



School Board hears from residents on masks, transgender policies

The Fluvanna County School Board held its regular meeting on Wednesday (Aug. 11), a marathon five-and-a-half-hour session that covered the twin controversies of mask wearing and transgender policies, and even featured an unexpected cameo by Representative Bob Good (R-Va 5th).

The meeting came just two days after the board met in a special session on Monday morning (Aug. 9) to debate whether children should be required to wear masks ahead of the start of the new school year on

Only three members were able to attend, and they voted 3-0 in favor of universal masking by students, teachers, and staff.

Andrew Pullen (Columbia District) was one of the members not able to attend Monday morning, and joined the Wednesday meeting by phone. He argued that the vote on Monday was "illegitimate," because proper procedures had not been followed and asked that the mask issue be pulled from the evening's agenda pending a legal review.

The board voted 3-2 to keep the item on the agenda.

Public comments

Public comments lasted for about two hours and covered much of the same rhetorical territory presented during the Monday session -- although there were a greater number of pro-mask and pro-transgender rights speakers than at the previous meeting.

Karen Mann spoke of her life experiences as gay and gender non-conforming, and said many of Fluvanna's gay and trans students have reached out to her. "They need our support, your support, to create an educational environment that's supportive and inclusive and values them for all that they are," she said.

Parents opposed to universal masking also shared their views, often equating a mask mandate with a loss of personal freedom.

Some threatened legal action against the board, with one speaker closing his remarks with "anyone who wants to join a class action lawsuit, come talk to me after the meeting."

Bob Good

Representative Bob Good took a frontrow seat for the meeting and stayed for just under four hours. Although Good is not a resident of Fluvanna County, board members did allow him the opportunity to speak late in the comment period.

Good started his comments by praising the parents who had come out to speak, and that they should do so during every public meeting. "The school board will listen to you when they fear you more than they fear Richmond."

Good made several comments on the hot-button issues of the day -- saying, for example, that critical race theory, or CRT, was "absolutely being taught" in Virginia schools.

When it came to transgender students "we know the science: God created two genders." He called trans students "gender confused" and this "confusion" should not be reinforced by the schools.

Finally, he said, "we all know masks don't work." He encouraged anti-mask parents to refuse to comply with mask mandates and called these mandates "absolutely child abuse."

Following public comments, Dr. Gretz gave a detailed presentation on how the school system might develop policies and procedures for transgender students under the new laws and guidelines from the state.

He said his proposals to the board were based on the Virginia Department of Edu-

We do not need interference from Mr. Good or any other non-Fluvanna resident. I encourage all residents of Fluvanna County to attend School Board meetings to let your voices be heard. Our taxes support our schools. The members of the School Board are responsible for the leadership of our schools. We need to elect members to the Board who will stop non-residents of Fluvanna from attempting to influence the decisions made about our schools.

Eric Anderson, candidate for the Cunningham District, has the skills and experience to lead our schools for the benefit of all our students. He is a 10-year resident of Fluvanna who is on the engineer-ing faculty at the University of Virginia. cation's model policies and his own discussions with faculty, staff, and students, including transgender students.

"There are literally dozens of decision points within these model policies," he said. "They need to be carefully considered, and we've done that as a team."

There were also areas where the school system already had policies in place -- for example, the prohibitions against bullying, harassment, and discrimination. Those didn't necessarily need to be changed, in his opinion, merely affirmed.

Gretz said he didn't believe it put an undue burden on teachers or staff if a student confided information about their gender identification but asked to keep it private, and that staff should

"do anything we could reasonably do to respect that."

However, he argued that they needed to deal with issues on a "case-by-case basis." If, for example, staff felt a student's safety was at risk, the schools should have a role in "encouraging communication" between parents and students.

The model policies also call for eliminating "gender markers" wherever possible, and while Gretz said there certainly are some areas where this might be possible, the school system was "very limited" on how to do that across the board.

Other areas, like dress codes, were more straightforward. He also said they could "eliminate gender-specific activities" wherever possible.

Bathrooms

"Frankly, the bathrooms are getting all the attention here," he said of the public debate. In conversations, bathroom access was

not one of the major concerns he was hearing from transgender students themselves.

Parents, on the other hand, were vocal in their concerns that bathrooms were "essentially going to become a free-for-all," where any male student, or even adult male, could suddenly assert they identified as female and use that as entry into the girl's rooms, and that the staff wasn't allowed to question them.

Gretz said that was not the case.

Transgender students who "consistently assert" their gender identity would be allowed to use the bathroom that fits their preferred identification -- but it was not the case that a male student could simply walk into the girl's room on the argument that "he felt like a girl today."

"We're not going to stop kids in the hall and grill them," he said. "But there has to be a process where there's a conversation."

His proposal was that trans students would have a one-time conversation with the principal and guidance counselor to gain access to the bathroom that best fits their identity. He pointed out that in the vast majority of cases, staff was already aware of the student's transgender status.

Gretz added that the policy would only apply to students. Adults would always be offered a separate restroom, away from students.

The proposal drew questions from James Kelley (District), who said he didn't want to see trans students have to jump through "unnecessary hoops" just to use the restroom.

"There are different beliefs about gender," Gretz said in his closing remarks. "There are different beliefs about how many genders there are, there are different beliefs about the nature of gender, the difference between sex and gender, all of those things. I think we need to create a policy that, first and foremost, respects students and cares for students, and says: you matter. We see you, we know you, we care about you."

Board members asked Gretz to create a written version of his proposals for further consideration.

Masks, again

In the final hour of the meeting, the board revisited the issue of masking.

Members Andrew Pullen and Charles Rittenhouse (Cunningham District) voiced their opposition to the mask requirement, but the majority of the board was clearly holding to the decision they had made on Monday. In a compromise, they agreed to revisit the issue monthly, or if they received legal guidance that they could move to a optional model.

However, the day after the meeting, Governor Ralph Northam's administration issued a Public Health Emergency Order that requires universal masking for students in all K-12 public schools in the Commonwealth. This order will remain in place for the foreseeable future.

NAACP presents third forum on children and vaccinations

The Fluvanna NAACP is sponsoring a third virtual health forum on Thursday, Aug. 19, at 7 p.m. Their forums focus on current health issues and the previous two discussions centered on information regarding COVID-19. Medical experts answer questions and present important information on how we can keep ourselves safe during the COVID pandemic. It is free and accessible by the public.

"Part of our mission is to help educate and inform the public on issues related to health and education. With a return to school and a rise in cases due to the Delta variant, we want to provide valuable information to the community to help keep our community safe and healthy," said Sharon Harris, communications chair for the Fluvanna chapter.

Though it seemed as if we might be conquering COVID by getting everyone vaccinated, our progress reached an impasse when some refused to get vaccinated and others refused to wear masks. While we still are in the midst of a health crisis, added to the mix are children returning to school which presents another issue to be debated.

According to The American Academy of Pediatrics, as of Aug. 5, 4.3 million children tested positive for COVID-19 across the U.S. Nearly 94,000 cases were reported that week, a 31 percent increase since the 72,000 cases reported the previous week, and 39,000 the week before. Parents questioned whether it is the Delta variant that is responsible for the uptick in cases. Hospitalizations and death are rare among children effected with COVID-19. and is less than two percent. Nevertheless,

hospitalizations are up in children's hospitals and experts believe this trend will increase over two to three months.

"We are also aware of the disparities in health access and health outcomes and we want to draw on the resources of local medical experts to reduce barriers, promote informed decision making, and help keep our community healthy," she said. Dr. Taison Bell, Dr. Paige Perriello, and Dr. Denise Bonds will be answering questions as to what parents can do to keep their children safe, particularly since they are returning to school.

Dr. Bell is a leading expert on infectious diseases and critical care medicine and has served as a national medical resource as he has appeared as a medical expert on numerous national media broadcasts. Dr. Perriello is a local pediatrician with the Charlottesville Pediatrics Associates and a member of the Virginia Chapter of the National Academy of Pediatrics. Dr. Perriello has led community vaccine efforts for children. Dr. Bonds is the Director of the Blue Ridge Health District and will provide information on the many efforts of BRHD to make vaccines widely available in the community including a mobile vaccine unit and in-home vaccinations.

One reason for the hesitancy regarding vaccines is that many, including parents, feel it was rushed and there is not enough information about the long-term effects of the vaccines. According to John Hopkins, the COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna were created with a method that has been in development for years, so the companies could start the vaccine development process early in the pandemic. China had also isolated and shared genetic information about COVID-19 so scientists could start working on vaccines. Some types of COVID-19 vaccines were created using messenger RNA (mRNA), which allows the process to progress more quickly than the traditional way that vaccines are made. With advanced technology and modern methods in science, the ability to get the vaccines out early was achieved.

The vaccine developers didn't skip any testing steps but conducted some of the steps on an overlapping schedule to gather data faster. Other factors included social media helping companies find and engage willing study volunteers for COVID-19 vaccine research and because the virus is so contagious and widespread, it didn't take long to see if the vaccine worked for the study volunteers who were vaccinated. The companies also began manufacturing their vaccines before FDA authorization, so some supplies were ready when authorization occurred. Teamwork and effort from all involved helped to get the vaccines to the public, showing everyone can work together for a common goal.

Regarding children 12 and under and vaccination, data is still be gathered and studies are being done to assess many factors including proper dosage. But the BRHD recommends all school staff and children wear masks. Transmission in Fluvanna is moderate but surrounding counties have a transmission rate that is high or substantial among their populations.

The other issue is where to get reliable and factual information. It has been no surprise that there has been misinformation floating around social media and on websites. Check the sources. The CDC is the best source for upto-date information and state health departments.



Fluco football returns with a normal fall schedule

The Fluvanna County high school football team is preparing for a regular fall schedule in 2021. It will be the second football season of 2021, as the team played an abbreviated 2020-21 season in February and March, due to the pandemic caused cancellation of the regular 2020 fall football season.

The team has practiced prior to the official opening of school and scrimmaged with William Monroe High on Aug.13. A second scrimmage is scheduled on Aug. 20 at Nelson County. The regular season begins on Aug. 27 when the Flucos will travel to play at Broadway High.

Head Coach Michael Morris said that he has around 30 athletes on the varsity team this year. His team will not be as big as some of its predecessor squads, but he notes that he has some very strong athletes who have been doing impressive work in the weight room.

Morris will have two quarterbacks this year. Senior Kobe Edmonds will split time with junior Owen Leydig, with Edmonds spending some time as a running back. As has been the case in the past, Morris will have a number of

running backs at his disposal. He mentioned Kenyon Smith, Chase Paschall, Izzy Johnson, Marcus Dickerson, Clayton Cannedy and Tristan Chisholm.

Receivers may have a bigger part in the offense than has recently been the case. Morris said that he thinks Addison Pachett may have the "best hands" in the Jefferson District. Jacob Seymore will also be a target for the Fluco quarterbacks, as will tight end Austin Moore.

Stalwarts on the offensive line will be Grant Brown, Scott Fulton, and Jason Banton. The defensive line will be anchored by Brown and the Morris twins Jarred and Jacob who are iuniors.

A number of athletes will play both ways. Edmonds and Leydig are expected to put in time at defensive back. Running backs, Paschall and Johnson, who is only a sophomore, will be in the linebacker corp. Aiden Valentine, who is a junior, will also be a linebacker. Running back Smith is expected to put in time at defensive back, as is wide receiver Pachett. Cannedy will probably be




