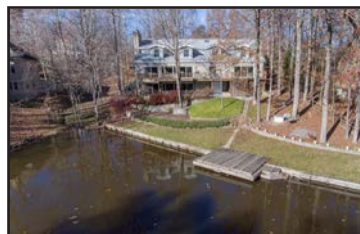

Electric cooperative training center opens

The sun shone brightly. The sky was blue. A soft breeze wafted through the air.

It was a hearty Fluvanna welcome to the new electric cooperative training center on Salem Church Road.

About 120 dignitaries, locals and members of the Virginia Maryland Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives (VMDAEC) gathered Wednesday (May 22) to cut the ribbon on the \$1.5 million building.

VMDAEC is made up of 15 member cooperatives in the three states, said CEO Richard G. Johnstone, Jr.

The association has been training power line workers on the nine-acre parcel across from Central Virginia Electric Cooperative's home office since 2013.

While VMDAEC had the outdoor equipment needed, administration and indoor training went on in a triple-wide modular structure until they erected the 9,600 square foot building they gathered to dedicate.

Johnstone said it was built in "the cooperative way."

CVEC sold the nine-acre parcel to the association at a "very reasonable price." It partnered with Southside Electric Cooperative to supply components of a substation for trainees. With the contributions of the rest of the

co-ops, the project was paid for exclusively by the members and came in on time and under budget, Johnstone said.

CVEC's President and CEO Gary Wood said the center will be important to Fluvanna's economy.

"A thousand or more people will be training here and staying four to five days," Wood said.

"This is [also] an important investment in our line workers. We call on them to work within arm's reach of a dangerous amount of electricity. Then when a thunderstorm comes we count on them to put on their capes and come save us," Wood said.

Fluvanna County Administrator Steve Nichols spoke to the crowd and joked about the weather.

"Welcome. You know this is our normal weather. This is what it's like here every day," he said, warning they may have to go somewhere else to train in adverse weather conditions.

Nichols touted Fluvanna's central location and accessibility as assets to the center.

Johnstone said that was exactly why VMDAEC decided to stay in Fluvanna.

"We decided to build our permanent center here because this location is excellent," Johnstone said. "It's very close to the geographic center of our three-state territory and easily accessible from I-64 and Route 15. So it just made sense to stay with what has worked for us in the past."

Fluvanna Chamber of Commerce Board President Rudy Garcia welcomed VMDAEC's commitment to the county.

"This is an example of what happens when people work together and cooperate toward a common goal," Garcia said.

Training is ongoing for power line workers and the amount of training events increased 75 percent since 2016, Johnstone said.

"The job of a line worker is changing almost daily, thanks to new technologies and innovative equipment," he said. "The need for a comprehensive training center like ours is more important than ever, and we look forward to working with those who will keep the lights on for the next generation."

And it won't be just line workers who'll be coming to the center.

Over its lifetime, the Fluvanna center will train thousands of cooperative employees and directors, Johnstone said. "We'll be providing training to engineers, accountants, customer service representatives, and the elected directors who serve on the boards of our member cooperatives. We'll also offer training to employees from Virginia municipal electric systems, and we intend to work with community colleges as well."

Paul W. Bragg Scholarship recipients announced

Fluvanna County High School is pleased to announce recipients of the Paul W. Bragg Scholarship. Established by Bragg's will, and managed by the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation, the scholarship is meant "to provide undergraduate college assistance based on both need and merit" to FCHS graduates.

Bragg was a life-long resident of Fluvanna County. He was born in Fluvanna in 1916 and lived his entire life in the family home on Middle Ford Road, where he died at age 87 on Oct. 9, 2003. He was a hard-working farmer, and he saved and invested wisely during his long life. He bequeathed the bulk of his considerable estate to the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation and directed the foundation to establish a scholarship fund to benefit young people graduating from FCHS.

The foundation and the Paul W. Bragg Scholarship Fund Advisory Committee are dedicated to carrying out Bragg's wishes in perpetuity. The foundation manages the Bragg Scholarship Fund as part of its permanent endowment and each year notifies the committee as to how much income is available to provide for scholarships in that year. The committee then selects recipients from among that year's applicants.

Since the first scholarship was first awarded in 2006, there have been 185 recipients and over \$1 million in awards. This year \$122,000 in new scholarship money was available to members of the Class of 2019. One \$40,000 scholarship payable over four years, four \$10,000 scholarships, six \$5,000 scholarships, five \$2,000 scholar-

ships, and two \$1,000 scholarships were announced at the awards night held May 21.

I applaud LMOA for outsourcing the management and maintenance of our new swimming pool. I read that this will result in an annual savings of \$15,000. It's a great idea to let a professional company take over. So why not do the same with our maintenance department?

Today very few companies or organizations employ a full-time maintenance staff. This work is contracted out. Equipment, trucks, labor, supplies, payroll and all the expense is transferred to an outside source. An immediate savings would be realized and in most cases the current staff would continue on as associates to the contractor.

Everyone seems to enjoy reading *Lake Views*. I have been told by LMOA that it

can be viewed online. The questions here are: what is the cost to produce, how much is spent to mail to every home, and does the advertising make it profitable or at the very least offset the expense? A savings may be realized here.

I read another article stating that in order to improve customer service barcodes would now be issued at the marina on weekends. Why not service barcodes at this location every day. I recall that this is where we originally obtained barcodes before we created a position to specifically take on this task. Consolidate and save.

I know that Lake residents have many helpful ideas on how to reducing spending while keeping our community, along with its amenities, in pristine condition. LMOA would like to hear from you. Continuing to increase fees, dues and special assessments cannot be the only solution.

We vote in June. A yes vote will result in business as usual. A no vote will result in change.

Lake residents can't afford higher dues

In response to the story "Lakers question proposed dues increase" that ran in the May 23 edition: In my years living at the Lake, dues have increased constantly. I live at the Lake for affordable home prices and location. But as dues and water prices continue to rise, I see many homeowners leaving, as evidenced by recent open house events on past Sundays where 20 to 30 houses participate.

As your paper is distributed to the entire Fluvanna community, I want to ensure the story is correct as it seemed one-sided. First of all, the current dues rate of \$861 is not 100 percent correct. This may be for an undeveloped lot, but not a developed lot. A developed lot is almost \$1,100 per year. There was just an increase last year and now they are asking for another. I read comments on the Facebook page for residents and see people who just moved into the area who are in disbelief.

Not all amenities are part of the Lake dues. Homeowners do not have free access to the pool or golf course; this is an extra cost. The pool is crowded and because they do not make money, they

rent out to the swim team so it is unavailable when people could use it. To punish residents because the restaurants are not making money is shameful. If they change the prices, maybe more people would go. I don't believe we need fine dining. If money is not being made, close it. Don't punish people, which is what the increase in dues ends up doing.

Some people are retired, some people are on a fixed income, some people just can't afford any more money in their budget for anything else for a variety of reasons and asking for more money because the HOA cannot properly manage the money is extremely unfair. This is poor mismanagement, project planning and communication.

Cross country bicyclists on their way

Transcontinental cyclists are arriving at Palmyra United Methodist Church (PUMC) in groups ranging from seven down to those who travel solo. They have taken time off in their busy lives to ride over 4,000 miles. The majority of them ride from Yorktown, Va., to Astoria, Ore. – or vice versa.

Later in the year we see them taking a southern route, where they end up in San Francisco, Calif. If they are in the annual race, they may bike over 200 miles a day and can finish the route in less than three weeks, but most folks take their time and enjoy the scenery and history of our wonderful country,

finishing it in around three months.

PUMC's involvement started four years ago on a stormy night when we sighted two young men standing in front of our little church on the hill in Palmyra. Their bicycles were loaded with bags, tents, food, clothing and more. All they wanted was permission to pitch their tent for the night. The answer was, "No way! You are coming to my house for the night. This storm is going to be so bad you won't want to sleep in a tent."

A few days later two women showed up and shared with us a map of this transcontinental trail and pointed out the town of Palmyra. There was a statement saying there was lodging available here! We all know there are no public accommodations in this little town.

That was the beginning. After a very short discussion, our church decided that we needed to make this one of our missions. The map now contains two phone numbers and names so they can call ahead to let us know they are coming. Members of the church and our Pastor George Gorman greet them

with a spirit of friendship and hospitality. They are either cold, hot or wet (depending on the weather that day), tired and always hungry.

The bikes are pushed into our Fellowship Hall for safekeeping. Inside they find an array of drinks like Gatorade, sodas, water and snacks of all kinds. Some staples are available like peanut butter, jelly, eggs, bread, canned vegetables and even chicken from EW Thomas grocery store. Toward the end of their trip they can often be low on money and are so appreciative of a free meal. We try to accommodate different diets and have fed many types, including gluten free, vegetarian, vegan and paleo. These cyclists need up to 4,000 calories a day or even up to 6,000 calories, if they are in the race.

When they don't want to stop or there is no place to buy a meal, many of them turn to their packs full of protein bars.

In 2016 the Transcontinental Cyclist Association celebrated 40 years. PUMC housed 93 cyclists that year! The average is 60 to 75 riders a year.

The youngest cyclist was seven years old. He and his mom, dad and two older siblings were living their dream of the American vacation.

In comparison, the oldest was a 78-year-old man who takes each of his grandchildren with him cross country when they reach age 14 and he feels are mature enough to handle the trip. What a memory to have for the rest of their lives.

The stories just keep piling up as we meet people from not only from the USA, but Germany, France, Switzerland, Belgium, Sweden, Norway, England, Holland, Italy, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Korea, China, Brazil, Argentina and more. Some have had phones that translated different languages. Once a deaf father-son duo smiled at me as I tried to use my American Sign Language. Paper and pen won out over that battle.

Who are these people? Each person has his or her own reason for taking this trek: newlyweds for their honeymoon, newly divorced, newly retired, some working out their depression, some trying to get healthy, or others simply accomplishing an item off their bucket list.

As 2019 warms up, some cyclists have

braved the weather to get an early start. We are looking forward to meeting more of these courageous people and hearing their travel stories. Our fourth cyclist this year, who is from Holland, told us he started his trip – around the world – in February 2018 and plans on arriving home within a week. “I won’t know what to do when I sleep in the same bed every night,” he told us.

One favor we ask of this community: When you see cyclists on a loaded bicycle, probably with a tall flag pole on

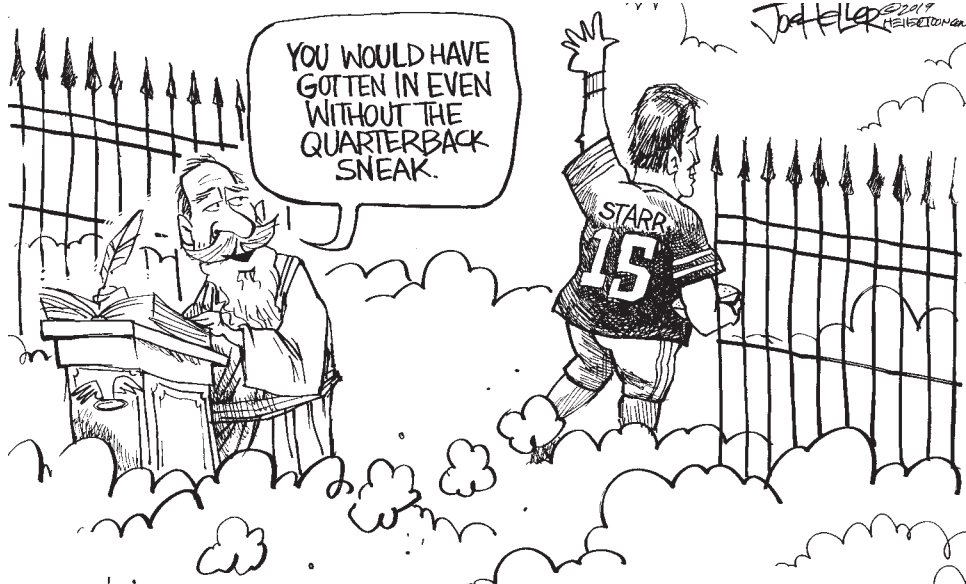

Every out a strike-out in no hitter

Fluco junior pitcher Andrew Ward turned in an astonishing performance Thursday (May 23) when the first-seeded Flucos hosted the eighth-seeded Blazers of Spotswood High in the quarterfinals of the Region 3C play-offs.

Andrew Ward faced 22 batters in a seven inning game. He walked a batter in the second inning and struck out every other batter.

"In 25 years of coaching I've never seen this happen before," said Fluco head Coach Joel Gray after the game.

Andrew Ward said he threw mostly fast balls and sliders, with an occasional change-up. He threw 65 strikes and only 20 balls. Less than three balls out of the strike zone

per inning is amazing control. Ward's speed and location were obviously completely overpowering. The Blazers were not a hopeless team; Grey said that they finished the regular season with a .500 record.

On offense, the Flucos scored nine runs with only eight hits. The Blazer pitchers were a little bit wild as they walked three and hit four batters. The Flucos scored the only run they needed in the first inning. Batting second, Andrew Ward helped his cause by singling. His twin brother, Kevin Ward, doubled to score the first run of the game.

In the second inning, the Flucos upped the score to 4-0. Senior third baseman Kyle Algieri led off and was hit by a pitch. Sophomore left fielder Mason Gross hit a ground ball

but reached on a Blazer error. Junior center fielder A.J. Brown laid down a sacrifice bunt to move the runners to second and third. Senior third baseman Ryan Groome followed with a two run single. Andrew Ward walked and Groome moved to third on a fly-out by senior catcher Jacob Critzer. Groome then scored the Flucos' fourth run on a wild pitch. The Flucos scored three runs on one hit in the inning.

In the third inning, the Flucos continued to build their lead. Junior shortstop Cameron Shields walked. Algieri walked and Gross and Brown each singled to score a run. After three innings, the score was 6-0 and the Flucos looked pretty safe, as Andrew Ward had struck out the side three times in a row. The Flucos failed to score in the fourth. In the fifth, the Flucos scored two runs, as the Blazer pitchers hit three batters and Andrew

Ward had a two run single. A double by Shields in the sixth led to the final Fluco run.

The Flucos scored in five of the six innings they batted, while Andrew Ward was striking out everyone he faced.

On offense for the Flucos, Andrew Ward was the only batter with two hits. Shields, Algieri and Gross were on base all four at bats, on an assortment of walks, hit by pitch and fielder's choices. Shields and Gross each had one hit.

The Flucos' win advanced them to the semifinals of the Region 3C play-off. They hosted number four seed Broadway High on Tuesday (May 28), which moved into the semifinals with a 16-13 win over the five seed Western Albemarle.
