

Her first day on the job was Sept. 10, and she is currently observing the community and business climate and understanding the prime areas of growth. She will then think strategically to determine what businesses would be a good fit to recruit to the community.

"I love that I am going to be developing and sustaining community, tourism, and business in Fluvanna County," said Edwards. "I am also learning a lot about the history and culture of the county through the Fluvanna Leadership Development Program."

Edwards has projects to tackle. She works on business retention and expansion efforts for existing businesses, making sure they are satisfied with the resources the county has to offer. For future projects, she wants to establish more education seminars on topics such as marketing and expanding the reach of customers for small and medium-sized businesses.

"I see a lot of potential to grow the community assets, incorporating the rich history Fluvanna has to offer as well as tourism, small and large commerce. I want the businesses of Fluvanna to sustain, develop and grow," she said.

Edwards earned her bachelor's in English from William Carey University, located in Mississippi, and a Master of Science in Economic and Workforce Development from the University of Southern Mississippi. Recently she was the director of external projects at the Melton Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation (MCEI). There she helped students, faculty, and the community target businesses in Mobile, Ala., to create a more entrepreneurially-minded area. On top of that, she helped establish the beginnings of a new digital media industry in New Orleans, La., through the Greater New Orleans Economic Alliance.

Those were just a few of the many tasks that kept Edwards busy during her time in Alabama. She also taught courses in management and entrepreneurship at the Mitchell College of Business from the University of South Alabama and served as an MCEI board member for six years from 2012 to 2018. In addition, she is a co-inventor of the product Banana Wave[®], which is a healthy alternative to soy or almond milk.

The previous coordinator, Jason Smith, moved to a take a new job with Virginia Economic Development Partnership located in Richmond. Smith handled new businesses and business spotlight submissions, as well as the Economic Development Authority. Last year he received the BASIC/IEDC Training Scholarship from the Virginia Economic Developers Association.

In her free time, Edwards like to go biking and hiking – activities for which central Virginia is known. She also loves to travel, going to festivals, picking from farms or orchards, and spending time with friends and family. Unlike most, Edwards enjoys a good rainy day because she can cozy up and watch a classic black and white movie.

Moving to central Virginia has helped Edwards get away from a congested lifestyle. Edwards is now able to be in a car for 40 minutes without traffic – something that was uncommon in Mobile, Ala.

ters, sources all his raw materials and employs people to produce his products. Business 101.



Business Spotlight: Evelyn's Confections

New ice cream shop makes cool addition to county

Whether you're looking for fresh breads to include in an unbeatable sandwich or the cake that's just right for your next special occasion, you are sure to find just what you need at the Food Lion bakery. At your local Food Lion, you can explore our selection of fresh bagels, rolls, breads, and more. There's a new shop in town located in the Food Lion shopping center near Lake Monticello's Turkeysag gate. Darryl Hoelscher, owner of Evelyn's Confections, opened his ice cream shop Aug. 1 with a variety of sweet flavors for the community to taste.

"I wanted to do something fun and I get to have great conversations with the clientele," said Hoelscher.

Evelyn's Confections has a variety of options on its menu for customers to choose from. It offers vanilla and chocolate soft serve with the choice of added syrup, milkshakes, sundaes, and razzles, which are similar to blizzards, with added candy pieces. Hoelscher also recently introduced smoothies and will be creating ice cream cakes in-house in the near future. Further down the road, Hoelscher plans on serving confections, so keep an eye out.

The most popular items on the menu are the flavor bursts of caramel and mocha cappuccino. The machine currently has eight syrups that can be combined with vanilla or chocolate soft serve. Other flavors include strawberry, butter pecan, cool mint, green apple, banana ripple, and tropical orange.

The machine for the flavor bursts has two separate hoppers and two barrels, which allows the machine to store both the vanilla and chocolate mix. The mix is a formula of different ingredients that Hoelscher and his son taste-tested themselves before selecting the perfect creation. Once the mix is poured into the machine, it's ready to dispense soft serve in 10 minutes.

Hoelscher praised the spot, which previously housed Frost Bites, for its location. "The traffic going into Food Lion and Subway is pretty heavy, so the location is great," he said. With the different restaurants in the shopping plaza and across the street, Evelyn's Confections offers a treat for those who have a sweet tooth.

Hoelscher moved from Texas 30 years ago. He has lived all over central Virginia, in Fredericksburg, Charlottesville, the Zion Crossroads area, and currently in Scottsville. Before running his own business, Hoelscher was in the automotive industry working as a redistributor for Fiat parts with Autosport.

Hoelscher came up with the name Evelyn's Confections with inspiration from his aunt. "Her funding is what allowed me to open the store," said Hoelscher.

Now that Hoelscher is his own boss, his number one responsibility is to make sure the customers are happy. His other responsibilities include making sure that his employees are paid and have a safe work environment for both them and the customers.

"I follow the tell-see-do management style, which is where you tell the employees what to do, you then show them what they need to do, and then they do it," said Hoelscher. "I allow the employees to learn on their own and correct their mistakes. I'll step in when I am needed."

In the next 10 years, Hoelscher wants to expand his business. He hopes to gain 15 to 20 more locations within a 70-mile radius. "I didn't start the store to run just one, I want a few more locations. That's the goal," he said. There is no set date for a grand opening, but he is planning one for December.

Hoelscher has been in customer service his entire life and will use his past experience to keep in touch with the community. He has established a friendly environment within his shop and will do whatever it takes to make sure the customers leave happy and with the knowledge that they will return.

Peaceful Passings Senior Animal Rescue receives \$1,000 grant

Peaceful Passings Senior Animal Rescue of Bremo Bluff has received a \$1,000 emergency medical grant from the Petfinder Foundation. The Petfinder Foundation emergency medical grant program is used to assist Petfinder members who are caring for a pet that needs special life-saving veterinary care in order to become adoptable.

The Petfinder.com Foundation assists the 12,000 + animal shelters and rescue groups that post their adoptable pets on Petfinder.com. A nonprofit 501(c) (3) organization, the Petfinder Foundation helps adoption organizations find homes for the pets in their care through its programs, including Sponsor A Pet, Disaster Fund, and Quality of Life.

Since its founding in 2003, the Petfinder Foundation has given more than \$20 million in cash and product grants to shelters and rescue groups in the United States, Canada and Mexico.

About Peaceful Passings

Peaceful Passings began as a rescue in 2002 for senior animals supported only by Meyers and her husband, Dave Sagarin. Their home also served foster animals that came to them through their local SPCA and animal sanctuary.

Their website was developed to offer the public information on caring for senior animals and as a resource on death, dying, and grief issues. Many people were paying their veterinarians for this information, which was knowl-



edge well known to those who had volunteered in shelters and worked with senior animals for a number of years. Their thought was to make this information available to the public, so when people took their animals to a veterinarian, they would be able to apply their financial resources toward addressing their particular animal's medical needs.

In 2009 they began the process to apply for non-profit status to expand their service to more animals in need by placing themselves in a position to accept donations to support their work. Their letter of determination was received Jan. 14, 2010; however, it is backdated to April 2009. At that point, Peaceful Passings was granted non-profit status as a 501(c)(3), which allowed them to accept donations and expand their rescue.

Peaceful Passings is an all-volunteer organization and, to the best of their knowledge, only one of two home-based rescues for senior animals in the state of

Virginia. They have a six-member Board of Directors. Peaceful Passings serves three populations: "super seniors," who are 12 and older and will remain with them as long as they have a quality of life; their hospice animals who will also remain with them as long as they enjoy a quality of life, and their adoptable seniors under 12 who they work to rehome.

Their mission is to save senior animals. Their vision is a world where no animal is euthanized because of age or medical challenge when a quality of life remains. They believe that animals will live a better life when humans respect that all stages of an animal's healthful life are of value to society.



Fluco volleyball tops Western Albemarle in five tight games

It was a highly competitive and extremely entertaining match. Western won the first game 25-22. The Flucos bounced back to win the second game 25-20. Western went back ahead by winning game three 25-17. The Fluco were undaunted and captured the fourth game by the slimmest of margins at 25-23. In the fifth and deciding game, the Flucos were victorious 15-10. Adding up all the points scored in the five games by each team the result is Fluvanna 104 and Western Albemarle 103.

In the first game of the match, it was obvious that these teams were likely to have a serious battle to the end. The score seesawed back and forth, with neither team able to break into a significant lead. In fact, the final margin of three points was the largest lead of the game. At one point, the Flucos ran off three impressive points with kill shots by freshman Khamare Steppe and senior Katie Morris to move from down one to up 16-14. However, The Warriors finished strong, outscoring the Flucos 11-6 from that point on. In the second game, the Flucos rushed to a 5-1 lead with senior Christina Walker contributing a kill shot and a service ace. Western Albemarle fought back to tie the score at 13-13, and surged ahead at 19-17. At that point, Fluco Coach Christi Harlowe-Garrett called a time out. The time out seemed to do the trick, as the Flucos rallied to score three points in a row for a 20-19 lead and went on to a 25-20 final score. The Flucos outscored the Warriors 8-1 after the time out.

The third game of the match was the least competitive. The Warriors scored early and often to lead 6-1 and then 16-4. The Flucos battled to get back into the game, outscoring the Warriors 13-9 in the final 22 points, but an early 12-point deficit was too much to overcome.

The fourth game was much like the first, as neither team was able to open up a lead early in the game. With the score tied 15-15, the Flucos went on a three-point run, and then opened up a five-point lead at 22-17. Western bounced back with three straight points and Harlowe-Garrett called a time out. With the

Steppe made it 24-23 with a thunderous kill shot and Evynne Stafford, the team's junior libero, served an ace for the 25-23 win.

When a match goes to five games, the fifth game is played to 15 points, not to 25. The deciding game opened with a decisive kill shot by Walker. Junior Sydney Crawford scored with a block at the net for the Flucos to take a 3-0 lead. Katie Morris had a kill shot for a 5-2 lead. Steppe had another powerful kill shot for an 8-6 lead and Crawford followed with a service ace. The Warriors scored three in a row to tie the game at 9-9. Harlowe-Garrett called time out. Again, the time out seemed to work. Steppe scored on a block at the net, Morris had a service ace, Steppe scored on a kill, and the Flucos were up by 12-9 and only needed three more points. Western called time out. The ensuing point was won by the Flucos when Western hit the ball out of bounds after an extremely long and exciting rally. Walker had a kill shot to put the Flucos within a point of the win. Stafford's serve hit the top of the net and rolled over for an ace and the Flucos had the win.

After the game, Harlowe-Garrett said that she feels her players are really starting to come together and are developing good team chemistry. She noted that all of her players got into this match despite its extremely tight scores.

The match was long with a lot of points scored, so the statistics were impressive. Walker had 15 kills and Steppe had 11 kills. Having two players with double figures in kill shots is impressive. Sophomore Lindsay Ward, whose job is to set up the kill shots, had 31 assists. Stafford, whose job it is to dig out the other team's attempted kill shots, had 26 digs.

The Flucos traveled to Louisa and Monticello High Sept. 27 and Oct. 2 respectively. They will be at home Oct. 4 hosting Orange County. On Oct. 9 and Oct. 11 they travel to Charlottesville and Powhatan



Russian artist discusses plein air painting

Russian artist Julia Lesnichy spoke about her passion for plein air painting with the Fluvanna Art Association Sept. 21. An award-winning plein air impressionist painter, she is originally from St. Petersburg, Russia. She majored in linguistics, German and English but took private art classes in drawing and painting in Moscow in 1998 and began her art career.

A year later she moved to Charlottesville with her husband who was studying law at the University of Virginia and took classes in pastels and oils. Though her pastel work is flawless, for practical reasons she favors oils.

"Pastels do not sell as well as oils and most galleries will not sell pastels," she said. "I took classes with nationally recognized plein air artist and instructor Lois Griffel and this changed my life." She then returned to Russia after attending the Cape Cod School of Art – the first outdoor school of figure painting in America, started by Charles Webster Hawthorne in Provincetown, Mass., in 1896. By 1915, it grew into one of the largest art colonies, attracting wellknown artists including Norman Rockwell, Max Bohm and Childe Hassam.

She returned to the U.S. to live in 2010 and became a full-time artist. Her work has been featured in many art publications and galleries around Virginia and other areas of the U.S. Her work is bright and beautiful with strong color.

"I love color," she said. Influenced by impressionistic artists like Monet and Hassam, her paintings are serene and have a calming effect. "I am inspired by fast-changing light and color in nature." If the light begins to change while she is outside working on a piece, she starts another painting of the same scene.

She showed the members her process and in the span of an hour and a half, she completed what most felt was a finished work. It often takes her two to three hours to complete 85 percent of the painting before adding detail. Beginning with her sketch, she pointed out several key elements in creating a still life.

"I love color. " – Julia Lenichy

"Always locate the center of interest in a still life or a landscape. Always think before you paint; plan your values and colors," Lesnichy said as she scumbled color onto the canvas, blending and sweeping colors into each other.

In designing her still life, she creates diagonals to show movement and stacks objects to show perspective. She stressed not to center large objects.

"It's a lot of work just arranging flowers in a still life," she said. "The rule is not to have repetition but to have as much diversity as possible." Her theory is that the arrangement should reflect reality in nature, and no two flowers are alike. When it comes to still life, Lesnichy is influenced by Dutch masters and contemporary still life artists like Jeff Legg and Daniel Keys for their arrangements and compositions.

"I engage in a very loose creative process, following basic rules," she said. Unlike Legg and Keys, she is not a realist, so her painting is not representational of the object itself but instead shows her view of what she sees. As she paints, she achieves balance through what begins as a haphazard method that gradually takes form. To keep her style loose she uses large brushes and a palette knife and later she will use a smaller brush for details.

"For landscapes, plein air, getting outside is the best," Lesnichy said. "Try not to paint from photographs. Learn from

the real world. If you do paint anything from photographs, darken in highlights – they tend to be too light." She continued a series of quick strokes with her brush, adding that using oils allows her more experimentation and that she was taught to ignore the edges of her subject but focus in on the negative space and values.

"Be conscious of light and shadows and reflective light. Shadows have more reflective light than you think," she said.

High intensity color is dominant in Lesnichy's work. She takes command of her palette and knows what works and what doesn't.

"I like high chroma paintings. But learn to balance color. Many artists are not sure about color and stick with predominately neutral colors. Don't be afraid of color," she said. "Everything is about balance."

A passion for hula hoops

When Jocelyn McClung feels stressed she reaches for one of her hula hoops. "I call it moving meditation," she said.

When she travels, she has to demonstrate to TSA and airline personnel that her collapsible fluorescent hoops will fit in an overhead compartment or under a seat.

She calls hula hooping "magical."

When she hasn't had a chance to hoop in a few days, the yearning is great to get back into the swing of it, so to speak. It's her passion.

This Louisa resident has taken her hoop to music festivals and beaches

and usually attracts folks with questions. "You want to watch. It's hard not to watch," she said.

The hula hooping craze six decades ago was not appreciated everywhere. The Soviet Union banned the toy as a symbol of the "emptiness of American culture."

McClung's love of hula hooping came four years ago, long past the short-term fad phase of 1958, when millions of plastic hoops were sold and probably soon discarded because of the difficulty for most people of keeping the swivel motion going long enough to have the

hoop stay around the hips. The idea of the hoop was not new. Early hoopers were depicted in art going back to 500 BCE all around the world. Like batontwirling, there's a fascination with what can be accomplished by people with talent and practice.

McClung is one of them. It is a portable hobby that she takes to the beach, among other venues.

"Hooping on sand is hands-down my favorite," she said.

She became interested in hula hooping

Early hoops were made by civilizations around the world out of grapevines, rattan and willow. Today's hoops vary in thickness of the material, the weight, and the diameter. Although less-

nough to have the

expensive options are still available at dollar stores, the most expensive ones ("mood hoops"), are about \$70 and up and have LED lights inside so that they create a colorful show when in motion.

Hooping is "flow art," McClung said. "It's the constant movement of your body with your hoop."

Her hoops are three-quarters of an inch for tubing size and 30" in diameter, five-eighths of an inch for thicker tubing size, and 26 inches in diameter, which is the smallest size she has. Beginners usually do best with the larger size hoops, McClung added.

After introduction to the sport by a friend, she mostly learned by watching people, especially on YouTube and Instagram.

She demonstrated what she has learned by having a hoop roll down her back, or doing the "escalator," when it seems to spiral up or down her body, or she can spin it around her knees. In addition to the escalator, common moves are "isolation" and "weaves."

When her bun is positioned just right, McClung said she "can do a hoop on my hair."

McClung's family moved to Louisa County from Fredericksburg when she was 14, where she had studied ballet since she was about three. Although her mother, Donna McClung, has not gotten into the sport, McClung said her four younger brothers have tried it, at least on the beach. And although one grandmother "first thought I was crazy," she became more interested when she saw Olympic gymnastics performing rhythmic hula hooping.

Then, to her surprise, her paternal grandmother confessed that she had won a hula hooping contest back when the sport was in full spin.

With the hula hooping relieving stress, providing exercise and a way to meet people, McClung has a new daily job. In July she began working at Dockside Realty and said she's enjoying getting a foundation there for her new career in real estate.

It fits with her love of sales and selling, which she began five years ago at Victoria's Secret, rising to the level of selling manager for several stores in the region.

If customers are expecting someone to jump through hoops for them, McClung might just be that person.




