Pontoon boats burn at Lake Monticello

A fire broke out May 3 around 1:30 p.m. on an unoccupied pontoon boat moored at the boat dock adjacent to Lake Monticello's Beach 4. The fire spread to five other boats, sending huge plumes of black smoke into the air.

No one was injured, and the cause of the initial fire is not yet known.

Lake Monticello Fire Chief Ritchie Constantino said the intensity of the fire caused it to spread from boat to boat and to the docks.

Multiple explosions were heard by res-

idents, possibly caused by exploding gas tanks on the boats.

Lake Monticello residents and pontoon boat owners Ken and Nancy Quantock were working on their boat several slips away when the fire started. The Quantocks quickly alerted the young children playing on Beach 4 to leave the beach and stay out of harm's way. Nancy Quantock said, "I have never been so scared in my life."

Multiple 911 calls were made by Lake Monticello residents, and the fire depart-

ment and the police were quickly on the scene.

Several of the docks to which the boats were tied were melted. Lake Monticello General Manager Steven Hurwitz was also on the scene and he noted that the docks would have to be replaced. Most, though not all, boat owners have insurance.

Constantino said that the lake is being checked to ensure that there is no contamination from gasoline or oil, which may have been consumed in the intense

fires.

Beach 4 is closed until further notice, Hurwitz said in an email sent to residents on Monday. "Please exercise caution if underway in Jackson Cove. Our Emergency Management Team is meeting daily and we will update the community as new information becomes available," he said.

Constantino commended the excellent cooperation among the several fire departments, police departments and Lake marina staff that responded.

County gets unanticipated \$207,000 reduction in health insurance

County supervisors, who had anticipated spending about \$435,000 on health insurance increases for fiscal year 2019, will only spend \$228,000 – a \$207,000 reduction, management analyst Mary Anna Twisdale told the Board during its regular meeting Wednesday (May 2).

“I thought you’d like some good news,” she said.

Twisdale said bids from other insurers came in higher than they had hoped. They eventually negotiated Cigna, the county’s

current health care provider, down to a 15 percent increase. The dental insurance program will rise by 9 percent.

In a 3-2 vote, supervisors decided that the county would absorb the cost of the increases for health care, and county employees would pay for the increase in dental care.

This leaves the unexpected \$207,000 for the county. Finance Director Eric Dahl outlined several options, but the Board’s consensus was to return it to the fund balance. A formal motion will be presented later.

In other business, County Registrar Joyce Pace said that 15 homes along the Fluvanna/Louisa county line were assigned to the wrong voting district.

The Virginia Department of Elections, which has been comparing 2010 census block data with voter rolls all over the state, found the problem.

She said it would cost about \$800 for the county to notify the 24 affected registered voters at those addresses. With just a few weeks before early absentee voting is set to begin, she urged that it be done as soon as possible.

Capt. Von Hill of the Fluvanna County Sheriff’s Office asked the Board’s permission to apply for a grant that would allow them to bring a school resource

officer (SRO) to the county’s elementary schools.

The sheriff’s office currently has two SROs for the high school and middle school, but Hill noted that there has been

an increasing need for those officers to visit the elementary schools.

SROs “build a more supportive environment for student to flourish,” Hill explained, with duties that extended beyond mediating schoolyard disputes.

By identifying at-risk kids in the schools, they are uniquely positioned to get help to students and families struggling with mental health, substance abuse, and other problems in the home that so often end up impacting classroom behavior.

The four-year \$50,000 grant would require matching funds from the county of about \$15,600 a year. “I think it’s a high value to Fluvanna County,” said Hill. The supervisors agreed, voting 5-0 to allow him to pursue the grant.

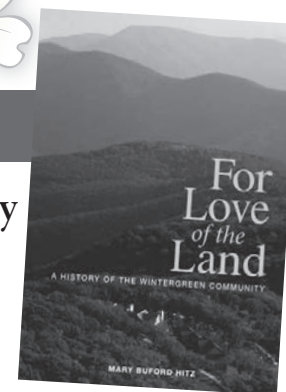

Lake recycling to resume next month

Curbside recycling pickup will return to Lake Monticello in June -- but at a price.

By a 6-1 vote, the Lake Monticello Board of Directors has approved a contract amendment with County Waste at their regular meeting on Thursday (April 26).

Under the new plan, all residents will be given a 65-gallon totes for recyclables. County Waste will dedicate one day a week to recycling pickup and trash service will be reduced to the remaining four days.

County Waste will begin distributing totes in May, with service to begin on June 1.

The service will add \$4 a month, or \$48 per year, to each households' improved property fee.

By comparison, Time Disposal announced last month that customers could expect to pay \$6 a month for curbside pickup.

LMOA Contracts manager Angie Cook told the board that Lake Monticello had

provided curbside recycling since 1997 and that it is obligated to do so under LMOA policy. The contract will run through May 31, 2023,

The community, like most area residents, lost their recycling earlier this year when Van Der Linde Recycling suddenly announced they would stop processing household waste at its Fluvanna County facility.

County Waste, like other area trash companies, was dumping its loads with Van Der Linde so recyclable materials could be culled from non-recyclable waste, a process known as single-stream recycling.

Lake officials set up temporary dumpsters for recycling at Tufton Pond and the campground, but these were quickly overwhelmed. For more than a month, residents wishing to recycle have had to use the Fluvanna County Convenience Center of the McIntire Recycling Center in Charlottesville.

The first time I saw the proximity of gasoline-powered boats within feet of the swimming area at beach 4, I was concerned about public safety and health especially since it is used often by children. Other boating facilities do not allow swimming near gas engines.

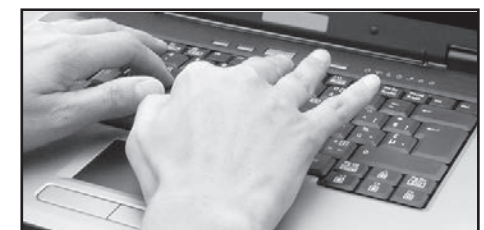
Not only are gas powered engines very polluting, making the swimming water more toxic than other places to swim, but an incident like this fire reinforces that there are other dangers having power boats so close to people.

I live across from Beach 4 and I watched the entire conflagration including numerous explosions. It was just a matter of luck that no one was hurt. I would strongly encourage the relocation of power boats directly next to swimming areas throughout the lake. And now that

there are power engines allowed on the other side of the swimming area at beach 4, it is even more toxic and dangerous for people who just want to enjoy the water.

Rather than rushing this project, it would be prudent to look for alternate design solutions. Swimmers desires seem to be largely ignored here confined to tiny areas, while power boaters get preferential consideration.

Sheriff's office educates cadets about drugs and alcohol

Fork Union Military Academy invited Fluvanna County Sheriff's Department to help educate cadets in the areas of tobacco/alcohol/drug awareness and prevention. This initiative resulted in a series of training sessions which stressed the impact of illicit substances on the lives of young people, including health effects and the legalities involved in their use.

The sessions were based on an Office of the Attorney General, Virginia RULES program. The first three hour-long training sessions were prepared specifically for cadet leaders, with an emphasis on the impact student leaders have on the academy's younger cadets. Subsequent sessions were offered to three separate groups of cadets: middle school, and upper school freshmen and sophomores.

Each group attended three sessions with representatives of the county's

sheriff's office: Capt. Von Hill, chief of administration, Deputy Lacorie Steppe, Deputy Leslie Koczan, and Investigator Brandon Bryant. Among their other duties, officers Steppe and Koczan serve as school resource officers in the Fluvanna County school system.

"We have always valued the relationship that we have with the Fluvanna Sheriff's Office," said Col. Rob Feathers, the academy's director of guidance. "We are grateful for the willingness of these officers to share their time and knowledge to help educate our cadets on a topic that is so crucial to the health and welfare of our young people."

Feathers stated that Fork Union hopes to offer this awareness and prevention program again next year. According to Fluvanna's Sheriff Eric Hess, "FUMA is part of our community. We are willing to provide whatever assistance we can to the cadets at Fork Union."

FCHS art show showcases outstanding work

This year's crop of Fluvanna County High School art students showed impressive skill in the annual Fine Arts Show.

The judges from the Fluvanna Art Association had a difficult time choosing among the students work. Each of the judges looked at the pieces from a different viewpoint.

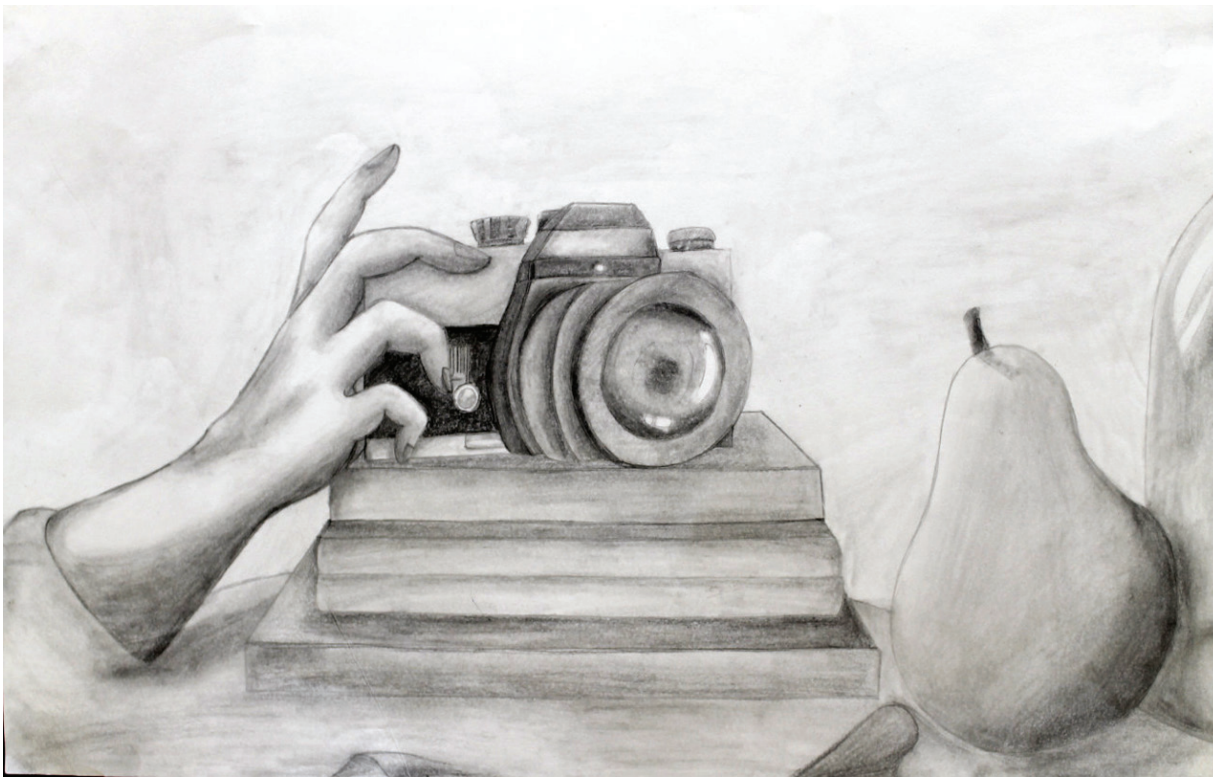
In each category, most of the students had a handle on their medium and showed strong ability in using their tools, but one or two students stood out.

A few of the students in perspective, not only mastered the technique, but took it further and created neighborhoods in their cityscapes with recognizable commercial icons.

Those that stood out in the zentangle category, used their imagination and created perfect and neat patterns, which produced stunning pictures. The black and white patterns made the art work pop.

Linoleum block prints are also difficult to execute because the tool is difficult to master. The students who created these, along with other print medium, ranged from the neat and simple to the exotic.

Arts and crafts had a myriad of paper mache sculptures, ceramics and other

items. Most were fun, offbeat and colorful. A papier Mache abstract dog was amusing, painted bright yellow with big Gremlin ears and other quirky patterns. Also worth mentioning was Lilly Abernathy's tile painting, showing a variety of confetti colors in shapes resembling puzzle pieces.

In years past, students featured enormous paintings, but this year featured very few oils. Art teacher Michelle Coleman said it was because those that work in that medium were helping her design the art work for the student theater production. What was outstanding this year were the watercolors, drawing, and photography.

Drawing and pastels saw surprises with Rachel Many's large charcoal portrait of a young woman. Many got first for her portrait, capturing the sultry essence of her subject. Alex Creel's soft pencil subject of a still life within a still

life, showing a hand holding a camera and taking a photo of a pear, was intriguing.

Among the ones to watch are Andrew Sheets, who already won an award for his flawless pastel drawing of a cat, also won first for this work and won second in colored pencil for his panel of grizzly bears. Sheets has learned at a young age how to use and master colored pencils. His attention to detail is flawless and meticulous in his rendition of the bear's rough fur, the claws and its canines as it roars.

"He worked on this piece for a long time, drawing every blade of grass and pine needle," said Coleman, agreeing about Sheet's dedication to details.

Watercolor featured an enormous amount of talent in one category. Adora Gamage, who won first in the novice category in the recent FAA judged show, showed off her versatility with an offbeat

fun illustrative piece featuring breakfast items floating in midair -- including a perfectly executed croissant and splashing coffee.

Bri Parker grabbed the attention of judges and got first for her quirky colorful portrait of a young woman with long hair and flowers.

"She comes up with a variety of subjects," said Coleman. But the painting that got Best In Show was Reanna DeVarennes' striking watercolor. Like Parker, DeVarennes was another one who went far outside the box for her subject, which was a reflection of a marching band seen in a tuba. The judges were in awe of her work, noting her perfect distortion of the musicians represented in the contour of the tuba. Coleman added that Parker would be studying illustration



when she went to college -- good choice for someone who already has a head full of forward-looking ideas.

The take away from this year's show was that the students saw no boundaries when it came to their imaginations and this signaled to the adult judges that no matter what age, you can go beyond what you learn and create something memorable.

Track and Field

Flucos finish second and third at Jefferson District meet

The Fluvanna high school girls and boys track and field squads traveled to Louisa County High School on May 2 for the Jefferson District meet. Fluco athletes turned in several excellent performances and the girls' team finished in second place, while the boys team was third overall.

The girls team had 13 individual athletes and two relay teams turn in All-District performances. The girls did not win any of the events, but the team showed extraordinary depth to achieve a second-place finish as a team, with a team score that was nearly double that of the third place team.

Sophomore Jules Shephard was the Fluco's most versatile performer. She took third in the high jump, fourth in the

triple jump, fifth in the long jump and sixth in the 100 meter dash. Senior Saige Haney was second in the 800 meter and was also on the second place 4X800 relay team. Other runners on that relay team were Kieri Hart, Emily Smeds and Kristen Cabrera. Hart and Smeds from this relay team also were high finishers in individual running event. Hart was third in the 800 meter and Smeds was third in the 1600 meter.

Two second place finishers for the Flucos were Junior Delaney Reed in the discus and sophomore Amina Wilson in the pole vault. Reed's throw was 99.09, two feet longer than the third place throw. Wilson's vault was 10 feet.

Distance runner Emily Beckman turned in two top performances, finishing

second in the 3200 meter (two mile) and fourth in the 1600 meter run. Others who scored points for their team and finished All-District were Hattie Lintecum with third in the 400 meter, Summer Craig with fourth in the 3200 meter, Emily Goodman with sixth in the 3200 meter, Ashley Pieno with fifth in the pole vault, Khailah Lee with fourth in the shot put and Amy Glowatch with fifth in the discus. The 4X400 relay team finished fourth. It consisted of, Hart, Smeds, Cabrera and Brianna Parker.

The Fluco boys' team finished in third place by a wide margin over the fourth place team. The boys were led by the team's only district champion. Junior Christian Holland soared a distance of 44.02 feet in the triple jump. This was

more than a foot better than the second place finisher. Holland also grabbed second in the long jump event. Another first place finish for the boys came in the 4X100 relay race. This team consisted of Kevin Alvarenga, Holland, Colby Martin and Dante Eddings.

Holland was not the only Fluco with more than one top performance. Sophomore Eli Hartzog got off several good throws in the discus and the shot put. He finished second in the discus and third in the shot put. His discus throw was five feet longer than the third place performance. Martin combined jumping and running skills to finish third in the long jump, sixth in the triple jump and fifth in the 100 meter dash. Eddings was also good at both running and jumping. He finished second in the 100 meter dash, third in the 200 meter dash and fourth in the long jump. Hurdler Jared Newman was fifth in the 300 hurdles and sixth in the 110 hurdles. Long Distance runner Jack Rice placed sixth in both the 800 and the 1600.

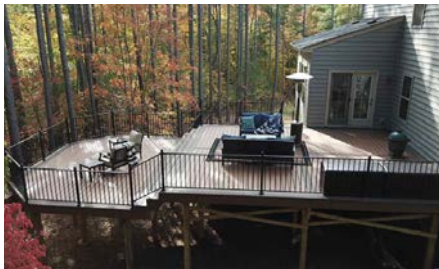
