## **Rebecca Carter – A Steady Presence in** Buckingham

ost working people get up every morning with an anticipated list of tasks to accomplish. It's basically what life's all about in a working day. But, consider this list of issues to address; zoning regulations, solid waste, water supply systems, road repair, building projects, noise ordi-nances, public utilities, finance and budgets, economic development, emergency services, constant calls from the public with various questions and inquiries, and last but not least, COVID-19<sup>°</sup> and a pandemic. That, along with directing and supervising the day-to-day operations of all county departments and offices, under the governance of the Board of Supervisors. That is basically the typical working day of Buckingham's County Administrator, Rebecca "Becky" Simpson Carter.



When Carter lists off the names of the supervisors she's worked for it will take many readers down memory lane (see list at end of article). And, it basically demonstrates that elected politi-

cal officials may come and go but a well-respected and efficient administrator can remain for years; in Carter's case, 34 years.

'I started work with the county in September, 1986," said Carter. "I was Administrative Assistant, Assistant County Administrator, interim County Administrator many times and then County Administrator." And based upon the years in service, it would appear that the lady is right where she belongs

Carter, who is originally from Alleghany County, was one of seven children. 'My father was a conductor with the C & O Railroad and my mother was a stay at home mom," said Carter.

Ever industrious, Carter's first job while in high school was at the local Dairy Freeze. "I will never forget when I rushed home to tell mom and dad," she said. "My father got upset. He said that once you start working you will work for the rest of your life. I saw my parents struggle and wanted to help all I could. I am head-ing toward age 69. Bringing up this memory sure makes me think about that." Carter arrived in Buckingham County when her husband Wayne, who worked for the CSX Railroad, was transferred to the area in 1986. Hired in September of 1986,

Carter worked under Administrators Arthur Lane, Lewis Teeple, David Moorman and Johnny Roak. In 1990, she was promoted to Administrative Assistant and Assistant County Administrator. Over several years, Carter would serve as interim until final-ly she was promoted to County Administrator in 1995.

As administrator to the various offices that are part of the county services, while also serving the members of the Board of Supervisors, Carter's days are never dull. "A typical day involves a multitude of phone calls, answering questions, meetings and putting out fires. Real work has to be done during the evenings or early morn-ings as that is when I have time to focus on them," said Carter. Such meetings

include regional monthly meetings outside of the county and office committee meetings. "Our office committee meetings include finance, solid waste, public utilities, and personnel, whenever needed. There are also other committees appointed by the board such as rescue squad or noise control. Seems like there's always a committee meeting," said Carter.

Over the past 34 years Carter has taken her job to heart. "I probably take my job too personally, but I just do. So often I feel personally responsible when things do not go as they should, when most times it is beyond my con-

trol." Working for so many different board members over the years, Carter is reflective about the running of the county. "It is also difficult to see board members faced with situations, such as now, in the middle of a pandemic, of having to find money to operate the rescue squad and try to have as little additional financial impact on the taxpayers. Keeping the county financially strong is sometimes difficult."

And, of course, there's been many changes. "The county has grown so much and we have so many more programs and so much progress has been made," said Carter. "We now have regional programs and committees in which we participate. Our total budget

has grown from about \$20 million to about \$56 million. Our real estate rate was 48 cents, now it's 52 cents. Personal property in 1995 was \$3.30; now it's \$4.05."

Carter also noted other changes. "We now have an Emergency Management Department, an Information Technology Department, and last but certainly not least we have the Zoning Department. We have a solid waste department that we did not have when I started. We have a finance department now. Our educational appropriation of local money has gone from about \$2.8 million to \$7.3 million operations and \$2.2 million debt payments. We have had increased reassessment values but we have also had a lot of natural growth, thus increasing our real estate tax base."

The citizens of Buckingham obviously have a say in the running of the county. "We do not get a lot of complaints," said Carter. "Some complain about dogs barking, we get complaints about the roads, and some complain about our website not being user-friendly," she said. "We respond by trying to take care of their complaints and fix the problems, if possible. Some take more time than others but most are taken care of fairly soon. I believe board members get more complaints than our office does."

With all the changes and growth, Carter has always been a steady presence as the county has changed and grown. One of the projects that she is most proud of is being involved in is the updating of public utilities (water and sewer) to the intersection of highways 15 and 20, which has allowed development in that area. "It was a great achievement in that it took coordination between the town of Dillwyn and the county along with working with interested developers," she said. "Once Food Lion got there it brought in many other businesses, including the Dollar General and Family Dollar, McDonalds and the Cameron Station complex."

Carter also said that the hotel project investors are still committed to investing in the county. "It's still coming but there are still some negotiations between the lender and loaner. And, of course, COVID has slowed everything down. I truly enjoy when projects and issues come together for the good of the county, when I can help people."

When Carter is not working, spending time with her family is priority. "I like to sit on my porch and drink coffee and also to spend time with my four grandchildren. I bought a new fishing pole and want to start fishing again. It's my time to reflect and recharge.'

Although Carter's children, grandchildren and family give her great happiness there is a special person that is always on her mind; her daughter, Joanna, who died in February 2011. "My job has been a blessing to not only provide income but for also keeping my mind busy. I chose to continue to work

and stay busy as my way of dealing with grief." Carter also sees her daughter as an inspiration. "Joanna was always so proud of me and my work. When she died, I initially wanted to stay in bed and didn't want to work. I've been thinking more seriously about retirement but certainly don't want to leave in the middle of a pandemic. Work has been a big part of my life."

Carter believes that it's important for Buckingham citizens to know that her office and the Board work hard to do their best for the citizens of the county. "You have to look straight down the middle and respect all people's views," she said. "We cannot always please everyone, that is for sure. But our decisions are not political and are not made based on particular political party views."

Board of Supervisor Chairman and James River District Supervisor, Harry Bryant, spoke highly of Carter's role in "Becky has been an exthe county. tremely dedicated employee for many vears. Becky has an excellent work ethic, we hope she will stay with us for quite some time because anyone coming in after her would have HUGE shoes to fill. We are well satisfied with the wonderful job she does, always grateful." Stale River District Supervisor Joe Chambers also has praise for Carter. "Becky has been doing a great job for

Citizens in Buckingham County were notified in early September that Buckingham Sentara's Family Medicine office in Dillwyn will close. A well-respected medical facility, Buckingham Family Medicine, which originally began by Dr. Irving Epperson as a local health facility, has provided thousands of Buckingham citizens with much needed and convenient health service. Local leaders are working with concerned citizens to try to keep the health facility. Sandra Moss is shown speaking to Elizabeth Holmes of Channel 29 in Charlottesville, while Board of Supervisor member, Jordan Miles waits his turn to encourage Sentara to remain in the county. Along with a petition that has gathered well over a 1,000 signatures, the Chamber hosted a community march in late September to show their support for the facility. Since that announcement, Sentara Martha Jefferson Medical Group announced plans to extend the planned closure of Sentara Buckingham Family Medicine. Sentara Buckingham Family Medicine will now continue operating through December 23, 2020. In the New Year, Dr. Richard Muller, the lead physician at Sentara Buckingham Family Medicine, will continue seeing patients on a part-time basis at Sentara Spring Creek Family Medicine.

This is successfully accomplished through the use of evidence based practices and principles that enhance effective communication strategies and role modeling as part of collaborative multi-disciplinary teams addressing offender needs. Officers provide security over adult offenders at the institution and while in transport: supervise the daily activities of offenders while observing and recording their behavior and movement to ensure their safe and secure confinement. They interact with the visitors, staff, offenders and public to maintain orderly and secure operations.
