Customer Service Manager Bernanette Laury (left), Laura Wills and Donald Christensen are only a small sample of the dedicated workers at our local Food Lion who are working each day to make sure that we have access to groceries and other supplies. The staff has been dealing with various shortages including milk, meat, and of course, toilet paper, while also being short staffed. As the COVID-19 crisis has progressed, the store and its customers have had to adjust to changing habits and new guidelines such as limiting meat purchases to two packs per customer. Laury noted that Food Lion is now offering senior citizen hours (Monday and Wednesday, 7 a.m. - 8 a.m.) and shared a personal story of sacrifice. "We go home, and have to change clothes and shower before we can hug our kids and loved ones," she said.



Truckers

Everyone should know that truck drivers are the backbone of our nation. They are responsible for hauling almost every purchasable item in the country; food, gas, raw materials, and finished goods; items necessary to live and function in daily life. And the COVID-19 crisis hasn't stopped them. Willie "Lil Bill" Harris is a perfect example of that dedication. A truck driver for over 36 years, Harris is currently employed by C. F. Marion Trucking and hauls chips and wood on a daily basis.



Post Office

Post office workers continue to report every day to serve the public and keep mail and deliveries going. The Dillwyn office now has two layers of protection to protect not only the public but also its staff. Dillwyn also is the post office for all incoming and outgoing mail from the two prisons. Postmaster Jermaine Battle (front) is responsible for handling all prison mail. The facility conducts a daily cleaning and the staff shared that they strip down and wash their clothing every day when they get home. Prisons

Buckingham is home two state prisons (Buckingham and Dillwyn) which employ a large number of citizens in and outside of the county. During the pandemic, state prisons are on modified lockdown and both of the county's prisons have noted a large number of COVID-19 cases, including two deaths (at this writing). Offenders are normally hired to work with the corrections staff to prepare three meals a day in the facilities. But these are
