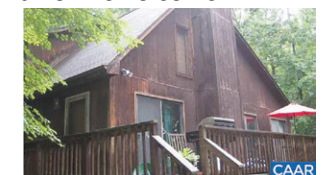

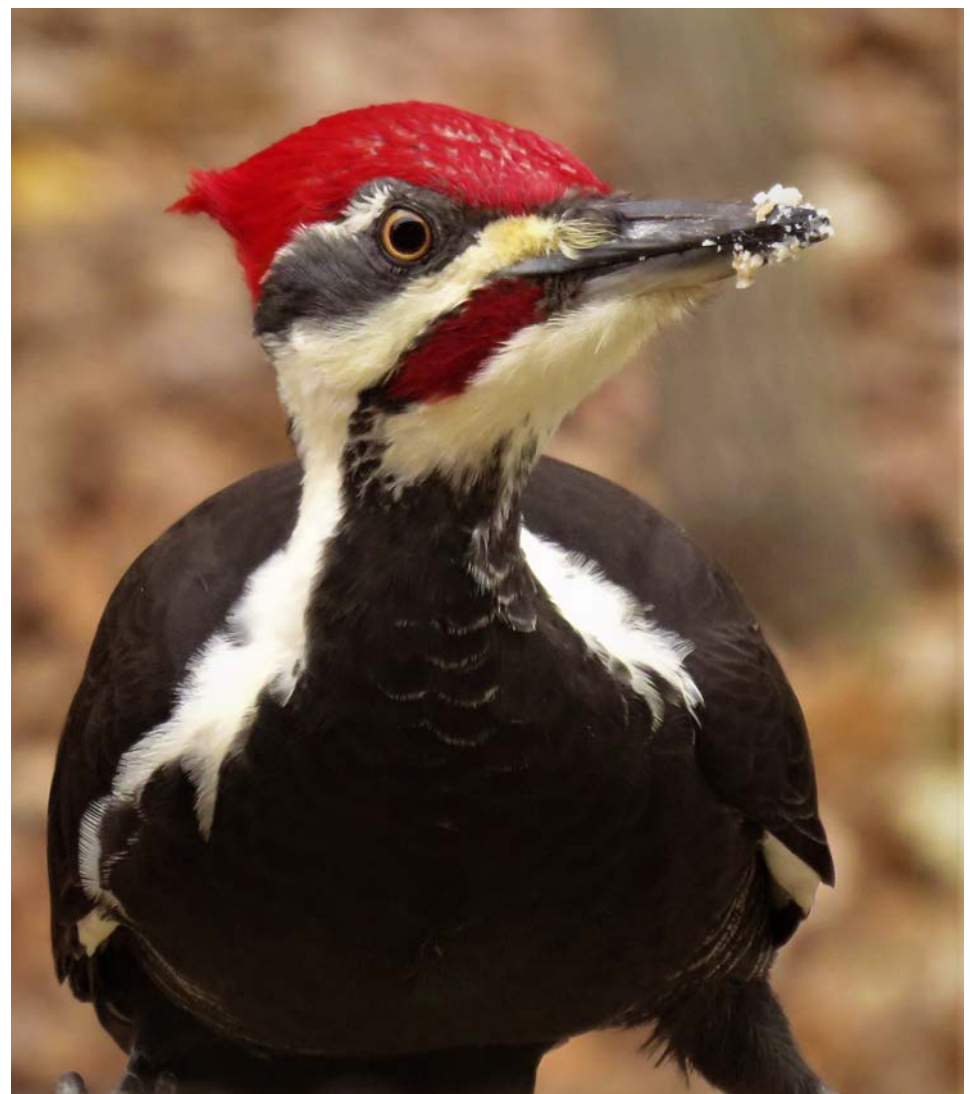

State police urge motorists to drive safely this Thanksgiving

As millions of Virginians take to the roads this Thanksgiving to celebrate the holiday with family, Virginia State Police urges motorists to slow down and keep their focus on the road so everyone makes it safely to the holiday table.

Four lives were lost in one day (Nov. 16) in three fatal crashes across the Commonwealth. Over a seven-day period (Nov. 9-15) traffic crashes have claimed 17 lives on Virginia highways, including a motorcyclist, two pedestrians, four passengers and 10 drivers. Sadly, eight of those individuals were killed in crashes where speed or reckless driving was a factor.

While fatalities in crashes involving distracted driving are down by approximately 37 percent, according to preliminary data, total traffic deaths remain on pace with last year. Through Nov. 15 712 individuals have lost their lives in traffic crashes compared to 724 over the same period in 2017.

"When you get behind the wheel this Thanksgiving, remember the cars on the road with you are carrying someone's loved ones, and the choices you make in the driver's seat affect your family and theirs," said Col. Gary T. Settle, Virginia State Police superintendent. "Avoid distractions, comply with speed limits, ensure everyone in your car is buckled up and never drive drunk. If we drive like every car is filled with our friends and family, we can make sure there are no empty chairs at the table this year."

Speed-related fatalities have already outpaced last year with 291 fatalities, rising by 9 percent. Fatalities involving unrestrained drivers remain relatively flat with 298 unbelted motorists killed so far in 2018 compared to 301 during the same period in 2017.

In 2017 248 people were killed as a result of alcohol-related crashes throughout the state. If holiday celebrations involve alcohol, remember to always plan for a designated driver, cab or rideshare.

To help prevent traffic deaths and injuries during the Thanksgiving holiday,

the Virginia State Police will once again be participating in Operation C.A.R.E., an acronym for the Crash Awareness and Reduction Effort. The state-sponsored, national program encourages law enforcement agencies to increase visibility and traffic enforcement efforts on major travel holidays. Over the five-day statistical counting period (Nov. 21-25), state police will increase its visibility and traffic enforcement efforts on highways throughout the Commonwealth.

The 2017 Thanksgiving Holiday C.A.R.E. initiative resulted in troopers citing 611 individuals who failed to obey the law and buckle up, as well as issuing 206 citations for child safety seat violations on Virginia's highways statewide. In addition, state police cited 8,181 speeders and 2,479 reckless drivers. A total of 105 drunken drivers were taken off Virginia's roadways and arrested by state troopers.

There were 14 traffic fatalities statewide during the five-day statistical counting period (Nov. 22-26, 2017) for the 2017 Thanksgiving holiday, marking the highest number of holiday fatalities since 2013. Less than half of the individuals killed in holiday crashes last year were wearing seat belts. Six of those deaths occurred in alcohol-related crashes.

In 2016 there were eight traffic deaths and in 2015, Virginia experienced nine fatalities on Virginia's highways during the holiday weekend.

With increased patrols, Virginia State Police also reminds drivers of Virginia's "move over" law, which requires motorists to move over when approaching an emergency vehicle stopped alongside the road. If unable to move over, drivers are required to cautiously pass the emergency vehicle. The law also applies to workers in vehicles equipped with amber lights.

From 2008 to 2017 nationwide, 126 law enforcement officers working along the roadside were struck by a vehicle because a driver failed to heed the "move over" law.

I was getting out of my car to take off a vest (too hot), so I put my car in park (or so I thought) and opened the car door to step out. The next thing I knew (it all happened so quickly) I had been knocked down to the ground and the front left tire of the car was rolling over my calves... and continued rolling up a slight incline until stopped by the 45-degree angle of the hill.

It was all surreal and naturally I was in shock. As I started crawling toward the school, I saw a red vehicle to my far left. I yelled for help...and my first angel arrived. (Unfortunately I didn't have my cell phone with me.) Brandon Smith came immediately to my aid, helped me to call AAA, turned on the car blinkers and gave me a safe place inside the school where I could safely sit and wait for AAA.

As it turned out AAA took two hours to

arrive (from Mineral). As I was waiting, two more angels showed up. Two Lake Monticello neighbors, unknown to me, a father-son duo, stopped to check out the scene. They would prefer to remain anonymous. Just know that they insisted on staying with me until AAA arrived. Their support was most reassuring and made all the difference as they checked back with AAA, reminded me to get checked out (I was in no pain at the time) and generally entertained me with their friendly social manner.

When AAA arrived it took five minutes to pull the car off the incline. Once they saw that I was able to safely go on my way, we all left.

I went to the ER and discovered that I basically have swelling, lacerations, bruising and a sprained ankle. Not too bad.

To Brandon Smith and my fellow Lakers, I just want to thank you for all your help and kindness to me. Thanks to you I made it through a very tough situation. I am so grateful to you!

Threat against high school triggers lockdown

Fluvanna County High School was placed on lockdown late Thursday morning (Nov. 15) after receiving a threat against the school.

The threat was resolved later that morning. No one was hurt.

A high school student allegedly overheard another high school student state that he or she was going to shoot, commit violence or kill someone, according to a press release from Capt. David Wells of the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office.

With schools on a two-hour delay due to inclement weather, students still on buses at the start of the lockdown were diverted to the middle school. The high school implemented a code blue lockdown.

According to the school handbook, code blue requires students go to the nearest classroom and the classroom doors should be locked. It is generally called in response to reports of an intruder in the building.

Melanie Cheripka said on a Facebook forum that her daughter texted that students were safe. "They locked all the kids that were there in the auditorium and are guarding the doors," she added.

Reports of the threat came from two sources, so officials initially didn't know whether there was one threat or two. Deputies secured the schools, determined there was one threat, and located

the student who allegedly made the threat, according to the release.

"The student was secured and taken to the sheriff's office to be interviewed," the release stated. "The student did not possess any firearms or weapons when located... At no point... did the student who allegedly made the threat possess any firearms or other weapons on school property."

The schools released a message at 10:52 a.m. stating that the person who made the threat had been located and was being questioned by police. They said that schools were returning to a normal operating schedule.

A heavy police presence at the high school was planned for the remainder of the day.

"The nature of the alleged threats is still under investigation," the release stated. "The Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office takes all possible threats of school violence very seriously and takes all threats as credible until they are able to determine otherwise."

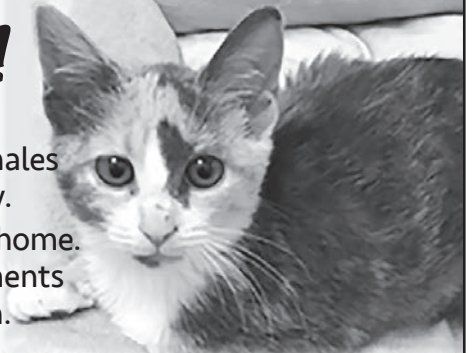

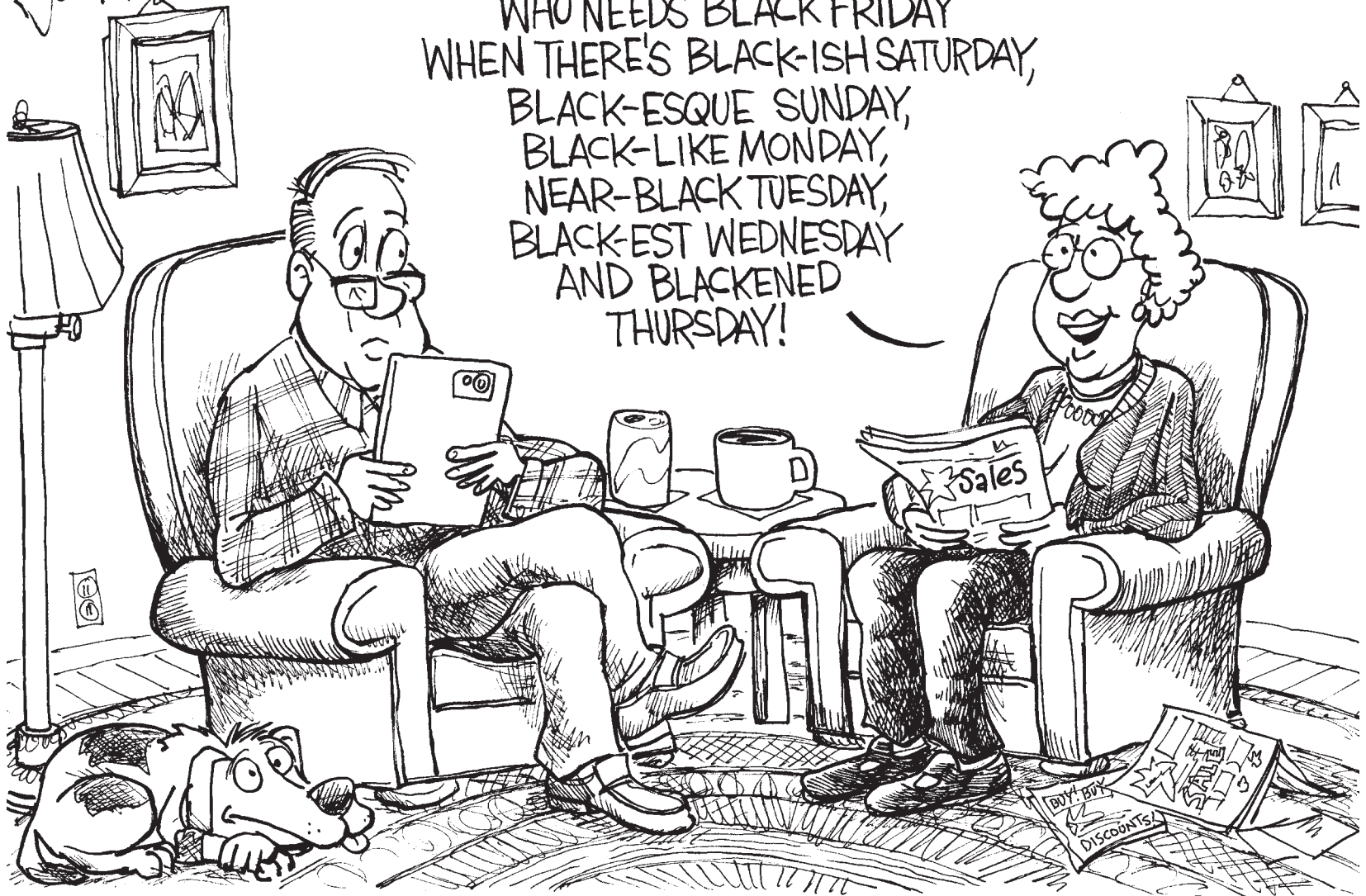

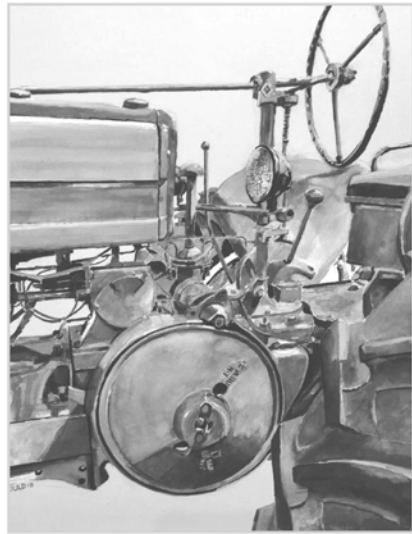

Who's your favorite artist?

Artists share their inspirations

Members of Fluvanna's art community recently took time to discuss their favorite artists.

A consensus emerged: American artists Andrew Wyeth and Winslow Homer were among the favorites, though there were many surprises as to which artists and styles inspired them.

Wyeth has a haunting and stark realism in his work – a style that made him a leading exponent of his generation. In depicting everyday life in New England, Homer recorded simple scenes and subjects in a memorable style and became revered as one of the great American masters.

Many of the great artists learned to manipulate color and light to create certain moods in their work. They also experimented and explored, working progressively and never compromising.

Artist Troy Weidenheimer believes in capturing the true nature of the subjects

he paints.

"At the moment I'd say Charles Napier Hemy, a European realist marine painter, working around 1900... And several modern Chinese artists like the wonderful Liu Yi, are among my favorites," he said. Like Homer, Hemy, a British painter, captured the day-to-day scenes of life on the coast of England in realistic detail. His depiction of light as seen in the sky or in shallow waters is so vivid that it draws the onlooker in as if she is standing right beside the subjects.

Weidenheimer has a great admiration for Asian artists. The apparent realism of Liu Yi's work is subtler with a soft, light touch. His subjects are wispy, almost ethereal.

Liz Ellis, who has been known for her portraits of animals, was one of the fans of Wyeth.

"I chose Andrew Wyeth because I love the realism of his work and the sub-

jects," she said. "I love the softness of his colors and of course the way he handles the light. It really is all about light and shadows, isn't it?"

On a more contemporary note, Ellis mentioned Doug Dawson, a pastel artist: "I really admire the clear, brighter colors of Dawson. His style is so different from Wyeth in that he is not as controlled. Two very different artists; both so inspiring."

Watercolorist Linda Bethke cited the late-19th century Russian painter Ivan Aivazovsky and Americana-German painter Albert Bierstadt as her favorite artists. This is an eye-opener when seeing Bethke's own work, which is the total opposite of those she admires. Her watercolors are bright and cheerful, while Bierstadt and Aivazovsky are vastly different in style with subtle and often dark colors, and muted blending portraying landscapes.

Susan Lang named Caravaggio and

Joaquín Sorolla among a few artists she looks to for inspiration.

“These two artists’ lives were separated by over 300 years. Caravaggio’s paintings have extremely dark shadows and the subjects glow in bright shafts of light creating such a dramatic contrast, I find them captivating,” she said. “Sorolla’s paintings capture light in a different way; bright sun light shimmers in his depiction of people along the shore. My favorite is *Mending the Sails*. The light dances over the canvas.” She also added Edward Hopper for his “simplistic compositions that tell complex stories.”

painting of scenes in Virginia and elsewhere, stated Winslow Homer and Andrew Wyeth as topping his list of favorite artists.

“Although I am partial to Eric Fischl and Gustav Dore,” he added. Fischl’s paintings are often realistic and offbeat, with many figures, mostly nude, and contain an underlying statement about human nature. Dore’s illustrations featured detailed pen and ink drawings of fantasy and lore.

“There are many artists I admire from the Renaissance on, including Italians like da Vinci and Caravaggio, and Dutch masters like Rembrandt and Vermeer,” said watercolor landscape

artist William Snow. “I am also a big fan of Degas, Renoir, O’Keefe, Louise Nevelson and others.” When it comes to watercolor, John Singer Sargent, Winslow Homer, Andrew Wyeth, John Pike, Edgar Whitney, and Murray Wentworth influenced Snow.

“A master at plein air watercolors, Sargent’s superb compositions are bold, simple and fresh. His brush strokes, along with his use of light, set the standard for watercolor as a sketching medium,” said Snow. “Winslow Homer’s simple yet pleasing compositions” strike him, he said. “The animated employ of human figures and subtle use of color mark Homer’s expert ability with a difficult medium, and Wyeth’s ability to mix quick, loose passages with dry brush detail mark his unparalleled ability at study and observation.”

The methods of more contemporary watercolor artists that are closely related to Snow’s own work are seen in the wet-on-wet techniques of artists like John Pike and Edgar Whitney.

“Great wet-on-wet color layering techniques and a wonderful sense of directional light are some of Pike’s foremost attributes,” he said. “Whitney was masterful at strong design, broad, single passages and wet-on-wet color diffusion. A great teacher as well.”

Snow studies his artists with utmost detail and scrutiny. “Little known in watercolor circles today, Wentworth worked fast and loose on smooth, hot press surfaces,” he said. “His ability to pull and rub out color, along with his mastery of splatter and scratch out techniques to create texture, give his landscapes an immediacy and spontaneity admired by many who knew him.”

Those we admire or who inspire us may be far removed from our own style, but if the onlooker peers at the work more closely, the subtle nuances of that admiration and inspiration can be seen in these artists’ work.

Strickler was given framed pictures of the band for him to display at home or in his classroom.

Gray Foxes announce winners at annual banquet

At the end of the season, the Lake Monticello Gray Foxes golf organization has its annual banquet. This year it was held Nov. 12 at The Pub. There is an 18-hole group that plays every Thursday morning and nine-hole group that plays on Friday mornings. Players may elect to compete in either group or in both.

Each week players pay a small cash amount and compete in the game of the day for money collected that day. So if \$120 is collected, that amount goes to the pro shop and store credits in that

amount go out to the contest winners. Each week the game that is played changes. Some weeks the competition is on an individual basis and some weeks there is a team competition. Most weeks the competition is for best gross score and best net score. When team competitions are conducted the teams are balanced as to handicap.

In addition to this weekly contest there is also a voluntary "skins" competition, for both gross and net scores. This involves awarding prize money to

the competitors who manage to shoot a lower score on a hole than any other player in their pool. In other words, if one of the players in the gross score pool has a birdie on a hole, he will win money only if no other player has a birdie on that hole.

To make things even more complicated, there is a yearlong "ringers" competition. This game is played once a month and a record is kept of each player's best score on each of the nine or 18 holes. A birdie on a hole in April will remain your

score on that hole for the rest of the year, unless an eagle is achieved. If a player never does better than bogie on a hole for the first six ringers competitions, but achieves a birdie in the seventh ringers event of the year, he now has a birdie on that hole.

Finally, this year the 18-hole players added a new competition called the Majors. This voluntary competition involved a simulation of the four pro golf tournaments that constitute the Majors (the US Open, the British Open, the

Masters and the PGA). This was a net score only competition and each player had to play four rounds to compete in each of the four tournaments.

In the nine-hole weekly competitions, the top two money winners were Stacey Barnard and Dan Henry. In the nine-hole group, the low gross in ringers was a 34, achieved by Stacey Barnard. The second best low gross was 37 by Ned Long. The low net in ringers for the nine-hole group was a 24 by Dan Henry. The second best net score was 26, which was scored by Ed Albright, Doug Caron, Mark Chase and Walt O'Connell.

In the 18-hole group, the top two money winners in the weekly competitions were John Stenz and Steve Wormington. In the ringers competition, low gross was won by Bob Lamb with a 62. The second best gross score was a 66, which was recorded Karl Bergstreser and John Alluisi.

In the ringers net score competition, Steve Wormington was the best with 42; Duncan Nixon was second with 44. For the 18-hole players, the best low gross score for the season was a two under par 70 by Bob Lamb. The best net score for the season was 61, recorded by Bill Russo, Ben Stoppe, Steve Wormington, Dan Atkinson, John Stenz and Paul Schmidt.

The top money winners in the skins competition were Gary Vogan and Dan Atkinson. In the Majors competition, the winners were:

- The Masters: Bill Russo;
- The US Open: Duncan Nixon;
- The British Open: Kevin McDonald; and
- The PGA: Larry Reynolds.

Kevin McDonald was the overall point winner for all four Majors combined.

The Gray Fox players made contributions of \$520 for the pro shop staff and the grounds crew. The Gray Foxes orga-

nization added \$200 to this amount and provided \$720 for golf pro Mark Marshall and course superintendent Jim Prucnal to distribute to their staff and crew.

The results set forth above were provided by Dan Foley for the nine-hole group and Dan Atkinson for the 18-hole group, who both do a yeoman's job throughout the year.
