Fluco football team falls in opener to Broadway

Fluco Head Football Coach Michael Morris described the battle as "an old school physical football game." Unfortunately, for the Flucos the Gobblers were able to jump to a 21-9 lead in the first half. The Flucos looked good in the second half as each team managed one touchdown for a final score of 28-17.

The game started with a pooch kickoff by Broadway that the Flucos covered at their own 36-yard line. Fluvanna went three and out and punted. The Gobblers took over at their own 28; they promptly marched down the field and scored on an 18-yard run. The extra point was good and the Flucos trailed 7-0 with 7:02 left in the first quarter. The Flucos took the ball deep into Gobbler's territory gaining most of their yards on a nice run by senior Richard Price. The Gobbler defense stiffened and the Flucos turned the ball over on downs. The first two Gobbler running plays were stopped for losses, with Fluco junior defensive tackle Keeron King making one of the stops. A bad snap then sailed over the quarterback's head and the ball went out the back of the end zone for a safety. The Flucos trailed 7-2.

After a safety, the team that gave up the safety must kick to the team that re-



corded the safety. Broadway's kick went down the middle of the field, Fluco junior running back Isaac Lewis took the ball up the middle and burst through the oncoming Gobblers. He was immediately in the clear and no one came close to running him down. He scored the touchdown with no one anywhere near him. The Fluco's Cullen Long added the extra point and the Flucos led 9-7 with 1:18 left in the first quarter. As the quarter ended, the field and the stands were cleared due to lightning in the area. After a 45minute delay, during which only a very light sprinkle occurred, the game was resumed.

After the game, Coach Morris noted that he felt that his squad might have come out of the delay "a little flat." Using mostly running plays the Gobblers ate up most of the time in the second quarter. On the Gobbler's first possession the Flucos bent but did not want to break. They forced the Gobblers into fourth down situations twice. On a fourth and four, the Gobblers gained five yards and then on a fourth and goal from the eleven, the Gobblers completed a rare pass over the middle for their second touchdown. They never trailed after that touchdown.

Broadway tried another pooch kick after their touchdown, and this time it worked. The Gobblers recovered the kick at the Flucos's 40-yard line. A 22-yard run and a late hit penalty put the Gobblers inside the ten yard line. The Flucos stopped two running plays for minus four yards and a fourth down, but again the Gobblers passed for a touchdown, with only 1:08 left in the half. The Flucos were now down 21-9, and Broadway's ball control offense made the prospects for a Fluco comeback somewhat bleak.

Broadway received the second half kick-off and went into ball control mode. The Flucos forced Broadway into a fourth and nine, so the Gobblers lined up in punt formation. Instead the punter ran a sweep for a first down. Three plays later, the Gobblers were in the end zone again for a 28-9 lead. The Flucos marched down the field but failed on a fourth down from the 16. Early in the fourth quarter the Flucos finally forced Broadway to punt. Erwin Cuellar made a big catch and run for the Flucos, and Lewis made a short spinning run for the Fluco's second touchdown. A two-point conversion was good for a score of 28-17, with only 5:31 remaining. The Flucos forced the Gobblers into punt formation. This time a fake punt run was unsuccessful. The Flucos had the ball back with 3:46 left on the clock, but they could not generate any more points.

Morris noted after the game that he thinks the play of sophomore quarterback Cam Via suggests that the team may be able to have a more diversified offense. He also liked the play of the defense, and lamented that several key penalties hurt. Linebacker Marcus Dickerson made some impressive hits. The Flucos host Spotsylvania on Sept. 2, a school with a less impressive football history than Broadway High, which went to the VHSL football playoffs last year.

Palmyra man arrested in connection with Lake fire

The Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office has arrested a Palmyra man in connection with the Aug. 23 morning fire near Beach 5 at Lake Monticello.

According to a press release issued Aug. 24, Michael Joseph Taylor, 31, was arrested and charged with violation of a family abuse preliminary protection order while armed with a firearm, breaking and entering to commit arson, and maliciously burn an unoccupied dwelling house.

Firefighters responded to a Lake Monticello house fire Aug. 23 after a neighbor reported seeing smoke. Once on scene the volunteers made entry and extinguished multiple fires throughout the residence. Based on the fire command's observations, investigators and deputies from the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office were summoned to open an investigation into a potential arson, according to the press release. No residents were home at the time of the fire.

"At approximately 8:37 a.m., the Lake Monticello Fire Department, Palmyra Fire Company and Fork Union Fire Company were dispatched to the 700 block of Jefferson Drive for a reported structure fire with visible smoke from the eaves of the structure and fire alarms sounding from inside the residence," Lake Monticello Fire Chief Richie Constantino said the day of the fire.

Constantino said firefighters used a garden hose as well as a fire hose to douse the flames. "Firefighters entered the residence by the front door and discovered heavy smoke banked down to the floor. Firefighters entered the home to conduct a primary search for any potential victims and to locate the fire."

"Firefighters held the fire in check with the garden hose, while an attack hose line from Lake Monticello Fire Department Engine 51, was stretched to the rear of the residence," the chief said, adding that the fire hose immediately extinguished the fire.

A secondary and more methodical search of the structure for potential victims was conducted, confirming that the home was empty, according to Constantino.

Zoning change for Wolfpack Properties

Wednesday August 17th the Board of Supervisors changed the zoning on some land near the Crofton Plaza. The plan is to allow developer Wolfpack Properties LLC to bring in commercial businesses. I hope our leadership walks that path for this development, and any others.

focus on community development.

"LMOA should have a voice in the development and politics of Fluvanna County," Kurre said in a recent phone interview. She called the new LMOA Community Development Committee "instrumental." Kurre served on that committee prior to her appointment to the LMOA Board.

"We have seen some movement," she said from her car, as she and her husband travelled out of town. "We have spoken at planning meetings and believe the county is hearing us now. There is a window of time-and it is now-while Fluvanna County works on its comprehensive plan."

Kurre said LMOA is working through what the Lake community's vision is for future development. She would like representatives of LMOA to meet with other homeowners' associations (HOAs) in the general vicinity of Lake Monticello.

"I personally would love to see us converse with representatives from other HOAs. We can learn from each other," she said. "We are the largest community in the county by population and revenue center. We need to define our voice, own our voice and speak our voice."

Lake Monticello and Fluvanna County are "the good part in the middle," Kurre said. "We are halfway between Charlottesville and Richmond. That makes us easy to get to, but also easy to bypass. Lake Monticello is a great place to be, to live and to visit. We can not only get to Charlottesville and Richmond easily; we are not far from the DC area."

She said she wants the county to bring more business, while maintaining its rural character. "We have a beautiful, smalltown character and should be able to develop tourism and business," Kurre said.

"On our travels, we have all visited those quaint or attractive towns," she said. "Those towns are quaint and attractive because of very good planning. We are a diamond in the rough. Currently, there is no plan and that creates a hodge podge community. Without a vision, a community perishes."

Debra and Jim Kurre met in Macon, Georgia, where both completed graduate degrees at Mercer University. Kurre completed her MBA in 1988 and is a licensed CPA in Georgia and Virginia. Fluvanna sheriff's office posts two cold cases in new state database

PRESS RELEASE

Earlier this year, the Virginia State Police launched a website to display the newly developed cold case database in response to legislation introduced previously in the General Assembly. Cold cases include investigations into homicides and missing or unidentified persons cases that remain unsolved for at least five years. After working with the website administrators, the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office has been able to upload and publish two cases from Fluvanna County that meet the definition.

The Sheriff's Office believes the recent publication of this information has the potential to generate leads and productive discussion from within our community. Investigators and the families related to these cases ask that anyone with information contact the sheriff's office directly or submit any information through the tip submission button on the respective case on the cold case database website located at the website below. https://coldcase. vsp.virginia.gov/fluvanna-sheriffs-office/.

Two Fluvanna cold cases

Robert Lee Hourihan was last seen on April 8, 2011, at the E.W. Thomas grocery store in Palmyra, Virginia. He was wearing blue work pants, a grey work shirt, and brown boots. Hourihan was originally believed to have left his residence to go to work in Richmond, Virginia, at approximately 7:40 on the morning of the 8th. He left driving a 2004 Chevrolet Cavalier displaying a Virginia vanity plate "TARAMAE." The vehicle also bore a Winnie the Pooh sticker in the rear window. It was later determined that he was instead set to meet an acquaintance in Palmyra. It has been reported that he never arrived at that meeting. On May 28, 2011, the vehicle was located, abandoned in the parking lot of a Target store in La Plata, Maryland.

Janet Renee Field was last seen on July 2, 2014, at her residence near Scottsville, Virginia, in Fluvanna County. Her car was found at the Park-and-Ride commuter parking lot in Zion Crossroads, near I-64 in Louisa County on July 4, 2014. Her purse, vehicle keys, and mobile phone were still in the vehicle. Her Virginia driver's license, cash, and credit cards were missing. She is known by her middle name, Renee. She has ties to Short Pump, Richmond, and Lexington, Virginia. She is known to frequent plant/gardening stores, health food stores, and holistic healing centers.

Virginia Humanities partners with Arts Council on folklife film

Carysbrook Performing Arts Center is finally opening its doors again to the public after almost three years of being shuddered and silent. Once again, the theater will be filled with music.

New to the venue will be visual arts and film. To kick off the 2022-23 season, the Center will open on Sept. 9, 5:30-8 p.m., with a film presented by the Virginia Folklife Program.

Based at Virginia Humanities, the Virginia Folklife Program is the state center for the documentation, presentation, support, and celebration of Virginia's cultural heritage. Folklife is the centerpiece of Virginia's rich cultural heritage, expressed in its stories, music, performance, and hand-crafted items. It is the arts, customs, and practices that emerge in a community from necessity and eventually become the traditions of a culture and its connection to the community. The goal of the Virginia Folklife Program is to preserve the community traditions that entertain, inspire, and define Virginians. The program receives funding and support from the Virginia Commission for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts Folk Arts Program.

Since 2002, Virginia Folklife's Apprenticeship Program has served over 150 teams, consisting of two-or-more mentor artists and their apprentices, as well as granting funding, supporting and encouraging the continuation of cultural traditions. The program has supported artists who are masters in traditions ranging from instrument repair in southwest Virginia to Mongolian mask-making in Northern Virginia to growing and grinding heirloom cornmeal on the Eastern Shore. Other than awarding teacher-student teams with financial support, it also provides a platform to share their work. Carysbrook will be one of those platforms.

"The Fluvanna Arts Council is committed to presenting the stories and culture of our community through music, art, film, and food. We are thrilled to partner with Virginia Humanities. The Virginia Folklife Program is such a strong leader in the celebration of Virginia's rich cultural heritage," said Sharon Harris, president of the Fluvanna County Arts Council. It has been her goal to bring diversity to the performing arts center as well as adding other forms of art, including film and visual arts, making it a comprehensive experience for the community.

In Good Keeping in 2022 introduces audiences to the most recent mentor artists and their apprentices. This screening will feature and honor participating mentor artist Horace Scruggs, who led an apprenticeship team that included his daughter, genealogist Hannah Scruggs, and historian Niya Bates. Together, this team worked to repossess their relationship to the James River, by navigating it in a bateau, the same way their ancestors, freed and enslaved once did.

Following the film, there will be a discussion with Scruggs and filmmaker Pat Jarrett, digital media specialist for Virginia Folklife Program, and Justin Reid, director of community initiatives for Virginia Humanities.

Before the screening, there will be a reception featuring refreshments and snacks by Luz Lopez, who participated in the apprenticeship program in 2019, training her daughter in making the traditional recipes of Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula.



State Superintendent encourages families to submit applications for free meals

PRESS RELEASE

Superintendent of Public Instruction Jillian Balow is encouraging Virginia families to submit free meal applications to local schools.

Virginia is expanding eligibility for free meals during the 2022-2023 school year through funding provided by the General Assembly in the state budget. Students with families at or below 185% of the federal poverty level are eligible for free meals. Previously, students from families with an income at or below 130% of the poverty level were eligible for free meals.

Emergency federal flexibility that allowed free meals for all students during the pandemic expired at the end of the 2021-2022 school year. Moving forward, many Virginia schools will now require applications and use family income to determine eligibility for free, reduced-price or paid meals.

"School meals are important sources of nutrition for students and help reduce food insecurity in the commonwealth," Balow said. "I urge all families to apply to determine if they qualify. Filling out an application is simple and takes less than 15 minutes."

Students are automatically eligible for free meals if anyone in their household receives benefits such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations or Medicaid. Schools will notify families if a child is automatically eligible.

More than 525,000 students qualified for

free meals in Virginia when data was last collected in 2019. The new eligibility means approximately 64,500 more kids can access free meals.

Many Virginia schools and divisions use a program called the Community Eligibility Provision to serve free meals to all students, in which case free meal applications are not collected. Families can contact their local school divisions to see if they are a part of the program.

"It's more important than ever for families to apply for free school meals. If no application is on file, students will need to pay for meals on the first day of school and may start to accrue meal debt, said VDOE School Nutrition Director Sandy Curwood. "And the good news is, if you qualify, free meals are seamless. Students will access their meals in the cafeteria with a pin number or a lunch card, with no overt identification. Please apply now," Curwood said.


Filling out a free form may help families qualify for additional benefits to include discounted exam fees and college applications, extracurricular and scholarship opportunities.

"School meals are critical to supporting academic success and well-being," said Director of No Kid Hungry Virginia Sarah Steely. "We are grateful to all school nutrition staff who work hard to fuel our students' minds and bodies," Steely said.

"I love to feed people," said Andi Surface as she prepared homemade rolls for 50 for a Flucos Football dinner recently.
