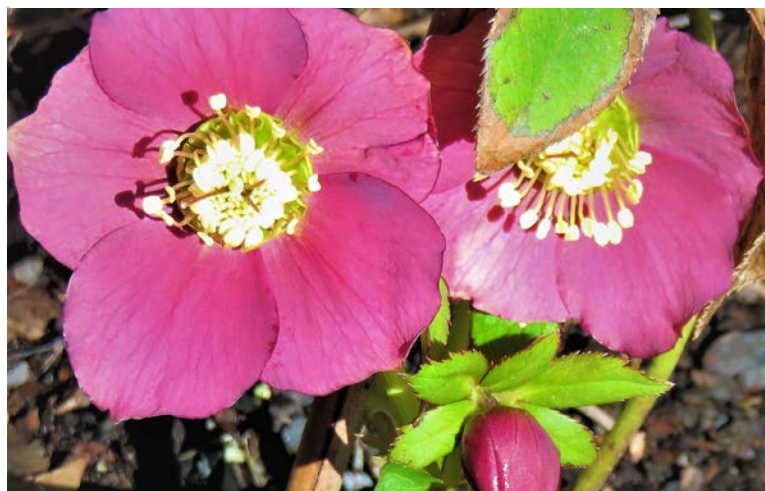

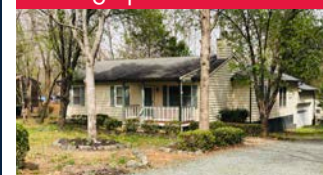

Brenda Pace announces retirement

Palmyra District School Board member Brenda Pace formally announced her retirement at the board meeting Wednesday (April 10).

"It's time to move on and address my bucket list," Pace said. "I have 26 grandchildren I'd love to spend more time with... It's bittersweet, but it's time. I want to put it out there for anyone who might want to run."

James Kelley announced April 6 he is running for the seat.

The Palmyra District elected Pace in 2011 and again in 2015.

Names

Scott Morris, high school athletic director, presented a letter of request to the board to name the high school baseball field after Steve Sheridan.

The letter began with the statement: "Steve Ellwood Sheridan is a dynamic factor in the development and progress of Fluvanna County Public Schools as a teacher, coach, administrator, athletic director, and 'keeper of the fields.' Steve Sheridan has been, and still is, a vital part

of the school system and the entire community of Fluvanna."

The board discussed the proposal and decided to vote on the matter at a later date.

Morris also presented the process of naming someone to the Athletics/Activities Wall of Fame. Nominations begin each May and induction ceremonies will be held during a fall football game.

Marcus Carter proposed naming the Central Elementary School auditorium the Paul Spraggs Sr.-Elva F. Key Auditorium after Central's first principal and a secretary who served the schools for 56 years.

Social work

Keely Baker, a Longwood University social work intern, described the role of a school social worker.

The recommended student-social worker ratio is 1:250. Fluvanna's one social worker, Susan Daly, is responsible for nearly 3,600 students.

Fluvanna school social worker roles include:

- Assisting students and families with improving student attendance;
- Filing truancy petitions on behalf of FCPS when appropriate;
- Assisting students and families with accessing local resources;
- Serving on special education teams and completing sociocultural assessments;
- Serving on the Family Assessment and Planning Team (FAPT) as case manager and representative for the schools;
- Representing FCPS on community teams such as the Crisis Intervention Team and Child Abuse Task Force;
- Delivering staff professional development;
- Coordinating the Santa Fund; and
- Providing group counseling and individual support for students.

Budget

Brenda Gilliam, executive director of curriculum and finance, reported on the state of the current budget and the 2020 budget. If the county passes the advertised tax rate of 93.5 cents and gives the

schools roughly half a million less than requested, the School Board needs to direct Superintendent Chuck Winkler on where to make cuts.

Winkler and Gilliam said their main concern was getting contracts out to teachers by May 10. The board will have a work session tentatively scheduled for April 25 at 5 p.m. to discuss what raise staff will receive.

Textbooks

During public comments, teacher and textbook committee member Kristy Muddiman spoke about the amount of time and effort the committee put into its recommendation.

"We spent more than four months vetting textbooks page by page for readability, clarity, issues of possible bias or anything anyone could find an issue with. The process was really comprehensive," Muddiman said. "I have kids in high school and they're reading books that talk about George W. Bush as president that are held together with duct tape. We need to do what's right for the students."

TAX TIPS

Tax Day is Here! OH NO! I missed the FILING DEADLINE! Now what?

Well the fact that the individual tax-filing deadline was on Monday, April 15, and you didn't file your taxes or an extension is a bit of a problem! But don't worry you can still take care of that by heading into our office and starting the filing process now!

According to the IRS you are in good company. Did you know the IRS keeps statistics on just about everything? One of the statistics they keep are the number of returns filed by Mid-May, Mid-July and Mid-November of each year. According to these table if you did in fact miss the filing deadline this year you are likely to be in good company! Last year approximately 15 Million tax returns were filed after the deadline of April 18th! So do not despair! Let us help get your late taxes filed sooner rather than later.

According to the IRA's own website (<https://www.irs.gov/newsroom/missed-the-tax-filing-deadline-irs-issues-tips-on-what-to-do>) there is no penalty for filing a late return after the tax deadline if a taxpayer is due a refund. So if you normally get a refund, (and are likely to get one for the 2018 tax year) you can mop the sweat off your brow and breathe a bit easier!

If you did not have enough withholdings or failed to make the correct amount of estimated payments and have an outstanding balance you will owe, you may have

to pay penalties and interest. Taxpayers who have not yet filed and will have owe tax should file NOW so they minimize the amount of penalties and interest!

According to the IRS's own website: "Filing soon is especially important because the late-filing penalty on unpaid taxes adds up quickly. Ordinarily, this penalty, also known as the failure-to-file penalty, is usually 5 percent for each month or part of a month that a return is late.

But if a return is filed more than 60 days after the April due date, the minimum penalty is either \$210 or 100 percent of the unpaid tax, whichever is less. This means that if the tax due is \$210 or less, the penalty is equal to the tax amount due. If the tax due is more than \$210, the penalty is at least \$210."

There is much to be said to waiting until the last minute to get things done. However, the buzzer has buzzed. The time to file is NOW. Don't wait any longer! The time for procrastination is over, call us for an appointment today!

Fluvanna Business Corner

The Water is coming, the water is coming!

For decades Fluvanna County has discussed providing public utilities for the Zion Crossroads area. Water and sewer infrastructure are essential elements needed to foster economic development. I am happy to say that water is on the way!

In March, the County issued notices to proceed to the three contractors who will be constructing our new Zion Crossroads Water and Sewer System. The initial phase of the project is scheduled for completion in October 2020.

Many companies have previously not considered Fluvanna for development because we lacked necessary public utilities. Now, however, the addition of water and sewer will make Fluvanna more attractive to prospective businesses, especially combined with our already central location, easy access to a US interstate and main highways, and our business friendly practices.

Contractors have begun mobilizing equipment and ordering material. Construction at the various sites will be visible in the next few weeks. A local Fluvanna company, AG Dillard, is installing both the water and sewer system pipelines. They plan to work from east to west, starting at Starlite Park on Route 15 and moving west toward the Fluvanna Women's Correc-

tional Center on Route 250 and south on Memory Lane.

Sargent Corporation is constructing the water booster station and wastewater pump station. The booster station will be located at the correctional center and will push the water through the nearly four miles of service area. The wastewater pump station will be at the end of the service area, by Starlite Park, and send wastewater back to the correctional center treatment plant.

Chicago Bridge and Iron (CB&I) / McDermott is constructing the water tower that will sit on the south side of Route 250 near Troy Road and across from the Crescent Inn Restaurant.

The County will hold information town hall meetings on April 23rd at Beaver Dam Baptist Church, 1794 Richmond Road, Troy, VA, and on April 25th at the Fluvanna Community Center, 5725 James Madison Highway, Fork Union. Both meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. with a brief presentation about the project and an opportunity for questions.

Get to know Debbie Smith, emergency management coordinator

When a disaster hits, emergency management coordinator Debbie Smith is two steps ahead of the game and is ready for what's coming.

The emergency management coordinator is in charge of preparing for, responding to and recovering from both natural and human-caused emergencies. To accomplish this, Smith coordinates emergency responses within the community.

Smith became emergency management coordinator 15 months ago, but started working for the county in 2016. She landed her first job with Fluvanna in the information technology department and earned her degree in IT from Piedmont Virginia Community College.

But Smith also has experience in fire and emergency medical services (EMS)

that stretches back 20 years.

"A challenging aspect of this role is community preparedness," said Smith. "We all tend to have the belief that it will not happen to us and we all tend to not get prepared before a disaster, winter storms or hurricanes we see coming."

When remnants of Hurricane Florence were predicted to trek through Fluvanna, Smith and her team held phone conferences to prepare for the impact.

"We wanted to be smart with what was projected, so county-wise, we were ready," said Smith.

While natural disasters seem more likely to happen, Smith also has to deal with human-caused emergencies. Human-caused emergencies can include material spills, fire, groundwater contamination, transportation accidents,

structure failures, explosions, and acts of terrorism. Smith wants the community to be self-sufficient for 72 hours after disaster strikes.

Smith encourages Fluvanna County residents to use Everbridge, an emergency notification system. Those who sign up receive notifications of closings and alerts within the area via voice communication or text. Community members are asked to confirm that the message was received, and if not, the system continues through the list of communication methods registered by the participant.

Smith's day-to-day responsibilities include attending meetings, working on plans, and coordinating with other departments.

"We are about to begin tabletop exercises leading toward a full-scale exercise

testing our emergency operations plan," said Smith. "We will be making changes where needed. That is a fun, exciting aspect of the job."

Smith wants to continue to improve disaster preparedness in Fluvanna through citizen involvement. Her goals include exercising and improving the emergency operations plans and providing a shelter for animals in disaster.

Smith said she is fascinated by science. She enjoys learning from past disasters, including what went wrong and what went right. She lives in Louisa County and enjoys taking care of her farm and animals. She breeds and shows miniature horses and has a couple of dogs with her at home.

Earth Day: Focus on global warming

As we approach next week's annual Earth Day celebration we might be asking, "How can I contribute to the survival of our fragile ecosystems?" Originally envisioned by Sen. Gaylord Nelson as a national teach-in on the environment in 1970, it influenced the creation of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and numerous laws that protect our planet, including the Clean Air Act and the Endangered Species Act.

Today the planet faces a new level of threat according to author David Wallace-Wells who has written *The Uninhabitable Earth: Life after Warming* as a warning of a dire future. He explains that more than half of the carbon emissions that have been produced from the burning of fossil fuels in the history of humanity have been produced in the last 30 years. His research has led him to believe that it's too late to avoid a 21st century that is completely transformed by the forces of climate change.

Many scientists are alarmed by "crazy" temperature rises in the Arctic and concerned that global warming is eroding the polar vortex, the powerful winds that once insulated the frozen north. "This is an anomaly among anomalies. It is far enough outside the historical range that it is worrying...

as we continue to poke the angry beast that is our climate," said Michael Mann, director of the Earth System Science Center at Pennsylvania State University. And if you're looking for proof, consider Longyearbyen, the world's northernmost town located 800 miles from the North Pole. For years, permafrost provided a base as hard as concrete. But now it's melting and buildings are sinking. Inger Hansen-Bauer, senior researcher at the Norwegian Meteorological Institute, says that since 1900 the annual mean temperature in Longyearbyen has risen by 3.7°C, which means it's probably warming faster than in any other town on Earth.

Perhaps the most important question on Earth Day should be: How can we elect those who will enforce our environmental policies? President Trump is clearly the biggest threat to our future on planet Earth and it's time to call for his defeat in 2020.

Master gardener discusses gardening with deer

Gardening in rural areas can be challenging. Master gardener Sue Tepper explained the pitfalls of gardening to a group at Lake Monticello on Sunday (April 7). The program was presented by the Lake Monticello Wildlife Committee regarding the difficulties and frustrations newcomers have when planting gardens that deer, rabbits, and other creatures find appetizing.

Along with Tepper was Walter Hussey, a master naturalist familiar with wildlife and their habits. Together they stated that gardening with wildlife, particularly deer, is daunting but can be mastered with planning and dedication.

Gardening in the Piedmont area has many challenges of which people need to be aware before planting anything. Knowing what type of gardener one is goes a long way in determining the type and style of a suitable garden. Having a landscaper design and plant what a homeowner had up north, or simply plants the homeowner likes, will usually result in disappointment and disaster.

Any gardener, whether planting in containers, beds, or an entire front yard, can benefit from Tepper's tips.

Though it may sound clichéd, the gardener's goal is to be in harmony with nature. Tepper described her "deer-resistant tool box," listing the tools she uses for a successful garden. She said there are five important things to remember before one plant goes in the ground: observing, planning, designing, selecting and maintaining.

"With observation, you want to identify features in your yard, such as plants that may be candy to the deer, or water features that would draw them and other animals," Tepper said. She added that at the Lake there is a higher concentration of deer, and thus more damage, in certain sections. Deer follow patterns – houses may be on their feeding path – and they teach their young the same patterns. To some this may seem hopeless but the right management practices are key. "They are creatures of habit," Tepper said.

"Also, observe the deer browsing seasons," she said. "They love newly planted young plants so note the age of the plant that was damaged." She added that they eat anything that is considered a soft mass in spring, including twigs, buds, flowers and grasses, and will eat four to 10 pounds of vegetation daily. In the fall they eat what is known as hard mass, which includes seeds and acorns.

"We have a part in what happens to our gardens," she said, adding that ornamental shrubs are a direct invitation to the deer. Planting and landscaping is a considerable financial investment as well as repellents and fencing. "Become knowledgeable and educate yourself."

Regarding designing a garden, she suggested looking for or creating a focal point, including containers, rocks and ground cover. She also suggested terracing a garden since deer do not like multiple levels. Rock gardens can also be utilized for a nice effect and a deterrent.

"Select your plants wisely. Deer will eat all plants but some are more preferable. They do not like anything that smells, is spiny or fuzzy," Tepper said. Replace any damaged plants with deer resistant plants. Ideal are boxwoods, grasses, pachysandra, lantana in containers or in the ground, daffodils, lavender in containers, mountain mint, rosemary, basil, other herbs and native plants. She recommended doing some research before rushing to the nursery.

"Regarding damage, know whether it is deer or rabbits. Deer leave ragged leaves and rabbits are a straight cut," Tepper said. As far as deterrents go, Irish Spring soap and other similar remedies are considered old wives tales passed from gardener to gardener but are not proven methods. Many deterrents need to be reapplied after it rains. Tepper recommended Bobbex.

Regarding fencing, Tepper said that double fencing could be an alternative to explore for avid gardeners but Lake Monticello has rules regarding fencing.

Fluco baseball rallies to top Powhatan 4-2

It was the kind of game that can make you a baseball fan. Tension building as the game progresses, with a sudden ending.

On Thursday (April 11) the Flying Fluco baseball team rallied with three runs in the bottom of the sixth (in a seven inning game) to take a 4-2 lead. The Powhatan Indians then loaded the bases in the top of the seventh with only one out. A sharply hit ground ball to third baseman Ryan Groome was just what the doctor ordered. Groome fielded the ball cleanly, stepped on third base for the force out and fired the ball across the field. First baseman Kevin Ward made a nice scoop on the throw for the out at first and, in a flash, the game was over.

This game started well for the Flucos. Andrew Ward took the mound and struck out the Indians' first three batters. In the bottom of the first, Jacob Critzer, the Flucos' outstanding catcher, batting in the third slot, launched a long drive over the left field fence. This home run was the only score in the first three innings. Ward gave up only a walk and a single in the first three and struck out five.

However, Powhatan got its offense going in the fourth. A walk, a long double and two singles brought home two runs and gave the Indians the lead. In the bottom of the fourth Andrew Ward led off for the Flucos with a double, after an out, Kevin Ward singled to left, but because the left fielder looked like he might make the catch until the last second, the Flucos' pinch runner for Ward was frozen and the Flucos were left with runners at first and second. A strike out and a ground out followed and the Flucos remained down 1-2.

In the top of the fifth the Indians' lead-off batter got on base on a hit batter. He tried to steal and Critzer fired a strike to

second to cut him down. In the top of the sixth, Critzer threw out an Indian trying to steal third. Critzer was three for three in throwing out Powhatan baserunners trying to steal. The Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office may want to recruit him.

The bottom of the sixth was the crucial inning. Groome, the Flucos' lead-off batter, drew a walk. After a fly out Critzer singled sharply. Kevin Ward then drilled a double down the right field line to score one run and tie the score. The Indians pulled their infield in for a possible play at the plate, but did not walk the next batter to set up a force at home. Fluco shortstop Cameron Shields showed that strategy to be mistaken. Shields stroked a line drive up the middle for a single that scored two and gave the Flucos the lead they needed.

The Flucos are now 7-2 and Coach Joel Gray said that the two losses were both by only one run. This was an important win for the Flucos over a solid Powhatan team that came in with a winning record. The Flucos have a deep and veteran team this year, with solid defense, good hitting and strong pitching.

In this game, the Flucos used Andrew Ward as their starter, with Toby Sherman and Kyle Algieri in relief. In seven innings, the Fluco pitchers struck out 11 and walked four. They allowed only six singles and one double.

The baseball team was at Albemarle High April 16 and will host Western Albemarle April 18. On April 23 and April 25, they will play at Louisa County High and Monticello High. They return home April 30 to host Orange County. The final two home games on the regular schedule are May 9 against Albemarle and May 16 against Louisa.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REENACT CHAPTER 15, ARTICLE 2, SECTION 15-2-3 OF THE FLUVANNA COUNTY CODE REGARDING EXEMPTIONS FROM LICENSE FEES FOR CERTAIN VEHICLES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FLUVANNA COUNTY that Chapter 15, Article 2, Section 15-2-3 of the County Code be, and it is hereby, **AMENDED** as follows:

Sec. 15-2-3. Amount of fee; when fee due and payable; collection; exemptions. (Effective January 1, 2019)

The license fee on every motorcycle shall be eighteen dollars (\$18) per year, on every trailer and semi-trailer shall be eighteen dollars (\$18) and on every other type of motor vehicle shall be thirty-three dollars (\$33) per year, payable to the treasurer of this county. Such license fee shall be due and payable on June 5 in each year. If any license fee owed pursuant to this article is not paid on or before its due date, then the treasurer may add the cost of any fee incurred by the county pursuant to section 46.2-752(J) of the Virginia Code to the license fee due and owing to the county. The treasurer shall, after the due date of any license fee required by this section, collect such license fee in accordance with the provisions of section 58.1-3919 of the Virginia Code and any other applicable law. Additionally, the treasurer shall have the authority to take action as authorized by section 46.2-752(J) of the Virginia Code. The foregoing notwithstanding, the license fee provided for by this Chapter shall not be assessed on vehicles owned by active members of volunteer rescue squads and active members of volunteer fire companies located in the county (at one vehicle per such member); and for the following who served at least ten (10) years in the county: former members of volunteer rescue squads and former members of volunteer fire companies located in the county (at one vehicle per such former member). *In addition to the foregoing, effective January 1, 2020, the license fee provided for this this Chapter shall not be assessed on vehicles owned by volunteer reserve deputies of the Sheriff (at one vehicle per such member) during the continuation of their volunteer service.*

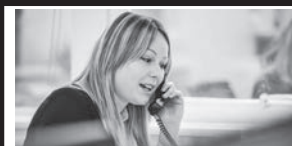

Speech

Ending another highly successful season, the FCHS speech team won its third state championship March 30. Of the 17 Flucos that attended, 14 made it into the finals (second and third place) and nine of the finalists won state champion titles.

State champions included junior Alex Pellicane (extemporaneous), sophomore Ally Hansen (dramatic interpretation), sophomore Maddie Scopelliti (poetry), freshman Evie Benson (prose), seniors Jakob Shiflett and Justin Hamill (humorous duo), senior Lily Dobrin and sophomore Hollyn Grace (serious duo) and sophomore Simon Skinner (story-telling).

"In the beginning, it was hard to get a grasp on everything, but by the end, it was amazing to see more than half the team make to States and win," said Scopelliti. This is the team's third state win in the last four years under the oversight of Coach Craig Edgerton.

Boys' soccer

The varsity team was scheduled to play a home game against Charlottesville April 8, but the game was cancelled due to thunderstorms. On April 11 they played a home game against Powhatan. In anticipation of that game, goalie Ryan Holeman said, "I haven't won against Powhatan. I have a feeling this year is the year we take them. I believe we will be able to go to States." Despite his hopes and a strong effort by their team, the Flucos ultimately lost the game by a score of 2-3.

Meanwhile, the JV team was also scheduled to play April 8 against Charlottesville, but that game was also cancelled due to thunderstorms. Like their varsity brothers, they took on Powhatan at home April 11. Sophomore Daniel Bustillo was positive in his assessment of their chances before the game. "I feel pretty confident in my team for tonight. It's definitely going to be a really tough, physical game," he said. After a fairly even match, the Flucos lost by a score of 0-1.

Both teams looked forward to matches against Albemarle and Western the week of April 15.

Girls' soccer

Varsity played an away game at Charlottesville April 8, which they lost 0-3. Three days later they traveled to Powhatan, where they tied the Indians with a score of 1-1. "We're trying out a new formation and switching around some positions, so I'm excited to see how that turns out," said sophomore Allie Hanson.

JV lost its game against Charlottesville by a score of 0-3. Hoping for a better outcome in the game against Powhatan, the team was disappointed by a loss of 0-1. "There's definitely been a lot of progress, especially with all of our younger players, and of course there's still more progress to be made, but we're just going to take it one step at a time. After all, we are one of the youngest teams in the league," said freshman Riley Yowell.

Like the boys, both varsity and JV girls have games against Albemarle and Western the week of April 15.

Boys' lacrosse

In what has been a challenging season thus far, varsity hosted a home game against Monticello April 9. The score was 3-20, with Fluvanna ending on the bottom. "We held together pretty well in the first quarter against a good team, only being down 3-5. However, we came out of spring break rusty, unconditioned, and short in numbers. Then they started to run up the score," said sophomore Sam Singer.

Meanwhile, the JV team also took on Monticello April 9, but lost 2-8. Still, team members tried to focus on the positive. "The team never gave up. We just need some time to work on some defensive structure in practice," said sophomore Ryan Elliott.

Both teams anticipated games against Charlottesville the week of April 15.

Girls' lacrosse

Taking on Monticello April 9, the girls' varsity team lost by a score of 7-21. The next day, they redoubled their efforts in an away game at Patrick Henry, but came away with a loss of 3-20. Sophomore Rebecca Taylor, who plays attack, was positive despite the results.

"I [feel] we're already improving this semester. We've played really tough teams," she said.

The JV girls' team also had a challenging game against Monticello that ended in a 3-11 loss. "The team really tried their hardest. We might be struggling, but we can work harder to get the next time," said freshman Taylor Parker.

Tennis

The Lady Flucos tennis team had a successful match against Charlottesville April 9. They left with an overall victory of 6-3, including singles wins by senior Adora Gamage, junior Sarah White, freshman Anja Bajs and senior Lydiah Napier. Doubles match winners included the teams of Gamage and White, and Napier and Saige Patchett.

Gamage said she felt that the match was in their hands from start to finish. "We started out pretty strong and kept the same momentum throughout the match," she said. White agreed. "We had plenty of control, and we stayed up by a lot." The girls feel that they are in a good spot as a team at this point in the season. "I think we're doing really good as a team so far. We support each other. But there is always room for improvement," said Gamage.

In their April 11 game against Powhatan, the team was missing starters number five and six, as well as their seventh seed. As a result, Taylor Watson and Catherine Napier subbed in for match play.

Napier and Watson easily won their singles matches 10-2 and 10-6. Freshman and third seed Anja Bajs came from 1-6 to win the next nine games, taking the match 10-6. Meanwhile in doubles, the team of Gamage and Bajs won 8-2, while the sister team of Lydiah and Catherine Napier won their match 8-5. Overall, the team's record for the season is 5-1.

The boys' team lost its April 11 game against Powhatan, in part because they were missing key players, forcing them to forfeit at least one of their matches.

Baseball and softball

The varsity baseball team traveled to Myrtle Beach, S.C., during spring break to compete against teams from as far away as Kentucky and Tennessee. Jacob Critzer hit four home runs, including two in a single game. Overall, the team ended the tournament with a record of 4-1.

"Overall, we were in control of the game. We did all the little things right. We could've stuck together as a team better, but we got the wins," said junior Toby Sherman.

Varsity also played against Powhatan at home April 10, winning its game 6-3 and securing a season record of 6-3 as of that date. "The [Powhatan] game was tough. Powhatan is just a good team themselves overall. But in the sixth inning we did six runs, which gave us the victory," said Sherman.

The girls' softball game was canceled the week of April 8 due to inclement weather.

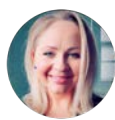
