

Public Notice – Environmental Permit

PURPOSE OF NOTICE: To seek public comment on a draft permit from the Department of Environmental Quality that will allow the release of treated wastewater/stormwater into a waterbody in Fluvanna County, Virginia.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: November 30, 2023 to January 2, 2024

PERMIT NAME: Virginia Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit – Wastewater/Stormwater issued by DEQ pursuant to applicable water laws and regulations.

FACILITY NAME AND LOCATION: Tenaska Virginia Generating Station; 2300 Branch Road, Scottsville, Virginia 24590

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Tenaska Virginia Partners L.P. has applied for reissuance of a permit for the Tenaska Virginia Generating Station. The applicant proposes to release treated industrial wastewaters/stormwater at a rate of 1.73 million gallons per day into Rivanna River in Fluvanna County in the Stigger Creek-Rivanna River watershed. A watershed is the land area drained by a river and its incoming streams. The permit will limit the following pollutants to amounts that protect water quality: physical and chemical properties, solids, thermal, and inorganics. Tenaska Virginia Generating Station does not generate a quantifiable amount of solids from wastewater treatment. Any generated solids are contained in the Retention Pond onsite. The permit includes requirements for cooling water intake structures.

HOW TO COMMENT AND/OR REQUEST A PUBLIC HEARING: DEQ accepts comments and requests for public hearing on the draft permit by hand-delivery, e-mail, or postal mail. All comments and requests must be in writing and be received by DEQ during the comment period. DEQ must receive hand-delivery and postal mail by close of business and email and fax comments by 11:59 p.m. on the last day of the comment period.

Submittals must include the names, mailing addresses or email addresses of the commenter/requester and of all persons represented by the commenter/requester. A request for public hearing must also include: 1) The reason why a public hearing is requested. 2) A brief, informal statement regarding the nature and extent of the interest of the requester or of those represented by the requestor, including how and to what extent such interest would be directly and adversely affected by the permit. 3) Specific references, where possible, to terms and conditions of the permit with suggested revisions. A public hearing may be held, including another comment period, if public response is significant, based on individual requests for a public hearing, and there are substantial, disputed issues relevant to the permit.
