





## Planning Commission approves Rt. 618 commercial development

A proposal for a commercial development took one step closer to fruition during the Planning Commission meeting on Tuesday night (Aug. 9).

Joseph Jones of Wolfpack Properties LLC has requested the 35-acre parcel on Lake Monticello Road (Rt 618) be rezoned from A-1 (Agricultural) to B-1 (Business).

The proposal was first introduced to the commissioner at its July 12 meeting but was deferred to the August meeting because Jones had failed to sign a set of proffers, or guarantees, ahead of the public hearing. He said at the time that it was a misunderstanding on his part, and the proffers were signed by the start of Tuesday's meeting.

Jones began reaching out to the community in and around Lake Monticello early this year to see what people might want in a new commercial development.

At the top of nearly everyone's list were an urgent care center and a new grocery store.

From these conversations, he has introduced concept plans that show freestanding buildings for those specific types of businesses, along with a considerable amount of office and retail space.

The property backs up against the gated sections of Lake Monticello and may also result in the building of a new gate.

Public comments at the top of the meeting on Tuesday showed both support and concern for the project. There has been an ongoing debate in recent months about the balance between maintaining Fluvanna's essential rural character and the need for economic growth.

Palmyra resident Suzy Morris said it would be an excellent plan – "if we had not experienced so often here in Fluvanna developers who promise this and that and fail to deliver."

Some of the commissioners raised concerns that Jones has not yet reached out to medical providers or grocery chains to test their interest in his plans.

Jones said he was reluctant to make any serious inquiries before the property was rezoned, but he was confident that "at the least, we can [get] one or two of these items."

"It would not be truthful if I told you I could get a 24-hour care center," he said. However, he assured commissioners that he would get a medical facility and grocery store on the site if at all possible.

Douglas Miles said other permitted uses for the site included retail stores under 4,000 square feet, small restaurants or delis, daycare centers, studio spaces, veterinary offices, banks and financial institutions, and convenience stores.

The commissioners approved the zoning request by a vote of 3-1, with one member absent.

The Board of Supervisors will take a final vote on the permit at its Aug. 17 meeting.

## Fluco football returns with added line depth

The Fluvanna County High football team did not have a lot of success in 2021. Coach Michael Morris believes that this year's squad will be different because of increased depth on both sides of the line. At all levels of football, games are often decided "in the trenches." Morris said he thinks that this year scores will be lower, as he emphasizes running the ball most of the time on offence and defending vigorously. Running successfully uses up clock time and limits the number of possessions for both teams.

As of this writing, the Flucos have not taken the field for even a scrimmage. Accordingly, quite a few starting positions are still undecided. Morris has 35 athletes to choose from. At the important quarterback position, Morris is looking at sophomore Cam Via and Avery Pleasants. At running back, he has some speed and size. He will be using a number of players including Richard Price, Clayton Cannady, Marcus Dickerson and Isaac Lewis. Morris said that his running backs may also take some direct snaps as well. The Flucos won't be doing a lot of passing, but they have some tall targets on the outside. Izzy Johnson and Andrew Sheridan were both listed at 6-2 or 6-3 last year. Jalen Johnson will also be in the mix. Senior Jacob Morris will be at tight end and will also be at fullback for some plays.

Morris' offensive line depth includes, junior Linwood Perkins, junior Christian Lambert, senior Jared Morris, senior Matt Benton, junior transfer Kyeron King, sophomore Zeke Johnson and junior Cullen Long. Several of these linemen are in the 250 pound range. A number of these linemen will also go two ways and will join Hayden Campbell on the defensive line. Linebackers will include, Braeden Haney, Aiden Valentine and some of the running backs. Defensive backs will include Jon Jones, a senior, Kenneth Cuellar and a few of the running backs.

The kicking game has not been finalized, but Morris said that Via will probably be the punter, and that Cullen Long is likely to handle kick-offs and PATs. Having a quar-

terback as your punter makes it possible to try a fake or two over the course of the season. Return specialists will probably be Lewis, Jones and Price.

## School Board honors champion athletes

Fresh off their success at the 2022 Special Olympics USA Games in June, the Flucos unified track and field team was recognized by the Fluvanna County School Board at the top of their meeting on Thursday night (Aug. 11), sharing some of their experiences – and showing off their impressive haul of metals.

The Fluvanna team, which represented Virginia at the USA Games, brought home 15 gold medals, four silvers, and a bronze at the first-ever unified competitions in Orlando in mid-June. They also brought home the national championship title.

Unified teams combine student-athletes with and without disabilities with the goal of building friendship, greater understanding, and teamwork.

Once selected to represent the state, the Special Olympics paid most of the expenses for the trip to Orlando, which included airfare, accommodations, and even trips to area theme parks. "It was the trip of a lifetime for them," said Coach Nick Ward.

Because the team was put together shortly before the competitions, many of the athletes didn't know each other well, but they quickly built a sense of camaraderie.

FCHS senior and multiple medal-winner Abby Seal said she didn't know if she had a favorite memory of the experience, but said that "every single night we would all hang out together as a group and that was probably the most memorable time. We had so much fun together."

"Mind you, they were only together for six months, and they go to Florida and win the national championship," said Coach Von Hill Jr., adding that in those six months, they only had two full practices

with the whole team. "That's very special and it also proves that they're just like you and me. Regardless of their disability, regardless of whatever may be going on back home.

Hill said it had been great to see the team bond and quickly become like a family "That's what we always preach here in Fluvanna. We're one big family. That's what Flucos are to me."

## More student resource officers

"Opening school this week has been phenomenal," said Superintendent Peter Gretz in his monthly report. "It's been a very, very smooth opening."

He told the board that Fluvanna had won a grant that will bring two more Student Resource Officers (SROs) to the schools. This will allow them to place an SRO at both Carysbrook and Central elementary schools.

Gretz said that he had partnered with Captain Von Hill Sr. of the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office on a presentation on Fluvanna's model for successful partnerships between the schools and law enforcement, and the two have spoken to school boards and at other meetings around the state.

Fluvanna's model is based on the idea that SROs are educators, rather than merely acting as a policing force. Despite "a ton of interactions" between students and SROs, no student has been arrested under this program. The focus is instead on intervention and prevention.

"It's being recognized by the law enforcement as a standard nationally for how to partner with law enforcement successfully."



## Local first responders rescue teen from crash

Local firefighters rescued a 16-year-old male driver Wednesday, Aug. 10 after he was trapped in his pickup truck in a single-vehicle accident, according to Lake Monticello Fire Chief Richie Constantino. The chief said he heard the teenager was on his way to school.

The Lake Monticello Fire Department, Palmyra Fire Company and Lake Monticello Rescue Squad were dispatched at approximately 8:22 a.m. to Ruritan Lake Road for a reported motor vehicle accident with a person trapped in the vehicle, Constantino said.

Upon arrival at the scene, Constantino said he saw "a pickup truck lying on its side with extensive damage and a male trapped inside." The victim said he was injured and could not escape from the truck because his legs, feet and lower body were trapped under the dashboard of the truck, the chief said.

Lake Monticello Engine 52 arrived on the scene and personnel immediately began to work to free the victim, the chief said.

"The vehicle was stabilized and with the use of the extrication tools, personnel removed the roof of the pick-up truck to gain access to the victim," Constantino said. "Palmyra Engine 10 and its crew arrived on the scene and together personnel worked to extricate the trapped victim. The victims' condition was assessed by the firefighters who determined the victims' legs, feet and lower torso were entangled under the dashboard which occurred during the crash," he said.

"This was a very difficult extrication," Constantino said. "Due to the position, condition of the vehicle and the inability to move the dashboard with the extrication tools, the firefighters completed a 'slow roll' of the vehicle to create unfettered access to the dashboard and victim. Once that evolution was accomplished, the firefighters easily shifted the dashboard from the victim's lower body from under the dashboard, brake, and gas pedals."

The victim was removed from the vehicle and turned over to personnel from the Lake Monticello Rescue Squad and the critical care crew from the University of Virginia's Pegasus helicopter who were requested to respond, Constantino said. The victim was flown to U.Va. hospital by Pegasus critical care crew for treatment.

Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office deputies also were on the scene.



## Burke talks about art

matter what Debbie Burke paints, ictures have a quiet solitude about that welcomes the viewer into a eful meditation. Whether it is the tiness of a house with streams of n morning sunlight coming through doors and windows or a cat relaxing, they all have a sense of calm. The key is using and shadows to convey certain moods and Burke has learned to manipulate them well in her work.

She was a psychology major at a college in New England when she discovered her interest in art in her junior year.

"I took an art class for non-art majors, got interested in graphics and black and white photography, and found my passion." She continued to study art and teach herself techniques and skills. Her career took her in many directions, including advertising design and graphics and then architectural design and construction contracting.

In her 40s she began to think about color and painting.

"I went to museums and studied paintings and how color worked. When I was about 50 I took an intro to a painting class at a local community college and found a new passion. I take classes on and off when I find art instructors that inspire me. Painting as much as you can, can be the best teacher."

She echoes the same mantra as many artists who delve so deep into their work that it becomes meditative, calming the mind and lifting the spirit.

"I find painting to be very challenging and is a meditation at the same time. I believe anyone can become a good artist if they have the desire. A strong desire is the motivation you need."

She finds it comfortable to draw and work in pencil or charcoal but her favorite is oils which she said is challenging. Of all the painting mediums, oils are the most forgiving and can be mastered in many ways to create an artist's unique style.

Burke is not focused on one subject but tries her hand at an array of subjects, from still life to animals to architecture.

"I'm still in the process of finding and trying new subjects but I always come back to flowers. Recently I've been studying skies and dramatic clouds and want to start trying to paint them."

She said what inspires her is the secret to creating mood in her work.

"I find dramatic lighting with contrast and reflections exciting and compelling. I'm also drawn to repeating patterns."

When asked if she wanted to meet one of her favorite artists and why? She replied, "I'm not as interested in meeting my favorite artists as much as I would just like to watch them work. That fascinates me."

## Agriculturalists discuss Virginia's farming future at annual Farm Bureau expo

Over 200 young farmers and budding agriculturalists gathered to network and discuss agricultural issues at the 2022 Virginia Farm Bureau Federation Young Farmers Summer Expo, held July 29-31 in Wytheville.

The expo kicked off with a keynote speech from Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Commissioner Joe Guthrie, who encouraged attendees to explore foreign markets for their products.

Guthrie also participated in a panel discussion with Del. David Reid, D-Ashburn, and Del. Marie March, R-Floyd. The trio answered questions from the audience about the increasing difficulty of obtaining land; labor shortages; and solar facilities, and how lawmakers can help solve those issues.

Attendees took part in workshops about the National Cattlemen's Beef Quality Assurance program, drone piloting, pesticide certification and managing family dynamics on the farm. The expo also featured tours to Wytheville-area dairies and agritourism destinations.


During the event's awards dinner, farmers and VFBF staff were recognized for their outstanding achievements in supporting Virginia agriculture.

Jacob and Jennifer Gilley, who operate Heaven's Hollow Farm in Orange and Madison counties, took home the VFBF Young Farmers Excellence in Agriculture Award. The award recognizes involvement in agriculture, leadership ability and participation in Farm Bureau and other organizations.

On their farm, the Gilleys raise broiler chickens, cattle, pigs and sheep; and market meat and eggs under the Heaven's Hollow Farm brand. The couple represents District 7 on the VFBF Young Farmers Committee, and Jacob serves as president of Orange County Farm Bureau.

Tanner Wise of Buckingham County was named the 2022 VFBF Outstanding Young Agriculturalist. The award honors high school juniors and seniors for academic, community and agribusiness achievements.

Wise earned dual degrees from Buckingham County High School and Southside Virginia Community College, and plans to pursue a degree in animal and poultry science at Virginia Tech. He also served as president of his high school's FFA chapter and the Buckingham County 4-H Livestock Club.

# Popular hay bale decorating contest showcases agriculture

The Virginia Farm Bureau Federation Women's Leadership Committee's Hay Bale Decorating Contest is back, and individuals and organizations are invited to help celebrate agriculture with imaginative hay bale displays.

For eight years, the committee has encouraged communities across Virginia to highlight their love for farming through creative displays.

"It's a fun way for people to come together, build something out of hay bales and express their voices and artistic side," said Susan Harrell, Southeast District leader for the VFBF Women's Leadership Committee. "It's not just for the kids—adults enjoy getting involved too and sharing their creativity through agriculture."

Applications will be accepted from Sept. 1 through Nov. 1. The contest is open to anyone, including farmers markets, farm supply businesses, student groups, community associations, individuals and county Farm Bureaus.

Participants can showcase their ingenuity by converting round or square bales into animals, structures, shapes and farmscapes. Other items such as corn stalks, farm tools, pallets and pumpkins can be used alongside bales to create various scenes.

Guidelines and an entry form are available at bit.ly/3Q9gNyB. Participants are required to include a photograph of the hay bale display with each application.

There are five classes: best promotional display for agriculture business or commodity; best promotional display for community spirit; most creative; best agricultural theme; and best agribusiness, FFA, 4-H or school display. Winners will be selected in each category and will receive a cash award.

Photos of contest entries will be displayed in late November at the 2022 VFBF Annual Convention in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia.

Last year's contest received a record 52 entries, with displays encompassing farm animals, aquaculture, horticulture, farm machinery and farm safety. Winning entries included a scene encouraging people to drive carefully during fall harvest season; a train made of hay bales celebrating Farm Bureau and other agricultural organizations like FFA and Agriculture in the Classroom; and two creative displays of a fish and an owl made of round bales.

The displays generate a lasting impression and typically are placed near schools, outside of businesses, at county Farm Bureau offices and in people's yards.

"It's fun for everyone to ride around and see the different displays throughout the counties and state," Harrell added


