School Board eyes equity statement on inclusion

After almost five hours of deliberating a hybrid start at its Oct. 14 meeting, the School Board got a first look at an "Equity Statement" (see sidebar p. 7) crafted by a 40-plus member task force.

Don Stribling, executive director for human resources, operations, and student services, directed the task force and presented the statement.

Charles Rittenhouse, (Cunningham) asked: "Why was it a necessity for this? I mean we already have antidiscrimination policies in there."

Stribling said it wasn't a necessity nor was it being presented as a policy, just a statement.

Rittenhouse said, "So just pretty much about any group can come up with a statement and present it to the public schools?"

"I assume they could request it," Stribling said.

James Kelley (Palmyra) and Shirley Stewart (Rivanna) wanted to know if everyone on the task force agreed

with the final statement.

Stribling said some members wanted different language, but all signed off on the version presented to the Board.

Andrew Pullen (Columbia) weighed in.

"I do not disagree with the statement...what I do question is the timeline, the intent, the reasoning," he said. "I believe the committee is too large and there was a lot of political activism rather than reason on the committee. In fact, in the first meeting, I was not thrilled at all with the level of political activism."

Pullen and Chair Perrie Johnson (Fork Union) both served on the task force. Neither attended the third and final meeting.

Pullen agreed with Rittenhouse that Fluvanna schools already have codes of conduct policies that address hiring practices, anti-discrimination

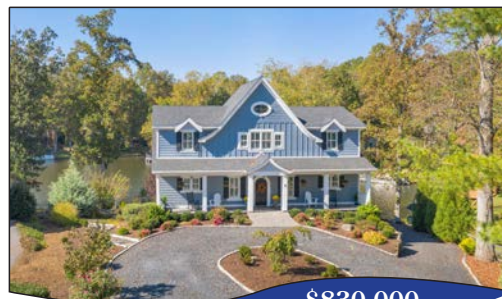

and how to report it.

"In my three and a half years I've never seen a report of discrimination within the schools, have you?"

Stribling said, "Yes. There are informal ways to come to a resolution on that."

Pullen said several of the members of the committee had been in the schools for years and seen many positive changes.

"To see the changes they've seen and the progress they've made and for someone to suggest there's systemic racism in the schools, I think it bothered them. Do you believe there is systemic racism in the schools as some suggested?"

Stribling said, "I've seen research and there is literature that shows structures that there is a case for that."

Pullen suggested again the group was too large, and he had some issues with theories of restorative justice and well-meaning policies that address it and fail. But he didn't want the group to disband, wanting them to keep working on specific issues that need addressing, such as discipline.

"We have to understand that you cannot create policy or legislation that removes hate from people's hearts,"

Pullen said. "If there is systemic racism in the schools, why has this not been brought to us until it became politically necessary after some terrible events this summer," Pullen said.

After this discussion and before the meeting ended, during Board comments, Kelley noted the late hour.

"I will say if not for it being 11:30, Andrew and I would be going toe-to-toe on his language related to diversity and inclusion. I don't understand how you can at the same time at one side argue we don't need it at all and on the other side make overtures saying you hope it continues as a working group. I sat in this room when you told me you hadn't heard of white privilege until this year. I also continue to think that anytime someone disagrees with you, you paint it as political activism instead of having differing opinions. I think that minimizes and isn't helpful to the conversation."

Pullen said, "I still to this day don't know what white privilege is. I've never experienced it. I've worked hard for everything I've gotten."

"And that speaks volumes," Kelley said.

Pullen said: "Nobody's given me a damn thing in my life. I've worked for everything. And anyone in this room who knows me - Mr. Rittenhouse knows - I came from absolutely nothing and it had nothing to do with white privilege and I stand by that and we can move on."

Kelley asked, "Do you think that how you look has nothing to do with how people perceive you?"

"No," Pullen said.

At that point Johnson cut off the discussion for a motion to adjourn.

While the vote was taken, Pullen gathered his things, got up and walked out.

2021 Social Security Changes Announced

2021 Key Social Security Benefits

The Social Security Administration announced a 1.3 percent boost to monthly Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits for 2021. The increase is based on the rise in the Consumer Price Index over the past 12 months ending in September 2020.

For those contributing to Social Security through wages, the potential maximum income subject to Social Security tax increases 3.7 percent this year, to \$142,800. A recap of the key amounts is outlined in graphic above:

What does it mean for you?

- Up to \$142,800 in wages will be subject to Social Security taxes, up \$5,100 from 2020. This amounts to \$8,853.60 in maximum annual employee Social Security payments. Any excess amounts paid due to having multiple employers can be returned to you via a credit on your tax return.

- For all retired workers receiving Social Security retirement benefits the estimated average monthly benefit will be \$1,543 per month in 2021 – an average increase of \$20 per month.
- SSI is the standard payment for people in need. To qualify for this payment you must have little income and few resources (\$2,000 if single/\$3,000 if married).
- A full-time student who is blind or disabled can still receive SSI benefits as long as earned income does not exceed the monthly and annual student exclusion amounts listed above.

As we head into the 2020 tax preparation season, remember we are here to assist you with year-end tax planning. Jackie Meyers

A fighter for the welfare of kids and animals



Jacqueline A “Jackie” Meyers PhD, 66, of Breomo Bluff crossed the Rainbow Bridge November 1 after a shockingly brief struggle with brain cancer. She was widely known and respected for her work in animal welfare, as the founder and director of the Peaceful Passings Senior Animal Rescue. There are people throughout the world now active in the field who were inspired and mentored by her. Jackie was also long-time member of the Fluvanna County administration.

She was born and spent her girlhood in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, and was proud of her distinctive central Jersey accent. Her father left the family early, two older brothers were grown, and her mother raised her while seeking higher education and finding a series of jobs in college administration in Michigan and western New York. Regardless of where they were living, Jackie spent summers on the Jersey shore with her beloved Uncle Emil and Aunt Ruth.

She earned an undergraduate degree in literature at SUNY Brockport near Rochester, NY and remained a warm friend with many of her classmates from Brockport High and the college. Finding a vocation in counseling, Jackie obtained an MSW from Keene State in New Hampshire and some years later after a divorce, her doctorate in public administration from the Wilder School at Virginia Commonwealth University.

She started her career in Massachusetts but, influenced by a sister-in-law who had settled at Yogaville in Buckingham County, Jackie and her then-husband moved to Fluvanna in 1991. She held a series of jobs in counseling at Elk Hill, FUMA and Albemarle County Schools before becoming Fluvanna’s Children’s Services Act program manager. The Act directs the expenditure of state and local funds to provide intervention and support for at-risk youth and families. Jackie worked with and coordinated efforts by schools, courts, the sheriff’s office, and social service agencies. She retired from county overnment in 2016 to devote herself full time to Peaceful Passings, and was recently honored by the Board of Supervisors “for her many contributions to the County as seen through her Community Leadership, Civic Responsibility, Volunteer Service, Community Spirit, and Innovation.”

In May of the first year of the new millennium she attended a birthday party for the sculptor David Breeden, where she met Dave Sagarin, and they never looked back. They married a year later and started to accumulate dogs.

They determined to take in senior and

special-needs animals, and to provide them with first rate medical care (settling on Old Dominion Animal Hospital in Charlottesville), to provide love and family for dogs that may have been mistreated, and to move them along with adoption wherever possible. The smaller dogs lived in the house, in numbers that occasionally reached 15 or 16. A system of pens and then sturdy shelters were built for the larger dogs.

Jackie was not a “nice” person. She could be cold and relentless dealing with a world that treated the vulnerable, kids and animals, badly. She hated hypocrisy and games-playing and was without the political skills to let things go. She was a tireless poster on Facebook and dealt each day with 50 or more messages, emails, and phone calls from shelters and owners with dogs to place and stories that would melt your heart. Fundraising for the rescue was a constant pursuit. In 2018 Jackie published “Loving an Older Dog,” a collection of essays, insight and advice.

Jackie and Peaceful Passings were frequent subjects of media attention, including several articles in the Fluvanna Review and a segment on the Virginia Currents television program (accessible on YouTube). As a consultant to the Humane Society of the United States, she was deployed occasionally to help administer special rescue facilities. This included stints in Louisiana following Katrina and in New Jersey following Sandy.

Several bequests in recent years permitted the addition of a facility for senior cats and the acquisition and furnishing of a small chapel. The Peaceful Passings Senior Animal Rescue facility is in hiatus, and the animals have been placed in foster care or adoption through the good offices of friends and cooperating rescue organizations. Purchasers are sought who will continue the work of the rescue.

A brother Robert died some years ago, and a brother Harold lives in Staunton. Dr. Meyers had no children of her own and is survived by her husband, four stepchildren, six step-grandchildren, and a panoply of nieces and nephews. She has a half-brother living in the West and another who died recently. Arrangements are being handled by Sheridan Funeral Home of Kents Store. Interment will be private, while a memorial service is being planned for next summer, when it is hoped that larger gatherings will be better accommodated. Donations in her memory may be made to the Fluvanna SPCA or the animal welfare organization of your choice.

Why an equity task force?

The NAACP worked with administrators throughout the 2020 school year to address issues of equity and inclusion in Fluvanna Public Schools. In the summer, the NAACP called upon the schools to create a task force to draft an equity statement.

After the Oct. 14 board meeting controversy, the Fluvanna Review contacted people involved in the Task Force. Andrew Pullen did not respond.

Here are the responses from those who did:

Statement from Fluvanna NAACP Education Committee:

Members of the NAACP Education Committee were surprised to hear that a member of our school board is unaware of issues of racism in our schools. We were also surprised that no one from the FCPS administration countered this statement with the facts – facts that we have been working with them for some time to address well-documented racial disparities and racial bias experienced by students in Fluvanna. Had Mr. Pullen attended all of the task force meetings as he volunteered to do, he would have heard additional evidence cited by teachers to indicate the need for the FCPS to adopt this statement. We hope that the school board demonstrates a commitment to students in Fluvanna and votes to adopt the equity statement and that the FCPS administration commits to the action items that will build a more equitable school community.

Don Stribling, school administration representative

FR: What prompted you to serve on the task force?

“The School Board received a request from the NAACP Education Committee to review and approve an equity statement. I was given the opportunity to create a task force, that included staff and community members, to review and finalize a statement that would be presented to our School Board. I saw this as an excellent time to work with and engage our staff and community on a significant topic in our community but more importantly in our school system.”

FR: What are your thoughts about institutional racism

and how it affects public education in Fluvanna?

“I believe that focusing on equity is one of our priorities, both as an educator and community member, along with teaching and leading from an equity lens to improve cultural proficiency in Fluvanna County for all of our students. There is no better vehicle than the educational system to promote equity.”

FR: What do you hope is accomplished by the group?

“Providing resources, support, and information to our division, so FCPS can give students what they need in the classroom to be successful in life.”

Perrie Johnson, school board chair

FR: What prompted you to serve on the task force?

“I’m excited to serve on this committee because the issues raised by the NAACP Education Committee have been an interest of mine since the beginning of my teaching career in Fluvanna. Over 30 years ago I began teaching at Cunningham District School and spent more years there than at any other school in Fluvanna. My son and daughter attended Cunningham and made many friends. I came to know the children and parents of that community, as well as those in the Fork Union District, where I live.”

FR: What are your thoughts about institutional racism and how it affects public education in Fluvanna?

“I know that Fluvanna County Public Schools deplore any evidence of conscious racism. I also acknowledge the reality of unconscious racial bias and its presence throughout probably all American institutions. We must identify unconscious bias and work harder to eliminate its effect on our students and, by extension, our entire community.”

FR: What do you hope is accomplished by the group?

“I believe in the mission statement of the NAACP Education Committee and want to do more than pay lip service to their intent. I hope my participation on an FCPS equity committee will help us craft a realistic, effective plan addressing these

issues, but tailored to the unique strengths and challenges we face in Fluvanna.”

FR: What prompted you to serve on the task force?

“I was motivated by the wonderfully brave people that have taken to the streets during recent events to fight for a world that fundamentally believes in equality. I, like many others are tired of seeing black students underrepresented in advance courses and colleges, while at the same time, are over-represented in suspensions, special education, prisons, and on the playing field.”

FR: What are your concerns/thoughts about institutional racism and how it affects public education in Fluvanna?

“It is obvious that racism continues to be the most destructive force in our society and unfortunate that our educational institutions, ignore it at best, and often perpetuate the inequities, stereotypes, and lies. I believe that schools have the potential to be an agent of change, but they have been used to maintain inequality.”

FR: What do you hope is accomplished by the group?

“It would be wonderful if we can develop very specific targets, measurements and mechanisms of accountability that will allow the school division to tackle issues related to race which make Black students more successful. But more importantly, I hope that we can create a culture of antiracism that will reach every teacher and classroom.”

FR: What prompted you to serve on the task force?

“I decided to serve on the task force because I grew up in Fluvanna, went to Fluvanna County schools and now teach for Fluvanna County Schools. I grew up as a member of a multiracial family that experienced discrimination and prejudice. I had previously complained, lamented and discussed my concerns or opinions at home or with close friends; and while this was a good release of frustration, it did nothing to help provide solutions or change inequities. I decided it was time to speak up.”

FR: What are your concerns/thoughts about institutional racism and how it affects public education in Fluvanna?

“The history of the United States and the very laws and systems that have governed our country for years have created institutional racism. The distribution of opportunities, resources (both economic and social) and power have historically benefited people who are white to the exclusion of black and brown people. How can this not affect public education? A study of the national data will show that Black students are less likely to access college ready courses, that Black students are disciplined more harshly and lose more class time due to discipline than their white counterparts, that black and brown students are more often concentrated in schools with fewer resources, that there is a lack of black professional staff, and that teacher expectations for Black students are lower from white teachers. These are just a few of the statistics that reflect racial disparities and inequities in US schools. Are we so perfect in Fluvanna that we have found a way without effort that not one of these statistics apply?”

FR: What do you hope is accomplished by the group?

“I hope that the task force will unashamedly create transparency regarding the data examining racial inequities in our schools, create safe spaces for students and teachers to examine implicit bias and stereotypes and ultimately not just have an equity/diversity statement, but become a school system that is anti-racist with a full equity policy and accountability.”

FR: What prompted you to serve on the task force?

“Recent events in our country have prompted me to research racism and its impact on people of color in our country. I learned that racism is literally everywhere. It doesn't skip small towns, or only happen in certain places. It is woven into the fabric of our culture and, until now, it has not really been addressed because the white majority in our country have the privilege of ignoring or dismissing it. After learning more about racism, I also realized that protesting and sharing social media posts with information really doesn't have the impact I would like to see. I think the best way for each of us to recognize

and address racism is to start with ourselves and our local institutions. If every community were to come together to learn about the experiences of people of color, identify the problems associated with bias and racism in our community, and then work together to address those issues and resolve those problems—then we can truly say that we are working on being anti-racist and creating an equitable community for people of all colors. I am a part of this commission because I want to use my privilege to make a difference for the people of color in our community.

FR: What are your concerns/thoughts about institutional racism and how it affects public education in Fluvanna?

“I prefer the term structural or systemic racism, so I will use that going forward. Systemic racism exists throughout society, including in our public schools. No one is immune to systemic racism, including Fluvanna and surrounding counties. A few patterns commonly seen in schools that result from decades of systemic racism are: harsher/disproportionate discipline practices for students of color, underrepresentation of students of color in gifted and talented programs and honors classes, under-representation of teachers and staff who are people of color, and overall lower expectations for students of color. It is our duty, as staff members and community members, to collect data and information on these areas of concern, to analyze that data, and then to create a plan of action to ensure that we are always working toward being anti-racist.”

FR: What do you hope is accomplished by the group?

“I hope this group will be able to identify and acknowledge the impacts of systemic racism in our schools and then create an action plan that will work to remediate those impacts and create a safe environment for students and staff of all colors. This action plan would certainly need to include educating school staff and community members about the issues of racism and how they impact people of color in our community. I know for a fact that there are staff members who are scared to speak about their experiences with racism in the county and I would not be surprised if there are students who feel the same way. We're not here to call people racist, or to criticize the county or those in it. We are here to say that change

starts at a local level and if we can all be open to listening to the people of color in our schools and community, we can begin to help them heal and work towards a better future for everyone.”

PROPOSED EQUITY STATEMENT

Fluvanna County Public Schools (FCPS) rejects all forms of racism as destructive to the Division's mission, vision, values, and goals. FCPS commits to identifying and eliminating the factors that contribute to intolerance, inequities, and academic disparities in our division.

Educational equity means that all children receive what they need to develop their full academic and social potential. As a division, we are intentional in our efforts to replace the factors that may lead to inequities, including racism, discrimination, and prejudice, with attitudes and behaviors that reflect acceptance, belonging, compassion, integrity, understanding, fairness, cooperation, and respect.

FCPS educators and staff members play a vital role in reducing racism and inequity by recognizing the manifestations of racism, creating culturally inclusive learning and working environments, along with addressing practices that directly or indirectly perpetuate racism through our teaching, modeling, and practice. These inequities were created over time and can be eliminated. Similarly, personal prejudice is learned and can be unlearned. This will be accomplished through continued efforts of collaboration and action steps. We owe this to our students, staff, and community.

School Board weighs in on budget, re-opening plans

The Fluvanna School Board met Wednesday (Oct. 28) to hear the superintendent's re-opening plans and to weigh in on Fiscal Year 2021 budget priorities.

Neither Andrew Pullen (Columbia) nor Charles Rittenhouse (Cunningham) attended the meeting.

Less than half of students enrolled will return to school in-person (two days per week).

Superintendent Chuck Winkler said out of 3,215 students, 1,406 indicated they will attend hybrid classes starting Nov. 5.

The rest will remain virtual learners. But of those, 530 noted they would return to in-person classes Feb. 1, which is the beginning of the second semester.

Winkler said students and staff will be required to wear masks and maintain at least a six-foot distance on the bus and in school. Those who don't comply will be reported and may face discipline, he said.

James Kelley (Palmyra) asked what happens if someone has symptoms of or tests positive for Covid-19.

Winkler said they have developed letters to alert parents depending on the situation.

"We have to follow our local health department guidelines," he said. "I'm trying to keep the public informed but not alarmed."

Kelley said parents need to know if their child has been in contact with someone who tested positive.

Winkler assured him they will tell parents of children in that classroom.

Kelley asked if students who need quarantined will receive instruction.

"It depends," Winkler said. "Certainly, if a whole class is quarantined they'll all be virtual during their quarantine."

Winkler said a big concern is making sure students have access to fresh water because they can't use water fountains.

He also wants to make sure they have enough substitute teachers.

Children will eat in the cafeterias rather than in classrooms.

There's no charge for meals for any student.

discussing enforcement of masks for students and teacher populations," he said. "I'm finding it unacceptable there are times at which individuals in our board meetings are not wearing masks. Despite any protests otherwise this isn't a political hoax, this is a public health issue. There is no reason that myself or especially the staff who - this is a workplace for these individuals - there is no reason in the world why they should be subjected to an unsafe work environment, especially given the fact that we have a policy in all of our buildings that everyone must wear a mask. We as a Board should not be above this. We should make a statement that we expect all persons attending the meetings to wear a mask."

A discussion followed.

Chair Perrie Johnson (Fork Union) asked Kelley if he wanted a policy or a statement.

Kelley noted it may be semantics but asked what the difference was.

Johnson said, "a policy is legally binding and enforceable. That's the difficulty with your request. It's simply not enforceable. We've had information that if we call law enforcement they're not going to enforce it."

I have no more control over you than you have over me in my position here on the board. Only our constituents have control over us in our positions here. The enforceable part is what bothers me. As an old teacher I know you're not going to ask a student to sit down if you're not going to make him."

The discussion ended with no resolution.

Budget

The FY21 budget ended with a \$1.4 million carryover. The county agreed to allow the schools to keep \$400,000 of that for new buses and upgrades to the Abrams building.

In discussing the FY22 budget, Winkler suggested funding at \$44 million.

Winkler offered possible budget priorities for FY22:

- Reading specialists, one each at Carysbrook and the middle school;
- Additional math specialist for kindergarten through fifth grade;
- Additional social worker;
- Health insurance premium increase;
- Staff compensation – step or one percent = \$400,000; additional percent = \$375,000.

Kelley and Shirley Stewart (Rivanna) expressed an interest in having enough additional staff to help returning students who may have stalled in their education due to the pandemic.

The Board will meet Jan. 20 to work on details of the FY22 budget.

In new business, Kelley suggested the Board adopt a policy or at least make a statement requiring mask wearing in Board meeting.

Billy Casper Golf to take over golf operations at the Lake?

Much to the surprise of the golfing community at Lake Monticello, the LMOA Board of Directors recently released a proposed new fee schedule developed by Billy Casper Golf (BCG) that BCG apparently projected would cut LMOA losses on golf in half in 2021.

Leading individuals in the golf community at the Lake were taken aback. According to Board chairman Jay Hinkle, BCG, which is already handling the golf course maintenance and the food and beverage service, came to the Board and proposed that it take over golf operations as well. Hinkle said in a recent interview that the idea would be to develop a master management contract with a single payment to BCG for golf course maintenance, golf course operations and food and beverage services. This would be a better deal for LMOA than having individual management contracts. When the Board made the BCG proposed fee schedule public, it was news to LMOA's own Golf Committee, the officers of the Gray Foxes group, the women's golf groups, the Monday

night golf group, and the very active Hardin golf group, that any talks were in the works for BCG to take over the Lake's golf operations.

At a public meeting, on Oct. 29, the leaders of the Lake golf groups gave the Board of Directors quite an earful of opinions, about the Board's procedures and about the proposed new fee schedule. Board chairman Jay Hinkle said at the meeting that operating losses are currently running at about \$250,000 per year. In addition, this figure does not include capital costs that include planned improvements projected out over a 30-year period.

The proposed fee schedule offers all kinds of combinations and permutations. For instance, the daily fees for a single round of golf actually go down under the proposal, but the annual contract fees go up a lot. One calculation for a golf playing couple that practices on the driving range shows an increase of 28 percent. A calculation for a single player playing three 18-hole rounds a week and practicing regularly on the range shows an

increase of 46 percent. The cost for an associate single member (i.e. non-resident) goes up by 65 percent.

Regarding the annual operating loss, a little perspective is in order. The Lake is fortunate to have a large base of dues paying units over which to spread this cost. The subsidy of the golf course per dues paying unit comes to about \$60 a year, or \$5.00 per month. In the event that the Lake were to lose or abandon its golf course, it is fairly certain that property values would be negatively affected to some extent. Prospective buyers looking for a house at a golf course community would look to Spring Creek and Old Trail and skip over Lake Monticello. Housing prices would obviously not tumble, but a loss of a couple of percentage points for most homeowners would make the \$60 a year cost look piddling. Nonetheless, Hinkle says the Board is committed to improving LMOA finances and making the golf course break even or profitable would be consistent with that goal.

Most of those commenting on the new fee schedule told the Board that the schedule appeared to reflect a lack of knowledge of the make-up of the golf playing community at the Lake. The demographics of players at the Lake may be significantly different from the demographics of the golf playing communities at other courses managed by BCG. Comments were quite uniform in their view that if the proposed fee schedule is adopted without change, a portion of players will walk away from the course. If that were to happen, it is very hard to imagine how BCG could cut losses in half in year one. Golf courses around the country are generally not making money and golf demand is highly elastic, meaning that if golfers per-

ceive that prices are too high, they may turn to other courses or hang up their clubs. It was clear from the comments that the proposed fee schedule would have a significant negative impact on the golfers who play most regularly. On the other hand, the proposed fee schedule would be beneficial to the casual, occasional player. In a recent interview, Hinkle said that the Board is committed to working on the fee schedule with the regular, high volume players. He noted that currently, 53 percent of total golf course revenue comes from these players.

While the reaction to the Board's negotiations and the proposed fee schedule was entirely negative, the fact is that most golfers at the Lake have been very happy with the way in which BCG has handled golf course maintenance at the Lake in recent years, and with how it has handled food and beverage management of late. Furthermore, BCG is a highly successful golf course management company, managing approximately 160 different courses all around the country. The Board apparently believes that it cannot go wrong in turning golf operations over to BCG. Hinkle said that one thing that BCG might do is try to integrate the golf course into the community more fully with events to bring in non-golfers. He also suggested BCG is very committed to promoting lessons and youth golf, two areas in which the Lake Monticello golf course is already quite strong.

If a more realistic fee schedule can be worked out, it is possible that the Board's proposal to turn golf course operations over to BCG could be approved at the November, or December Board meeting. The November Board meeting is scheduled for Nov. 19.

The Fluvanna SPCA will be closed to the public until further notice. We are trying to do our part to help cut down on the spread of COVID-19, and with our animals' and employees' best interests in mind we are trying to reduce foot traffic to help keep our employees healthy. The animals at the shelter will continue to receive wonderful care just as they normally do, so no need to worry. 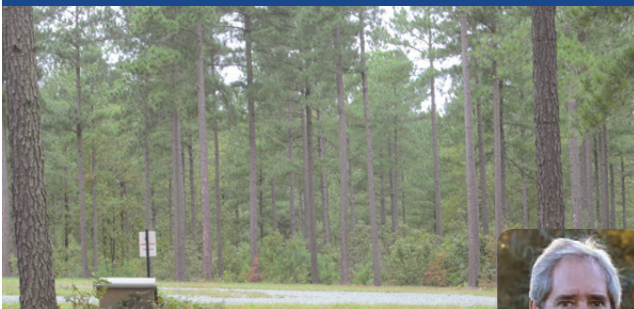

Fluvanna business turns goat milk into soap

It all started with goats. Jennifer Lyons moved from Lake Monticello to Columbia to raise animals. When she and her husband heard goats in a backyard when they were buying chickens, they knew this was their moment to finally buy goats. They came home with two goats that day, Wesley and Buttercup, names inspired by the 'Princess Bride', and the following spring, a baby goat was added to the list of animals. Lyons pondered about what she should do with the goat milk and after some thought, was inspired to make soap, which led to the creation of Totes McGoats Body Soap.

"My kids actually came up with the name," said Lyons. "At the time my kids were teenagers, and the movie 'I Love You Man' coined the phrase and then there was a Sprint commercial with James Earl Jones and Malcom McDowell that sealed the deal."

Lyons was also inspired to create soap using goats' milk because her kids suffered with eczema when they were little. Eczema is the name of a group of skin conditions that cause dry, irritated skin. Goats' milk is filled with vitamins such as A, B1, B6, B12, C, and E and minerals to help nourish and heal skin.

"Goats' milk contains alpha hydroxy to loosen dead skin making it easier for skin to absorb moisture provid-

ed by the high fat content in the milk and oils in the soap," said Lyons. "Goats' milk moisturizes and hydrates naturally. Commercial soaps are filled with chemicals to make a lather that strip oils from your skin and some contain alcohol that is drying or petroleum that just sits on the top of your skin preventing absorption of moisture.

Lyons first started selling her goats milk products at farmer's markets and eventually worked her way to selling at festivals and Fluvanna's own Old Farm Day to reach as many customers as she could. The next step was a shop, which is now located at 177 Main Street in Palmyra.

"We are family owned and I could not do this without my family," said Lyons. "My oldest daughter, Amanda, is great at selling and wrapping, and I just hired my youngest daughter, Sydney, for her first job."

Lyons is also a registered nurse who helped manage the COVID-19 unit at Martha Jefferson. Now that things are under control Lyons was able to go back to dedicating more time to making products for her business.

However, this year, like many small, locally owned businesses, COVID-19 did slow Totes McGoats down. But that did not stop Lyons from reaching her customers.

"Since there were no festivals, we had to think of ways that we could still do this," said Lyons. "We would get huge orders online, do Facebook lives, and also provided curbside pick up to customers."

With the store opened to the public again, entering customers are required to wear a mask and the store offers hand sanitizer for customers to use while browsing. Totes McGoats offers more than soaps, they also offer dog shampoo, lip products, bath bombs, and lotions. Lyons is currently working on hand soap and always trying to think of new ideas to expand and create something new.

"Customers have told me my soap has helped with eczema, psoriasis, poison ivy, acne, dry skin," said Lyons. "They want natural products, and want to use the products, not just look at it."

With the holiday season approaching fast, customers can expect to see their favorite scents like Monkey Farts, which is a sweet banana scent, as well as some essential scents like jasmine vanilla and lavender at the store. The store is open from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday and from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday.



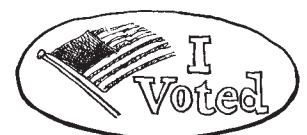

PTP goes virtual

Empty stages and shuttered theaters are the norms during the pandemic, but it is not deterring those who insist theater still has value even if it is viewed on zoom.

"I think it's the best we can do at the time to keep theater alive," said Persimmon Tree Players member George Gaige. Persimmon Tree Players is branching out on its own with a new, original performance. "Ernest in Isolation," is an original play written by member Tom Green, based on Oscar Wilde's "The Importance of Being Earnest."

Green explained that after struggling to try to put on "Moon Over Buffalo" in the spring, and ultimately figuring out that virtually distancing only works for certain types of plays, the idea surfaced during rehearsals decided that he needed to write a play intended for Zoom.

"There were some pretty funny mishaps that I thought everyone could relate to in these times of socially distant communication." He then set out to find a play that was in public domain to use as the backdrop that would meet a few criteria such as it should be relatively well-known, comedic, could be performed on Zoom, and need only a fairly small cast. "The Importance of Being Earnest" checked all of those boxes for me. I wanted it to be based on a fictional theater troupe and began thinking about ways to plug "Earnest" into a Zoom setting as a "play within a play."

Green has adapted children's plays from the original books and also wrote "Aesop's Avenue," an original children's play.

"Writing the play was a little terrifying and the idea of writing a play for adults was daunting," he said. He started to brainstorm ideas and said he had many different iterations in his head but couldn't settle on a format. He read Wilde's "The Importance of Being Earnest" multiple times and used it as a basis for a summer theater class he was taking at Longwood University. After the class ended, he had a breakthrough.

"I saw potential in using *Earnest* as the guiding story for this virtual medium, and began writing," he said. "The idea to have it be a community theater group needing to adapt the original "Earnest" to virtual and fighting through all of the obstacles of that became the heart of it." He finished it in August. "I still left that process not being able to determine if what I wrote worked or not, but we went ahead with auditions. When I heard it live, it clicked. We treated it as a "living document."

Green says "Ernest in Isolation" was the result of all of these experiences and obstacles. It is about a community theater group trying to do exactly what PTP tried to do this past spring with "Moon Over Buffalo" and finding ways to keep theater alive in a time when they are unable to gather on a physical stage or be in front of a live audience.

"It embraces the love of theater and the family bonds that theater creates. It is about rising above the challenges in these times to create and share the stage as actors with an audience."

Green admits the experience has been very rewarding but misses the

camaraderie and relationship-building of being in the theater together, and it has made personal connections hard.

"I also know it is challenging for the actors to act in a box, but I have to say that they have done an amazing job of adapting."

Speaking of the actors, some are local and others are as far away as northern Virginia, Syracuse, New York, and Ocean Shores, Washington. Much of putting the cast together was through networking with local actors, PTP members, and other theater groups.

The principal benefits to doing a virtual play were that we could cast actors from outside the area, we didn't have to travel to rehearse or have production meetings, and anyone in the world with a decent internet connection can see our production," said Jen Starkey, a PTP veteran. "And with our production costs being much lower than they are with one of our onstage productions, we're able to offer a pay as you wish pricing option for tickets so that the cost to watch the performance won't be prohibitive for anyone."

Gaige views it from an audience standpoint.

"On the plus side, you can sit in the comfort of your own home and see a quality performance in your pajamas," said Gaige.

As an actor in the Zoom production, Starkey, it is a vastly different experience from what she is used to. She explains the director has to have a different mindset when looking at a play through Zoom. For Green as the director, this was an added challenge.

Stages being wide open spaces, directors and actors have to adapt to a new form, similar to film and television where actors are used to speaking in boxes. For Starkey the most demanding aspect was blocking.

"The actors enter the "stage" in a specific order so they're positioned cor-

rectly on the screen, and then making sure they know in which direction to look, which often isn't the direction in which they see the other characters on the screen." She admits it was a learning process for her and Green because of the technical aspects of virtual theater that they were unfamiliar with.

She credits Technical Director, Shannon Montague, with creating the finished product that the audience will see. Unlike film or TV cameras that have the luxury of panning, the camera on computers is stationary and requires someone who understands the result of how things work on Zoom. To actors used to moving on stage, they can feel the restraint.

"As an actor, interacting with other characters when I wasn't able to face them was extremely difficult and, at times, made me feel unconnected to the other actors. I had to rely on Tom's direction to make sure that the way I was portraying Sarah was complementing what the other characters were doing onscreen."

That aside, Starkey revealed her thoughts about her character Sarah Foster.

"She is the actress who portrays Gwendolen in the community theater's production of "The Importance of Being Earnest." She thinks she's a talented actress, but as with most performers, her insecurities tend to get the better of her, which makes her lash out at all of the other cast and crew members," she said. "She's pretty difficult to work with, but underneath I think she's just worried that the performance of the play is going to be awful. And her lack of confidence is heightened by the fact that she's far too old to be playing the part of Gwendolen."

Medal found in Scottsville cave speaks of history

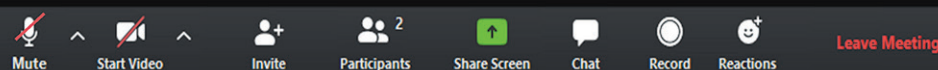
"May you live in interesting times," is said to be an old Chinese curse. I'm sure we are all feeling that times are a little too interesting right now. Maybe it would help to go back in history to a time and place which was worse—16th century France. The Protestant Reformation was beginning to attract followers in France, meeting with fierce resistance from the Catholic Church establishment.

Unfortunately, the French kings were the young, sickly sons of Catherine de Medici and Henry II. Charles IX, the second son, ruled from 1560-1574, beginning when he was ten years old. Into the power vacuum moved the powerful, pro-Catholic Guise family and the pro-Protestant Bourbons. In 1562, the religious wars broke out. Per the historian, Ferdinand Schevill: "The war, like all the religious wars of the century, was waged with inhuman barbarity, and incendiarism, pillage, massacre, and assassination blot every stage of its progress. Protestants and Catholics alike became beasts of the field and vied with each other in their efforts to turn their country into a desert."

On August 24, 1572, St. Bartholomew's Day, the Catholic faction with the connivance of the crown, organized a massacre of prominent Protestant leaders. It quickly got out of hand, and over 3,000 people were slaughtered in Paris and perhaps as many in the provinces. "We reach some understanding of the ferocity of religious divisions of the time," writes Schevill, "when we hear that at the news of the massacre Pope Gregory XIII ordered a solemn Te Deum to be sung and that the somber Philip of Spain burst into his only recorded laugh."

What does this have to do with Scottsville? We have in the museum, on loan from Jack Hamner, a medal which was struck to honor the occasion. Dated 1572, it shows Charles (Carolus IX, D.G. Francorum Rex Invic., 1572--Charles IX, by the grace of God King of the French, Unconquered, 1572) on one side and his wife, Elizabeth of Austria, on the other. Jack's father found this medal in a cave near Scottsville. It had been strung on a cord with shell beads and was obviously used as an ornament. How did it get to Scottsville? Did its native American wearer have any idea what it was, or was it seen simply as bling, a piece of foreign silver?
