

Miss Fluvanna waves goodbye

Beauty pageants have been around since 1921 and started in Atlantic City. The reason behind the idea was to lure and keep summer tourists in town past Labor Day, hence the Miss America pageant. All of them centered around one theme, highlighting a young woman's physical attributes. Nowadays, most are calling for a ban on what seems to some to be an archaic contest. Some cite the only reason for participation is scholarship money, if available.

Local festivals often featured a young woman wearing a crown and smiling at crowds reminiscent of ancient pagan rituals and this was a part of American life in rural small towns and counties. It was in 1950 when the Apple Harvest Festival was held in the fall to draw attention to Charlottesville and Albemarle's vibrant culture and booming trade, especially in apples. In 1958 the name was changed to the Dogwood Festival in honor of the Virginia state tree and flower and is still held every spring.

It was the Lions Club that started the first Miss Fluvanna pageant back in the 1960s. In 1976 Three Chopt Ruritan Club took over the pageant from the Lions Club. Its first coordinator was Frances Tucker "Tee" White who made the first pageant a success. No one recalls much of the early history behind what transpired between the groups or how long the Lions Club had been sponsoring the pageant.

"I do not know why Miss Fluvanna was started but I think that with the surrounding counties entering young ladies into The Dogwood Festival that Fluvanna also wanted to be represented," said Emily Payne, a member of the Three Chopt Ruritan Club. "The club members were excited to put on the pageant and see which young lady would win the title to represent Fluvanna County at the Dogwood Festival. We were excited when Miss Fluvanna became the Dogwood Queen."

She adds that during the time the club was sponsoring the pageant they were

fortunate to have so many people and businesses in our community to step in and help support it.

Payne adds that when Three Chopt took over the pageant approximately 25 young women were vying for the title but as the years passed and other activities in the county were offered for the young women to participate in, she says they were lucky to get as many as five. In 2020, the last year they had the pageant, there were only three participants.

"There have been many young ladies who won and participated in the Dogwood Festival tell us how much they enjoyed being a part of the Dogwood Festival."

With the decrease in club members and the lack of interest from the young ladies in the county, the Ruritans decided that

they would no longer be able to put on the pageant. Any competition has to be one where women are vying for scholarship money using skills and talents rather than just looks. Young women today are focused more inward and cultivating their unique abilities rather than focusing only on outward appearance.

"I would love to see some other organizations in Fluvanna County take over the Miss Fluvanna Pageant so our county would be represented at the Dogwood Festival," said Payne.

Check out Scheier Natural Area

Looking for a quiet and beautiful place to walk? Check out Scheier Natural Area in Fluvanna County just off Long Acre Road. This property of 100 acres is mostly wooded and includes a branch of Cunningham Creek. The three miles of trails are well-marked: red (which circuits the entire property), yellow, white, and blue. There is also a sheltered picnic table and an outhouse.

Scheier was the property of Howard and Neva Scheier who moved to the area in the 1950s. They left their home in Ohio and traveled the country looking

for a new home and found it here. In 1997, they bequeathed the land to the Rivanna Conservation Society, which has managed it ever since. According to the Scheier will, no trees may be cut down.

Across the road to the south, the Scheier property includes nine ponds that were dug to raise minnows for fish bait, one of the ways the Scheiers made their living. These ponds are silting up now, but still provide a home for frogs and passing ducks and games. Look for the annual Frog Walk in March. Held at dusk (bring a flashlight), informed guides

can help you identify the numerous varieties of noisy amphibians.

A few years ago, in a very wet winter, we saw hundreds of mushrooms of many colors and sizes. Last weekend we went, hoping the wet weather would have brought them out, and did see about a dozen mushrooms before we were chased back to the car by a torrential downpour complete with hail.

Come to walk, but, sorry, no dogs (except service dogs) or bicycles.

Fluvanna Rotary looks at life after COVID

The Rotary Club of Fluvanna County recently completed work on a new information kiosk at the Disc Golf course at Pleasant Grove.

The kiosk was designed by Jan Pavlacka and Kornel Krechoweckyj, members of the Fluvanna Leadership Alumni Group (FLAG), who previously installed a similar kiosk in Palmyra Village.

In all, the project involved 25 volunteers putting in 150 total hours to move from planning to construction. Work was completed on June 18.

It was a welcome sign that the Rotary club is getting fully back into the swing of things as COVID-19 loosens its grip on daily life.

Like many organizations, the start of the pandemic in the spring of 2020 forced immediate changes to established routines, with no idea when or if things might return to normal.

Rudy Lee Garcia, executive secretary of the Fluvanna Rotary, remembers that club leadership held a planning meeting just as things were starting to shut down. "One of our members introduced us to 700m."

By the next scheduled meeting date, they were ready to go virtual. "We didn't miss a beat," he said.

They held virtual meetings from March 2020 to July 2021, and have since adopted a hybrid model with both Zoom and in-person meetings.

Keeping the group connected and engaged allowed them to collaborate on ways to continue to serve the people of Fluvanna.

"We knew that the community was struggling," said Garcia.

With food insecurity on the rise during

the pandemic, Rotarians held a half-dozen food drives to help the MACAA Food Pantry at Carysbrook between April 2020 and August 2021. In all, they collected 35,000 pounds of food and raised \$20,000

Garcia said the unique thing about the food drives was the level of community participation. There are around 20 Rotarians in the Fluvanna club, but a project so large required many volunteers.

In each of the drives, between 50 and 70 members of the community helped with everything from delivering fliers to picking up food donations and boxing them for delivery to MACAA.

"We have never done anything at that level where we got the community involved," he said.

Today, the club is working on "removing barriers so more people who are service-minded can join us."


Membership in the Rotary Club is by invitation only. Rotarians recommend people they know or meet in the community who seem like a good fit. Those who are selected for membership commit to participating in weekly meetings and regular service projects.

Garcia said modifying the bylaws and creating different membership tiers might allow more people to participate - for example, if their schedule doesn't allow weekly meetings but they can join in projects

Confusion over Roe v Wade

There is much confusion and misinformation being presented on television and social media about the Supreme Court of the United States decision about Roe v Wade. Some of it seems hysterical, so I decided to see what President Biden's attorney general has to say.

U.S. Attorney General Merrick Garland said on Friday that: "Today's decision does not eliminate the ability of states to keep abortion legal within their borders. And the Constitution continues to restrict states' authority to ban reproductive services provided outside their borders." In other words any state may keep abortion legal within their state, and women have a constitutional right to seek medical services in those states.

So it is up to each state to decide for themselves based on what their residents want, and pass laws accordingly. Several states have already said that they would become sanctuary states for abortion access including California, New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Colorado and many others. Many states already have abortion on demand, such as Oregon, up into the third trimester.

Public opinion polls repeatedly show that the majority of Americans believe that women should have the right to decide on parenthood for themselves. At the same time these polls repeatedly show that the majority of Americans are opposed to third trimester abortions and ninth month abortions on demand. I am with the majority on both of these questions.

So now it is possible for at least some states to put some reasonable and moral limits on "the right to choose." Make your choice before the third trimester, before a completely formed baby would have to be carved up and the pieces pulled out of your uterus. The majority of us are horrified by that procedure. Decide before then.


