

## **Answers to Common COVID-19 Unemployment Questions**

provides individuals and businesses significant financial relief from the financial strain through July 31, 2020. caused by the coronavirus epidemic.

Here is a snapshot of the unemployment benefits section of the bill and how it affects individuals and businesses.

- Who qualifies to receive unemployment benefits? In addition to full-time workers who are laid off or furloughed, the Act provides individuals who are not already eligible for state and federal unemployment programs, including self-employed individuals and part-time workers, a set amount of unemployment compen-
- How much will I receive? There are two different components to the new law's unemployment benefits:
  - Each worker will receive unemployment benefits based on the state in which they work, and
  - In addition to their state unemployment benefits, each worker will receive an additional \$600 per week from the federal government.
- How will benefits for self-employed workers be calculated? Benefits for self-employed workers are calculated based on previous income and are also eligible for up to an additional \$600 per week. Part-time workers are also eligible.
- · How long will the state unemployment payments last? The CARES Act provides eligible workers with an additional 13 weeks of unemployment benefits. Most states already provide 26 weeks of benefits, bringing the total number of weeks that someone is eligible for benefits to 39.

The recently passed Coronavirus Aid, Re- • How long will the federal paylief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act ments of \$600 last? The federal payment of \$600 per week will continue

> • How do I apply for unemployment benefits? You must apply for unemployment benefits through your state unemployment office. Most state applications can now be filled out online. Workers who normally don't qualify for unemployment benefits, such as self-employed individuals, need to monitor their state's unemployment office website to find out when they can apply, as many states need to update their computer systems to reflect every type of worker who is eligible to collect unemployment benefits under the CARES Act.

#### What to do now

If you have not already done so, you must file for unemployment with your state as soon as possible. State offices and websites are being slammed, so the sooner you get in the queue the better for you and your loved ones. And remember, these benefits now apply to self-employed and part-time employees.

## How do you plan for the unplannable event?

**If** don't think anyone was planning versity of Virginia for an in-depth study this," I heard in a webinar recently. I mentally circled that as one of the biggest understatements I've heard in this season.

Like everyone, the Economic Development Office did not have on the calendar, "deal with a pandemic on March 15 2020." None of my economic development classes had, "responding to a pandemic" as a course offering. We all are adapting as we go.

I'm thankful for the businesses from Fluvanna who have done the best they can to adapt to a changing landscape. Some of them quickly added online availabilities. Others have converted to curbside. In collaboration with the Fluvanna Chamber of Commerce, we are working on completing the circle of businesses from Fluvanna being able to conduct business in person, remotely and virtually. We hope to have more on that soon. It is just one way the Economic Development Office has tried to adapt.

The Board of Supervisors has re-appropriated a loan fund through the Community Investment Collaborative to help the Fluvanna business community. The Fluvanna Business Recovery Loan program is for up to \$5,000 at a 1% interest rate on a two-year term. More information is available on the website.

We also are collaborating with the Uni- Bryan

on the Fluvanna economy. This two-week study will be done by UVA students with mentorship from alumni at the biggest consulting firms in the world. We will then work on quickly implementing ideas and strategies from the study. This is an exciting opportunity for us.

COVID-19 has brought on challenges we never saw coming but we are working on using it to create solutions that work in 2020 and beyond.

I encourage any business from Fluvanna to participate in the Friday Town Hall meetings put on by the Chamber. The sessions are 6:30 pm and a great chance for business owners to chat, especially as we start to plan Phase II and Phase III of the Governor's Forward Virginia plan. ## School schedule likely a moving target

At Wednesday's (May 13) School Board meeting the board approved the 2020/21 school calendar calling for students first day to be Aug. 3.

However, that could change as things continue to be fluid due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

James Kelley (Palmyra) said the Board needed to start somewhere.

"...the calendar represents what is likely a moving target," Kelley said. "I'm confident all of these dates will change, but it's a good-faith, best effort to provide a quality education."

Superintendent Chuck Winkler agreed, adding the calendar isn't set in stone and isn't perfect.

"It will change but I have to make some plans for the next school year," he said. "(The calendar) adds six instructional days in the first semester and six to the second semester. This is an intense, learning focused calendar, not a professional-development focused calendar. This calendar assumes Johnny and Susy are going to be in the classroom on Aug. 3, but the way things look right now, I doubt

The meeting was held in person at the administration building following social distancing guidelines. Kelley took part from home. Andrew Pullen (Columbia) did not attend.

Winkler reported a possible graduation date for the 2020 class: July 11.


"No specific plans have been decided," he said. "The team will meet within the next few weeks to discuss possibilities."

For curriculum and instruction Winkler said he is exploring a virtual teaching platform.

"The process will take several months to develop if it's required," he

changes to the health care plan offerings minus the spousal exclusion. However, they said it would likely be part of the 2021/2022 plan.

The spousal exclusion would mean if the spouse's employer offered insurance, the spouse cannot get insurance through the schools.

The board voted to not force that exclusion until next year because they didn't feel there had been enough notice.

When it came to passing the Fiscal Year 2021 budget, the board tied on the first vote: Johnson and Charles Rittenhouse (Cunningham) voted against; Kelley and Shirley Stewart (Rivanna), for.

Johnson said she voted no because with the rise in health care costs to staff, the budget didn't offer the additional, original raise or contemplated changes to scale B compensation.

The FY21 budget is nearly \$42.7 million, which is \$1.2 million more than the current year budget.

Winkler proposed using the extra money in the following ways:

- · A one percent pay increase (\$634,000);
- · Adding a special education teacher, a literacy coordinator, additional hours for athletic trainers and extending a career and technical apprenticeship by one month (\$160,797);
- Substitute coverage cost (\$25,000);
- Health insurance (\$400,000);
- Trip bus driver pay (\$20,000).

Johnson said her May 4 called-meeting proposal to have the Board give "serious consideration" to using any leftover funds from the FY21 budget to give teachers a retroactive pay raise was met with little enthusiasm.

Kelly said his goals all along have been to fairly compensate staff, but it was important to recognize the extreme circumstances everyone was in because of the pandemic - particularly the expected decrease in state and local tax revenues.

Johnson suggested not hiring the literacy coordinator position.

Stewart said that position is needed given the pandemic-shortened instructional time.

"I'm concerned about giving up the literacy coordinator especially this year with students who've been home for a few months," she said. "We need help figuring out where we're at with our students."

Kelley agreed.

"I would argue cutting the literacy coordinator is a ginormous mistake," he said. "Look at the gaps between the haves and have-nots... the literacy coordinator seems so fundamental to our charge. To be frank, over the last couple of years we haven't increased all that much and we did a big thing by keeping health care cost increases away from teachers for several years. We have a responsibility to all our students...we need this more than ever. If we do not have this position we'll see widening gaps."

The Board decided to reconsider the budget vote.

It passed on the second vote: Johnson, Stewart and Kelley for; Rittenhouse abstained.

Johnson made a motion to discontinue Esports – the online gaming extracurricular activity where students compete against other schools.

She reiterated her past objection based on two of the three sanctioned games are warned to contain violence, drinking and the questionable portrayal of women. Johnson said she didn't think the school should encourage that message. She also cited an American Medical Association study that concluded the more screen time a student had in a day had a negative effect on learning.

Both Stewart and Kelley said they agreed about the choice of games, but they felt those in charge would find more appropriate ones. They said students who wouldn't normally take part in athletics or other extracurricular activities were playing Esports and reaping rewards.

Rittenhouse said: "I can't think of a more horrible waste of time than playing video games. I guess I'm old school."

Kelley said Esports "gives someone who's not interested in traditional sports a chance to play for Fluvanna in a sport. As for Mr. Rittenhouse's fundamental issue with technology, there's not much I can do about that."

The vote ended in a tie with Johnson and Rittenhouse voting to ban Esports and Kelley and Stewart voting to keep

## Graduation cords available for four-year FCHS student athletes

As a student athlete herself, senior Brooke Nazar, and many other seniors all over the country this year were unable to participate in their last season of sports as a high school student. Many of Fluvanna's high school seniors grew up playing sports and then played sports for Fluvanna County High School (FCHS) for four or more years. Some

have even played multiple sports during their time as a Fluco. Since the pandemic cancelled school for the remainder of the year back in March, sports were of course also cancelled. With no final season to remember, Nazar followed through with her plan to find a way to recognize senior student athletes at their graduation ceremony with special cords. The idea was presented that those who played in a program for four years at FCHS could earn one of the cords. While blue, gold, and white colored cords combinations would have been the obvious choice to

coordinate with the school's colors, but Nazar reached out to the other clubs to ensure that the senior athletic cords did not duplicate the same color combinations. Ultimately, the cords were selected as a red and blue combination because they not only complement one another, but also represent the colors associated with the VHSL.

"This was an opportunity for our student athletes to be recognized when they graduate for participating in these activities during their time at FCHS," said Morris. "I think it is a great idea."

Nazar and fellow senior athlete Alison Sawyer and other organizations sold and passed out 40 cords to students on May 13. The cords cost \$10 and students are still able to purchase them before graduation.

"A lot of students said that this was the only cord they were getting," said Nazar.

Morris added that "we do plan to continue this tradition at FCHS in the future."

Nazar and Sawyer were cautious given the COVID-19 situation and wore masks as well as practiced social distancing when handling the cords. Before COVID-19 hit, Fluvanna's graduation was to be held on Friday, May 22, at 7 p.m. Currently, the tentative date is July 11. 

## Fluvanna takes on Phase 1 reopening of economy

In Fluvanna, when the state's economy re-opened with phase I on May 15, the county had 79 total cases of COVID-19, 21 people hospitalized, and six deaths.

Most of the cases are concentrated in northern Virginia, the Virginia Beach area, and around Richmond. Overall, Virginia is holding its own during the pandemic and remaining stable but Gov. Ralph Northam is cautious about moving too fast..

"I think the governor's doing a good job of keeping Virginia safe and by not re-opening certain counties in northern Virginia based on the number of cases," said Mo Cahill, a frequent customer at Cuppa Joe's.

Phase I of the governor's plan for Virginians has reduced the order from "shelter at home" to the less restrictive "safer at home." The plan also calls for salons to open for one-on-one appointments only and allows restaurants to offer outdoor dining at 50 percent of its normal capacity, though social distancing is still required. Curbside take-out and delivery can continue. Retail stores can operate at 50 percent of their normal capacity and workers must wear masks. Cuppa Joe's is continuing with the ten person or less rule and with social distancing inside the cafe. People are welcome to sit outside and take-out orders are never a problem.

"We have expanded our hours from 8 am. to 5 pm. But take no large groups at this time," said manager Hannah Youngblood. The cafe usually hosts large groups of people for meetings or after church gatherings, book clubs, and knitting groups. But Cuppa Joe's has been seeing more regulars trickle back in. And Tropic Tan next door opened by appointment on Friday when phase I was rolled out.

"I was in town (Charlottesville) at Dick's Sporting Goods and they are only allowing 20 people in at a time. If one to two came out then one or two can go in," said Michael Jordan. Cosco had been doing this at the height of the pandemic.

Kristel Townsend of EXP Realty

says business is steady with sales and closings and now she is doing property management. But she is concerned with how the black community will fare through this next phase since they have been hit the hardest by the pandemic throughout the U.S. Like any business she is all for getting the economy going but not at the price of more lives being lost to the pandemic.

Mark Youseff sides with those who want to re-open but also with those who err on the side of

"It would be nice to stay at home but it's not realistic and I think the governor has failed and not stepped up enough. People's backs are up against the wall. When we open though, we should also be cautious."

Some agree with Youseff and Jordan added that non-essential places people gather including movie theaters, concerts, casinos, and sports arenas are not necessary at this time. He understands they have a bottom line to watch

but it is not worth putting so many lives at risk when it is not neces-

Artist Tom Tartaglino agreed but his wife Jill thinks it is too soon to open. Jerry Patchen agrees with

"You have to be cautious, test, and have contact tracing in place,"

Virginia will be receiving \$650 million in federal aid but even with federal aid and the re-opening of the economy some businesses may never recover. Cities have been the hardest hit by the coronavirus and shifts in the economy that had been taking place -- such as more automated cashiers in stores and threats to mom and pops up and down main street may become a harsh reality. But Fluvanna is not a city so only time will tell where we go from here and where we finally end up.

## **FUMA** to hold graduation ceremony on campus July 18

Fork Union Military Academy announced last week that it would hold in person graduation exercises for seniors in the Class of 2020 on July 18.

Founded in 1898, this will be the Academy's 121st commencement and is being planned to take place in the school's stadium where past graduations have been celebrated. School officials say that the July 18 date was chosen because it is expected to meet the schedule announced by Governor Northam for the lifting of restrictions on larger events. Additional protocols will be shared with families as the graduation date approaches.

"We will continue to monitor the changing circumstances," said Colonel David L. Coggins, USMC (Ret.), the president of Fork Union Military Academy, "and we are developing a comprehensive plan for our graduation and our phased return to school. We are determined to have a graduation ceremony for our seniors that appropriately honors them and the completion of their high school journey. They have done very well under extraordinary circumstances and I couldn't be prouder of each one of them."

Out of an abundance of caution and its commitment to hold a traditional, in person graduation, the Academy has asked seniors and their families to also hold the weekend of July 30-August 1 in the event circumstances change.

The senior class hails from more than a dozen states and several countries. Fork Union is a college preparatory, Christian school; each member of the senior class has been

accepted to at least one college. The members of the Class of 2020 have been awarded college scholarship grants of more than \$2.5 million.

The COVID-19 pandemic caused the closing of school campuses across Virginia, by order of Governor Ralph Northam. Many schools scrambled to put in place online learning alternatives. Fork Union Military Academy follows a unique curriculum plan called the One Subject Plan, in which students take just one class during each of the five grading terms of the school year. This simplified the school's conversion to distance learning for the final grading term. Term 5 is subject to standard grading requirements, so the valedictorian and salutatorian will be announced after Term 5 is complete.

"Because each teacher is only teaching one class with approximately five to 15 students," explained Col. Mike Goad, Fork Union's academic dean. "We were able to set up distance learning in a way that was really tailored to the needs of each class. It's worked very smoothly for us. We miss having our students on campus, though, and we are looking forward to having a graduation ceremony this summer."

"Graduation from high school is a true rite of passage for our seniors," Goad continued. "Even though we had to send our students home and finish the school year with distance learning, we have been looking forward to the day when we could be together and celebrate the accomplishments of our senior class in person."

The Fluvanna SPCA will be closed to the public until further notice. We are trying to do our part to help cut down on the spread of COVID-19, and with our animals' and employees' best interests in mind we are trying to reduce foot traffic to help keep our employees healthy. The animals at the shelter will continue to receive wonderful care just as they normally do, so no need to worry.
