The importance of culinary history Recipes from Fluvanna's Black community

Nina Monroe is mining relationships with older friends and relatives for recipes.

And now she'd like to reach readers. The owner of The Elephantz Trunk recently joined the Fluvanna Economic Development Tourism Advisory Council.

"It seemed as if the African American culture wasn't included (in plans/suggestions), Monroe said. "I mean, we're not going to go rafting down the James River."

So Monroe suggested searching for, cataloging and publishing a list of recipes from the people and the county she grew up in: Fluvanna's black community.

"I feel this is a missing part of Fluvanna's Black culture," she said.

Monroe grew up in Bremo Bluff where her mother still lives.

Two of the recipes she has gleaned so far are for buttermilk cornbread with crackling and wild rabbit and gravy.

"So many of mothers and grandmothers didn't cook from a written recipe," Monroe said.

When she asked her mother for how much flour went into a dish, she said, "I don't know, we just threw in what we needed."

That's one of the obstacles to sharing the recipes. Monroe often has to sit with a relative while they make the dish and write down the ingredients, amounts and steps.

Her mother told Monroe to bake the cornbread at 425 degrees.

"I knew she cooked on a wood stove and I asked how she knew what the temperature was. She said those stoves had a gauge on top. I had no idea," Monroe said.

Tricia Johnson, director of the Fluvanna Historical Society, said culinary history is important.

"It's not only a reflection of how families spent their time together but it shows what their resources were and what they did with them," Johnson said. "Culinary history is fascinating because it teaches us about what people had and how they creatively used what they had."

Monroe said the recipes will be available in a downloadable pdf version online at www.fromfluvanna.org.

"We'll have blog posts highlighting the recipes," she said.

Gale Babcock Robertson, devoted wife, mother of four, grandmother of 11, and great grandmother, passed away on Thursday, January 21, 2021, at the age of 82.

Gale was born in Vancouver, Washington on April 24, 1938. She was Senior Class President and received an Associate's Degree at Sullins College in Bristol, VA before marrying George R. Good supported insurrection

The article in last week's paper stating that Bob Good was simply exercising his right when he objected to the electors of certain states, is accurate. The writer, Ms. Rateau, compares Good's actions with those of several Democrats in the past twenty years. Her history is accurate. However, her context is faulty.

Well failure feared

Moving from an urban site to this bucolic setting in 1987, zoned A1 (agriculture), my property nestled next to a story-book hundred acre wood riddled with serene trails, briskly flowing Ballinger Creek, animals, and nature, I found home! Here was privacy, peaceful country living, stars in the quiet night sky, and freedom to exist and raise children with room to run. The only drawback has been limited water supply through my well.

Harsh reality arrived quite abruptly in October 2020 when a developer suddenly knocked on my door and announced his intention to cut down the entire beloved 100 acre wood and create a subdivision adjoining my entire property line. My heart sank, and I grieved.

This suburban density is planned for a rural area zoned A1 not serviced by public water or sewer which includes plans for a total of 48 homes (18 immediately adjacent to my property line), each on approximately 0.35 acre lots, each with a well and never-before tried or proven septic/drainage field systems that will service four homes in a documented water-problematic area of Fluvanna County. It includes topographical slopes in some areas too steep to ever consider sleigh riding. This subdivision is a startling deviation from other homes in the area.

Many Palmyra neighbors have documented testimonies such as well/pump failure, multiple wells dug before tapping water, and turning off pumps daily to allow water to re-accumulate before use can resume. The fear is very real that current and future Fluvanna County citizens will experience well and spring failure in this setting at their own expense. Perhaps Fluvanna County will have to step in and rescue failing or faltering wells of its citizens by providing an expensive and prohibitive public water supply because of this dense urban plan.

It is my opinion that the developer who stands to benefit financially from this subdivision should bear the expense of piping water to it, sparing Fluvanna County and citizens from assisting him in his financial gain.

PUBLIC NOTICE Pleasant Grove Park Wildlife Meadows Restoration Controlled Burn

Fluvanna County will soon begin the next phase of meadow management and restoration at Pleasant Grove Park by conducting a series of prescribed controlled burns. The burns will take place in two wildlife meadows, as indicated by the yellow encircled areas in the image below.



As part of the County's long-term meadow maintenance plan, controlled burns will allow us to retain these areas as valuable, and rare, wildlife habitat, as well as arrest the natural progression of these meadows into forest. The first two controlled burns are planned for February 2021 when wind, humidity, and other weather conditions are more likely to be favorable. Native grasses and wildflowers are dormant at this time of year and wildlife nesting has not begun.

Five years ago, the Fluvanna County embarked on a plan to create native wildlife meadows at Pleasant Grove. The first step, no longer mowing certain areas, created nearly 70 acres of wildlife meadows, some of the largest areas of native meadow on public property in Virginia, outside of national parks. While the actual burn will be conducted by trained and experienced Virginia Department of Forestry personnel, the County is coordinating with many other agencies to prepare, conduct, and follow-up after the burn. The agencies involved in the planned burns include the: Fluvanna County Fire Departments, Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office, Fluvanna County Public Schools, Virginia Department of Transportation, Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources, Virginia Cooperative Extension, Rivanna Master Naturalists, and Fluvanna Master Gardeners. After the burn, donated native grass and wildflower seeds will be planted, particularly in the areas disturbed by creating a fire line around the perimeter of the burned area.

Fluco boys start strong, hang on to top **Orange 53-48**

The Fluco boys' basketball squad outscored the Orange County Hornets 16-9 in the first quarter on Jan. 29, and Orange never led the rest of the way. Maurice D'Alessandra was hot for the Flucos as he hit two three-point shots in the middle of the quarter and then sank three free throws after being fouled on a three-point shot. His nine points in the first quarter equaled Orange's total for the quarter. The Flucos also had a three pointer by Kobe Edmonds and four points from John Rittenhouse in the quarter.

The second quarter was a low scoring affair as both teams were having trouble getting off makeable shots. Xavier Copeland had two baskets for the Flucos. One came on a steal and a drive for a lay-up and the other came on a lay-up off a nice pass by D'Alessandra. Both teams scored eight in the quarter for a half-time score of 24-17.

In the third guarter, the Flucos continued to have problems finding their stride. The Hornets picked up their game somewhat and they outscored Fluvanna 12-7 to cut the margin down to two points at 31-29. D'Alessandra had another threepoint basket for the Flucos and Rittenhouse and Copeland both contributed two points.

The pace of play heated up significantly in the final quarter, as both teams put up more points than in any previous quarter. The quarter started well for the Flucos, as Rittenhouse scored on a layup, Edmonds made a steal and went coast to coast for a lay-in. Orange countered with a lay-up and Rittenhouse nailed a threepoint shot. The Flucos were back in the lead by seven, at 38-31. Copeland scored a basket and a free throw, while Orange recorded two two-point baskets and the score was 41-35 with three minutes left. D'Alessandra made his fourth three point shot and Copeland made a steal and fed Rittenhouse, who was fouled and made two free throws. The Hornets refused to go away, sinking a couple of three pointers in the final minutes to cut the Fluco lead to three points twice. However, the Flucos handled the pressure well as D'Alessandra, Rittenhouse and Copeland all converted clutch free throws, as the clock wound down, to preserve the Fluco lead.

After the game, Coach Heath Bralley commented that his team played very

Doctors answer questions about vaccines

On Jan. 26, the Fluvanna Chapter of the NAACP hosted a forum on Zoom with medical experts from the University of Virginia and the Blue Ridge Health District, associated with the Virginia Department of Health, discussing questions regarding the COVID-19 vaccines and vaccinations.

The panel included Dr. Taison Bell M.D., an assistant professor of medicine in the divisions of Infectious Diseases and International Health and in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at U.Va.

It also included Dr. Cameron Webb M.D., who is a practicing internist, assistant professor, the director of health policy and equity at U.Va.'s School of Medicine. Webb also helped found the Health Equity, Law, and Policy Research Laboratory at U.Va. Webb has been tapped for a senior role in President-elect Biden's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The panel also included Dr. Denise Bonds of the Blue Ridge Health District (former Thomas Jefferson Health District).

The discussion opened with questions regarding the disease, its structure, and how the vaccine works to bolster immunity using the body's defenses.

Dr. Bell began talking about the family of viruses known as CoV, including SARS and MERS. COVID-19 is related to SARS CoV-2.

"Variants are important and the reason they make the news is they spread more easily," said Bell. Dr. Webb addressed how the vaccine works in the human body to ward off the virus by giving detailed examples.

"If you have any questions ask your healthcare professional," said Webb. He recommends that those who want information do not search online because lottesville on Feb. 1 and Orange again on Feb. 3. They finish up this abbreviated season on Feb. 5 against Monticello.

some information may not be accurate.

The question was asked why the virus is more deadlier for African-Americans and other minorities.

"The African-American community has been neglected and not getting what they need. We need to make sure that we protect as many as possible," said Bell. Under the new administration, there is work being done to assure that the minority communities and native American reservations are included in the vaccination process. The problem in many of these areas is getting the people's trust in taking the vaccine. Particularly there is hesitation in the Hispanic communities because of misinformation and more education is needed.

"The vaccines have been researched for over a decade and it appears to work well across ethnicities," said Dr. Webb. Dr. Bell added, "The vaccines were developed using well-studied technology and were rigorously studied with independent oversight at all levels." Drs. Webb and Bonds agreed with Dr. Bell that the vaccines against COVID-19 are very effective for preventing symptomatic COVID-19 infection and are generally very safe.

Questions regarding reactions and allergies were uppermost in most people's minds. Dr. Webb explained that some may have a reaction to the first dose such as pain at the injection site, some muscle or joint aches, some fever, or a headache. Some may experience a few of these mild side effects or nothing at all.

"My wife had a temperature of 101 after the first dose and then a temperature of 102 with the second dose but my parents had zero side effects," said Dr. Webb.

"The severe allergic reaction is a rare

side effect but everyone should be aware of it," said Dr. Bell. He added that those with severe allergic reactions, such as a rash or the throat swelling and closing up are one in 100,000 with the Pfizer vaccine and one in 400,000 with Moderna's. "Speak with your physician if you have specific questions or concerns."

"It has been very well tolerated, only one person has had very mild symptoms," added Dr. Bonds. They did add that if you are a heavy user of alcohol or are sick, do not get vaccinated until you are in better shape.

Regarding the cases that have been declining in Virginia and elsewhere in the U.S the doctors stated this is no time to become complacent but to remain vigilant.

"After coming down from recent highs earlier this month it does look like our case counts and hospitalizations are coming down. Unfortunately, much of this is connected with the increase in holiday related travel," said Dr. Bell. "We should remain vigilant because this virus has shown an ability to persist when we let up our guard. Additionally, the UK variant spreads easily and will make sticking to our strategies to contain the spread of the virus that much more important."

Dr. Bonds added, "The best mask is the one you're going to wear." She also suggests following the new guidelines for mask-wearing and find one that has double layers of tightly-woven fabric.

Those waffling on the idea of getting vaccinated or refuse to do so for personal reasons might try to see it from Webb and Bell's perspective. Though a day for them is often grim they are still hopeful things will turn around with the vaccine and everyone doing their part to save lives, including their own by wearing masks, social distancing, and washing their hands. Dr. Webb usually sees people who are not as severe but may need treatment and isolation whereas Dr. Bell sees much worse and is frank about what he witnesses on a daily basis including death. But even the aftermath of COVID-19 changes lives.

"Life changes for survivors," said Dr. Bell. "They may experience depression or other physical changes affecting their lives which may not have been the case prior to the illness."

As for the vaccine roll-out it has been slow, frustrating, confusing for many. The key to organizing is in the planning of logistics, effective communications, and timing once there are enough vaccines to go around.

"The federal government sends a certain amount and it is just 100,000 in the state of Virginia. The Blue Ridge Health District (this includes Albemarle, Fluvanna, Louisa, Green, and Nelson) makes up three percent of the population so that would be 2,800 doses per week. But now it looks like the federal government will be increasing the doses to states," said Dr. Bonds.

The leading question was when would it be available at doctor's offices.

"Eventually, you will get the vaccine from your physician's but since these vaccines are so fussy, having to store one in ultracold temperatures, it is more likely that pharmacies like CVS, Walgreens, or Walmart will be able to provide it," said Dr. Bonds.

Regarding long-term immunity, Dr. Bell stated, "Long-term immunity is not definitive but drug companies are tracking those who have been vaccinated." There is a lot for these doctors to consider with the disease itself, the mutations, and the short and long-term effects. What we do and the choices we make will influence the outcome of the pandemic.

"Once we see cases decline and stay low as we start to gradually resume our usual activities, we will know then that we have turned the corner. I don't expect this to happen until we achieve herd immunity," said Dr. Bell.
