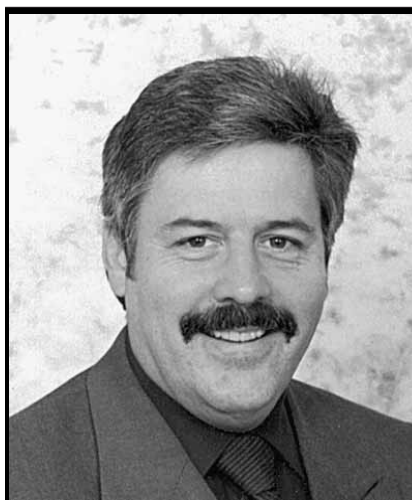

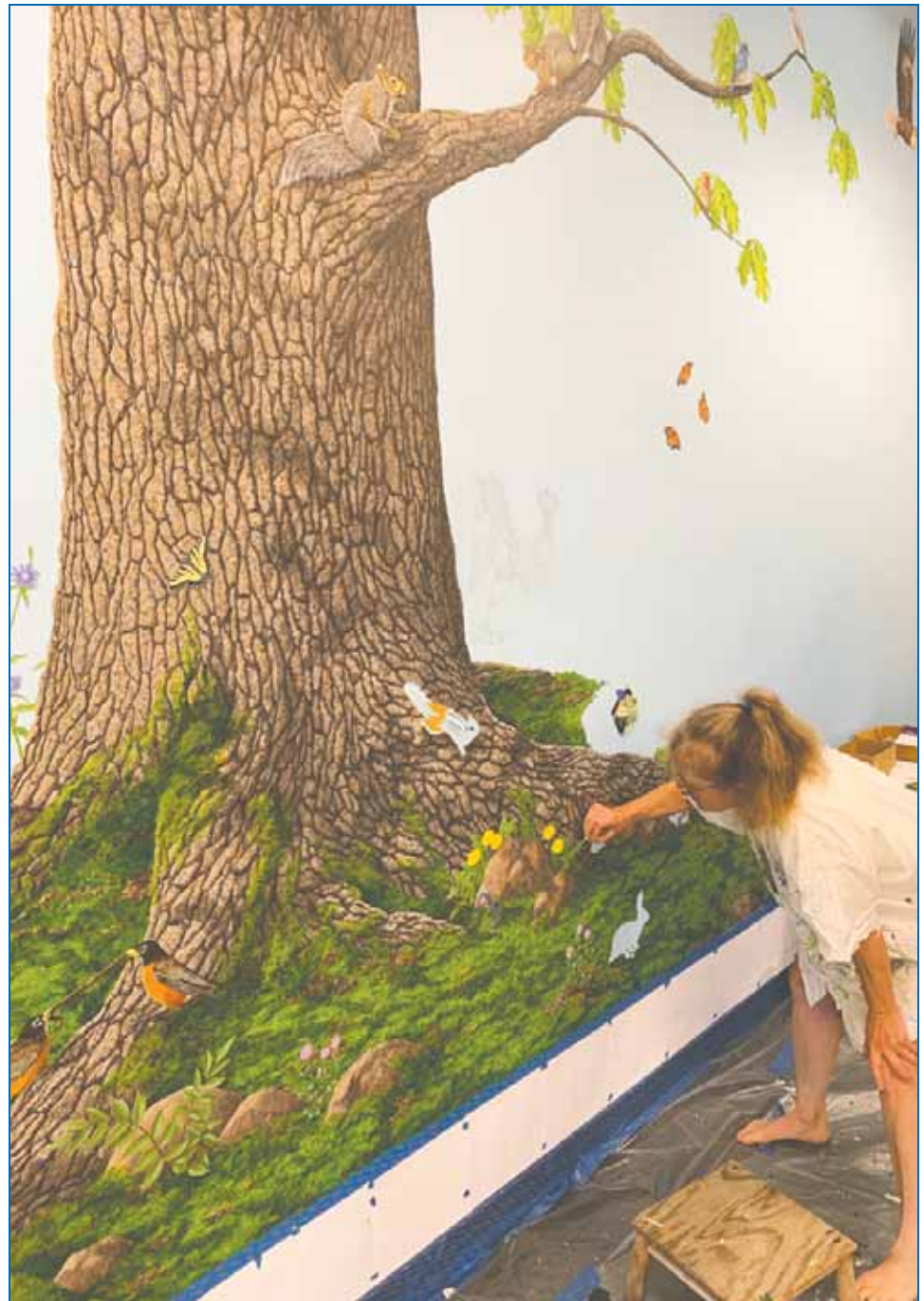

White started out playing ball for Buckingham County High School and then Virginia Episcopal School, where he played in two consecutive State Championship games. While attending East Carolina University, White started all four years, finished in the Top 4 in scoring in East Carolina's basketball history, while earning a Bachelor's Degree in Business Management. This past year White traveled to Perth, Western Australia where he played for the Rockingham Flames, part of the State Basketball League in Western Australia. During his season in Australia, White played 25 games, averaging 17 points, 4 rebounds, and 2 assists per game and earning a starting spot on the All-Star team. White, who returned to the U.S. in the fall, said that he enjoyed living in Australia and found that the only major adjustment was the left side of the road driving with the steering wheel on the right side of the cars.

COVER STORY: HONORING OUR VETERANS

Last November, in honor of Veteran's Day, the Buckingham Beacon featured, who were then considered to be, the five remaining World War II veterans living in the county. Since that feature, we regret to say that two of those members of the "Greatest Generation" have passed.

To continue recognition of our county's veterans, and with the assistance of Buckingham County's VFW and American Legion, the Beacon began research on veterans of both the Korean and Vietnam Wars. The U.S. Department of Defense's website defines the Korean War as occurring between June 25, 1950 and July 27, 1953 and the Vietnam War as starting November 1, 1955 and ending April 30, 1975. Therefore, the veterans we are recognizing would have had to have served in Korea or Vietnam during those defined timelines.

The Beacon made numerous, concerted attempts to reach out to the community and, while many veterans responded, we know that this is not a complete list, by any means. Many thanks to those who did participate and also for contributing pictures and information. Here are just some of our Buckingham heroes who have served their country during the Korean and Vietnam wars.

Note: Clifton Crews, who was identified just before the Beacon's deadline, is both a World War II veteran as well as a veteran of the Korean War. At age 93, we are honored to have found him before press time so that he can be recognized for his double duty in serving his country.

BCMS FFA Competes at the State Fair of VA

Buckingham County Middle School FFA was very excited to have 65 students attend the State Fair of Virginia. The Educational Exposition at the fair is designed to educate youth about all the Commonwealth has to offer in a setting unlike any other. "Virginia's Largest Outdoor Classroom" provides students an opportunity to experience agriculture, history, technol-

ogy, and natural resources first-hand.

In addition to all the exhibits at the fair, students in Career and Technical Education (CTE) classes also had the chance to showcase what they have learned by competing with other schools through the SkillsUSA program. SkillsUSA is a partnership of students, teachers and industry representatives working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce. Nine BCMS students were a part of the competition at the recent State Fair. These agriculture students competed in Forestry Field Day. The team events included two-man crosscut saw, water accuracy, pulpwood log toss, log rolling, and cutting a log with a bow saw. The team placed seventh overall. Team members included Hunter Branch, Ethan Martin, Jake Carter, Gavin Dunkum, Andrew Dorrier, Avery Schaeffer, Briane Slape & Taylor Duncan.

BCMS also had two teams participate in the Junior Foresters event held at the fair. The Junior Foresters team A included members Hunter Branch, Jake Carter, Ethan Martin and Andrew Dorrier. Team B included Taylor Duncan, Gavin Dunkum, Gabriela Mondragon, and Joseph Love. The event, run by the Virginia Department of Forestry, tests students' knowledge and skills in a variety of activities. Participants had to identify trees from leaf samples, identify disease and insect problems, and identify the tools used in the forest industry, as well as measuring trees to determine lumber volume and estimating land area.

Olivia Cummings and Sydney Oliver also participated in the Agricultural Demonstration competition on the junior level. Contestants performed demonstration topics that dealt with agriculture within any of the following areas: Plant and Soil Science, Animal Science, Agricultural Marketing & Agricultural Business, Natural Resources Management & Environmental Science, and Agricultural Engineering. Following the demonstrations contestants answered questions about their topics. Olivia and Sydney performed a demonstration on

how to cut a dog or cat's toenails.

Emily Long and Jenna Oliver participated in the Horticultural Demonstration competition. Contestants performed demonstration topics that dealt with fruits, vegetables, nuts, flowers, ornamental plants, and turf within any of the following areas: crop production or soil management, crop marketing or preparation for storage and exhibition, food preparation, floral material preservation, artistic arrangement, or landscaping. Following the demonstrations contestants answered questions about their topics. Emily and Jenna performed a demonstration on how to make asexual stem cuttings from a vine.

Andrew Dorrier also participated in the Agriscience Research Poster Contest held at the fair. The Agriscience Fair is an exciting opportunity for students interested in scientific principles and emerging technologies in the agricultural industry. The Agriscience Fair gives students a chance to display agriscience projects that represent original scientific research in one of the following areas: animal systems, environmental services/natural resources, food products and processing, plant systems, and power systems and social systems. Andrew's research on the germination rates of treated corn seed vs. untreated corn seed placed 2nd at the junior level.

BCMS also had a team compete in the FFA/4H Horse Hippology contest. The contest consisted of three phases. First phase was horse judging where contestants placed 2 halter classes and 2 performance. The second phase was an examination where they identified equine breeds, health conditions, conformation faults, color, color patterns, anatomy, disciplines and their proper appointments. The third phase was a series of stations or tables where all contestants will respond to the station's requirements. Team members included Jenna Oliver, Kaleigh Haines, Emily Long and Liberty Johnson.

Buckingham News: White Hall, 1899

By the spring of 1899, the *Appomattox and Buckingham Times* was a well-established newspaper. Correspondents from Buckingham County contributed columns on a regular basis, including one from the village of White Hall. The enthusiastic correspondent was identified only as "R." On April 27, 1899, the newspaper published:

White Hall.

Since the weather has been fair and favorable for work, the population has been very busy getting their potatoes planted and some have begun to plant corn.

Our town, while not actually on the boom, is building up in a quiet way. The sound of the saw and the hammer is heard, as new buildings are going up.

Mr. W. R. Silvey is having a residence put up. He has purchased the farm of Mr. George W. Garratt, which lies adjacent to this place.

Mr. Geo. W. Garratt and family have removed from their home here to some place in Pennsylvania.

Mr. Robert Smith of this neighborhood, and Miss Jesse Garratt, of this place, were married last week; Rev. W. E. Grant officiating. We hope for the parties much happiness in their married life.

Our Mr. Jefferson Davis is returned last week from New York.

Mrs. H. M. White, accompanied by her son Wilbur, left last week to spend some weeks visiting relatives and friends at Warrenton, Va. we wish her a pleasant visit and a safe return.

Mrs. Wm. R. Silvey is this week visiting her relatives near Rival, Va.

Miss. Susie Harden, of this place, is visiting friends at Gravel Hill.

Mrs. Willie A. Moss is visiting her relatives at Mount Vinco. On her return, we think our friend Willie will have everything already for health. . . .

We are glad to see letters from several Buckingham correspondents. Let's keep our paper to the front.

Auction: White Hall (Dillwyn)

In 1904, as a result of a decree in the Buckingham County Circuit Court, land and machinery were to be auctioned at White Hall, later called Dillwyn. The sale was the result of a suit by Della M. Hall against the White Hall Company, et. al.

The property to be auctioned included 200 acres of land, already developed with many stores and other valuable buildings, plus an additional 100 town lots which had already been surveyed and laid off. An advertisement in Richmond's *Times-Dispatch* stated: "THE IMPROVEMENTS ARE EXCEEDINGLY VALUABLE." The Buckingham Branch of the C. & O. Railroad ran through the village. There was a public school house and churches, as well as stores. The advertisement went on to say:

The machinery and engines are in first-class condition, and are suitable for the manufacture of all kinds of lumber; hickory handles, etc. White Hall is a prosperous and growing village, in a fine farming region, and a valuable tobacco and lumber trade is

now carried on there. It would be a most excellent location for a furniture or wagon factory.

The terms were typical, one third in cash and the balance in equal installments. The purchaser was required to keep the buildings insured until the purchase money was fully paid. The advertisement was signed by the court-appointed Special Commissioners: F. C. Moon, Lynchburg, Virginia; John R. Moss, Buckingham Courthouse; S. S. P. Patteson, Richmond, Virginia.

Attorney Frank C. Moon also maintained a residence at Snowden in Buckingham County.
