Groundbreaking solar farm opens in Troy

Gov. Ralph Northam was the guest of honor at Central Virginia Electric Cooperative's (CVEC) dedication of a new solar farm in Troy on Tuesday (May 22)—but the real star of the show was the sun, which emerged just before the hour-long ceremony and vanished not long after it finished.

As a group of about 75 people, including governmental officials, company representatives, and a few anti-pipeline protesters sat in the shade of a tent, thousands of solar panels covering the nearby 41-acre field were silently converting light into energy.

If all goes as expected, the Palmer Solar Center, along with the 35-acre Martin Solar Center in Goochland County near Kents Store, will be doing that job for at least the next quarter of a century.

"We're celebrating a monumental achievement here today," CVEC president Gary Wood said in his opening remarks.

Together, the Palmer and Martin Solar Centers can produce 10 megawatts of power, enough to meet the needs of 1,200 homes a year. It is the largest solar project undertaken by an electric cooperative in Virginia to date.

The facilities were developed and built by Coronal Energy, a Charlottesville-based solar energy company. Coronal will continue to own and operate the fa-

cilities, and CVEC has contracted to buy the output from both plants for the next 25 years.

"It's nice to finally be building solar in our own backyard," said Jonathan Baker, chief talent officer for Coronal. The company has constructed facilities in 16 states, but this is their first in the local area.

Kyle West, vice president of development for Coronal, talked about one of the most unique things about the CVEC project.

After scouting the locations in Fluvanna and Goochland, West approached the owners, Grover and Wanda Palmer. Sometime during the negotiation process, he learned that Grover Palmer was a 39-year veteran of CVEC.

"It's the first time in my history of solar development where the landowner is also a former employee of the utility," West said. "What a fitting testament to just how connected co-ops are to their members and communities."

Debra Roepke, representing the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association, said that "cooperative solar is surging across the country," with co-ops like CVEC producing 877 megawatts of solar power nationwide and another 800 megawatts under consideration.

She noted that CVEC was one of only

10 cooperatives in the country to tackle a 10 megawatt project.

Fluvanna Board of Supervisors Chairman Mike Sheridan said he was amazed at how quickly the project came together, noting that the Board approved the zoning just 18 months ago. "You guys didn't waste a second," he said.

Sheridan, who teaches at Fluvanna Middle School, said he had seen young people he taught and coached among the CVEC workers at the event. "That's what family is all about, and that's one of the things that's so great about this project," he said.

Northam was the last to speak. "You know, we have this beautiful sun that God gave us," he said in his brief remarks, "and we need to take advantage of that."

Northam is a strong supporter of renewable energy. In March, he signed SB 966, a sweeping reform bill that calls for the power utilities to increase Virginia's total solar and wind generation to 5,000 megawatts in the coming years.

According to the nonpartisan Solar Foundation, Virginia's current solar capacity is just over 600 megawatts and accounts for about half a percent of the state's power output. Virginia ranks 20th in solar power production nationwide.

Northam stressed that investment in renewable energy isn't just a smart en-

vironmental move: It's smart business. It draws new businesses to the state and creates jobs.

The Solar Foundation found that jobs in the solar industry grew by 168 percent in the last seven years. Over 3,600 Virginians are currently working in solar, an increase of 10 percent in a single year.

"This project created 60 good, well-paying jobs... We want to make sure all Virginians have a job that can support them and support their families," Northam said.

"It's pretty phenomenal when you think about it," he added. "Twelve hundred households powered from these two fields, without using any fossil fuels."

Northam and Wood concluded the event by symbolically "flipping the switch," signaling the official opening of the two facilities.

In another innovation, CVEC has earmarked 40 percent of the output from the Palmer and Martin Centers for individual members under their Solar Shares program.

Designed for those who want to use green energy but can't install solar power panels on their homes, the program allows members to purchase up to 250 kilowatts at \$4.50 per 50 kilowatt block.

Lake Monticello Road shooting ends in combined 56 years in prison

Dante Givens was sentenced to four years in prison on Friday (May 25) for his role in the 2016 robbery and shooting on Lake Monticello Road – the final sentence handed down in a crime that left a Fluvanna County man permanently injured.

Givens sat at the bottom of what Commonwealth's Attorney Jeff Haislip termed a "hierarchy of culpability."

Haislip told the court that Givens originated the sequence of events by telling his friend Thomas A. Jackson about guns stored in a gun safe in an apartment above a private garage on an isolated property off Lake Monticello Road.

Jackson then told John Morton Abbitt, a childhood friend then living in Virginia Beach. Abbitt told his friend, Gary Blowe, and the two men drove to Charlottesville on Nov. 18, 2016, to meet with Jackson and Givens and steal the guns.

None of the three co-defendants knew that Blowe, who had an extensive criminal history, was armed with a .45 caliber handgun.

The four men drove up Route 53 in two separate cars, but midway to Fluvanna, Givens decided he didn't want to participate in the robbery. They stopped at Me2 Market & Eatery, where Jackson joined

Abbitt and Blowe in their car and proceeded to the Lake Monticello Road property.

There they found the gun safe empty. Before they could leave, property owner Garnette Bourne arrived at the garage. Blowe immediately opened fire on Bourne, striking him in the leg.

Bourne's brother, Scott, and former Fluvanna County Sheriff Jackie Gillespie arrived moments later, and all three men exchanged fire with Blowe as Abbitt and Jackson escaped into the woods.

Jackson called Givens, who was then at the BP station on Lake Monticello Road, telling him to come pick him up.

Givens told investigators that he was just gassing up before returning home to Charlottesville, but Haislip told the court that it was more likely Givens deliberately stayed in the vicinity.

The two were stopped by Fluvanna County deputies within moments and placed under arrest.

Abbitt, Jackson, and Givens all cooperated with investigators and all three entered guilty pleas early in 2018. Blowe went to trial in January and was found guilty on multiple charges.

On May 11, Blowe was sentenced to serve 42 years in prison. Abbitt was sentenced to four years, and Jackson to just over six years.

Haislip said the Commonwealth's recommendation for sentencing in the Givens case was between 2.5 and 3.5 years, adding that Givens had no significant criminal background and had assisted in the case against Blowe.

The judge instead sentenced him to a total of four years. However, Givens will be permitted to apply for a work release program.

Like his co-defendants, Givens also was ordered pay around \$13,000 in restitution to the Virginia Victims Fund. The fund is designed to help victims cover their out-of-pocket expenses in the aftermath of a violent crime.

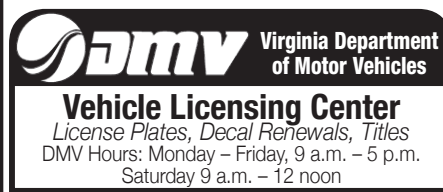

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC OF AN APPLICATION BY COLUMBIA GAS OF VIRGINIA, INC., TO AMEND AND EXTEND ITS NATURAL GAS CONSERVATION AND RATEMAKING EFFICIENCY PLAN CASE NO. PUR-2018-00057

On April 20, 2018, Columbia Gas of Virginia, Inc. (“CVA” or “Company”) filed with the State Corporation Commission (“Commission”) an application (“Application”) for authorization to amend and extend its Conservation and Ratemaking Efficiency Plan (“CARE Plan”) pursuant to Chapter 25 of Title 56 of the Code of Virginia. According to the Company, its current CARE Plan includes a portfolio of programs that promote conservation and energy efficiency among CVA’s residential and applicable small general service customer classes and a decoupling mechanism that adjusts actual non-gas distribution revenues per customer to the allowed distribution revenues previously approved by the Commission. In its Application, the Company proposes to extend its CARE Plan, along with certain modifications and amendments, for an additional five-year period, through December 31, 2023 (“Amended CARE Plan”).

The proposed Amended CARE Plan would only be available to residential customers and includes three conservation and energy efficiency programs, with 16 measures. Specifically, the Company requests approval to extend the following three conservation and energy efficiency programs, with certain modifications, for an additional five-year period: (1) Web-Based Home Audit Program; (2) Home Savings Program; and (3) Residential Low-Income and Elderly Program.

The Company expects to invest \$3.7 million over the five years of the Amended CARE Plan. According to the Company, the proposed Amended CARE Plan is designed to recover the incremental costs associated with its conservation and energy efficiency programs, as incurred, by means of a surcharge mechanism described in Section 12.4 of the Company’s General Terms and Conditions (the CARE Program Adjustment (“CPA”). The Company estimates that the proposed Amended CARE Plan’s CPA will cost the average residential customer approximately \$3.29 in 2019. In its Application, CVA requests authority to implement the CPA effective with the first billing unit for the Company’s January 2019 billing cycle (i.e., December 31, 2018). The Company’s proposed Amended CARE Plan also includes a performance-based incentive mechanism and a decoupling mechanism.

The details of these and other proposals are set forth in the Company’s Application. Interested persons are encouraged to review the Company’s Application and supporting testimony and exhibits for the details of these proposals.

The Commission entered an Order for Notice and Comment in this case that, among other things, directed the Company to provide notice to the public and provided interested persons an opportunity to comment on the Company’s Application.

The Company’s Application and the Commission’s Order for Notice and Comment are available for public inspection during regular business hours at each of the Company’s business offices in the Commonwealth of Virginia. 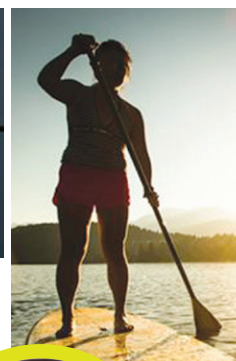

Track and field

Flucos perform well at Region meet

Impressive number head to States

The Fluvanna High track and field teams turned in quality performances in the Region 3C meet held Wednesday (May 23) at Monticello High. The boys' team under Coach Steve Szarmach finished in third place out of 13 teams, while the girls' team under Coach Rose Brogan took fourth place out of 12 teams.

The boys' team was unable to capture any Region titles, but achieved an impressive number of second place finishes. Christian Holland was second in the triple jump. Dante Eddings was second in the 100-meter dash. Shane Morris was second in the pole vault, and Eli Hartzog was second in the discus throw. All of these performances were of All-Region caliber.

Holland also was All-Region for a third place finish in the long jump. Hartzog also had a second All-Region performance with a fourth place finish in the shot put. Other All-Region performances for the boys' team were turned in by Colby Martin in the long jump and the triple jump, and by Ledric Reid in the 110-meter hurdles and by Ethan Yancy in the pole vault.

The Fluco girls' team won two Region titles. Emily Smeds finished first in the 3,200 meter (metric two-mile) in a time of 12:22.52. She won by just over two seconds. The Fluco 4X800 meter relay team also notched a first place finish. This team consisted of Kieri Hart, Saige Haney, Hattie Lintecum and Kristen Cabrera. They won by an impressive 18 seconds.

The girls' team had two second place finishes: Amina Wilson in the pole vault, and the 4X400 relay team consisting of Lintecum, Skylar Solga, R'Tia Payne and Cabrera. Others who finished well enough to garner all-Region honors were: Lintecum in the long jump, Delaney Reed in the discus, Emily Beckman in the 1,600 meter, Smeds in the 1,600 meter, Cabrera in the 800 meter, and Haney in the 3,200 meter.

The track and field season is still not over for a host of Fluco athletes who have qualified for the State meet. Szarmach said the following boys will be heading to Harrisonburg High June 1-2 to compete at the State level. The 4X100 relay team of Jared Newman, Holland, Colby Martin and Eddings, will compete in the long jump and the triple jump. Martin will also compete in the long jump and Eddings in the 100 meter. Hartzog will also head to the State meet to compete in the discus and shot put. Morris and Yancy will compete in the pole vault.

Brogan also will have a large contingent going to the State meet at Harrisonburg High. The 4X800 relay team and the 4X400 relay team will both attend. The 4X800 team consists of Hart, Haney, Smeds and Cabrera, with Beckman and Lintecum as alternates. The 4X400 team consists of Lintecum, Solga, Payne and Cabrera, with Hart and Alexis Kesterson as alternates. Individually Smeds has qualified for States in the 1,600 meter and the 3,200 meter. Haney will be running the 3,200 meter, while Cabrera will go in



the 1,600 meter. The girls' team will also have Wilson and Ashlee Pieno competing in the pole vault and Jules Shephard competing in the long jump.

The array of Fluco athletes moving on to the State meet is truly impressive.

Many schools, at this point, are down to only one, two or three athletes, or even none. The Flucos seem to be developing strong and balanced teams with top notch competitors in both track and field events on both the girls' and boys' side.

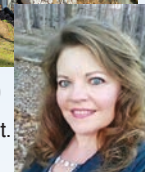

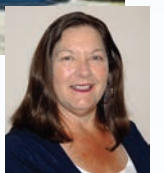

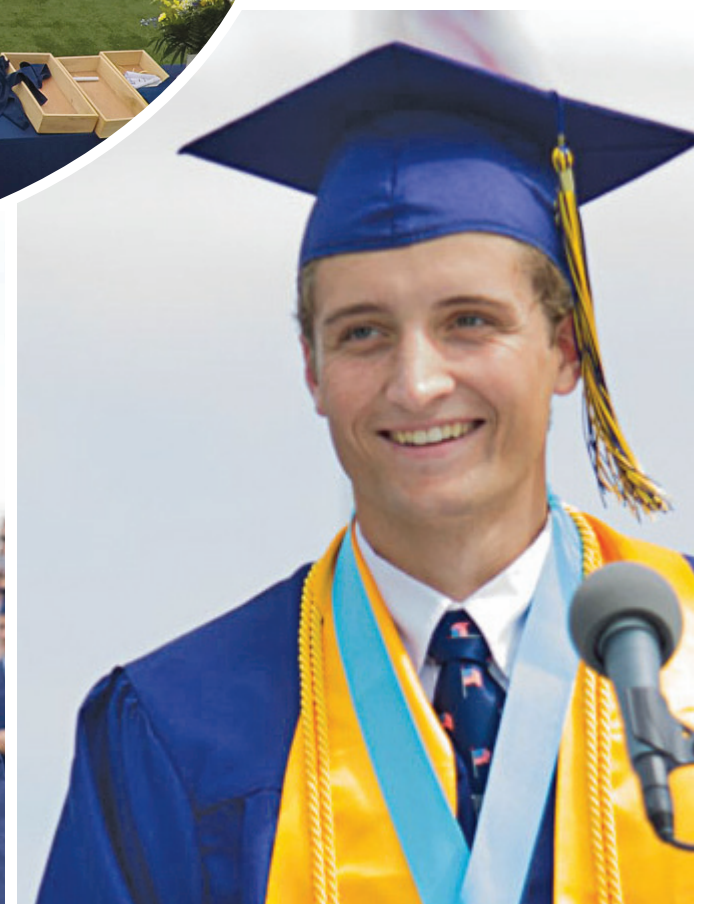
