What a Valuable Gap Year!

lthough Clemson University welcomed her to join other incoming freshman, Newlin Humphrey accepted another challenge that will defer her enrollment until the fall semester of 2018. After completing a detailed application and several interviews, she was selected as a Future Farmers of America state representa-

The 2018 graduate of Fluvanna County High School, who lives near Kent's Store and has close ties with Louisa County, joined FFA when the high school's chapter was rechartered after Russell Jennings, a former LCHS ag science teacher and FFA chapter sponsor, transferred to Fluvanna.

"I was in eighth grade," she said. "I was chapter president my junior year and student advisor as a senior which was a hands-on mentoring role. I also took the three agricultural-related classes offered at Fluvanna and did an independent study in floriculture."

Throughout high school, Newlin worked on her Supervised Agricultural Experience, an FFA requirement. She chose the field of equine placement. She signed on as an unpaid intern with Sally and David Lamb at Oakland Heights Farm, north of Gordonsville.

I helped with everyday barn tasks including feeding and caring for the horses mostly after school and on weekends until my senior year when I had early dismissal and clocked over 1400 hours." she said. "I worked with younger riders and had the opportunity to ride some of the more experienced horses as well as some green ones. I had to complete proficiency reports.'

As an FFA member, Newlin also attended leadership conferences and the state convention. But it was the summer leadership camps at Graves Mountain Lodge that motivated her to pursue FFA after graduation.

"I met other members throughout the state, and I decided to try to become a state level officer because of the opportunities it offered," she said. "I had to wait until the last event of the state convention last June to see if the nominating committee had chosen me. They selected me as reporter, one of eight 2018-2019 state officers.'


One of her duties throughout last year was to visit FFA chapters from Tidewater and inter-city Richmond to Northern Virginia and southwestern counties. Newlin remarked that because of the whirlwind of activities she has put about 30,000 miles on her

Using Warner Brother's cartoons to capture the kids' attention, he incidentally taught them comedic timing in the process. The post-camp performance on Friday evening was charming, touching and of course, funny. It was amazing what the students were able to learn from Steve during these short camp sessions.

As a former Ringling Barnum and Bailey Circus Clown, you can bet Steve takes his clowning seriously. Steve was invited to lead this unconventional educational opportunity by his friend LaVahn Hoh, former interim director of the Arts Center. As Ringling's Circus Goodwill Ambassador and Dean of the Ringling Clown College in Florida for ten years, Steve is a wealth of information and talent. He directed the 123rd edition of "the Greatest Show on Earth," as well as co-created and directed four original productions for Big Apple Circus in New York. He cruised through more clowning by leading Krooze Komics, a clowning program for the Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines, for nine years.

You can also catch Steve in the 2010 PBS television documentary "CIRCUS." As a five- time Emmy Award Winner in children's television and a member of the Clown Hall of Fame, his love for the craft of clowning and his desire to pass on this passion was readily apparent in his enthusiastic teaching. If we are lucky, Steve may return next summer to teach another class at the Art's Center... perhaps expanding to teach older youth and adults. (Give me my big red nose and a huge pencil to sign on the dotted line please....HONK! HONK!)

The Louisa Arts Center summer camps provide great opportunities for growth, and the numbers have reflected the community's growing enthusiasm; enrollment has increased 135% this summer, to include 75 children across six camps. Director of Programming Meagan DuBois, explains that besides the curriculum, students learn much more: respect for one another, expectations for behavior in the space of an art center and how to build relationships with children from different schools and backgrounds. "Campers come in shy and unsure on the first day, but throughout the week, they learn who

they are. They grow in their abilities and are motivated to embrace future possibilities. They learn joy and pride and leave with friends, peers and support-

These summer camps are possible in part by strong partnerships with the Louisa Rotary Club, Louisa Jr. Women's Club, and the LaVahn and Mary Frances Hoh Scholarship Fund. Fourteen students have been recipients of such scholarships this summer.

Meagan would like to reach a goal of having 100 campers in the 2020 summer session, as well as solve an ongoing need for providing transportation for student participants. Other summer programs reach out to more children. Public school teachers Rodrick Rhodes and Kaitlin Mull have partnered with LAC to provide mobile art camps. Area children have enjoyed several of these art camps at Jouett Square Town Homes, Mineral Trailer Park and 605 Trailer Park. classes. We had four varying presentations such as Team Dynamics or Opportunities in Agriculture. The teachers could request the topic," she said. "During the year, I visited 42 schools with a partner which was one of the other state officers."

More rural schools had campuses that allowed extensive agricultural projects which included livestock, while those in urban areas might be limited to a greenhouse. One Richmond school offered a vet science program.

A highlight of the year was two weeks in South Africa last fall. From among hundreds of applications, Newlin was selected to be one of 83 officers from across the United States to attend an international leadership seminar.

"We spent one week in Pretoria focusing on agro-tourism and seeing

how the climate affects livestock and grain production," she said. "We visited a game preserve and learned how environmental concerns affect population control of animals such as elephants who can deforest areas and lions that have no natural predators."

In South Africa, the group also attended college lectures and visited historical sites and museums. They experienced the beauty of the ocean at the Cape of Good Hope.

Since FFA is a member-led organization, the eight officers with help from several alumni officers planned and organized the state convention held last month at Virginia Tech.

"We spent over a month prepping from ordering award and degree plaques to creating slide show presentations," she said. "We had to line up the keynote speakers and plan the sessions. It was a lot of detail work."

At the convention, the officers gave their retirement addresses and were recognized for their dedication. But, her responsibilities were not over. She helped facilitate last month's leadership camp at Graves Mountain with 200 participants anticipated.

Her only regret was that the demands of a state officer limited her involvement

with horses. But, at Clemson she plans to try out for the equestrian team and resume her SAE project. She hopes to join Agriculture Future for America and Farm Bureau Young Farmers. Clemson has a FFA alumni chapter.

"I plan to receive a bachelor's degree in agricultural education with a teaching emphasis and minor in horticulture and non-profit leadership. Clemson is one of only a few colleges that have this program," she said. "I will probably continue to earn a master's and then teach high school agricultural classes."

If all goes as planned, Newlin will also earn the prestigious American Star award which would be presented at the 2020 National FFA Convention in Indianapolis.




