

Meet Dr. Meagan Tenia, new middle school principal

Fluvanna Middle School (FMS) has a new principal: Dr. Meagan Tenia.

Tenia comes from Short Pump Middle School in Henrico County, where she was the associate principal. There, in the absence of the principal, she served as acting principal, overseeing math, electives and physical education, and utilizing assessment data to drive effective instruction in the classroom.

But after four years, Tenia felt ready for the next step in her career, so she traded the suburban area for Fluvanna's rural one.

Before stepping into the world of education, Tenia had her thoughts set on becoming a doctor when she attended Old Dominion University (ODU). But after completing community service hours for a pre-requisite course at an elementary school where she worked specifically with one student, she fell in love with teaching and changed her major to education within her first semester.

After earning her bachelor's, she continued her education at ODU and earned her master's of science in education, elementary and teaching

as well as her education specialist in education leadership and administration. She started her teaching career with Suffolk Public Schools in 2004, worked with Charlottesville City Schools for almost eight years, and then went to Chesterfield County Public Schools for three years. While there, Tenia worked on her doctorate of education through Virginia Commonwealth University, finishing in

"Deciding to get my administration and supervision endorsement was a pivotal decision that helped shape my life," said Tenia. "I loved teaching – still do – and you can often find me team-teaching with teachers; however, after I had my second daughter I decided that I wanted to help shape teachers and so I got my administration and supervision en-

When Tenia first started teaching she felt strongly that students needed to learn her curriculum the way she learned. Since then, she realized that each student is different and that mastery of content is most important. She took the same philosophy in her

role as an administrator, but said that if a teacher has a different idea she is willing to listen and try it their way.

For the upcoming school year, Tenia has already set some goals for FMS. She wants to continue to help students reach their potential while also building meaningful relationships with staff, students and the community. And while the challenge of time management can sneak up in any administrative role, the reward of working with students makes up for it.

Students "are the reason I do what I do and I absolutely love getting to know the students in my building," said Tenia. "The students keep me on my toes and keep me laughing. I absolutely love what I do!"

This summer Tenia and the administrative team prepared themselves for the upcoming school year by diving into the school's data.

"We are being thoughtful with changes we plan to implement, making sure we keep our students at the center of every decision," said Tenia. "The real summer heroes are our custodial staff, who have been working hard to get our building ready to welcome our students and parents."

Every morning Tenia wakes up at 5 a.m. and hits the road around 6 a.m. to ensure she arrives at school early. Her commute is a bit longer than most since she and her family still live in the Richmond area. After brewing herself a cup of coffee and grabbing breakfast, she checks her emails and calendars to get ready for the day.

"I like to move, so during the day you can find me in the hallways, at lunches and in teachers' classrooms, and rarely you will find me in my office," she said.

Finally, when the day is done, she will make her way home to walk her dogs, go the gym, have dinner, and help her daughters with their homework.

On the weekends, Tenia puts in hours at the gym and then spends time with family. An early riser, she also reads education articles on best practice, new research and other current topics. Some of her hobbies include running, hiking with her family, cleaning and shopping. She is a proud wife to Mark Tenia and mother of daughters Gabrielle and Marley.

When looking to start a business or expand, the most important thing to provide Community Development is a written description of what you are looking to do on your property. You could also provide a business plan, if you have one available. Please call our office (434.591.1910) and ask to speak with me directly about your business. You can also email your business description or plan to me at dmiles@fluvannacounty. org. Your written description will allow me to do the proper research to classify your proposed land use in the Fluvanna County Zoning Ordinance. You can view the Zoning Ordinance on our website by going to FluvannaCounty.org: select

"Your Government" and click on "Zon-Development Department is coming Ordinance" to access the new online text. You can also scroll through the entire "County Code" for all related County Code information for businesses.

> Once we have met on your proposed small business use, that can either be based out of your home or located within an office, commercial or industrial building, I can prepare a Zoning Compliance Letter. To draft a compliance letter, we need you and/or your business partner to provide in writing your proposed business use and any related business land uses that are proposed on the subject property. Community Development staff members are ready to assist you through the County Administrative process five days a week.





Fluvanna Faces: Father David Ssentamu

What do you do for a living?

I am a Catholic priest, but I don't do it as earning a living in the strictest sense. If it were doing something to earn a living, I would be a psychologist. I therefore serve as a priest in the Catholic Church.

Where do you live?

I live at Lake Monticello.

How long have you lived in Fluvanna?

Two weeks.

What were your previous churches?

I served three smaller churches in southwest Virginia: St. Joseph Church in Woodlawn, All Saints Church in Floyd and the Risen Lord Church in Stuart.

How does Sts. Peter and Paul differ from your former churches?

It is different in many ways, but I would for now point out that the parishes I served before coming here were more rural. Otherwise each church even in the Catholic Church tends to have its own character.

Why did you change parishes?

I don't know. The bishop just asked me to take up a new position.

What did you want to be as a child? How has that changed?

Growing up, I always wanted to be a priest. Over the years I have just grown into loving it, and also sometimes challenging myself whether this is really what I wanted to do. But every time I challenge myself, I keep coming back to the same answer: priest.

What was your first job?

My first job was priesthood. How do you prepare for mass?

I give myself a few minutes before mass, and I sit before the Blessed Sacrament. That way I allow Jesus to teach me, before I go out to teach others.

What do you like to do in your spare time?

I visit with friends and have some fun. I like also to take a hike once in a while, as I observe nature in silence.

What are your favorite books and movies?

I like to read books related to psychology. Such books help me to understand man's brokenness. In my call as a priest, I encounter many people who are broken. Reading such books helps my understanding of them and also helps me to appreciate them. I am not so much into movies. I live most of the time by myself. I get bored watching interesting stuff by myself.

What sports do you follow?

Once I have company I like to watch sports, especially basketball and soccer. Right now I have been rooting for the American women's soccer team. I was very happy seeing them winning the World Cup!

What pivotal decision helped to shape your life?

Trusting that my parents always meant the best for me. Many times I did not like their decisions, but obeyed and trusted that they meant the best for me. I am going to be grateful always to them. I see that as a very pivotal decision I took: obeying them.

Tell us about a way you have changed over the years.

I don't think a lot has changed. I have always been a loyal person and attentive to the pain and injustices in society.

What has surprised you about your life?

Human nature being the same wherever you go. People tend to be the same regardless of their race, color, sex, and other factors. There is something I have found as a constant wherever I have been. I fail to give it a proper name though. I guess that is why it surprises me still!

What's one thing you hope to accomplish before you die?

I want to be a better person. I want to accomplish that wonderful person God created me to be.

Tell us about one of your regrets.

I don't regret much. I fail many times, but all the failures in my life become learning opportunities.

Tell us about your proudest moment.

In general and on a daily basis, whenever I accomplish a task. But my proudest moment ever was when I was ordained a priest in August 2006. I started seminary formation to become a priest in 1992. It was quite

a long journey of several years. When I was finally ordained, it made me so proud.

What is the craziest thing you have ever done in Fluvanna?

I have not yet done anything crazy so far. I plan to swim across Lake Monticello from one end to another in the shortest time possible. I want to break a record!

What quote do you connect with most?

It is a Bible verse from Jeremiah 14:9: "Lord, we are called by your name; do not desert us!" I believe I am weak. In this way, I need to feel God's presence always surrounding as I speak to his people and as I make important decisions that affect lives of many people. Who am I left to myself, really? That is why I feel I need him always.

Sharks fall to Key West 299-330 in final meet

The Lake Monticello Swim Team (LMST) hosted the Key West Swim Club at the new Lake Monticello pool Wednesday (July 17). First the meet was threatened by a need to drain and refill the pool. Then, at 4 p.m., it looked like the meet might be canceled as a significant cloudburst moved through Fluvanna County. However, the storm was a small cell that passed quickly, and by the 6 p.m. start time the sky was clear and the temperature was hot.

In the first scored event of the meet, Key West won the girls' under age 8 100-meter freestyle relay for 10 points. The Sharks squad was second for five points. The following event was the boys' 9-10 100-meter individual medley (IM). Key West took first and second for 12 points. In the girls' 9-10 100-meter IM, Key West took first but Lila Kate Robinson and Isabelle Thompson finished second and third, recording five and four points for the Sharks. In the boys' 11-12 100-meter IM, Landon Creamer was second, recording five points. In the girls' 11-12 100-meter IM, Sophie Pace was third for the Sharks.

In the boys' 13-14 100-meter IM, Cole Gustafson was second for the Sharks and Finn Thompson was third. Lake Monticello won its first event of the night in the girls' 13-14 100-meter IM, as Grace Farist won, and she was followed in second place by teammate Julia Tomaras. These swimmers gained seven and five points respectively. The boys' 15-18 100-meter IM had a similar result, as Hunter Strickland and Nathaniel Smith finished one and two for a combined total of 12 points.

Lake Monticello continued its dominance in the older races, as Abigayle Harlow and Olivia Strickland were first and second in the girls' 15-18 100-meter IM.

Once the IM races were over, the meet moved to races in the different disciplines. In the boys' under 8 25-meter freestyle, Mateo Achmad-Guzman finished second for the Sharks, losing by only two-tenths of a second. In the girls' 8 and under 25-meter freestyle, Ariella Miller was third for the Sharks.

All the freestyle events for older swimmers are 50 meters. In the boys' 9-10 freestyle, Lake Monticello took first and third. Jack Pace was the winner. In the girls' 9-10 freestyle, the Sharks were completely dominant. Reese Yowell won, Lila Kate Robinson was second, and the next three finishers were all swimming for the Sharks. The points system, however, awards seven for first, five for second, and then gives four and three points to the top two finishers for the other team, regardless of where they actually finish. As a result, although the Sharks had the top five times and eight of the top 10, they still only won the event 12 points to seven.


In the boys' 11-12 freestyle event, Jaxon Brooks was third for the Sharks. In the girls' freestyle event the Sharks dominated again. Sophie Pace was the winner, Sarah Beth Robinson was second and Sierra Miller was third. In the boys' 13-14 event, Cole Gustafson was the winner for the Sharks, and Finn Thompson took third. In the girls' 13-14 freestyle, the Sharks took the first seven places. Grace Farist was the winner, with Megan Farist in second. In the boys' 15-18 freestyle, the Sharks had the seven fastest times, with Luke Gustafson in first and Owen Strickland

in second. In the girls' 15-18 freestyle, Allyson Lounsbury was first, while her teammate Meghan Dech was second.

The meet then switched over to the breaststroke, with the under 8 age group swimming 25 meters and all the older competitors going 50 meters. In both the boys' and girls' 8 and under the Sharks took third and fourth. In the 9-10 boys' event, Key West had six of the top seven finishers with the Sharks only taking third. The Sharks finally got it going in the breaststroke in the girls' 9-10 age group. Charlotte Gifford was first and Madelyn Grout was second. In the boys' 11-12 it was again Lake Monticello in third and fourth. In the girls' 11-12, the best the Sharks could do was third. In the boys' 13-14 the Sharks managed a second by Finn Thompson. In the girls' 13-14, Julia Tomaras was a winner for Lake Monticello, while Abbie Ford was third. In the boys' 15-18 Owen Strickland was the winner, while in the girls' race, Abigayle Harlow was first and Meghan Dech third.

In the 8 and under backstroke the Sharks' Mateo Achmad-Guzman and Matthew Blevins were second and third. In the girls' 8 and under backstroke, Key West took the top three places. In the boys' 9-10 50-meter backstroke, Matthew Farist was second. In the girls' 9-10 backstroke, Reese Yowell was second for the Sharks. This event was as far as the meet was able to go.

Sharks Coach Sito Arroyo said that the Sharks had a roster this season of approximately 160 swimmers. He noted that he was very happy with the improvements in times shown by his swimmers and felt that the team had a good season in that regard despite not notching any wins.



FAST ends regular season 1-4

The Fluvanna Aquatics Sports Team (FAST) met the Louisa Gators for the final dual meet of the Jefferson Swim League summer swim season Wednesday (July 17). Just as swimmers and families were making their way to the pool, a huge thunderstorm rolled through Louisa, bringing with it strong gusts of wind, pounding rain and lightning. This resulted in a delayed start to the meet, as officials waited for lightning to move a safe distance from the pool and then set to work cleaning up the storm damage on deck.

Once underway, the meet ran smoothly until another batch of lightning brought things to a premature end during the freestyle relay events. The final score was FAST 381 to Louisa 502. FAST went 1-4 for the regular season.

Four FAST swimmers, Emma DiFazio (17), Jackson Kinsella (14), Harrison Williams (10) and Ryann Birckhead (6), swept their individual events for the evening, going home with all blue ribbons.

Emma DiFazio kicked off the evening with a win in the 15-18 girls' 50-meter freestyle, where she led by three seconds to finish in 28.31 seconds. In her 50-meter backstroke, Emma finished ahead of her opponents, in 32.29. Completing her evening trifecta, Emma grabbed the win in the 50meter fly, in 30.19. With these wins, Emma finished the 2019 regular swim season with a perfect record, having captured wins in every individual event she swam.

Jackson Kinsella's night began with a commanding win in his 100-meter individual medley (IM). Jackson led by nearly nine seconds, to finish in just 1:09.06. Over the course of the season, Jackson dropped an impressive 8.4 seconds in his IM. Jackson's other wins for the evening came in his 50-meter freestyle in 27.32 seconds, and his 50meter breaststroke in 38.09 seconds.

Harrison Williams led the evening with a win in his 100-yard IM, which he finished in 1:35.97. This was his first successful completion of the IM for the season. He also secured wins in the 50-meter freestyle in 37.91 seconds, and 50-meteer breaststroke in 52.88 seconds.

The youngest swimmer to sweep her events for the evening was 6-yearold Ryann Birckhead, who turned in wins for both the 6 and under 25meter freestyle and backstroke events. Ryann's wins were particularly impressive, as she dropped an astounding 14.06 seconds off her freestyle time and 5.03 seconds from her backstroke.

FAST also scored wins in the 100meter IM events of 10-year-old Ava Gray (1:39.78) and 15-year-old Joseph Sam (1:21.50). FAST led a number of the freestyle events with Ella Gray (8), Maya Hernandez (10), and Laura Hernandez (14) all grabbing first. Breaststroke wins went to Jacob Birckhead (7), Ella Gray (8), Josie Caruso (10) and Joey Hagan (15). Backstroke was led by Abby Caruso (8), Maya Hernandez (10), and Mitch Messier (14). The Caruso siblings, Abby (8) and Anthony (14), took wins for FAST in their respective butterfly events.

Summing up the night, Coach Nathan Johnson said, "Even with the high heat, swimmers dropped time and swam FAST. I can't wait to see everyone at Champs."

FAST will swim in the Jefferson Swim League Championship Meet July 26-27 at the University of Virginia Aquatics Center.

Historians recognize Fluvanna's last smithy

The Fluvanna Historical Society presented a slate historical plaque to the descendants of Everette E. Black, a Cunningham-area blacksmith, at a June 3 ceremony recognizing the historical importance of the site of Black's shop. The building is the last known blacksmith shop still in existence in Fluvanna County.

Henry Southworth, Black's grandson, and his wife Judy, and Black's granddaughter Laurie Jensen and her husband Jack, received the plaque from society president Marvin Moss. The society's historic marker committee, led by co-chairs Judi Ruch and Juanita Steere, researched the shop, found documentary evidence of its use, and learned about the remarkable man who owned it.

Everette E. Black of Cunningham opened his blacksmith shop in 1917. A talented and industrious man, he not only shod horses and forged implements of iron, but he was also a wheelwright and an artisan carpenter. His blacksmith shop, an upright white frame building which still stands on Thomas Jefferson Parkway, was a hub of the Cunningham community, where farmers met to discuss crops and livestock and exchange local gossip while Black shod their horses or did other smithy work for

Black ran his shop until the 1960s. His grandson, Henry Southworth, recalled visiting his grandfather and watching him shoe horses and make wheels in the smithy yard. He pointed out depressions in the ground that indicated where a stall had once stood to confine the horse being shod, and where the heavy wheel-making equipment had rested as the iron was hammered and bent into shape around a circular wooden frame.

Palmyra author Horatio Bigelow noted in his book Gunnerman's Gold, published in 1943: "Black is the only blacksmith hereabouts and will probably be busy in the smithy heating a piece of iron or a wheel rim in the

forge so he can hammer it into proper shape."

Justin Sarafin, director of preservation initiatives and engagement for Preservation Virginia, visited the site, agreed to its authenticity, and said, "This extant structure representative of Fluvanna's early 20th century history is a rare survivor for this type of utilitarian purpose." He went on to commend the Southworth and Jensen families for being good stewards of the site, and for moving forward with ongoing preservation efforts.



Changing with the times: Fluvanna Review turns 40

From simple beginnings as a onepage monthly newsletter for Lake Monticello residents, the Fluvanna Review has grown into a thriving weekly newspaper covering news throughout Fluvanna County.

In the years since the first edition was printed in July 1979, the world has changed. While print once dominated the market, now many people get their news from TV or online. This shift has affected advertising, and with online ads selling for pennies on the dollar, necessity has driven many once-free newspapers to sell subscriptions to remain in business.

Through it all, the Fluvanna Review has spent the last 40 years publishing news affecting Fluvanna residents' daily lives - for free. Its coverage of local government, schools, business, art, human interest and crime is unsurpassed.

As the paper turns 40, the Fluvanna Review took the opportunity to look back through the years.

Birth of the Bulletin

The first house at Lake Monticello was built in 1971, and four years later, 50 homes stood in the development - enough to necessitate a newsletter. So in April 1975, five Lake residents got together and started what would someday become the Fluvanna Review.

The first issue of the Residents' Association News Bulletin, a one-page monthly newsletter, championed the paving of Route 600, which was then a dirt road.

The newsletter hummed along for four years until one pivotal day in July 1979, when retiree Len Gardner, who had moved to the Lake a year earlier, volunteered to take over as Bulletin

"There was a collective sigh of relief," Gardner said in a 2014 interview. "No one else wanted the job. And as it turned out, no one else got a chance at the job for the next 18 years."

The reason for the job's unpopularity, Gardner said, was the sheer amount of work involved in producing the Bulletin, which had grown to multiple legal-sized sheets. "The editor had to collect all the news, do most of the writing, do the typing, run off 200 copies on the Xerox machine, collate and staple them, and then stuff the paper into the mailboxes," he

Becoming a newspaper

Four months after Gardner took over, the Lake Monticello Owners' Association decided it would no longer subsidize the Lake Monticello Newsletter, as Gardner now called it, either financially or through use of its typewriter and Xerox machine. Faced with the expense of printing in Charlottesville and loath to ask for donations, Gardner decided to sell advertising in the Newsletter to defray its cost.

"I had no trouble getting advertising," Gardner said. "The advertisers came to me because advertising in the Newsletter was the best and surest way to get their message to the growing population at the Lake."

The *Newsletter* played an important role in Lake affairs, helping to secure individual mailboxes for homeowners rather than clusters at the gates, and assisting in having Lake roads declared fit for school bus travel.

In 1985 Gardner changed the name of the paper to the Lake Monticello Review, joking later that he selected the title because the monthly publication schedule made it impossible to do anything other than "review" the news.

But Gardner made a more important change from the moment he took over: including Fluvanna County news, not just Lake Monticello happenings. After years of reporting on county Board of Supervisors meetings, Gardner decided to adjust the publication's name yet again to reflect its wider reach. And so, in 1988, the Lake Monticello and Fluvanna County Review was born.

Throughout the early years, Gardner relied on volunteers to keep the paper thriving. "More than 100 volunteers served with me in many

roles: typing, advertising, layout, editing, reporting, special columns, bill paying, photography and distribution," he said. "My wife, Doris, backed me up on almost all the jobs at the paper at one time or another."

Though the volunteers received no salary, the money generated by the ads was more than enough to cover the paper's expenses. So at the end of the year, Gardner would give his volunteers a share of what the paper had

Over time, Gardner's life grew busier. Once a mayor of a small town in Maryland, Gardner felt his political interest return. In 1992 he won election to a seat on the Board of Super-

Passing the torch

"By 1995 the paper was running 56 pages monthly in magazine format," Gardner said. "It had become too big an enterprise to be run by volunteers. The Lake, and Fluvanna County as well, had grown into a significant market. A monthly publication was no longer adequate for news coverage or to serve the needs of the business community. There was so much going on – if we didn't go to a weekly paper someone else was going to come in and do it. I was just too busy at that point in time. I was the chair of the Board of Supervisors, and I couldn't handle a weekly paper. So that's when I recruited someone else to do it."

Eric Allen, a Lake resident, graphic artist and former newspaper advertising manager, joined the staff in 1995, and when Gardner offered to sell the paper, Allen agreed. He took over as publisher in 1997 while Gardner stayed on as a silent partner.

"The 18 years that I ran the paper were among the most satisfying years of my life," Gardner said. "I learned on the job how to run a paper. I learned that sometimes it can be difficult and unpopular, but necessary. I learned to stand up for ethical and accurate reporting, to edit out poorly thought-out commentary and unfounded accusations."

Now 97 years old, Gardner stays in touch with Fluvanna Review staff and still occasionally attends Board of Supervisors meetings. "I'm really pleased to be associated with the Review," he said last week. "It has developed into a real county newspaper. It does a great job for the county."

Allen made several changes when he took over, but three stood out with lasting impact. He switched the paper to a tabloid format, which the Review still uses today. He began publishing every other week rather than once a month. But most significant of all, he changed the name of the paper one final time: to the Fluvanna Review.

Over the next two years, Allen's responsibilities began to take a toll. "I was getting burned out," he said in a 2014 interview. "I was the ad salesman, the editor, the designer and the delivery guy." Plus, he said, he had never seen himself as a lifelong newspaperman. So when an opportunity arose for Allen to go into the computer business with a friend in Lynchburg, he decided to sell the paper.

Dismal days

In 1999 Allen sold the Review to a man who lived in Martinsville. "He planned to move up here, but it wasn't working out," Allen said. "He tried to run it from Martinsville."

The task proved too difficult, and the paper started unraveling. Advertisers grew angry with mistakes in their ads and began dropping out. The Review's situation turned serious. "It was bankrupt on paper," Allen said. "It had more debts than it had assets."

Allen's business venture hadn't worked out, and merely a year after he sold the paper, he decided to return. "I bought it back for \$1 and assumed all that debt," he said.

Growing the business

Allen immediately got to work. "When people heard that I had come back, the advertisers who had dropped out jumped back in. I mended fences and put creditors at ease," he said, noting that Gardner

helped significantly by giving the paper a loan to get it out of pressing

Allen's new philosophy revolved around turning the Review from an essentially one-man show into a business. "I started hiring staff," he said. "That was the only way it was going to grow, because one person can only do so much. Over time I hired an office manager, a designer, an editor and additional salespeople."

In 2004 Allen also made the long-anticipated jump into weekly production. "We needed to be timelier with the news," he said. "Our competitors at the time were the *Central Virginian* out of Louisa, which had a Fluvanna section, and the Rural Virginian, which was mostly Scottsville but had a little Fluvanna news. They were weekly; we weren't."

As the Fluvanna Review grew, Allen kept its mission intact. "We reported both sides of any hot topic facing the county and let the readers decide," he said. "We tried to be unbiased. First and foremost our responsibility was to our readers, and secondly to our advertisers... We were the one paper that was all Fluvanna, all the time, and we wanted to be the best source of Fluvanna news."

Monthlies

One competitor, the Rural Virginian, "started coming really hard after us in Fluvanna, trying to compete," Allen said. "I thought the best defense might be a good offense." So in 2002 he began the Scottsville Monthly.

"The Scottsville Monthly was literally an overnight success," he said. "On my first day selling advertising, I sold enough to cover the first year of expenses. People in Scottsville loved having their own paper."

In 2003 Allen started another monthly, this time in Buckingham. "Buckingham was the one county in Virginia that didn't have a newspaper," Allen said. "So I started the Buckingham Beacon. The people embraced it with open arms."

Pleased with the success of his two monthlies, Allen looked next to Orange County, and in 2005 started OC Magazine. "There was already a weekly paper there and I didn't want to compete head-to-head, so we went with more of a magazine feel," he said.

Then in 2008 Allen decided to go

into Louisa, again using a magazine format for Louisa Life so as not to compete with the county's existing newspaper. Next he looked to Greene County, but the Great Recession halted his plans. "I decided to batten

down the hatches and ride it through," he said.

All four monthlies and the Review function under Valley Publishing, a company Allen created. While newspapers across the country are being bought up by media conglomerates, Valley Publishing remains a loyal Fluvanna company, located in Crofton Plaza off Lake Monticello Road.

New era

As time stretched on, Allen felt the sense of burnout return. "I had been

publishing for 12 years," he said. "My plan in life was never to be a publisher – it just kind of happened that way." He started looking for buyers.

Around the same time, two career newspapermen interested in running a local paper discovered the Fluvanna Review and liked what they saw. In 2010 Carlos Santos and Dave Ress, both former Richmond Times-Dispatch reporters, bought Valley Publishing. Santos took over as publisher and Ress stayed in the background as a silent partner.

One of the first things Santos did was establish a website for the Fluvanna Review. "It was primitive but it allowed us to have a daily newspaper," Santos said. "That was big, because suddenly we were competing with the local TV stations." Over the years Santos upgraded the website, culminating in last year's launch of a sleeker, more streamlined format that also includes the monthly publications.

Santos, who had 33 years of experience as a reporter when he took over, initially wrote many of the news stories himself, and over time the Fluvanna Review developed a hard news

edge. He doubled the number of color pages and focused on expanding the paper's reach throughout the county and into surrounding areas.

Now the five papers together have a monthly circulation of 46,000. The

> Fluvanna Review prints 6,300 copies each week delivered directly to homes at Lake Monticello, Broken Island and Sycamore Square, and available at over 100 key locations throughout Fluvanna, Albemarle, Louisa and Charlottesville.

> One of Santos' more influential decisions was to enter the Fluvanna Review into the Virginia Press Association's (VPA) yearly competition for journalism and newspaper design excellence. While the awards that began accumulating gave the Review's staff a sense of accomplishment, their impact went further than mere validation. The paper's journalists and designers started pushing themselves to meet a higher standard - by writing better, digging deeper, asking harder questions, and designing with elegance and creativity.

> The Fluvanna Review has won 88 VPA awards since 2010 for breaking news writing, investigative journalism, government coverage, column writing, advertising design, news layout, cover illustration and photography.

Looking forward

The news world has changed since the Fluvanna Review began in 1979. Local news in particular has suffered a tremendous blow, with many communities around the country already finding themselves without reliable, objective information about what's taking place in their hometown government, schools and law enforcement agencies.

Producing a newspaper each week isn't free. Staff members make modest salaries to support themselves and their families, and the costs of printing, distribution and overhead don't come cheaply.

Residents who value having a local newspaper – who appreciate not only the information provided but also the accountability enforced among those in power - need to speak with their dollars. It is a simple economic reality.

In the case of free newspapers like the Fluvanna Review, that means purchasing advertisements rather than asking the paper to make repeated gifts of its time, print space and publicity. Community newspapers like the Review do as much as they can to help the myriad worthwhile endeavors throughout their readership areas, but in the end – just like any other company – they need money to survive.

Santos reflected on that changing dynamic as he looked ahead to the paper's future in the Fluvanna community.



"Newspapers all over the country are struggling and some are gone. We plan to be around a long time, but in the end it's the community – both readers and advertisers - who make the final decision as to how long. I'm hoping for another 40 years."

Couple describes Croatian travels

Despite a bloody civil war that tore Yugoslavia apart, Croatia – which was once part of the former Yugoslavia and its communist regime – now stands with its own identity. Sue and Allan Mink took a three-month sojourn to Croatia from March to June of this

year, to discover everything historical and beautiful about this often overlooked travel destination.

Sue Mink, a history lover, recognized the destruction left in the wake of the civil war.

There were "three factions: the

Croats (mostly Roman Catholic, influenced by that region's historical ties to Venice), the Bosnians (mostly Muslim, influenced by the time parts of the region were ruled by the Ottomans) and the Orthodox," she said. "Although all three factions committed atrocities, in the region we were in, the Bosnians suffered the most. Entire villages were burned, there were mass executions of civilians and people were violently uprooted. Now, there are still scars, but the people who once lived peacefully side by side are trying to do that again. I think that in many cases, they still don't like each other, but they like war a lot less. This tension was a lot more evident in Bosnia-Herzegovina because the three factions are still all there. Croatia is strongly Roman Catholic and more homogeneous, so the recovery there has been a lot easier."

Game of Thrones fans might know that Dubrovnik, where the Minks stayed, is the setting for King's Landing – although they added important Game of Thrones buildings into the landscape that are not genuine to the area.

"Dubrovnik is a spectacularly beautiful city. It's impossible not to be impressed whenever you see it," she said. "The water is a turquoise blue, the islands dotted out in the water are breathtaking, and there's no describing seeing Dubrovnik's famous city walls." She added that the old section of the city is very small – just 34 acres. When they arrived in March, she said it was wonderful to go down and walk the old town, but by the time they left in early June, they avoided it as much as possible. Tour buses jammed the entrances by the city gates, and as many as five cruise ships were there at one time. It was very difficult to walk the streets due to the crowds.

"They are going to initiate tickets next season to attempt to reduce the people on the streets, but while I see the need, that will change the character of the town, making it more a Disneyland than a living, vibrant city," Sue Mink said. "We loved the region around Dubrovnik, but as we got more into the tourist season, liked the city itself less." However, she stressed that while visiting Croatia, Dubrovnik is a must-see given that so far she has seen nothing comparable to it in her world travels.

One of her favorite places near the city was the Peljesac peninsula.

"It's Croatian wine country – and the wine can be very, very good. The views are stunning, and there are some beautiful seaside towns in the region," she said. "My favorite was Korcula, a medieval walled city that was packed with charm, not tourists." There is a ferry that goes between Korcula and Dubrovnik, and Sue Mink strongly suggested that visitors stay in Korcula and visit Dubrovnik with the ferry, especially during high season.

"We loved the Bay of Kotor in Montenegro, and a real highlight was the Plitvice waterfalls, but that is a good bit north of Dubrovnik," she said. Plitvice is a series of 27 lakes that cascade



"Sarajevo is fascinating and a story in itself. It has a strong Ottoman culture, but it was also an important city for the Austrian empire. It was on a street corner in Sarajevo that Emperor Franz Joseph was assassinated, starting the first World War. It's a dichotomy there is a line in the sidewalk at one point where, if you face one way, you'd swear you were in Turkey," she said.

Coppersmiths craft their wares, and thick Turkish coffee is enjoyed in tiny cups on tables along the streets. "Just turn around, and you'd think you were in Vienna. Elegant European buildings line the streets and the coffeehouses are dark wood paneled with crystal chandeliers."

She added that the city still shows signs of devastation from the war, since they were in a siege for nearly four years. "It's a sobering view of a very recent war, but I was also very impressed by the resiliency and sense of (dark) humor in the city. They are survivors, they have seen the worst, and they made it."

She said the people were very warm and welcoming once they realized they weren't passing through on a cruise boat. Her husband, Al, often bicycled into Bosnia and became very friendly with the border guards and the owner of a small café that sat right on the border. Toward the end of their stay, the cook at the café would wave

him down as he biked by to come in and have a meal – or a few shots.

"When we mentioned we were Americans, it was common to hear about relatives who escaped the horrors of the war to settle in America, where they were now and how they liked living there," Sue Mink said. They also became quite close with the family who was hired to care for their apartment, a young, ambitious Bosniak couple with three small children. "They told us about their experiences and how they were working to help the country recover. Belka, the wife, was very involved in politics in the region, even running for a seat on the European Union council for Croatia while we were there. She lost the election, but continued to be actively involved in politics."

Sue Mink painted a picture of the people as survivors, using their strengths, talents and beliefs to build a better future.

"It's a powerful experience to have an elderly man point to the ruins of his home in his field of grapes and tell of how his family had to flee for their lives, but that they were able to return and he's rebuilt his home," she said. "These are strong, resilient and proud people and they are dedicated to rebuilding their lives there. I admire them."

Sue Mink said the entire coastline of Croatia has been influenced by several different cultures - but the coastline itself has strong influences from Venice. There are steep mountains only a few miles from the coast that effectively divide the coast from the rest of the region, and that a large part of Croatia is a very narrow strip of land running down the coast – usually only a few miles wide.

"Cross the mountains and you're in a different world," she said. "It makes for a fascinating region of different cultures all within a few minutes' drive from one another."

For those visiting Croatia for a shorter trip, Sue Mink recommended exploring the coast from the northern town of Zadar down into Montenegro at the Bay of Mostar. Not to be missed are the Plitvice waterfalls, though they are a detour from the coast. Wine connoisseurs in particular should spend some extra time in Split and the Peljesac Peninsula.

"If you want to see Bosnian culture, head to Mostar for an experience you won't forget," she said. "Walk the streets of Saraievo, taking in the dual cultures mixed with the horrors of what war can do and the hope of a people who have risen above it."
