Louisa County Appoints New Fire and EMS Chief

Press Release

At its meeting on August 17, 2020, the Louisa County Board of Supervisors appointed Robert C. Dubé Chief of Louisa County's Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS). The County conducted an extensive search which yielded over 30 applicants for the position. Dubé will begin work in early September.

"The leadership capabilities, qualifications and experience that Robert brings to the position would be desirable in any locality, regardless of size or complexity," said Duane Adams, Mineral District Supervisor and representative on the department's Management Oversight Group. "We're tremendously fortunate to have someone with those qualities and strong ties to our community."

Dubé brings over 40 years of public service experience to the position, primarily in fire and emergency management. He most recently served as Fire Chief for the City of Alexandria and as Deputy Director for the Virginia Department of Fire Programs. Dubé also served as the Louisa's Chief of Fire and EMS from 2008 through 2011, and as County Administrator from 2011 through 2014. During his tenure as Louisa's Chief, he oversaw the implementation of 24/7 emergency services coverage and critical consolidation efforts within the department. His prior

experience also includes service as the Operations Chief for Virginia Task Force One, a multi-functional international search and rescue team.

"It's an honor to join a great team and serve this community again," said Dubé. "I'm humbled and grateful for the opportunity to work together with our Board, career staff, and volunteer personnel to continually improve our

services to the citizens of Louisa."

A resident of Louisa County, Dubé holds an Associate's Degree in Fire Science Administration, a Bachelor's Degree in Public Safety Administration, and a Master's Degree in Executive Leadership. He began his fire service career in Loudoun County in 1974 as a volunteer and was a member of the Leesburg and Sterling Volunteer Fire Departments.

"Louisa is growing, and it's imperative that we strategically plan for the future requirements of our emergency services," said Christian Goodwin, County Administrator. "Robert's combination of knowledge and leadership experience make him uniquely qualified to ensure the success of those



ith government assistance and though the generosity of businesses, churches and individuals, the Louisa County Resource Council provides free supplementary food for eligible clients through various options. These on-going services are familiar to most residents, but a newer program provides dental assistance.

Vickie Southall, UVA nursing instructor, periodically brought her student interns to Louisa County as part of a rural nursing course. Follow-up discussions among the students noted the acute need for dental care which they observed while doing rou-

tine blood pressure and diabetes testing for the organization's food assistance clients. In addition, a 2018 study by the Thomas Jefferson Health District found Louisa County to have nearly twice as much need for dental care as surrounding areas.

"The nursing interns had done some background research and concluded that about 50 percent of county residents had not seen a dentist in two to three years," said retired dentist Dr. John Hodge.





Similarly, Cathy Portner, LCRC office manager, confirmed that numerous income-eligible clients served by the feeding programs were suffering with oral discomfort. Some expressed that the pain and swelling were so intense that their diets were limited to soft foods.

Because of the study and observations, Southall, Hodge and LCRC executive director Lloyd Runnett conferred to discuss optional solutions. In early 2019, the LCRC board decided to initiate a program to help with adult dental care, particularly emergency assistance. Donna Kirkley joined a committee with Hodge, Southall,

Portner and Runnett to head up the project.

"I was asked to talk with dentists in the area about a voucher project," said Hodge. "Six dentists across the county agreed to sign up with us. Then, we began asking for donations and people were most generous. As the project developed that year, grants from area foundations enabled us to increase the number of people that we could help."

Qualified adult clients are eligible to receive vouchers, now set at \$500, to cover emergency assistance. The initial step is to complete an application. Along with indicating the specific dental problem, the form requires information on previous dental care, if any, and general health. Qualifying applicants must show proof of Louisa residency but do not have to be registered for food assistance. Once approved by a committee mem-

ber, a voucher is issued and Portner sets up an appointment. Dentists are selected on a rotating basis, although location of the dental office in relation to the client's residence is considered. A \$25 co-pay or volunteer service at LCRC is required of voucher recipients.

"Last year we assisted 55 clients, this year we will be able to help about 10 to 15 people a month," said Portner. "Most clients require extractions or fillings which


vouchers cover. We can exceed the voucher amount if emergency cases require more extensive work, but that determination is made on a case-by-case basis."

Although the program's goal is focused on relieving pain, Hodge anticipated that additional grants and donations will permit preventative care or minor aesthetic work that might result in better employment opportunities. By mutual agreement, once the patient is referred, LCRC has no responsibility for the work done. Clients are encouraged to continue a client/dentist relationship.

Participating professionals are Dr. Darryl Pearlman (Louisa), Dr. John Andre (Louisa), Dr. Mohammed Arafa (Mineral Dental Care), Dr. Kirk Williams (Louisa Comprehensive Dental), Dr. Michael Clark (Piedmont Dental @ Lake Anna) and Dr. John Knight, Jr. (Spring Creek Dental). Hodge and Portner praise the generous support of the dentists. On several occasions, when the costs exceeded the voucher, the dentist wrote off the reminder of the invoice.

The Middle Pamunkey Branch of Lake Anna, now in addition to the Upper Pamunkey Branch, Terry's Run, and the Upper North Anna Branch of Lake Anna in Orange, Louisa and Spotsylvania counties are experiencing a harmful algae bloom (HAB). The public is advised to avoid contact with the lake in these areas until algae concentrations return to acceptable levels. Some harmful algae, called cyanobacteria, can cause skin rash and gastrointestinal illnesses, such as upset stomach, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.


