The Timeless Art of the Lake of the Woods Artisans

ocated in the northeastern tip of Orange County, Lake of the Woods is a private, planned residential community of single-family homes built around a man-made lake. Developed in 1967, it has evolved into a population of year-round and seasonal residents who enjoy the many recreational, social, and cultural offerings. There are 4,100 houses on 2,600 acres with a total population of approximately 9,500 people, making it the most populated area in Orange County.

Earlier this year, I attended a party at the home of Elaine and Joe Freeland in Lake of the Woods. It was my first visit to this wonderful development, and I

was quite taken with the beauty of the setting and the residents I met. The Freelands dazzled me with the amazing pottery they made and displayed throughout their house. I met some of their neighbors, and I learned that there is a large community of talented and diverse artisans within Lake of the Woods who show and sell their artwork at an annual art show. I wanted to know more about them and was delighted to meet several of these gifted folks at a Lake of the Woods Visual Arts Council meeting.

Lake of the Woods Visual Arts Council's 36th Art Show

The Lake of the Woods Visual Arts Council hosted its first show in 1982. The Arts Show has grown to welcome an average of 500 attendees and 45 artisans exhibiting and selling their art. This year's show will be held on September 28 and 29 at the Lake of the Woods Community Center.

All of the artisans are members of the Lake of the Woods Arts Council. They give back to the Orange County community by donating 15% of the total intake of the Show, including the table fees and what is sold and auctioned off, to Orange County art teachers for their classroom needs. They donated \$1,700 in 2017 and \$3,600 in 2018.

In past years, the Show has included art that Orange County art students created in their classrooms. This year, for the first time, Orange County art teachers were given 24x36 canvases for their students to make a poster for the Show. Each teacher

will determine how to the engage their students in this project. Each poster will be raffled, and it will be exciting to see what the students create!

Other raffle items to benefit the school arts programs will be generously donated by the artisans. This year the raffle will include pottery by Joe and Elaine Freeland, an oil painting by Peter Brown, a watercolor by Patty Bell, and a stained glass art class by Toni Ruther.

Show attendees can look forward to seeing a wide range of visual arts, including multi-media artwork, books, floral designs, needlework and quilts, photography, pottery, jewelry, stained glass, and wood art – something for everybody! Let's meet some of the multi-talented artisans who will be exhibiting or selling their creations at the Show.

The Potters

Potters Elaine and Joe Freeland were both software engineers at Lockheed Martin in Northern Virginia before retiring to Lake of the Woods. They designed and built their house with a pottery studio in mind, and one-third of the house is devoted to their studio that faces the lake.

They became fascinated with pottery when visiting New Mexico and marveled at the distinctive hand-coiled pots. But it was not until 20 years later that Joe found himself inspired while sitting at

the old patterns, and Flow Blue is the most popular and recognized china pattern that she uses. She makes custom pieces, such as broaches or pendants, for families who want a keepsake of their treasured family china.

For 25 years, Toni has also been creating beautiful stained glass. She retired from the State Department and Environmental Protection Agency, but she is not really "retired" – she is very busy with her "Timeless Patterns" business. She also sells her jewelry at a gallery in the Outer Banks and will host a show in their home in November. Her husband Jack designs the images for their clients. They have created swans, geese, lighthouses, angels, and stained glass windows featuring the lake. A graduate of the Corcoran School of Art, Jack retired from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. He designed the last two series of U.S. paper money (except the \$1 and \$100 bills). What a talented team they make!

The Quilter

Among the many needlework artisans at Lake of the Woods is a group that calls itself the "Closet Quilters." The group is comprised of 15 quilters who meet in the craft room at the Community Center. One of the members, Pat Lieb, who is originally from Pennsylvania, learned how to quilt from a book 30 years ago. She creates mostly small pieces such as baby quilts and wall hangings to sell, but keeps the larger quilts she makes for her family. She will be selling some of her lovely quilts at the Show.

The Photographer

Marco de Vito, a retired government contract executive, started serious photography 15 years ago. While he was traveling in Egypt, his point and shoot camera jammed with sand while he was taking pictures in the desert. His friend lent him his more sophisticated DSLR (digital single-lens reflex camera) and, after 30 minutes of using it, Marco was hooked. He enjoys being outside and finds photography to be a good escape. His subjects are mostly landscapes and animals and, as he

After retiring from a career in broadcasting, Peter Brown and his wife moved to Lake of the Woods. He painted in his 20s before he got a "real job." It wasn't until he retired that he became more serious about art and took classes. He works in oils and acrylics, mostly painting landscapes, seascapes, and some florals. He aspires to paint daily, but his painting has slowed down due to his involvement in the many Lake of the Woods activities, including being on the Board of Directors of the Lake of the Woods Association.

The Artists

Patty Bell, a native of California, retired from a varied career, including being the Executive Director of a Girl Scout Council. She has been doing art on and off for 50 years. Patty enjoys painting animals and people she photographs first, catching her subjects unaware in candid poses. Working with art medium from watercolors to pastels, she paints in her home studio, which has a glorious view of the lake and plenty of light and room. She mats and frames all of her art-

Sallie Wallace dreamed of being a nurse from the time she was three years old, and that's all she ever wanted to do. Her dream was realized, and she worked in all areas of nursing, including teaching, in a variety of hospitals. Originally from Pennsylvania, Sallie lived all over as a military wife. She traveled every weekend to find a home on the water, and she eventually found Lake of the Woods. She finds so many things, especially the lake and the wildlife, that inspire her to paint. She has been painting on and off since she was seven years old and paints "whatever captures her eye" using oils and acrylics. Look for Sallie's exquisite paintings at the Show.

The Authors

Lake of the Woods is home to several prolific and published writers who will be selling their books at the Show. They belong to the "Lake Authors of the Wilderness" group that "supports and educates writers in polishing, promoting and selling their work." This eclectic group, started in 2011, currently has 22 members who meet monthly to inspire and motivate each other. They sell their books at festivals and online through Amazon and Barnes & Noble. In 2017, the group co-authored a collection of stories, poems, and memoir pieces entitled Holiday Musings. In 2018, the group published Lake Authors of the Wilderness Cookbook, a collection of the authors' treasured family recipes, which celebrate the talents and diversity of the writers.

As a child growing up in Texas, Melinda Crocker spent hot summers daydreaming and reading adventure and mysteries such as Nancy Drew, the Hardy Boys, and Sherlock Holmes. She wanted to travel to the places she read about and create her own adventures. Suspense is her passion and, after a career as a bookkeeper, she is now a published writer of mysteries. She calls her first series "Seasons of Suspense" wherein all the women protagonists are named for a season. Melinda has three books in print now –The Truth About Autumn, Chasing Winter, and Where Has Summer Gone? Her fourth and last in the series will be Killing Spring. What adventures and mysteries from her imagination next await her readers? Melinda's first novel was based in the remote mountains of New Mexico, where she lived for several years. Her travels to the Caribbean inspired her second book, and her third takes place in a lake community – much like the one where she lives. (Names have been changed to protect the innocent.) Melinda moved to Virginia from Northern California to be closer to her daughter in Alexandria. She says that her daughter's involvement in law enforcement has been a terrific source for her books.

A native of Illinois, Judy Hill moved to Lake of the Woods after retiring from the Pentagon. A business writer for most of her career, she published her first historical fiction novel under her pen name J. Allen Hill. (She used her maiden name and initial to be gender neutral.) She took ten years to write her first book, The Secret Diary of Ewan Macrae, about a Scottish immigrant coming to pre-Revolutionary War America. Her second book, The Cause – The Odyssey of Daniel Grant, is about a rebellious and curious farm boy who walked across Virginia into the Revolutionary War. Her third, a collection of short stories about people dealing with life, is entitled A Walk in the Woods and Other Journeys. She is currently working on The Summer of My Eleventh Birthday, which takes place in the Outer Banks during World War Il. As a history lover, Judy said that she wanted to go back in time and write about people living in her own history and beyond. The Revolutionary War era is her favorite. She knew she could make the Founding Fathers real, not just paper figures, puppets playing a part, or icons. She loves her characters, both real and imaginary, and works hard to make them into living, breathing people.

Growing up in an Army family, Allita Irby lived throughout the United States and in Germany. She retired from a career with Verizon and the Maryland National Capitol Park and Planning Commission. A book lover and avid reader her whole life, she was inspired by authors Terry McMillan and Toni Morrison. For years, Allita was a member of a book club in Maryland that together wrote a novel about a book club,

"Fourth Sunday, The Journey of a Book Club" using the pseudonym B.W. Read (for "because we read") that was published by Simon & Schuster. In addition to being a writer, she is also a mixedmedia artist who uses traditional media and found objects (known as collage and assemblage). She exhibited her art previous years, and this year she will be offering her fiction and poetry books for sale.

Lois Powell grew up in Connecticut and later lived in Long Island, where she taught writing. She and her husband, a school principal (now deceased), had a summer home at Lake of the Woods and retired there. She enjoys playing tennis, golf, swimming, reading and, of course, writing. Lois loves writing all types of stories but especially children's books. Her first book, Samantha's Big Challenge, is about a little girl's struggle in learning how to ride a bike and overcoming her fears to help her grandmother. She was inspired to write the book watching little girls in her neighborhood learning to ride bikes on her street. Her character Samantha returns

in her second book Samantha and Her New Friend that deals with peanut allergy challenges. Lois also has had several of her poems published by The International Poetry Society.

A New York native, Arlene Rich writes in a genre different from the spectrum of mysteries and children's' book of the other writers. She is a spiritual medium, advanced clinical hypnotherapist, interfaith minister, and spiritual counselor who has published two books on her experiences with the spirit world.
