



#### A mother's grief gives others a chance

Barbara Cary lost her son Adrian on November 2, 2019, due to complications during heart surgery. He was young, the father of two and though two years later Cary's grief is still strong, she sees it as a way to give to others.

"Grief is a horrible thing, and it never goes away. Michael and I think about Adrian every day; we cry because we miss him so much, we laugh when we think about funny things he did and we imagined what his accomplishments would be if he were still with us," Her reflection on her grief is like many who have lost those that we have loved. "We did some things in his memory but it seemed like we needed to do more."

Doing more meant starting the Adrian Maurice Cary Scholarship Fund to help high school graduates with college expenses that are costly and stressful. Last year, she said that with the help and support of so many families, friends, and a few businesses they were able to help two students: one received a \$3,000 scholarship and the other student received a \$500 grant from Dominion Energy and a \$250 gift card from Walmart and Food Lion.

"We wanted to give back to the com-

munity in helping a student in memory of Adrian. So many people were so generous that made it possible for us to give scholarships. It was amazing how so many shared their love for Adrian by giving," Cary said. Any Fluvanna County High School senior can apply.

This year, the fundraiser will be a car, bike, and truck show which Cary says she hopes will become an annual fundraiser. Last year it wasn't held because of the pandemic. The Adrian Maurice Cary Scholarship Fund Car, Bike, and Truck Show will be held in April this year at Fluvanna County High School. The show is open to all vehicles: cars, trucks, and motorcycles, antique or new.

Adrian attended Fluvanna County High School. While attending VCU, he left for a while to look for a job to take care of his firstborn, Alana. After seven years of working at the Walmart Distribution Center at Zion Crossroads, he realized that he needed a degree to take care of his two daughters. Adrian worked two jobs while returning to college. With hard work and determination, he completed his Bachelor of Science degree in computer and information science at East Coast Polytechnic Institute in Richmond. For his parents, his graduation was a proud day and a major accomplishment. Adrian passed three years later after starting his career in IT.

"Adrian was a sweet, kind, and loving person. As a child, he always greeted everyone with a hug and he continued to do so with a hug and a big bright smile and he loved to joke with people," said Cary as she tells his story of his relationship with his daughters while putting himself through school to get his degree. "He loved and was so proud of his daughters, Alana and Amani. Every day was special with them, but he especially loved to see them off their first day of school and gave them big teddy bears for Valentine's Day. It was always something special with those teddy bears."

She added that family and friends would share Adrian's stories with them.

This young man said he had a hard time at VCU. He said some days he did not have much to eat. At his lowest moment, Adrian would always find him and say, "Hey man, come and get something to eat." Adrian would always look out for others and do whatever he could to help," she said. "We talked with Adrian's cousin last week that we had not seen in a while, and he said he started thinking about Adrian and began to cry. A week later, we saw two of Adrian's friends from high school that opened a barbershop in Fork Union and they talked about how they missed Adrian. This is the affect Adrian had on people; he will always be loved and missed."

It is this remembrance that everyone shared that led to the scholarship, giving other college students the chance to focus on their studies and get ahead without worrying about the day-to-day things like eating. With college expenses skyrocketing, like Adrian, most students are determined to get their degrees and get ahead but have a hard time making it. Cary not only has a scholarship in her son's name that can help students but has brought to light the seriousness of the affordability of college itself.

With this fundraiser, Cary is hoping people will "come and show off your pride and joy," to help raise money for student's college expenses.

"There will be trophies and raffles. Businesses have been very kind and generous in donating and we hope many more will support this cause. I hope people will attend with their beautiful cars, trucks and motorcycles to make this a successful event."

This event will be held April 16 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and is sponsored by the non-profit organization Providing Resources to Inspire, Develop, and Empower (PRIDE), Inc. #### Burn ban law in effect

The Virginia Department of Forestry (VDOF) and fire departments throughout Virginia are reminding the public about the 4 p.m. burn ban, which began Tuesday, Feb. 15. The law prohibits burning before 4 p.m. if the fire is in or within 300 feet of woodlands, brush, or fields with dry grass and other flammable materials.

Although Virginia also has a wildfire season in the fall, more than 60 percent of the Commonwealth's annual average of 700 wildfires happen in the spring - especially in March and April.

Many areas have had a lot of moisture recently, but Virginia is still recovering from a significant deficit last year. Sunny days with brisk winds can easily dry out fuels, such as storm-downed limbs, increasing the potential for wildfires.

Even though burning is allowed from 4 p.m. to midnight, the Virginia Department of Forestry says you should be cautious of weather conditions and winds. "The 4 PM Burning Law is one of the most important tools we have in the prevention of wildfires in Virginia," said John Miller, VDOF's director of fire and emergency response."The number one cause of wildfires in the Commonwealth is people burning yard debris and/or trash, and the 4 PM Burning Law goes a long way toward reducing the risk associated with wildfires each year."

Violation of the burn law is a Class 3 misdemeanor and is punishable with a fine of up to \$500. Forestry officials say those who allow a fire to "escape" are liable for the cost of suppressing the blaze and any property damage it causes.

Regardless of the time of day or time of year, it is critical to exercise sound judgment when burning. Even if it is legal to burn, it might not be wise to do so. This is especially true if it has not rained in several days, the winds are high, or if you do not have the tools and equipment to contain or control a fire.

# **Great Tips for Your Home-Based Business**

Home-based businesses can be financially rewarding and provide a certain amount of flexibility with your day-to-day schedule. Here are some tips to keep your business running at full steam.

• Stay on top of accounts receivable. It's easy to get caught up with fulfilling your business obligations while invoices you've sent out go unpaid. 

# Q: Tell us about Angell Husted before opening your dance studio.

A. I grew up in the '50s and '60s as both a tomboy and a ballerina on a small farm in the little town of Pleasant Valley, NY, near the Hudson River, 90 miles north of New York city. After graduating from Syracuse University in 1971 with a dual degree from the Schools of Education and Speech and Drama, I spent a year at UVA graduate school, and then embarked on a career in television broadcasting in several NBC-affiliate markets as a reporter, anchor and host of scores of telethons, parades, and community fund-raising events. Marriage to Harold Wright in 1978 found us spending our honeymoon at Lake Monticello, and residing there ever since.

#### Q: When did you open your studio and why?

A: By the late-1990s, Fluvanna County was growing by leaps and bounds, with a need for a local School of Dance. I opened my first studio in February of 1999. For the previous 17 years (since 1982) I'd already been teaching evening adult dance workouts and step aerobics, along with continuing part time broadcasting and raising four little boys. For a few hours each week, I had rented various rooms in the Lake Monticello clubhouse, then the Lake Monticello firehouse, followed by schools and churches. The county was growing so fast, rental space finally dried up, so I joyfully opened my own fitness and dance space at 7 Lake Centre Professional Park. Children's dance classes were added, as well as more adult dance and fitness programs, including Pilates. In 2015, the studio size was doubled with a new better and brighter facility across the road at 19 Centre Court.

#### Q: Going back to when I was the age of your young students, dancing was only for girls. Is this still true today? Is it still girl dominated?

A. Over the years, I've had a few boys join various classes, yet dance remains female-dominated on all levels. However, I always encourage boys to dance. "Besides being great fun," I say, "that's where the babes are." Any male of any age who can dance will always be sought after. And, if he can also cook, that's a double bonus!

Q: I've been told there are many benefits of dancing for children. These include reduced obesity, a fun source of exercise, healthier blood pressure and cholesterol levels, better coordination, agility, and maintenance of a balanced lifestyle. Do you agree and why?

> A. Yes, I certainly agree. However, please remember that the benefits are not just for children, but for everyone of any age. My students range from ages 3 to 90, and my passion is to share "the love and joy of music and movement" with every one of them! Besides the physical benefits, dance encourages socialization, promotes respect, acceptance and self-confidence. Most importantly, I witness every day how the "joy of movement and music" promotes emotional well-being, improves self-worth, helps manage depression and anxiety and is spiritually uplifting. Dance, for me personally, has literally saved my life, in body, mind, heart and spirit. Without God's healing power of dance, I never would have survived times of extreme loss and grief, including the car accident death in 2000 of my 17-year-old son Timo and the death just three-months ago of my beloved husband of 43-years, Harold Wright. Movement and dance not only helps me remain vital and sane, but also thrive, especially when I remember with joy and gratitude that Timo helped me build the first facility and Harold fully backed me in the building of both studios.

#### Q. Has the corona virus epidemic affected your business?

A. Yes, especially the first year when I had to shut down mid-March 2020. That first summer I offered a limited number of Zoom classes yet realized by the fall that in-person classes were much preferred by me and the students. My number one priority has always been the safety, health and well-being of everyone. So, since October 2020, I'm now in my fourth semester of in-person classes with COVID restrictions. Required mask-wearing, at least for now, remains in place, along with social distancing and hand sanitizing. Except for that first year, enrollment has not been affected; in fact, it keeps increasing. I remain grateful for the most wonderful students, parents and grandparents.

#### Q: Anything else?

A: Yes. I'd like to thank the Fluvanna/ Lake Monticello community for the many blessings of support in allowing me to share my "love and joy of music and movement" for 40-years now, ever since that first class back in February of 1982 in the Terrace Room of the Lake Monticello Club-house. Although I turn 74 on St. Patrick's Day, the dancing love and joy at Angell's School of Dance will continue, as I'm not going anywhere anytime soon!





The Flucos started strong but could not hold on in the final eight minutes. The Flucos managed to eke out a 17-16 lead after the first quarter. After a low scoring second guarter, the Flucos led 27-25. Play continued to be even and after three periods the Flucos still led, but only by one, 38-37. This win put the Flucos in the Region final and also qualified them for the State Class 3 tournament.

In the Region final, played on Feb. 26, the Flucos were matched-up against Spotswood High Blazers team that they had played earlier in the year. In that encounter, the Flucos fell 86-84 in double overtime. The Flucos' hopes to reverse that result were thwarted, as they were unable to get their offense going and the Spotswood High Blazers captured the Class 3 Region C title 64-49. Gardner led the Flucos in scoring with 22 and Kenyon Smith contributed 10. Unfortunately, the Blazers outscored the Flucos 34-20 in the paint.

The Flucos now move on to the class 3 State tournament. In the first round to be played on March 4, they will travel to the Roanoke area to take on the 25-1 Cave Spring High team.

#### The history of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church

Virginia Agee Gray wrote up this brief history of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church in Keene, that she believes to be the oldest Black church in Southern Albemarle County. After the Nat Turner revolt in 1831, Black people were not able to have their own churches but were relegated to the balconies of White churches. So most local Black churches were founded after 1865. But, as Mrs. Gray points out, Black churches had an earlier, secret history.

She writes, "My great-grandfather, Deacon James Agee, has related the story to us many times of how the black slaves from adjoining farms gathered at night at a log cabin where some slaves stayed, and they would turn down tin tubs to drown out some of the sounds of their singing and praying. They came from as far off as Carters Bridge.

"They later built a bush arbor on Merrick's Farm in the woods and had their services there. After slavery, the Merricks built a three-room building on their farm

at Glendower and named it Glendower School. This was a beautiful building with one large room, a stage, two smaller rooms, a cellar, two porches, a bell, and a bell tower. The building was painted gray.

"Church was held in this building until the late 1800s, when Mr. and Mrs. Munfeird Fortune gave land to build a new church. This consisted of one large building with pulpit, choir loft, and two beautiful chandeliers for light, and an entry hall. The building was used until 1963. It was abandoned because the county of Albemarle refused to fix the roads leading to the church. Land was then purchased from Deacon and Mrs. A. R. Gray to build a new church. Our present location in Keene, Va, is that church.

"The plans for the new church were drawn up by the late Rev. W.D. Ward, Rev. J.J. Agee, and Rev. J.B. Monroe. They worked alongside many members of the church to construct the building."





## Bored? Think twice before taking that Facebook quiz

Social media is used as a fun distraction for some people, and taking a Facebook quiz may seem like a harmless way to pass the time. But are you giving away more information than you think?

#### How the scam works:

A fun quiz pops up on your Facebook feed or another social media platform. A few questions are answered to prove how well you know a friend. Or a short personality test is offered to

match with a character from a favorite TV show.

These quizzes appear to be meaningless, but the intent behind them is to collect information. For example, questions like: "What was the first car you owned?" "What is your mother's maiden name?" or "What is the name of the street you grew up on?" These are common security questions for insurance, banking and credit card accounts. Sharing this information can lead to accounts being hacked, and personal and financial information being stolen.

Not all social media quizzes are data collection scams; however, BBB cautions users to be careful about what they share online and to check the privacy settings on the account. Social media data and quiz answers can be used to steal identity or enable a scammer to impersonate you to your friends and family.

#### Tips to avoid social media scams:

- **Be skeptical:** Before answering a quiz, figure out who created it. Is it a brand you trust? Just because something appears to be fun and innocent, doesn't mean there isn't an inherent risk.
- Adjust privacy settings: Review the social media account's privacy settings and be strict about any information that is shared and be mindful of who you are sharing it with.
- Remove personal details from your profile: Don't share information like phone number or home address on social media accounts.
- Don't give answers to common security questions: Be cautious if the questions in a quiz ask for things like your mother's maiden name, street you grew up on, previously owned vehicles, favorite foods, or the name of your high school.

• Monitor friend requests: Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know. Also be wary of a second friend request from someone you are already connected with; the second profile may be an imposter trying to access your data and your Friends list.


