

## Supervisors talk coronavirus and budgets

Fluvanna County is taking preliminary steps against the coronavirus.

In his report to the Board of Supervisors on Wednesday night (March 4), County Administrator Eric Dahl said there were already talks ongoing between the Virginia Department of Health and local governments. County office buildings will be getting some extra cleaning, and staff was being reminded to follow basic infection control like frequent handwashing, covering coughs, and staying home if they're sick.

However, Dahl added that if positive cases were discovered in Virginia, "then we're going to have to start creating more of an actionable plan."

### Budget


At a work session after the regular meeting, supervisors heard from Calvin Hickman, director of public works and Aaron Spitzer, head of parks and recreation.

Hickman, who manages 43 county buildings and properties, reminded supervisors that "it takes a lot of money to maintain old buildings," and costs for materials and services were on the rise. Asked what would happen if he didn't get the funding, he said they would prioritize critical issues, but all the needed work simply wouldn't get done.

Spitzer said one of his high-priority projects was fencing for the soccer field at Pleasant Grove, which is continually torn up by dogs, deer, and pedestrians. Fencing will cost about \$50,000.

Dahl spoke about the many



capital improvement projects (CIPs) on the county's wish list, from new school buses to major renovations on facilities.

Supervisor Tony O'Brien (Rivanna) said that with interest rates low and poised to go lower, "if we're going to borrow money, there's no better time to borrow money than now." Dahl agreed that it would be possible develop a package of high-priority projects and secure low-interest debt funding, although he couldn't say offhand how that might impact the current proposed budget plan.

One area where the county might be able to save money is in health insurance. Human Resources Director Jessica Rice explained that while the county's current provider, Cigna, was looking at a significant rate increase for 2021, The Local Choice, an Anthem provider, was offering them a package that would result in a 22% decrease over their current rates. More study needs to be done on the potential financial impacts on staffs and their families under the proposed plan.

### Funding approved

During the regular meeting, su-

pervisors unanimously approved a \$197,000 contract with CenturyLink to install new call handling equipment for the county's 911 center. This expenditure was anticipated as part of the migration to the new E911 system in 2018.

A supplemental appropriation of up to \$150,000 in debt funding for Fork Union Volunteer Fire Company's Engine 20 was approved 3-1 with Chair Mike Sheridan (Columbia) voting against the measure and Supervisors Tony O'Brien (Rivanna) absent for the first part of the evening.

Funding for the purchase of Engine 20 was approved in November 2019, but the original appropriation did not include equipment to outfit the vehicle.

Supervisors voted 4-0 to approve a public hearing for a rate increase for customers of the Fork Union Sanitary District (FUSD). With almost \$200,000 in deferred maintenance projects, under Dahl's proposal, the current rate of \$21 for the first 2,000 gallons of usage would raise to \$21.42. The cost for every 1,000 gallons over that would rise from \$11 to \$11.22.

This would be the first increase for FUSD customers since 2014, but likely won't be the last. The system currently needs about \$200,000 in deferred maintenance and could need an additional \$500,000 in the next five to ten years.

The public hearing will be held

April 15 at 7 p.m.

Supervisors also approved a public hearing that same night for a budget amendment on the Zion Crossroads water and sewer project.

Management analyst Liz McIver explained that they need to shift \$2.7 million from the unassigned fund balance to the project earlier than expected. While the request would simply move money from one fund to another, a public hearing is required under state law.

### Out of control spending and unfair taxation

The tax paying citizens of Fluvanna County are probably not aware that the Fluvanna Board of Supervisors will be casting their votes in the next few weeks regarding taxes, school funding, additional funding requests for non-profits and many other funding requests.

The county administrator is proposing a property tax increase, the Fluvanna school system is requesting \$43,330,198-- an increase of \$649,000 this year -- non-profits are asking for over \$600,000 in additional funding; the Drug Court is requesting \$50,000, etc. The Fluvanna County landfill lost about \$150,000 last year and that is set to increase this year. Fluvanna is in debt for around \$94 million, and spending millions on the Zion Crossroads water lines. The county is proposing about \$20 million for additional buildings at Pleasant Gove in the next five years, another very disturbing thought.

Fluvanna County provides (reduced taxes) for land use options for those that meet the minimum acreage usage requirements. Fluvanna consists of about 183,000 acres and over 110,000 of this taxable acreage is in some form of land use (reduced tax) status excluding county

owned property. Why is this important? Because that translates into about \$4.5 million in reduced taxes that could actually help reduce the tax rate if these properties paid the full accessed value. Over 60 percent of all landowners in Fluvanna are paying between 10 percent to 40 percent of their properties actual accessed value. About 70 percent of tax dollars coming is from 30 percent of the land acreage/owners paying full assessed value of their property. This is so lopsided, and unfair it is hard not to bring this to my fellow Fluvanna County tax payers attention.

A Lake Monticello property of 1.268
Acres has an assessed value of \$616,600
and pays \$5,703.55 in taxes. Land Use
217.2 Acres – assessed value \$325,800
-- pays \$903.73 in taxes – I It was sold on
Jan. 21 of this year for \$950,000. Actual
assessed/sale value taxes were \$8,787.50
-- they only paid 10.28 percent of the
actual value. Fluvanna lost \$7,883.77 in tax
revenue from this one parcel of land in one
budget year.

I believe that taxes should be levied evenly and fairly for all property owners.



## Art is a family tradition for one local artist

Art came naturally to Paul Charlton and his sister Page, who grew up with Peg Redd, a co-founder of the Fluvanna Art Association and taught art in the Fluvanna and Albemarle schools. Redd believed the arts were just as important as the academics and headed up a crusade to add art education to the Fluvanna public schools' curriculum.

Redd who was influenced by Matisse and other post-impressionist masters, featured a bright, bold impressionistic style in her work. Growing up, surrounded by art, Paul Charlton took a different route than his mother and studied photography and computer graphics in college.

"I pursued my interest in the visual arts. Afterward, I continued to explore these areas. I like photographing outdoor scenes and things I find unusual in landscapes. For computer graphics, I made several short, animated videos."

Growing up in Fluvanna, he graduated from Fluvanna County High School then

studied English at the University of Virginia and computer science at George Washington University. He lived in the Washington D.C. area for years before moving back to live in Fluvanna. He and his wife built a house next door to his moth-

> er's house in Fork Union and live there today.

He is largely selftaught when it comes to drawing and painting, he started teaching himself with a book on drawing.

"I found it very interesting. I continued to draw and learn about drawing and this exploration led to painting. For me, the personal style and voice of the artist is more

strongly expressed in drawing and painting and that's something I'm very attracted to," he said. "I haven't attended a formal program of art study, but I've taken many workshops at the Art League of Alexandria. I'm always on the lookout to learn from other artists, art technique books or online videos."


For many years, he attended art sessions at Tom Tartaglino's studio. For three hours, they would draw or paint from a live model.

"I'm always amazed how, painting from the same model, each artist creates a painting that is so different from the others."

Along with his mother and sister, they have participated in six joint exhibitions of their paintings at the Richmond Public Library, Bocce Restaurant, Sevenoaks Retreat Center, Fluvanna Community Center, St. Mary's Hospital and the Lynchburg Academy Center of the Arts.

His wife Wendy, a tapestry weaver, and their two children, Charlie and Anna, participated in the Charlottesville 2D exhibition at the McGuffey



Charlton is flexible when it comes to his favorite mediums and paints in oils for representational paintings and acrylics for graphic paintings. He agrees with most artists that

acrylics are very versatile, and brushes can be easily cleaned with water but prefers oils for blending



As an artist, he doesn't speak with one voice but said he divides his work between two areas: representational and graphic..

and the ability to

create softer edges.

"My representational paintings are painted from life or photographs. I've painted a wide variety of outdoor scenes, mostly landscapes. Recently, I've focused on painting clouds and sky scenes and expect to stick with

this for a while," he said. "I'm awed by the beauty and great variety of the sky and clouds and hope to convey that in my paintings. Even though I strive for closer realism in my depictions, I tend to paint with loose brushwork and choice of color."

When it comes to his graphic paintings, his work is influenced by past modernist masters.

"My graphic paintings have subjects that occur to me more as

ideas as opposed to painting a view from life. My favorite graphic subjects are geometric designs, multimedia collages or loose, cartoon-like images. I enjoy seeing these often offbeat ideas come to life."

Inspiration comes in many forms for artists while shaping their ideas.

"I'm inspired by the opportunity to create something I find beautiful or stimulating and have the viewer share that experience. I feel a sense of accomplishment

when I finish a painting which leads me on to the next painting," he said. "During the process of improving my craft I have lots of ideas for paintings, and I paint quite a few of them. I'm confident in my ideas and it comes down to the actual paint-







ing on whether the paintings work or not. If the quality of how a painting is done is not as good as it could be, then the original idea isn't conveyed. Improving this quality can be challenging, but hopefully, I'm getting a little better as time goes on."

Charlton isn't any different from other artists who strive to make their voice heard through the vision of their work.


"I want onlookers to look at a painting and find it beautiful or thought provoking. When they ex-

## Where has been your favorite place to travel?


"In 2017, I traveled to Israel. It was an incredible experience to walk where Jesus walked."

They open their season on March 16 and are scheduled to play five games in eight days. The Flucos open at Goochland. Then the next day they play their home opener against Chancellor high. On March 20 they are at Harrisonburg high and on March 24 they are at Western Albemarle. On March 25 they host Goochland.

The softball team has an identical starting schedule to the baseball squad. They play the same schools as listed above on the same days and at the same locations. At the Fluvanna County High School, the fields adjoin each other. The baseball field is at the back of the parking lot, (watch out for foul balls) while the softball field is directly behind the baseball field. It is actually possible to wander from one game to another when both teams are in action at the same time.

The boys' soccer team also opens its season on March 16 They host Nelson County on that date. The

soccer schedule is also busy early on. Five games are scheduled in the first two weeks. On March 19 the boys travel to Goochland. On March 23 they are at Western Albemarle. On March 26 they return home to host Goochland and on March 30 they travel to Nelson County high. Unlike the baseball and softball teams that play at the same locations but on different fields, the boys' and girls' soccer teams cannot play at the same location as high schools only have one stadium for football, soccer, lacrosse and track and field. Accordingly, the girls' soccer team while playing the same opponent as the boys' team, on the same night, plays at the opposite location.

The girls play at Nelson County on March 16. They host Goochland and Western on March 19 and 23. Then they travel to Goochland on March 26 and host Nelson County on March 30.

The tennis teams also open their seasons on March 16. The boys will be at home hosting Goochland, while the girls travel to Goochland. The Fluvanna athletic facilities will be mobbed on March 16 with baseball, softball, boys' soccer and boys' tennis all in action at once. Years ago, these contests would have been held at different venues around the county. Now they are all at the high school.

The boys' tennis team is scheduled to play at Chancellor high on March 19 and at Goochland on March 23. On March 24 they will be at Western Albemarle. They will host Charlottesville on April 2. The girls' squad has a very similar schedule, although at opposite locations, like soccer. They play Goochland away on March 16 and at home on March 23. On March 24 they host Western Albemarle and on April 2 they host Charlottesville.

The boys' and girls' lacrosse squads open their seasons on March. 17. The boys team hosts Patrick Henry high, while the girls travel there. The teams have different opponents on March 20. The girls are at Liberty, while the boys host Highland Springs. On March 24 both teams host Matoca high. On March 27, the boys travel to Patrick Henry. On March 31, the boys host Orange County and the girls travel to Orange.

The track and field squads do not swing into action until March 20, when they travel to Harrisonburg. A big event occurs on March 28 when the Flucos host the Fluvanna Invitational. On April 1 they travel to Orange County high. The district meet is April 14 at Albemarle high.

## Bill to manage wildlife collision rate passes **General Assembly**

The General Assembly recently passed a measure that will create a plan to reduce wildlife-related vehicle accidents, though opponents tout the bill as an example of wasteful government spending.

The bill, introduced by Sen. Dave Marsden, D-Fairfax, directs the Virginia departments of Game and Inland Fisheries, Transportation, and Conservation and Recreation to conduct a study to identify areas where wildlife habitat is fragmented by human development and roads with a high wildlife collision rate.

Marsden said the measure, known as the Wildlife Corridor Action Plan, is intended to help prevent wildlife related car accidents. There were 61,000 such collisions reported in 2016, according to VDOT.

"People get killed in wildlife collisions, mostly with deer," Marsden said.

There were 211 deaths from such collisions in the United States, according to State Farm, which tracks deer-related insurance claims across the nation.

The bill would give the DGIF two years to complete a study. Marsden said that after the study is done, the General Assembly will look into building wildlife overpasses along roads identified as problem areas. He said wildlife overpasses were successfully implemented in Charlottesville.

"They tried this on I-64 in Charlottesville and reduced wildlife collisions by 98%," Marsden said.

Ryan Brown, DGIF executive director, said the bill addresses a complex issue and is intended to protect wildlife in two ways.

Brown said his department will work with other agencies to identify places where development has fragmented wildlife habitats and address

the work needed to avoid human and wildlife conflict.

"Wildlife moves around and they don't read road signs," Brown said.

The agencies will identify wildlife corridors and study migration routes of native, game and migratory species using existing state data. They will assess human barriers such as roads, dams, power lines and pipelines and determine areas with a high risk of wildlife-vehicle collisions. The study will contain maps to detail such wildlife corridor infrastructure, as well as recommendations for creating safe wildlife crossings. Brown said options might include fencing along problem roads and bridge-like structures to assist wildlife with safe crossing.

Brown said this issue is likely to get worse over time.

"As wildlife habitat becomes more and more fragmented in an urbanizing Virginia, that makes it difficult in terms of management of wildlife population," he said.

Del. Mark Cole, R-Spotsylvania, voted against the bill. He said the measure would be too costly.

"I do not believe the legislation is needed and it will end up creating another bureaucratic process that will cost time and money for no real benefit," Cole said in an email. "The government is very good at establishing needless bureaucratic hurdles."

Marsden said the legislation is worthwhile, considering Virginia is one of the top states for wildlife collisions. In 2018, Virginia ranked 12th for deer collisions, with drivers facing a 1 in 99 chance of hitting a deer, according to data from State Farm.

"It's good for the animals and the drivers," Marsden said. "It's worth the effort to save property and save lives."

The bill now heads to the governor's desk.

operates a Regional Healthcare Coordination Center (RHCC), a 24/7 operations center designed to be the coordination and communication hub for health care and community partners during a disaster.


