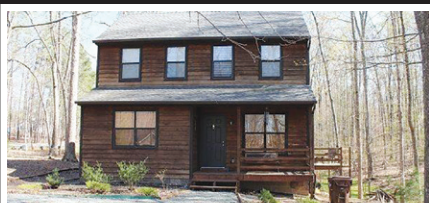

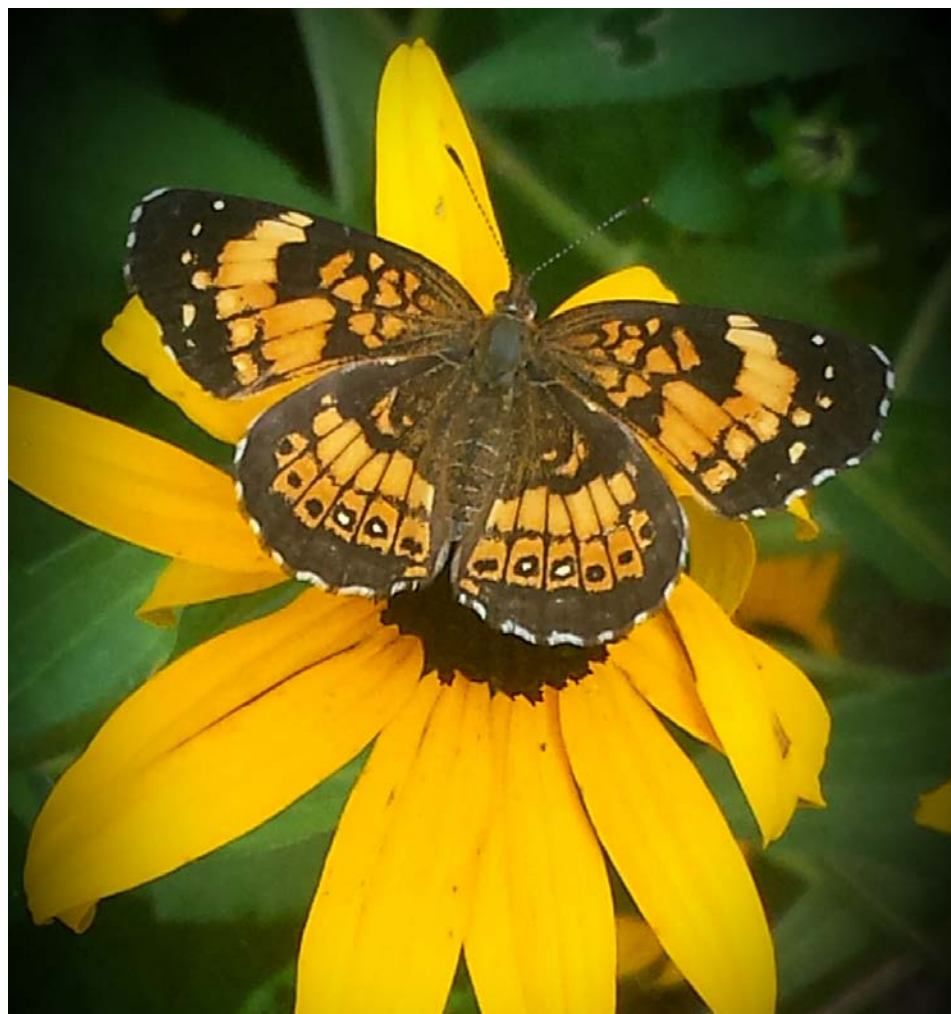

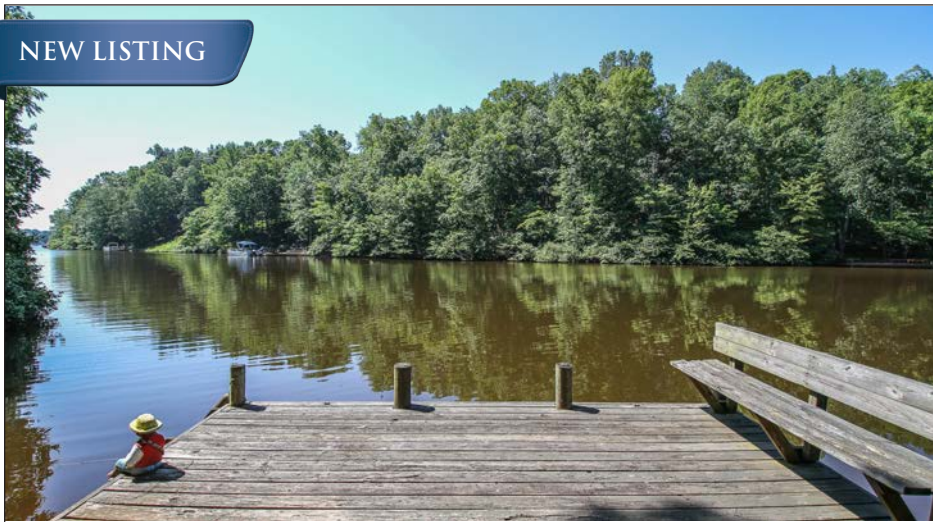

Roach found guilty in shooting spree

Residents of Hardware Hills Circle in Scottsville were so accustomed to Joe Roach's noisy rages that when he began blowing up during the late afternoon of April 29, 2017, neighbors barely reacted.

"Don't pay any attention to it," Michael Townsend recalled telling his grandson when the boy told him that Roach was "acting up" again.

How that day switched from the status quo to a near-fatal shooting spree ending in a seven-hour standoff with law enforcement was the subject of a day-long bench trial in Fluvanna Circuit Court on Friday (July 27).

Townsend, who had lived next door to Roach for about 20 years and was a frequent target of his ire, testified that the incident began as he was standing in front of his house talking with Kimberly Clements.

Clements had just walked from her home across the street with her 6-year-old son, Caleb, to ask Townsend to keep an eye on Roach, whose ongoing yelling was making her increasingly nervous.

"All of a sudden," Townsend said, "Joe started shooting at us."

Townsend said that Clements took cover behind a car in the Townsend carport as Roach continued to fire with a hunting rifle from his side porch just a few yards away, yelling "I'm going to kill you, white boy!"

Realizing her older son was left alone, Clements asked Townsend to help her get home. Using their bodies as shields for Caleb, they made their way across the street while Roach continued to scream obscenities at them.

As she entered her home, Clements testified that she heard a loud bang, as if a shot had hit the house or fence. She and her sons hid in a bathroom for a

time before finally making their way to her car and driving away.

Townsend returned to his house as the gunfire continued.

His wife, Judy Townsend, testified that she was standing inside the house when a bullet penetrated the wall and flew above her head. The shot blew the antlers off a trophy deer mounted on the living room wall.

Michael Townsend went to his gun safe and retrieved a shotgun. Standing on his deck, he fired two shots in the air,

yelling, "Joe, you'd better stop!"

Asked by Roach's attorney, James Reid, why he would expose himself to return fire, Townsend said, "If I didn't stay there and let him continue until the law got there," nothing would change. Roach had fired his gun before, police had come before, and nothing had been done, he said. "I stood my ground."

Judy Townsend, unable to reach 911 in her panic, instinctively called her daughter, Sarah Williams. Williams called the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office and headed to the family home.

Williams recounted shuttling between her father, still standing on the deck, and her terrified mother inside the house while Roach continued to shoot. She was standing at the door to the deck when she heard another shot and suddenly felt a burning sensation on her face near her eye. Blood began to run down her cheek.

"Dad, he hit me!" she recalled crying out.

Later evacuated by law enforcement, Williams refused to go to the hospital. "I've always been the caretaker for my mom and dad," she said, crying softly. "And I wasn't going to leave until I knew they were okay."

Asked to guess how many shots Roach fired, each witness estimated between 10 to 15 shots. Capt. David Wells later testified he recovered eight spent shell casings and one live round on Roach's side porch and one spent casing on the front porch, and noted other casings may have gone undiscovered in the yard.

Wells also recovered two hunting rifles from the Roach home: one in a case in the attic, another downstairs.

Sgt. Aaron Hurd noted bullet holes and perforations from bullet fragments in the Townsend home, carport roof, car and fishing boat.

No bullet holes were found in the Clements home.

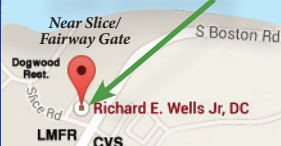

10-year-old driver crashes on interstate

A frightening scene played out Tuesday morning (July 24) when a 10-year-old Fluvanna boy and his 7-year-old brother were discovered driving down I-64 in Goochland County.

According to Capt. David Wells of the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office, the children's custodians called 911 to report the boys and the family's black Lexus missing at around 8:15 a.m.

"The caller stated that she thought the boys may have taken their car to drive to the Shenandoah Valley to see their dog," Wells said in a press release.

As Fluvanna deputies were heading to the family's home, Virginia State Police received a report at around 8:35 a.m. of a black Lexus driving erratically along I-64 eastbound near mile marker 148 (Shannon Hill).

The caller, driving a Nissan Rogue, followed the Lexus for approximately 10 miles to Gum Springs. Around Exit 159 (Gum Springs) the Lexus stuck the Nissan and then continued down the road for a short distance before crashing in the median near mile marker 160, according

to state police.

Neither the boys nor the driver of the Nissan were injured in the incident.

As state police began their investigation of the crash scene, a Fluvanna County Sergeant Curtis Brandon arrived to take custody of the children.

Wells said the boys told investigators they were going to Virginia Beach. He added in an email that it's not clear what route they took to the highway or how they got there so quickly. They have lived in Fluvanna County less than a month.

The boys have been returned to their custodians. "The matter will be referred to the Juvenile Court Services Unit and the Department of Social Services," said Wells. "It is undetermined at this time if any petitions will be sought in this matter."

Lake police are unsung heroes

Our friend Mary Boyd described calling 911 last winter when her husband Bill had a heart attack in the middle of the night. Within minutes a Lake Monticello policeman was there to administer CPR to Bill before the EMS people arrived. Mary took comfort from his support when she felt all by herself.

Mary's story echoes one we've witnessed or heard of often at the Lake.

Our community police under Chief Tom Boisvert work 24/7 to provide the kind of modern preventive and flexible policing that provides maximum security in today's complex culture. We see them fixing gates and driving in late hours or attending meetings. Yes, they stop us for speeding and we beef when that happens. But they save us from thoughtless behavior. Would we want to hit a mother with children or a deer jumping across our narrow winding roads?

Burglaries and vandalism are down since we moved here in 2006. In my book we've never lived in a better community nor felt more confidence in local policing than at the Lake with "our seven guys."

Roach was also charged with assault and battery on law enforcement for drawing his weapon on Lt. Sean Peterson and Sgt. Stephen Proffitt.

Proffitt testified that as armed Fluvanna deputies approached the Roach home, Roach said, "I'll kill you, you come any closer!"

The officer's bodycam video was played for the judge. While not visible to the courtroom audience, audio captured the moment Proffitt saw Roach's weapon. "He's got a long rifle! Take cover!"

He testified that the video showed Roach briefly raise his rifle and look through the scope before lowering it and going inside the house, where he would remain for the next several hours before negotiators convinced him to surrender.

From his vantage point a few feet away, Peterson said he had also seen Roach point his rifle in his direction.

Both officers testified they had been in fear for their lives. A .243 round "would have went through my vest, through me, and through my vest again," said Proffitt.

Issues of malice

The defense called no witnesses and did not dispute most of the facts entered by the Commonwealth. Instead, Reid argued multiple motions to strike most of the charges against Roach on technical grounds.

Specifically, he argued the evidence did not prove "malice." Roach was shooting in the direction of the Townsend home, but even when Michael Townsend was in full view, Roach didn't fire directly at him. Sarah Williams was hit by fragments of a random shot, not deliberately targeted, and there was no clear evidence he had shot at Kimberly Clements or her home at all.

"He's either the worst shot in the world, or he wasn't trying to shoot at the Townsends," Reid said.

Commonwealth's Attorney Jeff Haislip countered, "There's a ton of evidence that he was trying to hurt these people, [but] he was thwarted by metal and steel and wood, and probably some bad aim along the way."

Immediately following closing arguments, Judge Richard E. Moore found Roach guilty on all charges against the Townsends and Sarah Williams, including attempted malicious wounding, aggravated malicious wounding, and maliciously shooting at an occupied building.

He was also convicted in the assault and battery of both Proffitt and Peterson and multiple charges resulting from the use of a firearm in a felony.

However, Moore found Roach not guilty of shooting at the Clements home and an associated firearms charge, and found him guilty of a lesser charge of assault on Kimberly Clements.

Roach was ordered to return to court for sentencing Nov. 1.

As Winkler said, it's not just teachers preparing for the first day of school.

Mechanics have been readying buses. In all, 65 bus drivers are learning their routes. Support staff have buffed, polished, painted and scrubbed so the buildings are gleaming. New carpet was installed in the kindergarten wing of West Central Primary. Carysbrook's roof has been repaired and lighting upgrades installed in all buildings.

Students are identified and placed in special education programs in accordance with the Virginia Board of Education's Regulations Governing Special Education Programs for Children with Disabilities in Virginia. These guidelines, as well as the comprehensive Standards of Quality and the Objectives for Public Schools in Virginia, provide the organizational framework for all education programs and re-lated services.

Each student, ages 2 through 21 inclusive, receiving special education services has a program designed to meet his or her individual needs. These programs are discussed and planned by school personnel, parents, and the student involved. Often, instructional programming is carried out in both regular and special education classrooms. The student's progress is reviewed at least yearly and his or her need for special education services is reassessed at a minimum of every three years. Disabling conditions include the following: autism; deaf-blindness; visual impairment; developmental delay; emotional disability; hearing impairment/deaf; intellectual disability; specific learning disability; multiple disabilities; orthopedic impairment; other health impairment; speech or language impairment; and traumatic brain injury.

If you suspect that your child has a disability, please contact the principal of the school that your child attends or would attend if he/she were enrolled in public school. You may also contact the Office of Special Education at (434) 589-8208, and you will be directed to the appropriate school employee.

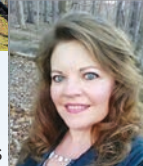

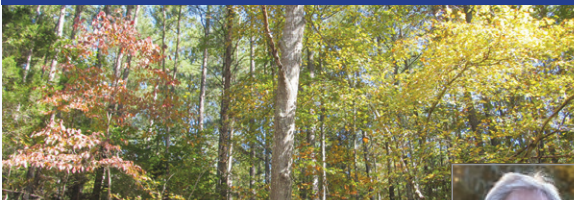

POLICY FOR PROVIDING FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS

July 1, 2018

FLUVANNA COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS today announced its policy for providing free or reduced price meals for children served under the National School Lunch, and/or School Breakfast Programs. Each school and/or central school nutrition office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

Household size and income will be used to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meal benefits. Children from households whose income is at or below the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines, shown in the chart below, may be eligible for either free or reduced price meals. Children who are members of households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly the Food Stamp Program) or who receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) may be automatically eligible for free meals. Children who are homeless, migrant, or runaway may also be automatically eligible for free meals. Foster children, who are the legal responsibility of a welfare agency or court, are eligible for free meals regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside. Children who are members of households participating in WIC may also be eligible for free or reduced-price meals based on the household's income.

Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free or reduced price meals for their children. Applications are also available at the principal's office in each school and at the central office. To apply for free or reduced price meals, households must only fill out one application per household and return it to the school division. Applications may be submitted at any time during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for determining eligibility and verification of data. Applications may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program officials. For school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price benefits, households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) only have to list their child(ren)'s name and SNAP or TANF case number and an adult household member must sign the application. Households who do not list a SNAP or TANF case number, including WIC households, must list the names of all household members, the amount and frequency of the income received by each household member, and the last four digits of the social security number of the adult household member who signs the application. If the household member does not have a social security number, the household member must indicate that a social security number is not available. The application must be signed by an adult household member in order to be approved.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal policy,

will review applications and determine eligibility. An application for free or reduced price meals cannot be approved unless it is complete. Households dissatisfied with the ruling of the eligibility determining official may wish to discuss the decision with the official on an informal basis. Households wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either verbally or in writing to:

Don Stribling, Executive Director of Human Resources, Operations and Student Services

Households may apply for free or reduced price meals at any time during the school year. If a household is not eligible now but has a change, such as a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, becomes unemployed or qualifies for SNAP or TANF, the household should contact the school for an application. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.

Households that receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly the Food Stamp Program) or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) may not have to complete an application for free or reduced price student meals. School officials will determine eligibility for free meals based on documentation, obtained directly from the Virginia Department of Social Services, that a child is a member of a household currently receiving SNAP or TANF. School officials will notify these households in writing of their eligibility. Households who are notified of their eligibility, but who do not want their children to receive free meals, must contact the school. SNAP and TANF households must complete an application if they are not notified in writing of their automatic eligibility within the first 10 days of the new school year.

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.

Persons with disabilities who require alternative means of communication for program information (e.g. Braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language, etc.), should contact the Agency (State or local) where they applied for benefits. Individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing or have speech disabilities may contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service at (800) 877-8339. Additionally, program information may be made available in languages other than English.

Fluvanna County Public Schools' Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education.

FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level. Students to whom the rights have transferred are "eligible students."

- Parents or eligible students have the right to inspect and review the student's education records maintained by the school. Schools are not required to provide copies of records unless, for reasons such as great distance, it is impossible for parents or eligible students to review the records. Schools may charge a fee for copies.
- Parents or eligible students have the right to request that a school correct records which they believe to be inaccurate or misleading. If the school decides not to amend the record, the parent or eligible student then has the right to a formal hearing. After the hearing, if the school still decides not to amend the record, the parent or eligible student has the right to place a statement with the record setting forth his or her view about the contested information.
- Generally, schools must have written permission from the parent or eligible student in order to release any information from a student's education record. However, FERPA allows schools to disclose those records, without consent, to the following parties or under the following conditions (34 CFR § 99.31):
 - School officials with legitimate educational interest;
 - Other schools to which a student is transferring;
 - Specified officials for audit or evaluation purposes;
 - Appropriate parties in connection with financial aid to a student;
 - Organizations conducting certain studies for or on behalf of the school;
 - Accrediting organizations;
 - To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena;
 - Appropriate officials in cases of health and safety emergencies; and
 - State and local authorities, within a juvenile justice system, pursuant to specific State law.

Schools may disclose, without consent, "directory" information such as a student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, honors and awards, and dates of attendance. However, schools must tell parents and eligible students about directory information and allow parents and eligible students a reasonable amount of time to request that the school not disclose directory information about them. Schools must notify parents and eligible students annually of their rights under FERPA. The actual means of notification (special letter, inclusion in a PTA bulletin, student handbook, or newspaper article) is left to the discretion of each school.

Although the term "school official" not defined in the statute or regulations, this office generally interprets the term to include parties such as: a teacher; administrator; board member; support of clerical staff; attorney; nurse and health staff; counselor; human resources staff; information systems specialist; school security personnel; and a contractor, consultant, volunteer or other party to whom the school has outsourced institutional services or functions.

A school official generally has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

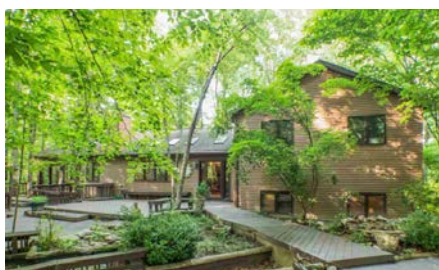
