-aid training, which recommended loosening tourniquets periodically to prevent damage to the injured limb. Modern research has shown that a tourniquet can stay in place for over two hours without causing longterm damage.

Aaron Matthews, a student in U.Va.'s graduate nursing program and an Army veteran, said he would encourage people not to improvise a tourniquet. To be ef-



A good bleeding control kit costs about \$70 to put together and should include a military-grade tourniquet and some packs of hemostatic gauze, which is specially treated to speed clotting. Cochran said there was also a nationwide push to place bleeding control kits next to automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in all public spaces.

It's something you hope you'll never

have to use, but could make all the difference in the face of an emergency. "All bleeding stops eventually," said Matthews. "The question is, are you in control of the bleeding?"

A fish farmer dives back into the pond

Once upon a time, Tom Simonin had 15 ponds scattered across 23 acres of land. He was busy installing ponds and water features for customers all around the region. His farm, Simonin's Aquatic Treasures, was poised to become a destination for families looking for a fun local outing.

Then it was 2008, and the bottom fell out of the economy. Aquatic Treasures folded. Ten years later, relocated to a smaller piece of property near Kent's Store, Simonin is energized to get back in the pond building business, with a renewed focus on promoting self-sufficiency through aquaponics.

"Because we lost everything, my biggest thing is living within my means," he said.

Aquaponics is a system that combines aquaculture (the raising of fish) with hy-

droponics (the soilless growing of plants) in an integrated system. The plants filter the water for the fish; the fish waste provides an organic fertilizer for the plants.

And because water is pumped through the system "you never have to remember to water your plants," he chuckled.

Plants grown in aquaponic systems tend to be healthy, organic, and mostly pest-free. Plus, you can grow edible fish as an additional source of food. Simonin farms tilapia, which helps irrigate a 1100-square foot garden in his basement. Tilapia are fairly easy fish to raise, with one breeding colony resulting in up to 35,000 eggs. Becoming a licensed tilapia farmer costs about \$12.

He also hopes to bring some of his produce to market later this year. A clean room stands ready to process his goods for the local farm stand circuit.

In his basement oasis, he can experiment. There are a lot of grow lights on the market, he says, from the very cheap to the very expensive, and "now I know which ones work best."

Simonin is clearly an experimental guy. His YouTube channel, Crazy Fish Farmer, has more than 200 videos he's shot over the last nine years, chronicling his various projects.

An ideal system for an averagesized property would combine a small greenhouse connected to a pond with a pumping system to connect them together. With some tweaks, the system could provide fresh food year-round. It could even be off-the-grid, with

the use of a solar-powered pumping and heating system.

Today, Simonin sees his role as a consultant.

"That's my biggest goal this time around--to help people. I can do it for them, sure, but I would rather help them build it themselves. That way they know exactly what they have and what they built, and then it won't cost them as much money. And they have a lot of enjoyment because they built it."

Fluvanna food bank opens

Before Bertha Armstrong, local head of rural outreach for the Monticello Area Community Action Agency (MACAA), unveiled the sign for the new FCCS Food Bank building at Carysbrook on Thursday (April 27), she pointed out that she'd actually bought the sign years before.

This unveiling was a long time in

Warren Tillman, director of Fluvanna County Christian Services (FCCS), said the new building had been needed for at least the past three years, but was only last spring that a group of dedicated volunteers had jumped in to make it happen. "Three old ladies," joked Susan Hughes.

Hughes's little committee plunged in to find builders, coordinate volunteers, and raise the \$35,000 needed for project. It took about a year from start to dedication.

Buggy Top Sheds and Barns in Cumberland provided the shells for two buildings and transported them to the site behind the Carysbrook Performing Arts Center. "It was the cheapest, most economical and quickest way to get going," said Tillman.

For the interiors, they reached out to Lowe's at Zion Crossroads. Through the Lowe's Heroes program, they received not only materials, but volunteer help from more than a dozen Lowe's employees.

"This was our biggest project so far," said Ellie Whinnery, project manager for the local Lowe's Heroes.

Her team installed insulation, drywall, lights, flooring, electricity, shelving, and paint, along with constructing a breezeway between the buildings.

Cadets from Fork Union Military Academy came in to move the inventory from the old building to their new home, carefully lining up boxes and jars on labeled shelves. Whinnery and Tillman laughed recalling that the cadets were not entirely sure what this was all about.

"You don't know what it is to be really hungry," Tillman recalled their supervisor telling the students. "The hungriest you've ever been is because you overslept for breakfast. There are a lot of people out there who don't know where their next meal is coming from."

Bertha Armstrong said the food bank helps between 60 and 100 local families in need. They take donations of food and use donated funds to take advantage of bulk sales. The Community Garden at Pleasant Grove contributed almost 1,300 pounds of fresh produce last year.

The building still needs a few finishing touches, including new industrial freezers and refrigerators. But with the bulk of the work done, it was time for a ribbon cutting.

Fluvanna County Supervisors Mozell Booker and Patricia Eager joined Tillman and Whinnery in the official dedication. Tillman thanked all the volunteers who had made it happen and led the audience of about 40 in prayer.

"It was a lot of work," said Whinnery as visitors explored the new building. "But everybody felt it was going to make a big impact on the community."

Students excel in middle school art show

Judges from the Fluvanna Art Association were again stunned by the young talent at the Fluvanna Middle School's annual art show.

The key to their success begins with their dedicated teacher Margie Kritzer's, whose techniques allowed the students to use their imagination to create their vision.

Kritzer explained how she approaches the youngest students, the fifth graders, who begin transitioning from elementary school art to seeing and thinking in more abstract forms. Kritzer starts her fifth graders off working with simple materials and an idea to nurture their imaginations. The kaleidoscope designs are always fun to look at and see how each student manipulated the little pieces of colorful origami paper in creating unique designs.


Focusing on pattern and painting yielded some outstanding results in the secondary colors painting category with paintings by 5th grade students like Guiliana Badalucca. Her secondary colors painting was flawless in its execution and her design was unparalleled.

"Guiliana Badalucca's secondary colors painting features a layer of fine decorative paint strokes that makes her painting the most memorable one of its kind," said Kritzer.

Learning perspective is daunting at any age but by learning it early it can become second nature. Many of the students exhibited a clear understanding of the process with one-of-a kind drawings.

Sixth grade students take the next step and learn more advanced skill and the process of creation. According to Kritzer, many of her students were amazed at their own achievements and learned that using tools like rulers helped them to

create more advanced designs.

The seventh grade, being more advanced with 3-D projects, showed skill and precision. Kritzer pointed out that in art the students learn problem solving through creation, which is an advantage in learning anything they choose later in life. She gives them the tools and the process they will need but they must figure it out and create it.

Every year since 1995, the year Kritzer began her career at FMS, her number one most inspired project is the 3D construction project.

"Although I choose to demonstrate the process of making a 3-part guitar, my own curiosity and interest in diverse solutions has paved the way for an endless variety of 3-D solutions. A great deal of engineering showcases the most outstanding projects, and simpler solutions are brought to life with captivating paint jobs," said Kritzer. Over the years she has overseen the creation of a working guillotine with a replica of King Louis, a trueto-size saddle, a Star Wars "Death Star" and the "Millennium Falcon," a grandfather clock with pendulum, an oversized Hershey bar, and the "leg lamp" from the movie, "A Christmas Story."

Many of this years' projects featured students who grasped the methods and techniques they had learned. Many agreed that Hayley Chisholm's Contrast-O project features outstanding craftsmanship that captures the optical illusion of movement. Kritzer cited Ariana Grier's black and white grid enlargement which takes Anime to a photo-realistic level. Kritzer adds that Grier is also building a portfolio with her own private collection of drawings.

Taylor Peck's "Do you want fries with that?" is Pop Art fun.

"His sculpture solves many engineering challenges and represents "Pop Art" in a fashion that everyone can recognize and appreciate," said Kritzer.

"Karina Ortiz-Ramos devised a cardboard layering method to make donuts that are realistic in form, yet she chose vibrant surrealistic colors of paint to challenge the initially realistic representation. And Asiana Hawkins used a deconstructed cafeteria milk carton to recreate her over-sized version of "Lyrical Lemonade."

Drawing is one of those mediums every student must master but some don't feel it is challenging enough. But 6th grader Allison Montfalcone transformed her 3D cubes into animals and other creative objects, coloring her composition masterfully.

Students will be making dream catchers and baskets in the upcoming weeks for the Arts & Crafts class. Kritzer added that this year the Advanced Art class was replaced by the end-of-the-year Arts & Crafts class.

As always, all the students were winners by showing their originality and understanding of art techniques in this year's competition.

Fluco soccer team topped at home 4-0

The Fluco boys' soccer team was unable to generate much offense against the Western Albemarle Warriors on April 25. The Fluco defense worked hard, but a skilled Warrior team made the plays that were necessary and managed to put the ball in the goal three times in the first half to insure a win.

The first half started with the teams playing evenly and scoring opportunities were rare in the first eight minutes of play. The Warriors broke into the scoring column with 28:58 remaining on a well- executed play. A crossing pass from the right side of the field was perfectly on target and was headed neatly into the left corner of the goal. Freshman goalie Ryan Holman had no chance to stop the shot.

Four minutes later, Fluco sophomore Emory Davis almost duplicated this score by Western, but his header shot on a long crossing pass was just wide of the net. After several minutes of back and forth play, the Warriors upped the score to 2-0 with a long shot that was perfectly placed and soared just over the hands of a leaping Holman. This score came with 20:09 remaining in the half. A third goal by Western Albemarle with 16:39 remaining seemed to seal the Flucos' fate. This goal came on a point blank shot on goal after a successful long

> pass to a forward who had broken into the clear. The Flucos were not threatening often enough for it to look likely that they could outscore the Warriors by four goals in the balance of the game. In the rest of the half, it was Albemarle that threatened the most. The Warriors were awarded a series of corner kicks in the final minutes of the half. The Flucos defended these well. preventing any further scores, but the ball stayed mostly in the Fluco end of the field. At the half, it was 3-0 in favor of the Warriors.

Early in the second half, sophomore wing Gabe Carlton made a strong run for the

Flucos, but his scoring try was turned away. Shortly thereafter, the Warriors upped the score to 4-0 and that is how it ended. Sophomore wing Mauricio Castillo and sophomore center-back Elijah Bullock were turned away on scoring attempts late in the half.

After the game, Coach Earl Gibson who has a very young team this season, cited junior Finn McLaughlin for his steady play on the defensive end. McLaughlin also showed a strong leg with consistently solid goal kicks. Gibson also noted that he felt that sophomore Ben Mooney played well in midfield, and that Davis adjusted well and performed well when he was moved from attack, back to midfield in mid-game.

The boys' soccer team hosted Louisa County on April 30 and will travel to Monticello High on May 3. Next week they will host Orange County on May 7 and Charlottesville on May 10. Two more home games follow on May 14 against Powhatan and on May 17 against Albemarle High. The regular season ends on May 21 when the Flucos travel to Western Albemarle.




