

Democracy at risk

This week, Rep. John McGuire (VA-05) did not directly respond to questions about whether he supports impeaching Trump from office. This is upsetting and I would appreciate more foresight and leadership from my district's representative.

As a concerned citizen and voter in Fluvanna, it's obvious that Trump is leading the country into authoritarianism. His threats not to leave at the end of this term are highly credible. Fluco lose to James Monroe in last six seconds of the game

Win at Highland Springs

The Fluvanna County boys lacrosse team hosted The James Monroe High Yellowjackets from Fredericksburg on April 11. It was an even match-up. Unfortunately, the Monroe team was able to hold the ball at the end of the game and slowly pass it around outside as the clock ran down. They then managed to find an attacker directly in front of the goal who fired in the game winning shot with six seconds remaining.

The game did not start well for the Flucos. James Monroe led at half time 5-2. The Flucos were only able to manage one goal on their own, as the first Fluco goal was mistakenly scored by a Yellowjackets defender. The Flucos second goal was scored by iunior attacker Maddox Beaulieu on an assist from junior long stick defender Henry Jeffries.

The third quarter was all Fluvanna. The Flucos scored their third goal of the game when Beaulieu dodged a defender and fired a low shot past the goalie. An assist was recorded by Sully Eckert. The Flucos scored their second goal of the quarter when Jefferies dug the ball out of scrum in front of the net and passed to junior attacker Cooper Tapscott for a close in score. James Monroe responded quickly but their good scoring attempt was thwarted by a save by junior goalie Colton Ball. As the third quarter was winding down, the Flucos tied the game on a goal by senior attacker Andrew Williams with an assist from Anthony Waguespack.

On virtually the first play of the fourth quarter, Williams stole an outlet pass by

the Yellowjackets' goalie and drove to the goal undefended for a goal to put the Flucos ahead 6-5. Three minutes later the Yellowjackets scored to tie the game at 6-6 on a nice pass to an attacker very close in. Ball had no chance to stop the shot. Another James Monroe goal followed to make it 7-6 in the Yellowjackets' favor. With only two minutes left, Tapscott cut across the front of the goal and took a nice pass from junior Jack Jeffries for the equalizing score. Unfortunately, Monroe was able to hold the ball for the rest of the final quarter by passing the ball back and forth near midfield. As the clock went under sixty seconds, the Yellowjackets moved the ball in before setting up the winning goal. It was an excellent game.

The next day, the Flucos traveled to Highland Springs High School In Henrico County and won easily. Junior attacker Joe Jones had a big game. He scored five goals and contributed an assist. Williams scored three goals and had two assists. Tapscott had two goals and an assist. Henry Jeffries had two goals and Jack Jeffries had two assists and won fifteen of seventeen face-offs.

Fluco Coach Don Wyant has a young team that is learning. His roster includes only two seniors, it has 14 juniors and two sophomores. It is early in the year, but the rest of the Flucos season is against tough Jefferson District opponents. On April 18, they host Orange County. On April 23 they travel to Goochland, then on April 29 and 30, they play Monticello High home and away. On May 2 they host Charlottesville and on May 6 they travel to Albemarle High.

Tax Uncertainty Requires Preparedness

You will soon have to confront a higher tax bill if Congress doesn't extend many credits, deductions, and lower tax rates that are set to expire at the end of this year. Here's who should be considering ongoing tax planning sessions as this uncertainty plays out in Congress and the Executive office:

- Your income will increase in 2025. Maybe you are looking to move jobs or obtain a promotion. This should trigger a planning session as marginal rates currently max out at 37% at a fairly high income, but that could all change beginning in 2026
- You were an itemized deductions taxpayer. A number of taxpayers may begin itemizing deductions again in 2026 if the rules expire as they are currently scheduled to. This means planning your expenses in light of this impending roll back of rules will take some thought. This is especially true if you have high state income and real estate taxes
- You have a large estate. The current By starting to plan now, you can be 2025 for single taxpayers, \$27.98 mil- you'll be navigating in 2025. lion for married) drops back to \$5 million in 2026. While this reset amount will be adjusted for inflation going forward, gifting money or other assets can help reduce the size of your

taxable estate while taking advantage of this historically high exemption amount.

- You have investments. Review your investments to be as tax efficient as possible. Municipal bonds and taxdeferred plans like 401(k)s and IRAs may also become more attractive after 2025. Also consider tax-loss harvesting strategies to offset future gains. Another idea: if your tax rate will be lower in 2025 compared to 2026, consider selling appreciated assets in 2025 at a lower tax rate, then immediately purchase the asset again. Remember that wash sales rules only apply to losses, not gains!
- You have pass-through business income. If you are a small business owner, assess how the loss of the Qualified Business Income deduction will affect your tax liability. Review whether you should change your entity type to minimize the loss of this

Lake foundation plans swim platform, mobility mat for Lake

The Lake Monticello Community Foundation board voted unanimously Wednesday (April 9) to work with the Lake Monticello Owners Association to install a floating swim platform and a wood-like mobility mat to make it easier for those with mobility issues to access the beach and docks.

The platform and mat, which would be completely financed by the foundation,


are to be installed at the Lake's Main Beach, hopefully in time for this summer's swim season. The total cost for the two projects would be about \$20,000.

The swim platform would float in the deeper area of Main Beach water and provide a safe platform, including ladders, for swimmers to enjoy. The roll-up mat would reach from the hard sidewalk to near the water and docks.

The new projects are among several the Lake Monticello Community Foundation has launched while it awaits final LMOA approval for a proposed family friendly pavilion at the Lake, also to be financed by the foundation.

In recent months, the foundation board also approved several grants, including \$6,000 for three scholarships for Fluvanna County High School students (one from the Lake, one from the rest of the county, and one for a vocational/ technical student) based on their commitment to community service. The foundation also approved a \$1,000 grant for a golf training simulator for Fluvanna County High School, which would be made available to others in the county. The board also said it will match the next \$2,000 that the golf simulator organizers raise toward its \$15,000 estimated cost. In addition, the foundation granted \$500 for the Studio Arts Tour in the fall and \$500 for an effort to pay for students' PSAT and SAT tests. The project, to replace money previously provided by the county, is organized by Fluvanna Leadership Development Program students and the high school PTSO.

Among the Foundation's planned fundraisers are a "Shred Day" 9-11 a.m. Saturday, April 19, at the Lake Monticello Fire Department (suggested donation \$10 per 30-lb. box of documents securely shredded) and the Lake Talent Showcase starting at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, April 26, at Sts. Peter & Paul Church (https:// www.lakemonticellocommunityfoundation.org/projects-events).

"It's all intertwined. My training and experience in theater informs my coaching and teaching, and daily life informs my comedy" she said. This past March, along with her comic partner, Mendy St. Ours, they co-produced No Country for Funny Women at Live Arts.

She has a BA in theater from Catawba College and an MFA in play writing from UVA. She has been a lecturer at UVA for 11 years, in the drama department for eight years, and currently at the Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy where she teaches graduate and undergraduate classes in public speaking.

"I've been a TEDx speaker and a coach for TEDx speakers, which I love-it lets me mix my theater roots with my coaching work in a meaningful way," she said. Stewart has spoken to various groups and organizations and is a professional stage actor. Her TV pilot Adjuncts, was a finalist for the 2017 Virginia Film Award.

She wrote and started performing Dirty Barbie and Other Girlhood Tales in 2010. She has many side hustles, most of them artistic and it was in 2009 at the Lee Street Theater in Salisbury, N.C that *Dirty Barbie* began to sprout.

"They reached out to ask me if I had any new work that I'd like to propose for their season. I didn't at the time, but I jumped at the chance to create something they were interested in staging," she said. "It felt like a good time to convert blog posts and stories I'd previously written about my childhood into a one-woman show. One of the stories was entitled Dirty Barbie and so that ended up being part of the title of the whole show. I had a successful opening run of the show." This show is a series of true stories and scenes from her life growing up in North Carolina.

The show is intended for mature audiences, combining storytelling, stand-up, and physical comedy in a 70minute format.

"Growing up in a wild family and a small southern town certainly has defined the extremes of my comedy. I have been working on my oral history for years. For this, I wanted to shape my stories into a one-hour wild ride."



Bulk Trash Week at Lake Monticello

Lake Monticello's trash and recycling partners at Green For Life (GFL) will conduct an annual curbside Bulk Trash Pickup from Monday, April 21, through Thursday, April 24. Residents can find their assigned service day on a map in the GM Corner or call Member Services. Residents can put their items out one day early. People love to pick up scrap metal and reusable items before GFL arrives.

GFL crews will start at 7 AM on Monday in the designated service area. If an area is not finished on its day, don't worry - the crew will start the next day to finish before moving on to the next area. Friday will be an overflow day if needed. Due to the high demand for this service each year, crews will not come back for items if the whole street has already been done.

Residents can set out standard household items like small furniture. trash bags, leaf bags, and small metal items like toasters, small TVs, etc. All items will be taken by hand, not by machine. Keep this in mind when putting items at curbside. Limit them to a maximum weight of 50 lbs each and a length of 5 feet.

Excluded materials are computers. printers, monitors, and similar equipment, mattresses, box springs, large appliances (e.g., washers, dryers, water heaters, dishwashers, stoves, refrigerators, freezers, A/C units), and any motorized equipment, including items containing freon, rocks, concrete, dirt, tires, soil, sod, tree stumps, and any type of construction or renovation debris, including insulation, lumber, drywall, landscaping timbers, and friable asbestos, free liquids, paint or paint cans with paint in them, spray paint cans, motor oil, lead-acid/wet cell batteries, biohazardous materials, needles, and any other medical waste, combustibles, toxic and/ or hazardous wastes, any material excluded from the disposal site, and all flammable products (e.g., petrol, chemicals, propane tanks) dead animals, fecal matter, or manure.

Some of these excluded items can be dropped off at Pleasant Grove Park, 1730 Thomas Jefferson Pkwy, on April 26. Car tires can be dropped off 9 - 11 AM or until the truck is full. All car tires must be off their rims, with a limit of 12 per resident. Hazardous waste collection is from 10 AM - 2 PM. Your Proof of Fluvanna County Residency is required and does not include businesses.

Fluvanna's tax rate set at \$0.689 - for now

The Fluvanna County Board of Supervisors met on Wednesday (April 9) for a public hearing on the equalized real estate tax rate.

Director of Finance Tori Melton told the supervisors that the total assessed value of real property had increased by 22.5 percent in the biannual assessment. However, some individual homeowners saw increases of over 40 percent.

Unlike some other Virginia counties, Fluvanna equalizes its real estate tax rate after an assessment, shifting a value that provides the same projected revenue as the rate approved for the start of a fiscal year.

In April 2024, the Board of Supervisors approved a real estate tax rate of \$0.844 per \$100 of assessed value. The equalized rate will drop to \$0.689at least for the next two weeks or so.

Reassessments are usually completed in the fall, but Pearson's Appraisal Service could not finish the work until late January.

So, the equalized rate will only be in effect until supervisors approve the Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26) budget and set the tax rate on April 23. The maximum advertised real estate rate was set at \$0.750 in March, and cannot go above that amount.

No vote was needed to approve the equalized rate; a public hearing is a legal requirement any time a reassessment increases the total property tax levied by one percent or more.

After the public hearing, the supervisors briefly discussed land use valuation.

This is a special assessment method used in Virginia to tax specific types of real estate based on their use rather than their market value. It encourages land preservation, mainly agricultural, horticultural, open space, and forested land.

Landowners received a reduced tax bill for preserving their land under approved uses. As a result, the county takes in less tax revenue than it would under market rates.

A county report from 2018 stated that 109,947.79 acres in Fluvanna were enrolled in the Land Use Taxation Program. This represented 60.92 percent of the county's total acreage.

Some residents had raised concerns about this loss of potential tax revenue, but Chair Christopher Fairchild does not see the program ending any time soon.

"There's not many things that I'll publicly say as far as how I'm going to vote before I get there, but I can't imagine there's anything in this world that would make me vote to get rid of land use," he said. "I think it's one of the great tools we have to help keep our rural community and to help keep our taxes down."

"I understand when people disagree, and we're 28,000 people with a bunch of different perspectives," he added. "But we want to make it clear to the citizens that I don't see anything coming that is going to change that, at least in the near future. Certainly not with my



When the United States began mobilizing for WWII, two of the Hamm boys from the Ferncliff and Kents Store area were pressed into service. Stanley and Linwood ("Lin") were called to serve in the Army, and both were sent to Europe. Tech 5 Stanley Hamm of the 113th Cavalry Group (mechanized) was severely wounded in Germany, and spent months recuperating from the wound. Younger brother Lin served with G Company, 331st Infantry Regiment of the 83rd Division. The 83rd, known as the Thunderbolt or Ohio Division, was driving the Germans back across France, Belgium and Germany in the summer of 1944

The 83rd had landed at Normandy on June 18, 1944. The first contact with the Germans occurred on June 26, 1944. From then on, the 83rd was constantly in combat. Regimental commanders in the 331st Regiment were continually being lost; at one time they lost 11 in two weeks. On July 4 the 83rd launched its first major attack, and from then on, they were constantly moving forward, losing men each day. Daily they withstood artillery, enemy bullets, and German

tanks including the dreaded tank, Tiger which was almost impossible to defend against.

That December the 83rd Division took part in the Battle of the Bulge in Ardennes Forest, fighting for ten days and nights with little or no sleep in the bitter cold of winter. On March 2, 1945 Lin dis-

tinguished himself near Brucke, Germany. Acting as a scout for his squad, PFC Hamm's progress was halted by a machine gun firing at close range. Lin fired a white phosphorous grenade, and under the cover of the smoke, advanced and threw a hand grenade, eliminating the machine gun. For his actions Lin was awarded the Bronze Star.

On March 12, 1945 Lin wrote his mother Effie Melton Hamm: "Write and tell me how Stanley is getting along every letter that you get from him...'

83rd The Division had crossed Rhine on March 29, and although Nazi Germany was on the verge of collapse, the resistance was strong. On

April 11 the 83rd liberated the horrors of the Langenstein-Zwieberge concentration camp where forced laborers in the mines died at a rate of 500 per month. Sadly, on Sunday April 15, 1945, just 23 days before the surrender known as VE Day, Linwood was killed instantly by a German bullet. In a letter to the Hamm family, Venters Keen of Portland, TN, wrote

of the heartache of seeing his best friend killed, a friend that he had fought, slept, and eaten with for the past year under continuous combat. Brother Stanley was able to visit Lin's gravesite. At the family's request, Lin was later removed from the cemetery in Margraten, Holland and returned to Beulah Baptist Church in Kents Store to be buried near his grandparents. Linwood Joseph Hamm was awarded the Purple Heart, posthumously, and died before his promotion to sergeant came through. On the Sunday that Lin was killed, his mother Effie Melton Hamm told a family member, that one of her boys had fallen. Thousands of miles away and without any means of communication, the story would seem both improbable and impossible except for the fact that she shared it with another family member.

The expected invasion of Japan required more men and another brother, George, was given his draft notice. Luckily the war ended before he was called into active service. Stanley would return safely to his home, but the missing brother Lin, is still missed even today in the Hamm family of Fluvanna and Louisa counties.

Teachers health care costs in spotlight

Teacher health was in the spotlight at this month's School Board meeting on Wednesday night (April 9).

More specifically, board members wrestled with how the district pays for teacher health.

Like many districts, Fluvanna County Public Schools (FCPS) maintains a "sick bank." Staff members who participate in the program donate one or more of their unused sick days to the bank, which can then be drawn on by those facing catastrophic illness for up to 40 days.

The system was changed in 2023 to remove a redundant program where teachers could directly donate their sick time to a colleague in need.

Part of the policy change was a 10-day waiting period between the exhaustion of their sick leave and application to the sick bank.

Before the discussion, teacher Shery Esch told board members that she had received needed support from the sick bank in 2021-2022 as she battled breast cancer. She argued that the 10-day waiting period would have imposed financial hardship on her family at a time when they could least afford it.

"Anyone accessing the sick leave bank is already facing a prolonged illness or injury," Esch told the board. "A 10-day gap in pay isn't just difficult—it's punitive."

Superintendent Peter Gretz said the question in 2023 that could be revisited is whether the 10-day waiting period could run concurrently with the final days of a teacher's accrued paid leave or whether there had to be a 10-day period of unpaid leave before the sick

bank time could begin.

"We already pay our teachers peanuts," said James Kelley (Palmyra). "Taking away said peanuts for 10 days to get what should be short-term disability coverage is insane."

There was no specific policy change on the agenda, but the board members signaled they were open to further discussion on how to help teachers facing health crises.

The same types of catastrophic diagnoses that lead people to the sick bank can also drive up health care costs for the district.

Executive Director of Finance Brenda Grasser said that some of the 10 percent increase in health care costs in the coming year was due to a surge in catastrophic cases, including one that cost almost \$1 million.

The impact of these high-dollar cases is mitigated through FCPS's participation in the Jefferson Health Plan, a collaborative insurance pool that allows everyone to spread out their costs.

Under the plan, FCPS directly pays claims up to \$125,000, Jefferson Health Plan pays claims between \$125,000 and \$550,000, and a secondary reinsurer pays anything over \$550,000.

Board members discussed the numbers and further cost-mitigating measures like expanding wellness programs to encourage preventative care.





Hurricane-impacted farmers begin recovery

While Hurricane Helene victims' losses accumulated, so did the overwhelming support from neighbors near and far.

The Category 4 storm hit northern Florida and tore through six states on Sept. 26, 2024, catching Southwest Virginia farmers by surprise. Strong winds and a raging flood toppled trees, destroyed farm fences and swept hay supplies downriver. A Virginia Tech economic analysis said damages to Virginia agriculture may cost up to \$630 million.

Though the storm's impact was unexpected, Virginia Farm Bureau Federation leaders were somewhat prepared to respond. Development of a disaster relief fund was initiated three years ago. The Virginia Farm Relief Fund, now managed by the Virginia Foundation for Agriculture, Innovation & Rural Sustainability, grew to \$278,000 following Helene, providing assistance to almost 80 applicants.

Tangible needs were prioritized after the storm, said Wilmer Stoneman, VA FAIRS executive director.

"Fencing was the number one asset folks needed," he said. "We allocated about 30 miles worth of fence wire and gates."

That allocation complemented an ongoing T-post drive orchestrated by VFBF Young Farmers. Supplies were distributed in conjunction with Virginia Cooperative Extension.

Wire was personally delivered by VFBF field services director Logan Boyd to those unable to travel for pick-up.

"It's good to be part of an organization that will help when we can," he said. "Though, most of these folks won't tell you they need something. They are not standing there with their hands out."

Robbins Family Farms in Smyth County lost a farm truck and about 2,000 feet of fencing to floodwaters. Three rolls of woven wire fencing were donated to the farm, along with gates, posts, minerals, feed and relief funds.

"They blessed these little farmers," said Connie Robbins. "It could have

been so much worse. There are farmers around us who lost much more."

Robbins recalled surveying the damage with her youngest grandchildren, ages 9 and 11.


"The 11-year-old took my hand, and said, 'Granny, this is just stuff,'" she said. "'It's you who we can never replace!'"


The relief fund ballooned with contributions from 69 county Farm Bureaus. Stoneman said individuals and other state Farm Bureaus also

contributed heavily to the fund.

"That's our culture," Boyd noted. "Neighbors helping neighbors, even if they're not next door."
