






Celebrating school's good news

Brenna Kidd-Bania: I Don't See Color

Want some good news? Look no further than Fluvanna schools.

Don Stribling, executive director, human resources, operations, and student services, is responsible for many things COVID-19 related at the schools: vaccinations, data, reporting.

He had great news for the week of Feb. 28. "No reported cases this week which is a first in almost two years," Stribling said in an email to staff.

That news was followed up with Superintendent Peter Gretz recognizing high school senior Brenna Kidd-Bania at Thursday's (March 10) school board meeting.

Gretz said Kidd-Bania won first place in the VSBA Spring Art Competition's Central Region for her colorful painting of a Black man.

"I called it 'I Don't See Color,' because when people say they don't see color, they're saying they don't see people of color because it's an integral part of who they are," Kidd-Bania said.

More good news came with the report of the average daily attendance: February's was 89.83 percent; up from January's 86.56 percent.

The Board also heard specifics about summer school:

- 55 teachers will instruct 250 students (last year 39/185);
- May 31 June 30, 8 a.m. 2:30 p.m., four days per week;
- Lunch will be provided free of charge;
- Regional/neighborhood pick-up and drop-off sites;
- Students will attend their home school;
 K-7 Staff will identify students in need at each grade level in the areas of reading and math. Invitations will be sent to identified students;

 Grades 8-12: Students who are in need of credit recovery and SOL remediation will be invited to participate. End-of-Course SOL tests will be administered to students in need of retakes;

• One classroom teacher per eight students in Grades K-8. One classroom teacher per 10 students in Grades 9-12.

In other business:

CATEC Director Stephanie Carter made a presentation to the Board.

The career and technical center was created to serve Albemarle and Charlottes-ville students.

Out-of-district students can apply.

It costs those students \$2,000 to attend, which includes tuition, uniforms, and certification testing.

Board member Andrew Pullen (Columbia) said he wanted to open a conversation about CATEC, Fluvanna and other local, county schools sharing resources.

"CATEC has some programs Fluvanna and others don't have, but each of the other schools has programs unique to their school," Pullen said.

Gretz said the federally sponsored free school lunch program for all students will stop at the end of this school year.

In the past when students paid for lunch, Fluvanna schools ended the year with up to \$40,000 in cafeteria debt. FCPS had to absorb the debt or try to collect it.

"(The) law now says we can't collect that debt," Gretz said.

Artist talks about her passion

Mary Volin recently moved to the area from Maine and was looking for artists like herself. She joined the Fluvanna Art Association and now that COVID appears to be manageable, she is looking forward to getting more involved with the group and the artistic community.

"It has been fun to connect with a new group of local artists and be inspired by a new landscape," Volin said. She said she comes from a family of artists on her father's side but remembers her grandfather telling her at a young age that there were easier ways to make a living. Therefore, she chose not to pursue art in college though her underlying passion told her this is what she wanted. While staying at home and raising her children, she took classes for fun and was encouraged to pursue art more seriously.

"I took a deep breath and in my mid-thirties went back to school for a BFA," she said. "I wanted to paint, but needed to put back the money I raided from my kids' college fund, so I pursued a major in graphic design and a minor in photography. I ended up working professionally as an art director and creative director for collectible and social expression companies in Maine."

When Volin retired, she wanted to have fun with art and do something hands-on, but she wasn't sure what that was. About 15 years ago, her mother-in-law invited her to paint a scarf with her at her retirement community.

"The minute I watched that paint flow on the silk, I was hooked," she said. "Silk painting has been described as "watercolor on steroids." Not only has she worked on silk but she has worked on cotton as well. "You don't exactly work on fabric, you work with it."

She says there are so many techniques for achieving different goals. Among her favorite techniques is Serti. Originating in Thailand, Vietnam, and India, it is an age-old technique for preventing color from bleeding by using resist lines. It uses dyes instead of fabric paint. Once the pattern is drawn, silk is laid over it, and resist lines – known as gutta – are applied to preserve the white space in the design.

She has also explored various Shibori sophisticated tie-dye techniques, hand printing, and vat dyeing. Originating in China, it was adopted by the Japanese. Labor-intensive in the preparation before dying, it calls for a variety of ways to create patterns by folding, pleating, tying, or sewing.

"There is no end to things to explore and I love to experiment," she said. Volin's work is vibrant and bright with bold patterns and colors and is a complement to any outfit.

In Maine, Volin belonged to a marketing co-op where she sold her scarfs, pillows, table runners, and fabric wall art. One of her pieces was published in *Art Quilts International, Abstract & Geometric* by Martha Sielman.

"Currently I hope to focus more on wall art while continuing to make the scarfs and decorative items I love." Some of her work will soon be available at Sweet Art Emporium.

Woodson wraps up Fluco swimming career

Ahmad Woodson has been the face of the Fluvanna County High School boys swimming program for the past four years.

The senior standout hopes to have a similar impact at the college level after committing to swim at the University of Lynchburg.

"To have an opportunity to compete at the next level of my swimming career is first giving honor to God that I never gave up, even when challenges beyond my control came my way that I would be considered from all the coaches that saw something in me that would impact their roster from the Class of 2022," Woodson said. "Knowing that I have not even scratched the surface in my swimming career, I want to continue becoming the greatest swimmer that I can be by putting in the hard work through my dedication to the sport."

Woodson wrapped up a sensation-

al swimming career at Fluvanna County as one of the most decorated athletes in program history. Last month, he placed in four events to help the Flucos capture the Region 3C swimming and diving title for the first time in program history.

He followed that up with another solid showing at the VHSL Class 3 swimming championships, where he finished fourth in the 500-yard freestyle (4:23.59) and added a seventh-place effort in the 200-yard freestyle (1:48.21). He also owns program records in both events.

Those performances made Woodson an attractive option to college swimming programs. He had interest from several programs, including Randolph College, Roanoke College, Marymount University, Washington & Jefferson College (Penn.), Notre Dame College (Ohio) and Wingate University.

After the state meet, Woodson evaluated all the options and felt that Lynchburg was the place he wanted to continue his swimming career.

"I was ready to make my decision to which team I felt was hungry and ready for the next level that I would be able to contribute to the process as a first-year swimmer, making history," he said.

Woodson credited his relationship with Hornets Coach Brad Dunn and his staff, as well as the members of the Lynchburg swim team for making him feel right at home.

"Being wanted by the coaches and swimmers as a contributor to help build the team growth from a fairly new program under Coach Dunn, I needed to feel the connection from the team as a family member, not a teammate," Woodson said. "After experiencing my first overnight recruiting visit this past summer with the team, my future brothers of UL kept the line of communication open by checking on my swimming, grades, well-being — with no pressure, just support — throughout the biggest decision of my life."

Another draw to Lynchburg was the educational offerings. Woodson believes the balance between academics and swimming will allow him to grow in both phases and enjoy the collegiate athlete experience.

Athletically, Woodson will likely continue to compete in the middle-distance events in the freestyle and breaststroke.

Academically, he plans to major in marketing with a minor in digital media marketing.



Modified Village Gardens plan to move forward

The Planning Commission unanimously approved a request from Southern Development on Tuesday (March 8) to move forward with a project that would bring four dozen new homes to the Village Gardens property on Rt. 53.

The 116-acre parcels were originally proposed for over 300 homes and an adjoining commercial development but failed to win zoning approval after months of debate and public outcry. Residents were concerned about the impact of such a large development on local traffic and infrastructure.

Under county ordinances, Southern Development has the right to build a limited number of homes per acre without the need for the types of permissions and ordinances required for large developments.

By right, the developer is permitted to build one single-family home per two acres on land zoned as A-1(Agricultural). At least 75 percent of the total property has to remain as open space.

Southern Development's plan shows 48 homes on 23 acres, with 93.8 acres left as open space with just one home site. This leaves 20 percent for housing and 80 percent for open space.

Director of Community Planning Douglas Miles told the commission that the initial sketch plan meets the criteria for a rural cluster subdivision.

The commission approved the sketch plan request by a vote of 5-0.

Fluco baseball team is young and talented

Weather permitting, the Fluco baseball season is already underway. Coach Joel Gray is looking forward to a successful season, but can't be sure how things will work out, due to the considerable youth of his squad. The team has only four seniors and has eight players returning. The rest of the squad are first timers and the Fluco coaches are still not sure who of the newcomers will be "grinders" who can make significant contributions.

The pitching staff looks strong and that is always a key factor. Two returning juniors have already committed to Division 1 programs. Joe Gomez has committed to Virginia Commonwealth University and J. J. Glasscock will be off to West Virginia. Gray said that these two both have high velocity fastballs (Glasscock over 90 mph and Gomez close behind) and can deliver four different pitches. They will be complemented on the mound by junior left hander Nathan Gregg and hard throwing freshman Camdyn Via, who may be used primarily as the team's closer.

Gray's infield will be a mix of experienced players and youngsters. Two first basemen will be senior Grant Brown and sophomore Maddox Warren. Brown will be playing in his third sport of the school year. He was an outstanding lineman on the football team, a valuable back-up forward on the basketball squad and now a first baseman on the baseball team. At second base, Gray will have senior Tristan Chisholm and freshman Christian Lounsbury. Patrolling the left side of the infield will be sophomore Ryan Mann at shortstop and Via at third when he is not on the mound.

When the pitchers listed above are not on the mound, they will be Gray's outfielders. Behind the plate Gray believes he is especially strong. Junior B.B. Cox can hit and is solid on defense. Two freshmen are also promising receivers. Gray noted that Cody Peck and Thomas Custer have good potential.

Not surprisingly Gray, who has a state championship on his resume, said that he will emphasize pitching and defense. Those are the things that win ball games. Of course, a team also has to score some runs. In a recent scrimmage, Gray said that the Flucos faced a pitcher who had 90 plus speed and they managed base runners and had only a few strike-outs. That is a positive sign. The Flucos play in the tough Jefferson District and several of the schools they go up against have significantly larger student bodies to draw upon, but the Flucos have always been very competitive in baseball. Gray said that a tough opponent this year will be Western Albemarle, which is not one of the really big schools. This year may not be a big year by the Fluco's past standards -- that remains to be seen. But look out in 2023.


