Supervisors weigh ambulance options

After a nearly month-long break, the Fluvanna County Board of Supervisors returned Wednesday (Aug. 7) to a conundrum.

The fiscal year 2020 (FY20) budget allocates up to \$190,000 to have Fluvanna Rescue Squad's Ambulance 49 remounted.

Removing the box from an ambulance, refurbishing it, and attaching it to a new vehicle chassis is a common solution to upgrading an aging rescue truck. It's generally far less costly than buying an entirely new ambulance.

But Purchasing Officer Cyndi Toler told supervisors that since the approval of the budget in April, Fluvanna Rescue has requested that the county instead purchase a new vehicle.

In conversations with Toler, Chief Crystal Mayo proposed an ambulance with a smaller box, which would better fit some of the county's narrow driveways, and a switch from a diesel to a gas engine. This model would come within the \$190,000 budget.

Toler presented a set of options, ranging from remounting the current

box on a 2019 or 2020 Ford F450 or F550 diesel engine for between \$144,500 to \$153,500, to purchasing a smaller F450 gas engine for between \$170,000 to \$180,000.

The rescue service has also requested an automated stretcher loading device, which could prevent back injuries for first responders who currently have to manually lift patients in and out of the ambulance. That could add another \$45,000 to 50,000 to the final bill.

As Toler and County Administrator Eric Dahl went through each option, it became clear the devil was in the details.

A diesel engine is slightly more expensive to maintain, but often retains a higher trade-in value and lasts longer than a gas engine. Remounting Ambulance 49 would take two to three months and would leave the rescue service with just two ambulances for that period. Purchasing a new ambulance would take six to nine months for delivery, but would allow Ambulance 49 to remain in service.

Then there was in the issue of financing. The county had hoped to defray

some of the cost of a remount by applying for a grant that could net up to \$40,000 of the cost of a vehicle, but if the county opted to buy a new vehicle, they would have to have to finance it with debt, making it ineligible for that grant.

After the presentation, a number of opinions emerged, but no clear consensus. In the end, they voted 4-0 to defer a decision until a future meeting, with Supervisor Mozell Booker abstaining.

Other matters

During the 90-minute meeting, supervisors approved the FY21 budget calendar and FY20 pay rates and classification schedule.

They also transferred \$120,000 from the FY19 medical insurance contingency budget to cover various over-expenditures in facilities, general services, and the convenience department. All three departments ended the fiscal year slightly over budget due to unexpected maintenance costs and increased electrical costs and other fees, while insurance expenses came in lower than anticipated.

The board approved an \$8,675 change order with AG Dillard for drilling services associated with the Zion Crossroads water and sewer project, after VDOT determined that part of the original drilling plan required modification. The work was completed in late July.

Updating the supervisors on the progress at Zion Crossroads, Toler noted that "we spent a little more than we anticipated" on land acquisition and had not originally factored in the cost of a SCADA computer control system in the budget.

At a previous meeting, supervisors approved \$271,000 for the design of a SCADA system, and Toler said she expected that the proposal for building and implementing the hardware would be coming within the next couple of months.

Dahl and Toler said that the project was still on track to come in within the original budget and was, at least at the moment, slightly ahead of schedule.

Webb joins race to represent 5th District

lives," Webb said.

Webb grew up in Spotsylvania along with his five siblings. His mother, a public school speech therapist, and father, a human resources manager with the DEA, taught Webb to take an active role in his community and serve others – lessons he carries with him today.

After graduating from the University of Virginia (U.Va.) and getting his medical and law degrees, Webb was tapped by President Obama for the White House Fellowship. Webb joins two other candidates, Kim Daugherty and Roger Dean Huffstetler, in the contest to win the Democratic nomination. Whoever secures the nomination will face the Republican candidate, likely Rigglesman, in the November 2020 election.

Impeachment reflections on Nixon's anniversary

How we love an anniversary. In July it was the moon landing. Today, 45 years ago on Aug. 8, Nixon's resignation. From the first article of impeachment we learned that the break-in at the Watergate complex was a very serious offense: "Richard M. Nixon, using the powers of his high office, engaged personally and through his close subordinates and agents, in a course of conduct or plan designed to delay, impede, and obstruct the investigation of such illegal entry; to cover up, conceal and protect those responsible; and to conceal the existence and scope of other unlawful covert activities." Sound familiar?

During the Special Counsel Robert Mueller hearings, Congressman Ted Lieu (D-Calif.) stated: "To recap what we've heard: We have heard today that the president ordered former White House counsel Don McGahn to fire you, the president ordered Don McGahn to then cover that up and create a false paper trail, and now we've heard that the president ordered Corey Lewandowski to tell Jeff Sessions to limit your investigation so that you stop investigating the president. I believe that a rea-

sonable person looking at these facts could conclude that all three elements of the crime of obstruction of justice have been met. I'd like to ask you: The reason, again, that you did not indict Donald Trump was because of the OLC opinion that you cannot indict a sitting president, correct?" Mueller answered by saying: "That is correct."

If this were a tennis game we'd assume the ball is now back in their court, meaning Congress should proceed with impeachment hearings. But this isn't a game. It's clearly the job of all members of Congress to support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic. They swear by oath to do so while in office.

Next week is the 50th anniversary of the Woodstock music festival. I was there on Yasgur's farm. Despite the heat, rain and mud, a half-million attendees stayed true to their ideals of peace and freedom. If we could only be that true to our beliefs today.

Use the least amount of money to gain the best outcome, not the highest amount while hoping for the best. Utilize common sense and take your time in decision-making; it costs more later to undo a bad decision. Be open and listen to what residents are saying. Be bold. Speak up if you disagree with another director, question what you do not understand, and do not doubt yourselves because you are new. You won by a wide majority to lead, not to blindly follow.

Remember that our community is a rare gem – as is. We are a rural community diverse in age, backgrounds, beliefs and finances. We are surrounded by a variety of wildlife in a natural setting, we offer a lake with boating, a good golf course, a restaurant and other amenities. Lake Monticello is unique and special as is; we need to preserve that

– not reinvent it. We cannot provide everything to everyone; the majority should rule and common sense should always prevail. We chose to live at Lake Monticello as is – there is no need to compete with other homeowners' associations.

Moving forward, perhaps our new board will consider holding two town halls annually. It would help ensure that the board is practicing transparency and accountability by communicating regularly with the membership – before major concerns and fiscal perils occur.

No doubt, being a director may be a thankless and no-win position at times. Most residents appreciate the good work the board has done and, hopefully, will continue doing. But all directors need to remember: You chose the position, and you are there to responsibly represent the community as a whole. Please be the good stewards that you were elected to be – for all of us. Thank you.

Reader shares slice of WWI history

I want to tell your readers how much we enjoyed Page Gifford's article on Sue Mink's travels to Croatia, which appeared in the July 25 edition. In my childhood I spent a summer vacationing on the Adriatic Coast and remember the beauty of the area and am fascinated by the historical treasures encompassed by the Balkans.

The one major historical error in the story came with the assertion: "It was on a street corner in Sarajevo that Emperor Franz Joseph was assassinated, starting World War I." The victims of that assassination were Archduke Frank Ferdinand and his wife Sophie.

The archduke was the son of Karl Ludwig, Franz Joseph's brother. The emperor died in 1916 at age 86, his 68-year reign being the third-longest after Louis IV of France and Johannes II of Liechtenstein. Franz Ferdinand was the only suitable candidate for the position because Archduke Ferdinand Maximilian, Franz Joseph's brother and emperor of Mexico, had died and Archduke Karl Ludwig, the next in line, had renounced his succession rights in favor of his son, Franz Ferdinand. He was an uncultured rough-and-tumble man who became even more reclusive following hismorganatic marriage to Sophie Chotek von Chotkova in 1900. Morganatic partners, where one is of noble descent and the other is a commoner, do not assume the rank or property of their parents.

His view of the Austro-Hungarian monarchy was quite different from that of his uncle, Franz Joseph, and he sought to change the format to allow the Slavs to have an equal voice. Many of the minorities in the monarchy had autonomy as their rights and resented any association with other members of the monarchy.

The court in Vienna decided that Franz Ferdinand had to be paraded among the people to make him look imperial. He was sent to inspect the armed forces at Sarajevo where, on June 28, 1914, the couple was assassinated. This day was also the couple's 14th wedding anniversary, which permitted the wife, the commoner Sophie, to ride in the same car as her husband.

The crowds along the parade route were festive, but there were seven members of the Black Hand movement in the crowd. As the imperial car passed the first assassin, Muhamed Mehmedbaxis, he got cold feet and did nothing. The next man, Nedeljko Cabrinovic, threw a bomb from his pocket, striking a lamppost and alerting the driver of the car, who accelerated. The bomb glanced off Franz Ferdinand's raised arm and exploded on the pavement, injuring a dozen spectators.

Cabrinovic swallowed a cyanide tablet, but the poison was old and instead of killing him, it made him vomit. He tried to escape by jumping in the Miljacka River, which, to his chagrin, was only a few inches deep at the time. He was arrested.

The motorcade proceeded to City Hall for a reception. Another conspirator, Gavrilo Princip, strolled into Moritz Schiller's food store to buy himself a sandwich. The reception did take place for the Habsburg royals, but word of a possible assassination attempt went down the line of drivers, who took different routes as they each went on their own way. Franz Ferdinand's car happened to stop directly in front of Schiller's food store, a mere five feet from Princip, munching on his lunch.

He drew his pistol and fired twice, then turned the gun on himself, but the crowd mobbed him. He then swallowed his poison, which was also old, and made him violently throw up but did not kill him. Franz Ferdinand was hit in his neck while Sophie was hit in the stomach. Losing her seat, she sank, cast a last look at her husband and died.

In Vienna things became chaotic and the government was forced to ask for an armistice Nov. 11.

Hope that this detailed update will interest other readers too, but will not take any credit away from the article's writer.

Photo sought of Palmyra veteran

Image of Harold Owen Richardson needed for memorial

Eight years ago my husband and I made our first trip to Washington, D.C. Because Vietnam was the war that was going on while I was in high school, the first memorial on my list was the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall. Even though I never knew anyone killed in Vietnam, I wanted a rubbing of one of the names. I approached the wall and chose a name: Gregory John Crossman, missing in action.

When I returned home I decided to research Gregory and try to find his family. In the event they were never able to go to the wall, I planned to send them the etching, hoping they would share a photo with me of Gregory. Off and on for six months I researched and never found any family, but finally my cousin, our family historian, found a college photo of Gregory.

Two years later I saw a story in our local news about the Wall of Faces project for the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund. The goal of the project is to put a face with every name etched on the wall. I immediately sent in the photo I had of Gregory Crossman.

Five days later I received an email from Jan Scruggs, the founder and then-president of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund foundation. He thanked me for sending the photo – the first for this hero – and, since I am local, asked if I could help him find photos for the 42 Maui County, Hawaii, fallen that were killed in Vietnam. I told him it would be an honor. I have always hoped I could do something for the Vietnam veterans as I believe the way they were treated when they returned was disgraceful. Here was my chance.

What I thought would be an easy project, due to Maui's small size, was anything but easy. I started by combing the phone books calling every like name of each soldier. I found about 10 of them this way. Then I checked archived yearbooks for every high school on Maui and found a few more. I headed to the library to look for obituaries and found three more.

Then I went to the *Maui News*, which printed a beautiful front page article about the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund and the Education Center. I started

receiving photos from all over the United States. I was unaware how many people read the *Maui News* online. The *Maui News* ran an article about every six weeks printing the list of names of photos I still needed. Every time they ran a story, I would receive another photo or two. After six months of searching I had a photo of every fallen hero from Maui County.

Once I had all the photos I decided I did not want to keep this to myself. I needed to share it with Maui County. I had a display made with all 42 photos and take it all over Maui giving presentations to high schools, libraries and civic groups. It has been well received.

I then moved on to my hometown of Hemet, Calif., and found the five soldiers from my childhood home. I also became involved in trying to locate photos of Native American soldiers, which brought me to begin searching for all soldiers in California.

Over 500 newspapers have run this story throughout Hawaii, California and 27 other states. The response has been amazing: I have collected over 7,000 photos since 2011. With your help it

will be more. I am taking one state at a time, moving west to east. I have helped to complete the states of Montana, Oregon, Idaho, Nevada, Washington, Utah, Colorado, South Dakota, Alaska, Idaho, Kansas, Missouri, Hawaii, Kentucky, Alabama and Arkansas, and we are very close on several others.

All of these photos will be submitted to the Wall of Faces online memorial with the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund website, as well as accompanying The Wall that Heals, a replica of the monument that travels all over the U.S.

Putting a face with a name changes the whole dynamic of the wall. It keeps our fallen heroes' memories alive and honors them so that their stories and sacrifice will never be forgotten.

Palmyra veteran picture needed

We need a photo of Harold Owen Richardson (1948-1970), who received two Bronze Stars. His home of record is Palmyra. He is buried at Little Rock Holy Church Cemetery in Fluvanna County. His parents were Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Richardson of Palmyra. He is the last photo we need for Fluvanna County out of four.

If anyone is a relative, friend or former classmate of Richardson, I would very much appreciate hearing from you. Even if you don't have a photo of him but know which school he attended, it would be so helpful. We need to obtain a photo of every single fallen hero whose names are etched on the wall: all 58,315 of them. To date we have collected over 53,000 photos.

I am also looking for an individual that would like to volunteer to be my "boots on the ground" in Fluvanna if we do not find Richardson's photo. It may mean a trip to the library to search for obituaries or to a high school to look through yearbooks.

Readers can also help improve the photos we currently have. Go to the Wall of Faces page online, type names into the search box, and view the profiles that come up. It is possible readers may have better photos of their friends and loved ones than the one that has already been uploaded.

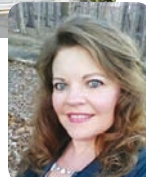

Member of 11th Fluvanna generation vows to stay in county

Charles Haden Parrish, or Haden as he is known, is a member of the 11th generation dating back to the 1690s in Fluvanna, and is related to the Hadens, Parrishes and E.W. Thomas – families who helped build businesses, farms and the community. While many young people shun rural areas to explore college, career options and opportunities, Parrish, 23, has returned to his roots. Centuries of family history and his admiration for his ancestors, their stories, hard work and traditions, have drawn him back home to stay and raise his own family.

A recent University of Virginia graduate with a double major in sociology and African American studies, Parrish is currently a college adviser at Fluvanna County High School through AmeriCorps, a nonprofit program that aims to help communities meet critical needs. This is Parrish's second and final year, then he plans to go to graduate school for a degree in school counseling and return to Fluvanna.

He brims with enthusiasm about his job at the high school, where he helps students figure out their future. Fluvanna County High School was one of the original high schools participating in the program; now there are 46.

"Students come to me with some idea of what they want to do and we discuss the best path, whether it be two years or four years of college or trade school," Parrish said. "It is scary to look toward

the future, but it is what I help my students do." Not much older than those he counsels, he says this as he looks toward his own future with uncertainty about where life will take him, yet he keeps his eye fixed on his goals.

He pointed out that Fluvanna's career and technical education (CTE) program is strong, including nursing, culinary, EMT, agriculture, carpentry and engineering. This program helps both those who want to explore a particular career and those who are certain of their career goals and want to build a basic foundation with technical and employable skills.

Aside from the CTE program, he praised electives like business, law, journalism and sociology.

"Our clubs are also expanding. We have book clubs, business, alliances, service, and others that are invaluable to the students," Parrish said. "This gives them more opportunities and resources in addition to the ones they can Google themselves," he said.

The biggest event of the year for Parrish is Decision Day, when students declare what college they are planning to attend and perhaps their major. He admitted with a grin that the event is challenging but rewarding.

Parrish volunteers with the Fluvanna Historical Society and has also enrolled in the Fluvanna Leadership Development Program for a second time.

"The first time I did it in high school

but I didn't feel I had the appropriate mindset to absorb it all and wanted to go through the program again," Parrish said. He's especially interested in the schools, having attended School Board meetings and expressed interest in the role of the board in determining the future of Fluvanna students.

"I am not necessarily looking for a formalized leadership role, but I wanted to continue living here and giving back to the community. My goal is to return to Fluvanna and make it the best it can be," he said. "I have viewed Fluvanna through different lenses. Everyone wants to see growth, but it takes time and planning."

Recent changes, including the EMS towers, broadband coming to the more rural parts of the county, and the use of new technology, has broadened the county's horizons for the better, Parrish said. He acknowledged that supporting all of Fluvanna's residents while maintaining the county's rural image and balancing that with economic reality is

a hard line to walk.

"I would like to make sure schools are adequately funded. We do incredibly well with the funding we have," Parrish said. He also wants the county to "continue to support our area history and our strong sense of agriculture and make sure that all Fluvanna residents have access to resources."

He expressed mixed feelings on Fluvanna's current direction.

"I think we are growing too fast residentially and I am nervous but excited at the same time. But we need to expand the infrastructure, maintain our roads and agriculture, and I hope we can keep up economically." He hopes his second round of the Fluvanna Leadership Development Program will yield more understanding of the county for which he has such a deep passion.

"We're fortunate to live between Charlottesville and Richmond," Parrish said. "It is a nice, rural oasis."

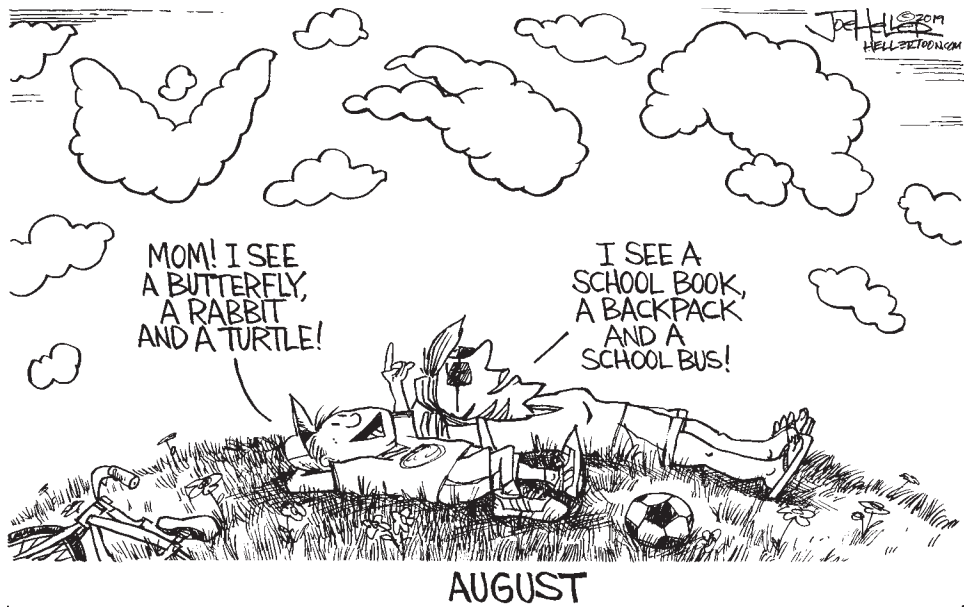
As an elected official, the County Treasurer is accountable to the citizens it serves. In this capacity, the treasurer acts in the best interest of the people or face political admonishment. Also, transparency is the tool used to regulate accountability activities of government officials. The Merriam-Webster defines transparency as "the quality or state of being transparent." In a political sense, the application of transparency is being open and honest with the people who voted you in office, and to illustrate to them that you are operating within the mandate afforded to your office.

Essentially, transparency allows for information sharing, constructive feedback, and community review of elected officers. Ideally, an active transparency program will

strengthen relationship with the community, elevate office confidence, and foster meaningful accountability practices with Fluvanna constituents. To help accomplish this, I will conduct community collaborative meetings to report office initiatives, provide updates, and receive inputs from county voters. These meetings would be consistent with the policy of not releasing sensitive and confidential material.

As your county treasurer, I would pledge to be open and honest with you while seeking to exchange information and ideas that would enhance the operations of the treasurer's office. For me, transparency is the underpinning of good governance that ensures honesty, integrity, shenanigans free activity, service-over-self, and accountability to county residents regarding how funds are collected, expenditures paid, and revenues invested.

Continuing the fun, Friday night will host the 4-H livestock show and the antique tractor pull. The 4-H Livestock Club has been preparing for this event for months in the hopes of selling their animals at the fair. Members of the club learn about leadership development, community service, and gain hands-on experience with their animals. And let's not forget the musical guests for the evening, Krossroads, who take the stage at 6:30 p.m.

As for Saturday, the day is filled with entertainment ranging from carnival rides to music to additional scheduled events for all ages. Guests can enjoy a magic-filled morning with magician Wes Iseli, a pie eating contest and DJ Rick. Lake golf course joins sanctuary program

The Lake Monticello Golf Course has received recognition in environmental planning from the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program (ACSP) for Golf Courses, an international program designed to help landowners preserve and enhance the environmental quality of their property.

The ACSP for Golf Courses provides an educational service to help existing golf courses develop effective conservation and wildlife enhancement programs and achieve recognition for their efforts. After the environmental plan is approved, properties in the program may apply for recognition in wildlife and habitat management, chemical use reduction and safety, water conservation, water quality management, and outreach and education by demonstrating that they have met minimum requirements for each category. Once the course has been recognized in all categories and received a site visit from Audubon In-

ternational staff, they are designated as a certified Audubon cooperative sanctuary.

"The open space of a golf course is utilized not only by golfers, but is [also] habitat for a variety of wildlife species," said Christine Kane, CEO of Audubon International. "We welcome Lake Monticello's commitment to the environment and to managing the golf course with wildlife in mind."

By joining and participating in the ACSP, the Lake Monticello Golf Course will be involved in projects that enhance habitat for wildlife and preserve natural resources for the benefit of the local community – like the Lake's existing blue bird program.

"The ACSP benefits both people and wildlife," said Kane. "It's a great way for the managers of developed properties and environmental organizations to work together to become better stewards of land and natural resources."

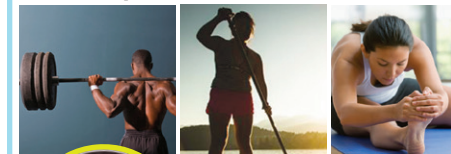

Coach aims to develop depth this season

Head football coach Mike Morris was named Jefferson District Coach of the Year last season after leading the Flucos to their first winning season and first playoff appearance in a very long time.

Morris said he hopes that last season's successes will not lead to too high expectations for this year's squad. However, he believes this season's schedule is favorable to the development of the depth that he is looking for at some positions.

The team opens its season with a scrimmage at William Monroe High on Aug. 16. On Aug. 23 the Flucos will host a three-way scrimmage with Fork Union Military Academy and New Kent High. The regular season opens with a trip to Broadway High on Aug. 30. The Flucos will then travel Sept. 6 to Spotsylvania, a Class 3 playoff team from last season. The following Friday Nelson County, a Class 2 team, comes to Fluvanna. After a bye week, the Flucos host Waynesboro Sept 27.

The tough Jefferson District schedule does not start until October. On Oct. 4 the Flucos host Charlottesville. On Oct. 11 they play their fourth home game in a row, hosting Western Albemarle in the Flucos' homecoming game. Home games start at 7 p.m.

By the time Jefferson District play opens, Morris expects that some of his younger players will be battle tested and able to step up and contribute. The team has some quality experienced players returning. The roster will include 17-18 seniors and 11-12 juniors.

Returning at quarterback is Kobe Edmunds, who turned in an impressive performance last season as a freshman. Morris lost most of his running back core to graduation and said that the team may do running back "by committee." He mentioned Malachi Hill, who was one of a number of contributing running backs last season. Also look for Gabe and Tyler Stoy, Nathan

Mentor and Justin Sullivan to get some carries. The coaching staff is also high on freshman running back Jaden Ferguson, who has turned heads with some outstanding track performances.

Morris notes that the offensive and defensive lines are the heart of the team. It is especially encouraging that the Flucos have some quality returnees, since it is common knowledge that football games are often won or lost in the trenches. Morris mentioned linemen Walter Stribling, Alden Custer and Trevor Wade and commented that he will probably rotate players in and out on both lines. Custer gained honorable mention honors at the District level last season as an offensive lineman. At the end of last season he was listed as 5'11 and 250. Stribling was first team All-District last season at offensive tackle. He was listed as 6-6 and 310 last year and is a dominating presence. Wade is also a big young athlete with a listing of 6-0 and 255.

On defense Morris is looking for some depth at linebacker. He expects Hill to lead the way for the linebacking corps, as he was first team All-District last season. Gabe Stoy is expected to be a tough man to block at outside linebacker. The secondary is one place that Morris feels he has solid depth. He mentioned Elijah Bullock, Keshawn Fisher, Cameron Holland and Devon Glasgow. He also expects that Edmunds will contribute in the defensive backfield.

The Fluco offense will be a "hybrid wing T." The quarterback will take some snaps over center and some shotgun hikes. Fluco opponents can expect to have to defend against some open sets. Morris said that the defense he deploys will depend a lot on what the opposition is doing. He may use a 4-4, a 4-2 or a 3-3.

For the first time this season, the coaching staff is putting together an eighth grade football team.
