The return of the American chestnut tree in Fluvanna

Growing up we heard about the chestnut tree in literature, heard it in Christmas songs, and some may remember, in places like New York City, street vendors selling roasted chestnuts. It was common to see chestnut trees in the wild and it was part of American life. They survived for 40 million years and died out within 40 years. In north-eastern America, there were three billion trees and 25 percent of the trees in the Appalachian Mountains were chestnut but the number of surviving trees 24" in diameter is now fewer

than 100.

"The chestnut trees, once a dominant tree of the Eastern deciduous forest, had been decimated by a blight in the early 1900s. Their nuts were a valuable source of food for wildlife and humans, while the wood was highly prized with its rot-resistant quality as well as strength. It was used for railroad ties, telegraph poles, etc.," said Walter Hussey, a master naturalist. "The American Chestnut Foundation (ACF) and the Virginia Department of Forestry (VADOF) are working to restore chestnut to our forests, but it takes time to breed a variety resistant to the blight due to the long life cycle of a tree."

A restoration project is underway to bring back the American chestnut tree to Pleasant Grove. There are many similar projects at Pleasant Grove supporting wildlife and plant life at the park including the successful pollinator garden. The project was the idea of the late Doug Frazier who lived in the county. According to Hussey, Frazier had visited one of the VADOF research nurseries working with the Virginia chapter of the American Chestnut Foundation, to crossbreed American Chestnuts with Chinese chestnuts that are resistant to the blight. Hussey said the ideal mix is 1/16th Chinese and 15/16th American.

"He arranged, with the lead Chestnut VADOF researcher, to obtain some nuts and introduced us. Doug knew that I had already coordinated the planting of over one thousand trees at Pleasant Grove as part of establishing the native wildlife meadows," he said. "The key point behind the Chestnut Restoration Demonstration Plot at Pleasant Grove Park was that the nurseries, while open to the public, did not do much to educate the public and also were just isolated oasis devoted to research."

He said the next step in the chestnut restoration was to start moving out into the public and to diversify the plantings beyond the nurseries.

"The Pleasant Grove Park Chestnut Restoration Demonstration Plot provides an initial activity moving us in that direction, an effort we expect to be copied by other public areas and parks throughout Virginia."

One of the key questions for some is what kind of nutrients do chestnuts provide and how do you cook and eat them. A large,

sweet, soft nut, tasting like a sweet potato, roasted chestnuts are the most common food and chestnut stuffing had been a feature at the Thanksgiving table decades ago. But they can be enjoyed in a variety of ways, including fresh, pureed, jarred or canned, and even ground into flour. They are a good source of antioxidants and are high in fiber, low in fat, and reduce heart disease. They are generally available in the fall.

Fluvanna County Parks and Recreation had been involved in determining the site. The seeds and seedlings were provided by the VADOF. The plantings were by volunteers from the Charlottesville Area Tree Stewards, Rivanna Master Naturalists, and the Fluvanna Master Gardeners.

The Chestnut Restoration Demonstration Plot is just one of the many efforts undertak en by Fluvanna County resident volunteers under our project, Pleasant Grove Park: A Natural Experience," said Hussey. These are opportunities for the public to learn about nature and it is a great educational experience for families to take advantage of as well.

Other nature experiences they have created at Pleasant Grove include self-guided nature hikes, a tree identification arboretum trail, a Nature Room with numerous nature artifacts, the native wildlife meadows, butterfly garden, birding guides, and trail/habitat maps, bluebird nesting box trail, and more. Hussey adds that these nature experiences are not only available anytime the public visits Pleasant Grove Park but are included in their education programs, including the monthly guided hikes, the annual Earth Day, 1st and 2nd grade field trips, summer library programs, Fluvanna County Fair and other events conducted by their voluntages.



Lake Monticello Travelers golf team crushes Orchard Creek

Back in 2015, the Lake Monticello Travelers golf team was established to play matches against comparable teams from other area golf courses. In that year, teams from five courses were involved. After a year off in 2020 due to the pandemic, the Lake Monticello Travelers are back in action. On July 8, the team hosted golfers from Orchard Creek (formerly Waynesboro Country Club) The format was Nassau and the Lake squad swept to a devastating 24-9 victory.

In a Nassau competition, there are three points to be contested in each match. Two-man teams from each squad face off over 18 holes. There is a point to be won on each hole and the team that wins the front nine is awarded one point. The team that wins the back nine is awarded one point and the team that wins the entire eighteen is awarded one point. Therefore, each match has a three-point score. In this competition, there were 11 matchups for a total of 33 points. If the two teams tie on a hole, each team gets a half point for that hole. If the teams tie on one of the nine hole competition they both get a half point for that nine in the Nassau competition.

In this match, three of the Travelers teams swept their matches, scoring all three points. These teams were, John Roeder and Mike Hanson, Everitt Horton and Larry Cormier and Jim Williams and Ted Moser. In addition, two Travelers teams scored 2 ½ points. These were the teams of Bill Scanlon and George Csapo and Pete Ferensak and Cole Hunter. It is not surprising for home teams to win in these competitions as local knowledge is important when playing a difficult course like the Lake course.

The Travelers will be playing home and away matches this year with teams from Glenmore, Birdwood, Old Trail, Stoney Creek and Green Hills. In 2015, only Waynesboro, Stoney Creek, Green Hills and Glenmore were involved. Spring Creek was in the competition for one year, as was Keswick. The most recent addition is Old Trail from Crozet. For 2015-2017 the Travelers coordinator was Dan Atkinson. In 2018 and 2019, the coordinator was Paul Seehaver. In 2021, the co-coordinators are Everitt Horton and Karl Bergstresser.

At the beginning of the day, the hosts treat the visitors to a continental breakfast. At nine sharp, the players rollout to their assigned holes in a shotgun start. This allows the foursomes to finish at approximately the same time, so that all the players can gather for lunch and an announcement of the match results.

In the girls 9-10 200 SC Meter Medley Relay, LMST took first place with a stellar team of: Teagan Brown, Vienna Barresi, Ariella Miller, and Elliot Gehling. LMST Shark, Norbu Barnett was first place in two events, the Boys 8 & Under 25 SC meter freestyle as well as the Boys 8 & Under 25 SC meter backstroke. Rounding out the wins, Stella Strickland was first place in the Girls 6 & Under 25 SC meter backstroke. However, it is not just our first-place swimmers who deserve accolades, each team member brought comradery, good sportsmanship, and heart to this meet. There were so many levels of swimmers in the pool that night, each showing up and putting their best effort forward. Have you asked your BFF for a recommendation yet?



Supervisors review purchase policy, TransAmerica bike route

BY HEATHER MICHON CORRESPONDENT

The Board of Supervisors held back-to-back meetings on Wednesday (July 7), their last sessions ahead of their regular midsummer break.

Chair Mike Sheridan (Columbia) was away for the week, so Vice Chair Tony O'Brien (Rivanna) took the gavel for the three-and-a-half-hour session. During that time, supervisors voted on two action matters, listened to two presentations, held two public hearings, and sat in for a one-hour closed

Small purchase policy

Purchasing Officer Cyndi Toler presented a

revised schedule for the county's policy on small purchases.

"Our small purchasing policy now only goes to \$50,000," said Toler.

Under the current county guidelines, anything above the \$50,000 threshold requires the county to put out a formal solicitation for competitive bids, while anything below \$50,000 requires between 1-4 price quotes depending on the total cost of the purchase.

This is well below the state's threshold, which requires formal solicitations for goods and non-professional services greater than \$200,000, or greater than \$80,000 in professional services.

After looking at other counties, including those







similar in size to Fluvanna, Toler and her staff recommended raising the threshold for formal solicitations up to \$80,000 for professional services and \$100,000 plus for goods and nonprofessional services.

They also recommended raising the dollar limits for the number of bids needed within pricing tier below \$100,000. For example, under the existing policy, the county only needs to solicit one bid for anything priced under \$3,000. Under the revised policy, anything under \$5,000 would require only one bid.

"I think it gives an appropriate amount of competition without being overly taxing on the employees, but still giving us the competition intended by the statutes."

County Administrator Eric Dahl said it might also save the county some money on legal fees, as anything put out for formal bid requires review by the county attorney's staff.

Dahl is the designated purchasing agent when it comes to signing off on small purchases. His signature authority would increase from \$50,000 to

Supervisors approved Toler's revised schedule by a vote of 4-0-1.

Transamerica Bike Route

Economic Development Coordinator Bryan Rothamel and his intern, Dana Korotovskikh, requested the Board's approval of a letter of support to change the path of Bike Route 76 through the Village of Palmyra.

BR76 is part of the TransAmerica bike route, established during the Bicentennial in 1976 to form a 4,228-mile-long coast-to-coast bike path from Astoria, Washington to Yorktown, Virginia.

The Fluvanna Leadership Development Program has suggested modifying the route, which currently takes riders down Rt. 53 and for a short distance

on Rt. 15 until it reaches Courthouse Road.

Not only is the short traverse on Rt. 15 dangerous for riders, it also misses the historic area of Palmyra.

A proposed change would add only a tenth of a mile to the route, but would have the effect of getting riders off Rt. 15 sooner and take them through the village, past the park, the Old Stone Jail, and the historic courthouse before crossing 15 back onto Courthouse Road.

Rothamel and Korotovskikh said this would provide more resources for riders and allow them to enjoy the historic sites of the village.

The Fluvanna Leadership Development Program will also update the resources listed in the official guides and brochures for riders on the route.

The approval process for changing the route is lengthy, but a letter of support from the Board of Supervisors would help the process move forward.

Off-duty deputies

In the second part of the meeting, supervisors also unanimously approved a modification to the county ordinances to allow off-duty deputy sheriffs to work as security and traffic control with the approval of the sheriff.

This is a long-standing practice for deputies, and the sheriff's office already has a formal process for approving off-duty work. The rate for off-duty work is set at \$45 per hour, with the deputy receiving \$40 and the sheriff keeping \$5 to cover administrative costs. The ordinance change simply clarifies the policy.

They also approved the rezoning of a parcel on Edgecomb Road at Zion Crossroads from B-1 (Business, General) to I-1 (Industrial, Limited). The plans for the site have not vet been finalized.

The next meeting of the Board of Supervisors will take place on Aug. 4 at 4 p.m.
