

## **Hugh Klein Staiger**

Hugh Klein (HK) Staiger of Palmyra, VA departed this life peacefully on June 9, 2022. He was born October 8, 1922, in Crafton, PA, the first son of Daniel Staiger and Juliana Flora Klein. Hugh frequently commented that in his younger life, during the Great Depression, he didn't know that the family was poor since everybody was poor. He attended the proverbial one room school, where he ate a lunch made by "Mother." Surely he must have played marbles and such on the playground. There were no buses then and he walked

through the woods along the one-mile-long trail no matter the weather. Home life was simple, with a bed to share, crows to shoot, a cow to milk, water to haul, and chickens to pluck. There was the weekly Grit newspaper for news since they had no radio. Electricity and running water came just before he left home, while indoor plumbing and freedom from the outhouse became realities after he left home. His chores served him well, teaching him independence and thankfulness for the "good" life.

Hugh was a superior student and in 1940 he graduated from Slippery Rock High School in Slippery Rock, PA. He attended Keystone School in Pittsburgh, PA and worked as a draftsman for Duquesne Light Co. In December 1942, he joined the U.S. Navy as an Aviation Cadet and was commissioned as an Ensign in April 1944. While attached to ZP-15 in Brunswick, GA, he met Addie Lucille Haygood and they were married on March 25, 1945. After the war he remained on active duty with the Navy, where he worked at various duty stations on the east coast, and in Panama and Iceland. Hugh and Lucille bought his current home and farm in Palmyra, VA in late 1963. He retired from the Navy as a Lt. Commander in 1964.

Hugh enjoyed his life and counted many friends. He was a good father and did his best to instill in his children a confidence for their potential. His constant example of thrift, honesty and diligence had a lasting positive influence on each of them. He was an excellent cook and will be remembered for his good bread. While in high school, he received a blue ribbon for his homemade cake entry at the county fair. He enjoyed entertaining friends, sharing his homecooked meals of "Chicken and Almonds" and "Spareribs and Sauerkraut"—to name a few. One of his greatest enjoyments in his younger years was flyfishing. Later, he and Lucille enjoyed many years of square dancing and its close circle of friends.

Hugh was noted for his charity to friends and neighbors. One of his most memorable services was the sponsoring of a family of Vietnamese refugees. The success and contributions of this family were, and continue to be, a source of great satisfaction to him.

Hugh was an avid woodworker. He built two fine fishing boats, his lovely home, and was noted for his skill in building small boxes. He enjoyed his farming years and took pleasure in seeing that he actually made a mark on the land. He and Lucille put their farm in a conservation easement which will assure that the woods they loved will remain for generations to come.

Hugh met his declining years with courage. His poor vision didn't stop his woodworking. His puppies brought him joy and appreciation for the gift of life. His work ethic is left to emulate. He will be missed.

Hugh and his wife, Addie Lucille Haygood Staiger, raised five children: Merle Daniel Staiger and wife, Rosa Lee, of Idaho Falls, ID; Linda Faye Staiger, M.D., of Palmyra, VA; William Andrew Staiger and wife, Karen, of Lehi, UT; Paul Jackson Staiger and wife, Tammy, of Buzzards Bay, MA; and Juliana Lucille Harris and husband, Johnny, of Palmyra, VA. Hugh was the patron to an extended posterity comprising 15 grandchildren, 38 great-grandchildren, and two great-great

He was preceded in death by his wife of 69 years, Lucille Staiger, in 2014; his parents, Daniel and Juliana Flora Klein Staiger, formerly of Slippery Rock, PA; his siblings, Virginia Jewel Staiger McClelland formerly of Butler, PA, Merle Dale Staiger formerly of Slippery Rock, PA and John Daniel Staiger formerly of Butler, PA; his granddaughter, Kira Yvonne Staiger, formerly of Springville, UT; and his daughter-in-law, Susan Ross Staiger (wife of son, Paul), of Fork Union, VA.

## Plans developed to give county children access to inclusive playground

LMOA is working with Fluvanna County Schools and the Lake Monticello Community Foundation to assure that special needs families from outside the Lake will be able to use the new All-Inclusive Playground at Lafayette Park when work on it is completed, said officials from LMOA and the Foundation.

"We are working with the county to identify special needs families who may access the All-inclusive Playground," said LMOA General Manager Tom Schauder in his weekly GM Corner message.

LMOA and the Foundation have asked the schools to provide a list of special needs children in the county who could benefit from the new playground. The names will be added to the list of those who could be admitted through LMOA gates. The system would be similar to that for people outside the Lake who access The Pub, the golf course and the pool for swim team, and visitors would be limited to using the playground.

"We always planned for this All-Inclusive Playground to benefit children with special needs from throughout Fluvanna County," said Foundation President Nancy Parsons. "We're very pleased that LMOA agrees and that they're providing a very effective and efficient way for those children to get access to the playground."

Lake Monticello Community Foundation recently announced it had raised 70 percent of the \$100,000 needed to pay for the All-Inclusive Playground, having achieved that in just eight months. It is launching a fund drive to raise the remaining \$30,000, as well as scheduling a variety of fundraising activities, including a professional magic show Sept. 30 and a dock concert Aug. 6.

The key playground equipment has already been purchased and is scheduled to be delivered in October, when an official groundbreaking ceremony is tentatively planned.

The Fluvanna Farmers Market, whose roots began at Pleasant Grove, has been around for years. Its multiple vendors have sold just about everything, including lamb, beef, eggs, plants, baked items, jams, and homegrown produce. The market in Fluvanna, however, has faced


headwinds including a disagreement with the county over insurance. The market has continued to look for a permanent home after setting up at the edge of the road at Pleasant Grove and in the back of CVS building. But then the pandemic hit, and the market was shut down.

On August 1, 2021, the market opened in the parking lot of ACE Hardware at Crofton Plaza with five volunteers organizing it, including Peggy Shanklin. Shanklin said it has been a bumpy restart. She blames the economy for the low turnout yet remains optimistic that more vendors will join and help the market

throughout the U.S. since 1994. Though the pandemic has had an effect, it has not stopped the markets from emerging and attracting customers with the lure of fresh produce.

Locally, some residents have cited Sunday as not being the best day for the market. Some said they go to church and then go home to eat lunch and by the time they come to the market everyone is packing up to leave. Others say the opening hours of 11 a.m.-2 p.m. are too hot to shop outdoors. When it was held at Pleasant Grove, the market was open on Tuesdays from 2-6 p.m. and when it was behind CVS it was held on Saturday mornings.

"We wanted to have a community event after church to bring people together," said Shanklin of the reason for choosing Sunday afternoons.

Though local produce starts to pop up at markets in July, August is the prime season in Virginia.

"We have had vendors try to re-sell produce but we will only take vendors who are selling right off their farms," she said. But there are other options, including fresh eggs, homebaked bread, and jams. In the old days, Sam Goin used to take orders for his grass-fed beef.

"It's healthier eating, it's local and we are not moving it to four corners of the U.S," Shanklin said. "It's all organic and fresh. No pesticides." She added that people have complained about the prices but Shanklin pointed out that these are small farms, not expansive corporate-owned farms able to churn out produce. Studies show that prices at Farmers Market are often competitive and in some cases may be less than retail.

Shanklin and the other volunteers already have other ideas for attracting more customers and expanding the market. They have four farmers selling goods now, including Muddy Paws, Two Labs Coffee, Crick Hollow Farm, and Totes McGoats as well as a vendor selling CBD oil, the popular Simply A'glazing selling doughnuts, and crafters.

"We have picnic tables, a food truck, and we are planning activities for kids," she said. Some of their plans include coordinating with the Fluvanna County Public Library for children's activities as well as face painting and treasure hunts

Across the U.S. many Farmers Markets are addressing the same issues and are trying to make the markets more attractive for customers by offering a variety of activities and events. California and New York have the most Farmers Markets followed by Massachusetts and the mid-west. Virginia is tied with lowa with 280 markets statewide. In the fertile Hudson Valley where they have thriving cattle farms, produce, and wineries, they believe the future is rosy for Farmers Markets. The bottom line everyone agrees upon is that locally grown produce tastes better.

"If you don't support it, it will go away," Shanklin said.

## Men's Travelers Golf group to play seven matches

For a number of years now the men's golfers at Lake Monticello have fielded a Travelers team that plays home and away matches with teams from other golf courses. This year the Travelers coordinator Karl Bergstresser said that the Travelers will be playing seven home and away matches against nearby clubs. All are within an hour's drive time. Four clubs that were in the competition last year are, Birdwood, Glenmore, Stoney Creek and Orchard Creek (formerly Waynesboro.) New this year are Ironwood (in Staunton) and from the Richmond area, The Dominion Club and the Richmond Country Club.

On July 7, the Lake Monticello Travelers hosted Orchard Creek. The format was two person better ball Nassau. Each foursome has two players from each team. On each hole the better net score of the two players counts as the team's score. In this contest, there were ten foursomes. Seven of the Travelers teams beat their opponents and one tied. The Nassau score is one point for the front nine, one point for the back nine and one point for the total eighteen. In the Nassau scoring, it was Travelers 21.5 and Orchard Creek 8.5.

The Travelers record rose to 2-3 with their win over Orchard Creek. Bergstesser said that the home team almost always wins. That has been the case in all five of the Travelers matches in 2022. Local knowledge matters. Last season, the Travelers finished 5-4 with three matches cancelled.

On July 14, the Travelers hosted for the third time, with the team from the Richmond Country Club coming to visit. They said that they wanted to play with 24 golfers. This forced Bergstesser to scramble a little as his roster only has 21 regulars and two alternates. To be a member of the Travelers you are required to have a golf membership, and the Travelers roster naturally includes most of the better players at the Lake who can play on Wednesday mornings. Being a roster player gives golfers the advantage of being able to

## **Central, West Central schools to consolidate**

## Won't Result in Changes for Students, Staff

Change was a theme of the evening for the Fluvanna County School Board during its meeting on Thursday (July 14).

First, the board was introduced to two new assistant principals - both with deep Fluco roots.

Stacey Holland, who has been working as school counselor for the last several years, will become the assistant principal at Fluvanna County High School. Hannah Collins, a veteran of the Fairfax County school system, will take the assistant post at Fluvanna Middle School.

Both are Fluvanna County natives and FCHS graduates. Don Stribling, executive director for Human Resources, said this gives both women an understanding of the Fluco philos-

"They say the best journey takes you home," said Collins, who added that her children are happy to be moving close to their grandparents and Fluvanna cousins.

## Consolidation

The major issue on the agenda for the meeting was how to deal with Central and West Central schools in light of a new mandate handed down by the state.

In June, the General Assembly approved a

change to the Standards of Quality (SOQ) requiring every elementary school to have its own full-time principal.

Fluvanna County technically has two elementary schools: West Central for pre-K and kindergarten, and Central for Grades 1-2. When the principal for Central resigned in 2016, the school system decided to have one principal and one assistant principal handle both schools, which share a campus and facilities on Central Plains Road.

Under the revised SOQ, the board had to decide whether to add a new principal or formally consolidate the two schools into, simply, Central Elementary.

Consolidation was the clear choice for the board, which approved the motion by a vote of 5-0.

In an email following the meeting, Superintendent Peter Gretz reassured the community that "for staff, families and students of those schools, nothing changes in the way you will experience the operation of the school. Mrs. Barnabei and Mrs. Smith will continue their excellent leadership of the school community, and the transition will be seamless."

Several board members, however, expressed frustration that the state was requiring them to make an unnecessary administrative change.

Nor was it without financial ramifications. Had they elected to add a principal, the state would have provided \$100,00 for salary and benefits. The way the new SOQ is structured, the decision to consolidate will remove \$26,000 from the annual state funding package

Plus, if the board decides to add an additional assistant principal for Central somewhere down the road, it will have to come up with the \$90,000 or so to fund a new position.

"State regulations have various and sundry impacts on the local levels and this is one of those occasions," said Chair James Kelley.

## **Planning Commission defers zoning for new** commercial development

A rezoning request for a proposed retail and commercial development on Lake Monticello Road has been deferred after members of the Planning Commission raised issues with their application package at their Tuesday meeting (July 12).

Joseph Jones of Wolfpack Properties has been holding extensive discussions with the Lake Monticello Owners Association (LMOA) and residents about potential uses for a 35-acre parcel located on Lake Monticello Road (Rt. 618) across from River Run Drive.

He hopes to be able to deliver on two longsought items on the local wish list: a 24-hour emergency or urgent care center, and a second grocery store.

The property could also include substantial retail and office space, and provide an additional gate for access into Lake Monticello

The application to change the zoning from A-1 (Agricultural) to B-1 (Business) ran aground on two separate issues.

During the public hearing, local business owners Corven Flynn and Cyndra Kerley renewed their arguments that the county was not following stated procedures in the handling of zoning and planning applications.

In this case, they said the documentation showed that the application was not submitted until after the proposal had been discussed with the Technical Review Committee (TRC). Under the checklist provided by the county, the proposal should only come to the TRC after the application package was filed.

Reviewing documents going back to 2019, Flynn and Kerley say there is a clear pattern of applications being submitted late in the

County Attorney Fred Payne and Director of Community Development Douglas Miles pushed back on some of these allegations later in the meeting.

Payne said that the checklist was developed under the previous department head as a way to help both applicants and staff move though the application process.








He added that failure to follow these internal processes did not violate local ordinances or state statutes.

Miles said that he prefers to have several up-front discussions with potential applicants because there are fees and obligations that take effect once the application package is submitted, and he wants to make sure people understand the process before it begins.

A more serious issue for the commissioners was the lack of signed proffers.

Proffers are specific promises made by the

applicant to adhere to technical and design specifications. They are usually agreed to and signed ahead of public meetings on an application.

While Mr. Payne agreed that the unsigned proffers certainly indicated an intention to sign and follow them, "intention is not legally enforceable."

Jones, citing discussions with county staff, indicated that he had misunderstood that the proffers needed to be signed before meeting.

To give him the opportunity to correct the package, the commissioners vote 5-0 to defer the matter until their Aug. 9 meeting.
