Future of Scottsville Assessed

At the May 2018 meeting of the Scottsville Town Council Town Administrator Matt Lawless reported that a \$23,000 Virginia Housing Development Authority grant had been awarded to the town "to determine redevelopment possibilities for the tire plant property and to assess the future of Scottsville's growth and economic development." That study has been completed and the

report was submitted to the Town Council at its October meeting.

Arnett Mulrow and Associates of Greenville, SC, was selected to do the work. This firm had done a similar study for the town a little over ten years ago and was a good choice as they not only knew the town, but could see changes since the previous study was done.

At the October council meeting Aaron Arnett, a principal in the firm, presented the findings. Through an online survey, a zip code survey, commercial and residential market assessments, and a demographic study, the findings represented "a mixed use, mixed income market assessment for the town." The project also included redevelopment possibilities for the tire plant property.

The online survey showed that 82% of those who responded live in Scottsville, while only 18% work in the town. As for the type of businesses needed here those responding indicated everything from a clothing store to a car wash to a Walmart. The "top three wants" of those responding ranged from a dog park to more housing and

dining options.

When it came to housing, the majority said that \$150K - \$200K was the range most needed while indicating they would be willing to pay \$500 to \$1,000 per month for rent. Scottsville's "owner occupied housing" has a median value of \$227,600 which interestingly enough falls close to the middle of the scale between Buckingham and Albemarle County.

Arnett Mulrow's vision for the tire plant property ran the gamut from an indoor golf driving range to a vocational training center to a mixed use of single family homes, offices apartments or a retirement/assisted living facility. Two main problems affect this property: limited access and flood plain issues.

Population growth was studied and it was found that over the past eight years, Scottsville's population has increased 4.42%; from 566 to 591 but is only projected to grow by .34% by 2023. There are 276 households compared to 263 in 2010.

In looking at the overall picture, Arnett grouped Keene, Esmont and Schuyler with Scottsville as the Primary Trade Area or where most of the shoppers come from. "Just under half of people 25 years of age or older in the primary trade area have at least some college with 21% having a Bachelor's

You Should Know Jack!

A lot of people do know Jack, Jack Maxwell that is. He's the one we are talking about. Jack is a resident of Scottsville and volunteers all over the place. He is also a Special Olympics golfer.

When Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr. died his fifth child, a daughter Eunice, was appointed to oversee the JPK, Jr. Foundation. Eunice had a sister, Rosemary, who was diagnosed with a form of learning disability and was institutionalized most of her life. Up until the later part of the 20th century mental illness and intellectual disabilities were looked at much differently than they are today.

Mrs. Shriver had a vision and she acted upon that vision by inviting young people with intellectual disabilities to a summer day camp in her backyard. This was 1962 and she called her get together Camp Shriver. She felt she needed to do more, and with the resources of the Foundation she was able in July, 1968 to host the first International Special Olympics in Chicago.

She felt that Special Olympics proved that "children with intellectual disabilities can be exceptional athletes and that through sports they can realize their potential for growth."

She pledged that Special Olympics would "offer people with intellectual disabilities everywhere the chance to play, the chance to compete and the chance to grow." Today there are over 4.7 million people in 170 countries served by Special Olympics. This is the only organization that has the permission of the US Olympic Committee to use the word "Olympic" in their title!

This year's Special Olympic golf tournament was held November 3rd and 4th in Virginia Beach and Jack competed. He will represent Area 3 which encompasses the City of Charlottesville, as well as Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene and Louisa Counties.

Last year Jack shot a 46 on the first round and on the second and final day of the tournament he shot a 36 to

earn a four way tie for fourth place.

Although he has never had professional lessons, Jack rises early every morning and watches the Golf Channel. He watches how the pros hold their clubs, the stances that they take when they drive the ball or putt and any other characteristic that might help him with his game. Then he goes outside to practice on a small two hole course he has designed and built himself.

A product of Monticello High School, Jack is a self-taught computer whiz. Several years ago he developed an online application that provided Town of Scottsville residents with instant notifications of impending serious weather conditions. His current computer related project is an online radio station that provides not only weather related information but also can notify citizens of any emergency. He is working on a phone app also!

Jack volunteers with the Scottsville Rescue Squad, the Scottsville Volunteer Fire Department, anywhere the town needs him, and volunteered at Yancey Elementary School before it closed.

Jack said he "loves his volunteer work" and "if you want to accomplish a goal you need to work hard and keep at it." His dedication will be on display at the Virginia National Golf Course in Virginia Beach when he competes.

Jack Maxwell won the Special Olympics Fall Championships in Virginia Beach. You are bound to run into him in town because he is always volunteering somewhere!

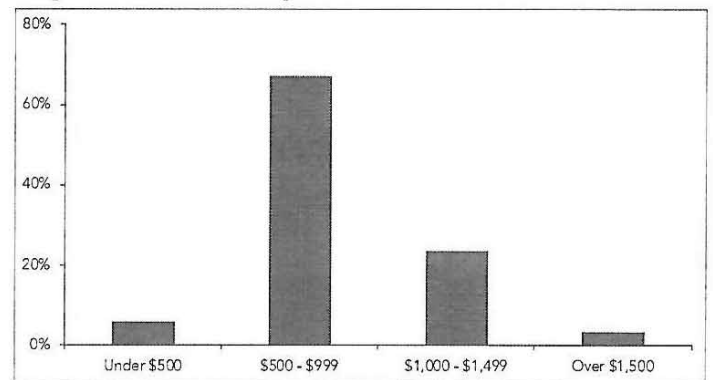

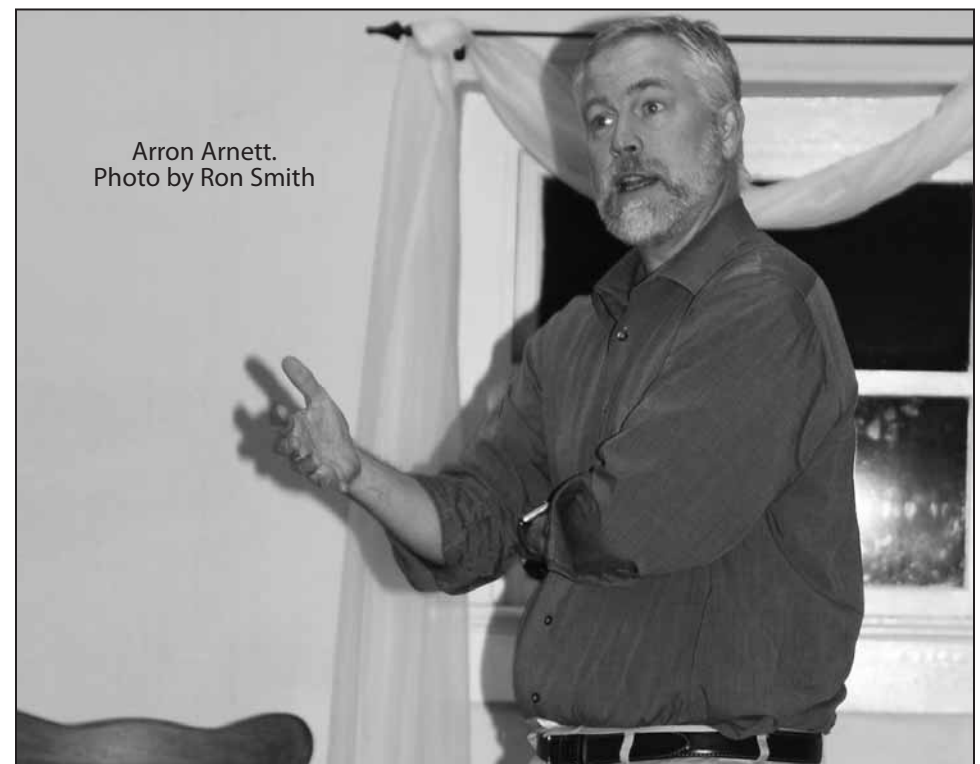

degree or higher," Arnett reported.

Another interesting statistic related to trade showed that consumers spent \$187.3 million in the primary trade area. But, as was pointed out, the area "lost" \$126.7 million to surrounding areas. This is obviously due to there being certain goods and services not available here.

This has been a brief summary of the report. It is available for review by

While things are better than they were ten years ago there is room for growth and improvement. AGE AND AGE DISTRIBUTION

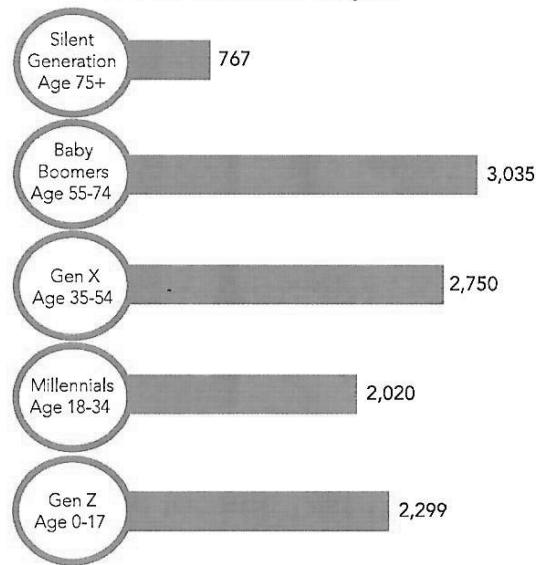
The median age in Scottsville (45.2) and the primary trade area (43.8) is higher than the median age in Albemarle County (39.5) and the metropolitan area (38.8). However, the primary trade area has a healthy mix of age groups, with 40% of the population being under the age of 35.

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

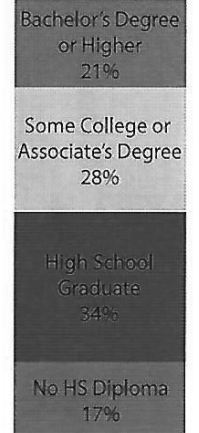
Just under half of people 25 years old or older in the primary trade area have at least some college education, and 21% of the population has a Bachelor's degree or higher. The Charlottesville metropolitan area is a highly educated region, and the primary trade area lags the region in educational attainment. In the metropolitan area, 65% of people 25 years or older have at least some college education compared to 49% in the primary trade area.

Age Distribution in the PTA

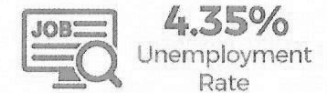

EMPLOYMENT TRENDS

In Scottsville, Accommodation and Food Services makes up over a third of the jobs in town. Other major sectors include Retail Trade, Construction, Real Estate, Wholesale Trade, and Health Care. There is a greater mix of industries in the Charlottesville metro, with the major jobs sectors being Educational Services (19%) and Healthcare (18%) followed by Retail Trade and Accommodation and Food Services.

Average Hourly Wages in Albemarle County (\$26.63) are slightly higher than the Metro (\$26.10) but lower than the state (\$29.08). The industries with the highest average weekly wage in Albemarle County are:

- Finance and Insurance (\$2,031)
- Federal Government (\$1,791)
- Management of Companies (\$1,768)
- Manufacturing (\$1,610)
- Professional, Scientific, & Technical Services (\$1,502)
- Information (\$1,463)

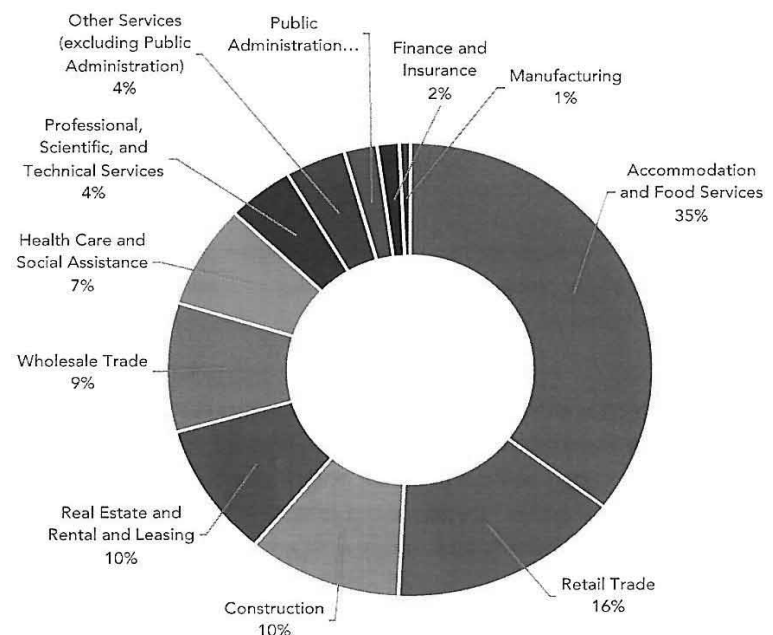
Between 2014 and 2024, it is projected that the Piedmont Workforce Network (10 County Region) will add:

- 4,591 jobs in Health Care and Social Assistance (20% growth)
- 3,015 jobs in Educational Services (12% growth)
- 1,916 jobs in Retail Trade (10% growth)
- 1,824 jobs in Accommodation and Food Services (12% growth)
- 1,585 jobs in Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (18% growth)
- 1,211 jobs in Construction (13% growth)

Healthcare jobs will be important in the region, with 12 of the 20 highest growth occupations being in healthcare. Other growth occupations include personal finance advisors, statisticians, veterinarians, web developers, photographers, and information security analysts.

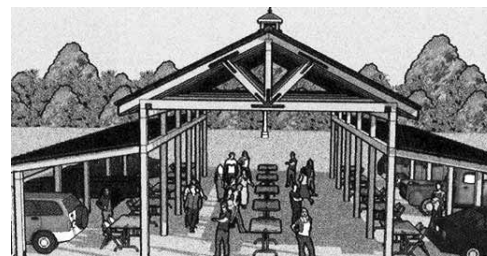

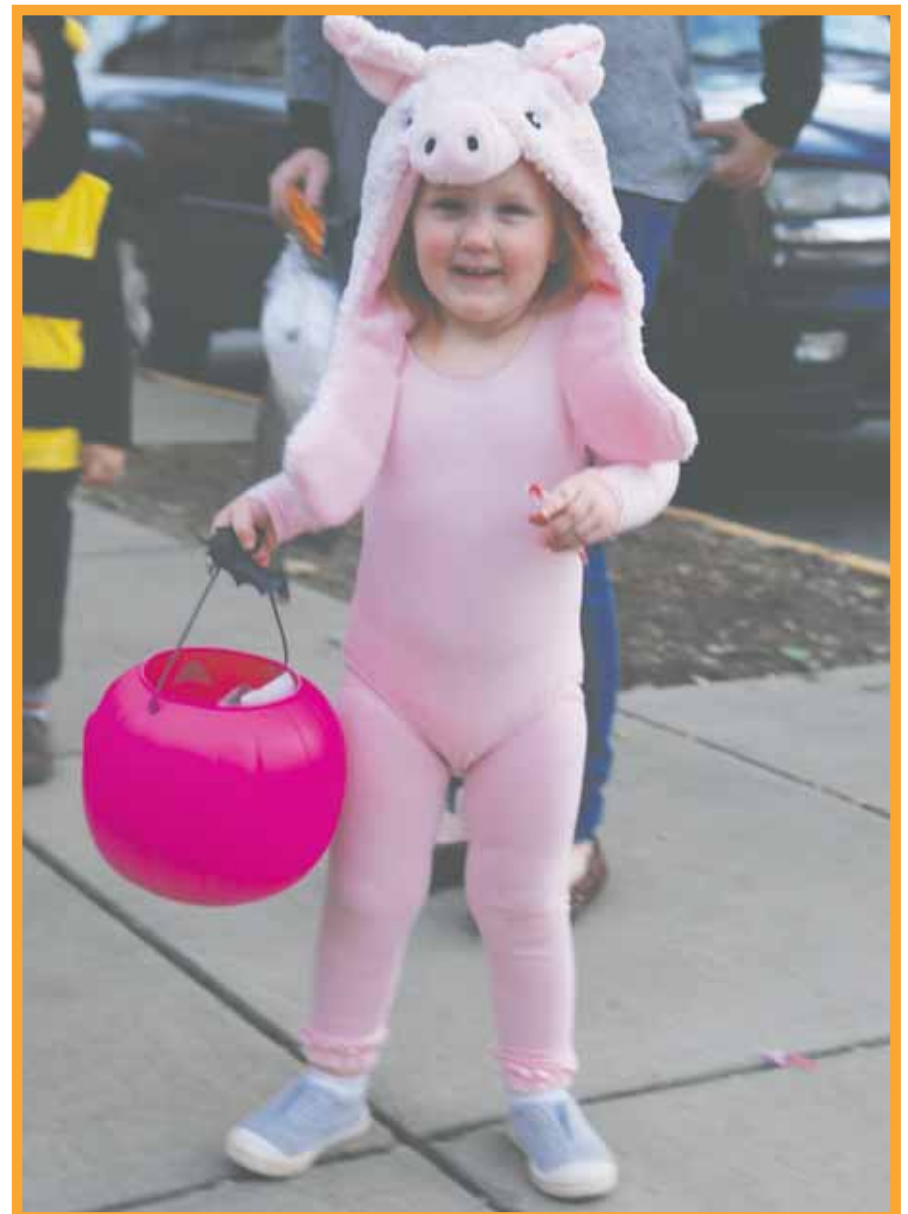

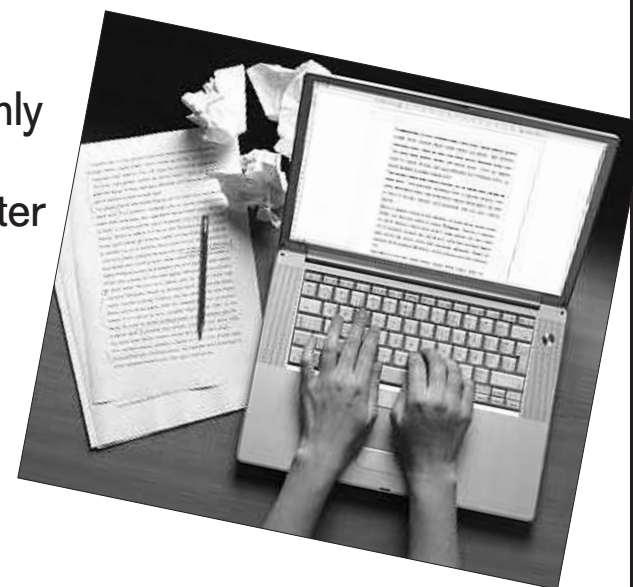
