

Lengthy sentence imposed in "tragic" arson, attempted murder

Carter, almost 28, will spend next 28 years in prison

Just two days short of the first anniversary of the night Cole Carter set a Palmyra home on fire with a family asleep inside, Judge Richard E. Moore sentenced him to serve the better part of the next 30 years

The sentencing came at the end of an emotional four-hour hearing in Fluvanna County Circuit Court on Friday (May 31).

Carter pleaded guilty to multiple charges of arson, attempted murder, and violations of a protective order at his arraignment in late January.

He admitted to setting fire to the home of William Lowry on Miles Jackson Road in Palmyra at around 3:45 a.m. on June 3, 2018, aware that the Lowrys were asleep

The arson capped a two-month period in which Carter was cited for repeatedly violating a protective order taken out by

his former fiancée, Jessica Lowry, who lived with her parents and brother at that address. She was not home at the time. The family awakened in time to escape the fire unharmed, but their home and belongings were destroyed by the blaze.

Carter was arrested later that morning as he tried to flee the area.

At Friday's sentencing hearing, Becky Lowry, Jessica Lowry's mother, testified to the impact the fire had on her and her

"It affects my whole life," she said.

Not only did she lose her home and all her possessions, but she also has to contend with psychological effects. Now, "if I hear any noise, I'm extremely anxious," she said. The smell of smoke and the sound of emergency vehicles can trigger severe anxiety attacks.

Her husband, William Lowry, said the

fire devastated the family emotionally: "When you lose everything you got, that you worked so hard for, it's hard. Everybody's different now."

For the defense, a half-dozen family members and friends testified to how out-of-character the crime was for Carter, whom all described as a big-hearted, hard-working, law-abiding young man.

His mother, Sandra Carter, told the judge that her son spiraled into depression following the breakup with Jessica Lowry. He began abusing Adderall, a powerful amphetamine often used for the treatment of attention deficit disor-

By May 2018, he was suffering from long periods of sleeplessness, anxiety, agitation, tremors and hallucinations. Late that month, Carter's grandmother unexpectedly fell ill and died, further exacer-

Gregory said she had witnessed the frightening decline in the weeks leading up to June 3. By the final days, he was losing his train of thought in the middle of sentences and couldn't finish even simple tasks. "One second he would be trying to pick himself up, and the next second he felt there was no way forward," she said.

He said that Carter clearly had emotional issues, but "in our society, whether you control your emotions, you have to control vour actions."

Before imposing the sentence, Moore allowed Carter to speak

"I want to take this opportunity to deeply apologize to the Lowry family," Carter said, holding back tears. "I thank God nobody got hurt."

He also apologized to the people of Fluvanna, the Commonwealth, and the investigators. "I can't fully explain my action," he said. "I'm so ashamed at myself and embarrassed." He added that rebuilding himself as a man was his primary focus

Moore said the guidelines in the case were too low for the gravity of the crime, and there had been a good chance a jury would have imposed a life sentence.

For the arson, he sentenced Carter to life, but suspended all but five years. On the three counts of attempted murder, the sentence was 10 years per count with 10 years to run concurrently, for an active sentence of 20 years. On five counts of violating protective orders and one count of using a false ID during arrest, he received a total of 72 months with 29 months suspended, or about four years.

Carter's legs seemed to buckle at the final total and deputies helped lower him into his chair. Crying, his sister, Danielle Robinson, asked the judge if she could make a statement, but he did not allow it.

Carter will also be required to make restitution of \$132,036.01. Once out of prison, he will face five years of supervised probation and will have to maintain good behavior for the remainder of his life.

5 Summer Tax Savings Opportunities

Ah, summer. The weather is warm, kids are out of school, and it's time to think about tax saving opportunities! Here are five ways you can enjoy your normal summertime activities and save on taxes:

1. Rent out your property tax-free. If you have a cabin, condo, or similar property, consider renting it out for two weeks. The rental income you receive on property rented for less than 15 days per year is not considered taxable income. In addition. you can still deduct your mortgage interest expense and property taxes in full as itemized deductions!. Track the rental days closely - going over 14 days means all rent is taxable and rental income rules apply.

2. Take a tax credit for summer childcare. For many working parents, the summer comes with the added challenge of finding care for their children. Thankfully, the Child and Dependent Care Credit can cover 20-35 percent of qualified childcare expenses for your children under the age of 13. Eligible types of care include day care, nanny fees and day camps (overnight camps and summer school do not qualify).

prietor and your child is under age 18, you can pay them to work without withholding or paying Social Security

3. Have a garage sale. In general, the money you make from a yard or garage sale is tax-free because you sell your goods for less than you originally paid for them. Once the sale is over, donate the remaining items to a qualified charity to get a potential charitable donation deduction. Just remember to keep a log of the items you donate and ask for a receipt.

4. Start a Roth IRA for your children. Roth IRA contributions are limited to the amount of income your child earns, so earned income is key. This can include income from mowing lawns or selling lemonade. Start make ing contributions as soon as your child makes some money to take advantage of the tax-free earnings available in a Roth IRA.

Taking the time this summer to execute these tips can put extra money in your pocket right away and provide you taxaving happiness in the future. Remember to call and have a conversation on what your specific tax needs are!







The arrival of hurricane season is the perfect time to talk about getting - and staying – prepared for severe weather. While Central Virginia doesn't typically feel the full force of these storms at their strongest, it's still important to know the potential for severe weather brought by hurricanes.

Hurricanes are massive storm systems that form over warm ocean waters and move toward land. The Atlantic hurricane season runs from June 1 to Nov 30 Potential threats from hurricanes include powerful winds, heavy rainfall, storm surges, coastal and inland flooding, rip currents, tornadoes and landslides.

Hurricanes can happen along any U.S. coast or in any territory in the Atlantic or Pacific Oceans, and can affect areas more than 100 miles inland. Hurricanes are most active in September.

If hurricane warnings have been issued, find safe shelter right away.

- Protect yourself and loved ones: Evacuate if told to do so, and take refuge in a designated storm shelter or an interior room.
- Listen for emergency information and alerts.
- · Only use generators outdoors and away from windows.
- Turn around; don't drown. Do not walk, swim or drive through flood waters.
- Don't wait for the storm. Be prepared by taking the steps listed below.

Know your area's risk of severe weather. Hurricane season begins soon, but severe weather can happen any time of the year.

Listen and watch for emergency alerts and Information. Sign up for Fluvanna County's emergency alert system: Go to www.fluvannacounty.org and click on the alerts sign up button at the bottom of the page. The emergency alert system and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration weather radio also provide emergency alerts. If you live in an area at risk for flash flooding, watch for warning signs such as heavy rain.

Practice. Know where to go for safe shelter from high winds. Small interior rooms, rooms on the lowest level not prone to flooding, or a ready-made emergency safe shelter are best. Make plans for evacuation or sheltering in place. Become familiar with the county's shelter locations.

Gather supplies for at least three days. Keep in mind each person's specific needs,

including medication. Don't forget the needs of pets.

Keep important documents in a safe place or create password-protected digital copies.

Protect your property. Declutter drains and gutters. Install check valves in plumbing to prevent backups. Review insurance policies.

Join Fluvanna County's 72 Hour Club. After an emergency, it is vital that every household be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Emergency services and responders will be busy and often overwhelmed. Representatives from FEMA will take time to arrive and set up to help. A prepared community is a resilient community and will recover faster.

Your 72 Hour kit should contain:

- Water: a minimum of one gallon per person, per day;
- · Medication: for people and pets, refilled before the storm arrives (pharmacies could be down for days);
- Flashlights; glow sticks for children; • Battery, solar or hand-cranked radio;
- extra batteries;
- · Waterproof lighter or matches;
- · Can openers; knife;
- · Children and infants: diapers, formula, coloring books and games;
- · Cell phones: Keep them on chargers. If the power goes out you will still have a form of contact:
- At least three days' worth of nonperishable foods, such as crackers, peanut butter, trail mix, dried fruit and canned meats;
- Pets: Stock up on food and water. Have pets microchipped or keep collars with tags on at all times. If you are separated from your pet, microchips and collars will make the reunion much easier and quicker; and
- · Water for livestock.

Whenever severe weather is forecast, Fluvanna County emergency management is monitoring the situation. Alerts can be sent from the county's emergency alert system to every resident in Fluvanna who may be in harm's way. But we can only alert you if you sign up. Visit fluvannacounty.org and click on the alerts sign up icon at the bottom of the home page.

Fluco baseball wins Region championships

The Flying Fluco baseball team won the Region 3C championships Thursday (May 30) after trouncing the Brookville Bees 8-1.

The game was played at Liberty Bedford High, a neutral field, and the Flucos scored three in the first inning and three in the third to rout the number three-seeded Brookville Bees.

As a result of the win, the Flucos advanced to the State quarterfinals, hosting Abingdon High on Tuesday (June 4).

"The three runs in the first [inning] were huge," said Fluco Coach Joel Gray after the game. In the first, senior third baseman Ryan Groome led off with a solid single. Andrew Ward singled down the right field line, sending Groome to third. On a steal attempt, the throw bounced into center field, resulting in one run in and a runner at third. Senior catcher Jacob Critzer walked and a steal of second set up junior shortstop Cameron Shields. He singled to score two runs and the Flucos were in control.

After scoring one in the second inning, the Flucos took complete control in the third. Critzer singled, Shields singled and Mason Gross singled to load the bases with one out. After a force out at the plate, junior outfielder Toby Sherman launched a long double to the fence, scoring three. Leading off the fifth, Shields doubled for his third hit of the game. He moved to third on a wild pitch and came home on a ground out for the Flucos' final run.

The Flucos used three pitchers to contain the Bees. Andrew Ward pitched the first four innings and allowed three hits, striking out three and walking none. He allowed no runs. With a comfortable lead, Gray brought in junior side-arm throwing lefty Kristian Negron to pitch the fifth and sixth. Negron allowed only one unearned run. Right-handed junior Walt Dansey pitched the seventh and allowed no hits.

The Fluco totals for the bottom of the sixth were 15 batters, 10 runs, six hits, four walks, a hit batter and an error by Broadway. The Flucos ended up winning by an apparently comfortable 11-4 score, but it looked pretty grim for most of the game.

The Flucos started against the Gobblers with Kevin Ward on the mound. He had trouble only in the third when four straight singles and a fielder's choice brought home three runs. A fourth run scored in the third when a single to center took a fluke bounce over the fielder's head for a lead-off triple.

Gray brought in Andrew Ward to pitch in the sixth and he struck out four and walked one over the last two innings for the win. As a result, Andrew Ward was the winning pitcher for the Flucos in all three Region play-off games. He started the play-off with an astonishing no-hitter in which he struck out 21.

In competing for the State title, the Flucos are going up against all the Class 3 schools in the state. The Virginia High School League divides all the public high schools in Virginia into six classes, based on enrollment size. As a result, there are six State champions, one in each class. Class 3 could be described as the smaller medium-sized schools. In each class, there are four Regions: A, B, C and D. The State tournament includes the top two teams from each Region.

Their only run came in the fourth when Critzer and Kevin Ward slugged back-to-back doubles.

After the game, Gray noted that he

This typical move did not work. Ward walked, as did Shields, to put the tying run on base. Gross singled to score a run. Sherman singled to score another run. Kyle Algieri singled to score the go ahead run. A.J. Brown grounded to short, but the attempt to get a force out at second failed. Groome singled to score two and the Flucos led 7-4. 



Animal communicator Legal teaches volunteers how to listen

In her mid-50s Kat Berard, an animal communicator or what some might call a dog or horse whisperer, decided to leave her job as a paralegal to devote more time to animals. She was at a transitional phase in her life when she came to visit her friend Mary Birkholz at Caring for Creatures (CFC). Sharing her intimate knowledge of animals with a group of volunteers May 18 led to a revelation about human relationships with animals and how we view the world around us.

Berard explained that the level at which humans communicate and connect is far different than the level that animals use to communicate.

"It is deeper than what we see, it is practical, humorous, sensitive and honest," she said. "Allow them to know you; be genuine with them. It makes it easier for them to engage with you. They are not layered with mental junk."

She added that animals may have issues – usually brought on by negative interaction with humans. Unlike humans, animals do not ponder past emotional issues. This explains why human relationships with animals are unconditional

"When you are working with animals, check your ego at the door. The animal knows himself or herself and doesn't care who you are," she said. "They are not mind readers. They have visual and mental images and sense emotional and mental energy." For example, her dog Max loved people but once ran toward someone, then did a complete 180-degree turn and ran back to her. That told Berard that the dog sensed something about the person he didn't like.

To understand animals at their level, Berard said to make no assumptions. The volunteers did exactly what Berard warned them against by projecting their feelings or emotions onto the animal, in this case Birkholz' dog Charlie, a large, handsome Rottweiler-hound mix.

"They feed off your energy," Berard said. "You are doing it on a rudimentary level. Perceptions and experiences influence translat-

ing energy that the animal receives."

In an experiment, volunteers gathered with CFC dog Roscoe. Roscoe came to CFC from a high-kill shelter in South Carolina and because of his hair loss and general condition had been passed over for adoption. The volunteer who suggested using Roscoe for Berard's communication experiment was overtaken by his past and fought back tears as she explained what a beautiful soul this dog was. She felt he may never get adopted because he was not attractive enough to potential adopters. Nowadays, Roscoe sports a thick coat of hair. He also looks older than his four to five years. One volunteer assumed he

All the volunteers watched Roscoe play, focusing on him in complete silence until Berard asked them what words came to mind. One volunteer said "loved and loving." Others had similar words but no preconceived mental images, since few knew him that well. Most of the volunteers were amazed that this was the same dog described earlier, which supported Bereard's point about assumptions.

Berard pointed out that Roscoe doesn't know what he looks like any more than Charlie knows he is handsome. Dogs do not look in mirrors or pass judgment on themselves the way humans do.

"Animals may have been negatively impacted but they have a fully functioning spirit and they do not need your help or your pity," she said. The volunteers learned that communicating is about intuition, knowing rather than thinking. Humans are notorious for overthinking. The volunteer who bonded with Roscoe learned about her preconceived notions, her projections and expectations.

Berard is not a dog trainer or a behaviorist but instead takes a different approach by understanding animals at their roots. She knows how to shape behavior. An understanding a dog's behavior overlaps with a strong relationship and good training.

Many volunteers walked away knowing more about their animals and even how to connect with humans in their lives as well.






