TO FLUTTERING LOVELY WINGS -

In partnership with the Rivanna Master Naturalists, at the Fluvanna Master Gardeners Discovery Center, next to the Butterfly Garden at Pleasant Grove Park.



Stages of metamorphosis can be observed first-hand in an enclosed habitat filled with native host and nectar-rich plants, where eggs hatch into caterpillars who munch, form their own incubation chambers, then emerge as butterflies.

<u>Visitors are limited to six at a time</u>, Saturdays and Sundays only, from 8 a.m. to Noon, beginning July 12 and continuing through the summer months.

- The butterflies' habitat is quite hot and humid, so visitors are advised to dress comfortably, bring water, and consider visiting as early in the day as possible.

- The Discovery Center is set in the Native Plant Butterfly Garden where a wide variety of pollinators are actively engaged and inspire home gardeners to add native plants to their backyard selections.

You can find them everywhere. At Happy Tails, Local Eats, Michie Tavern, Cunningham Creek Winery, and as far away as Gordonsville, Salem, Virginia Beach, and Roanoke. Paw Paw's Wholesome Homemade Dog Treats are all-natural dog treats lovingly baked by owner David Hawks.

With his 11-year-old lab mix, Fritz Schnitzel, by his side, Hawks diligently bakes five days a week from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m., producing 30 8-ounce bags of dog treats. He says on average, if he works hard, he can bake two full batches of his recipe.

"Each batch gives me 15 bags, so the most I can bake each day is 30 bags/15 pounds. This can be an issue during my

busy months. I sell out at craft shows and cannot keep up with the demand."

He mixes his treats in small batches, hand rolls and cuts every one, then bakes them exactly the way we would at home. My treats are not health food. They aren't exotic. They're plain, wholesome, everyday treats for lovable everyday dogs," he said. He added that none of the treats contain dairy or egg, common allergens for dogs. For dogs with gluten or wheat allergies, he offers rice treats. For dogs on a low protein diet Chicken Broth and Rice or Sweet Potato and Rice Treats are suitable. For vegetarians, his Sweet Potato and Rice treats are perfect.

The idea for the business didn't come from Hawks, but from the previous owner, Debbie Fail, in Salem, who founded it. Paw Paw's Wholesome Homemade Dog Treats was founded by Fail in Salem about 25 years ago.

"Her son was killed in a car accident, leaving behind a puppy. She grieved for her son by baking the puppy treats, the way she baked her son cookies. Over time, and with the help of several friends, it turned into a business," he said. "Fast forward to 2014. She began having health issues with arthritis in her hands and decided to close the company." At that time, I was working as an Interior Designer in Richmond, and my boss decided, with little notice and no severance, to close the firm."

A close friend of Hawks was selling Paw Paw's Treats at his boutique store and had just heard from Debbie that she was closing Paw Paw's. He suggested Hawks contact her to see if she would sell to him.

"I was truly tired of driving to Richmond each day, wanted to work from home and have a little more flexibility in my work, and I love baking and cooking in general and am quite good at it," he said. He followed up and called Fail, arranging a visit to see her.

Job hunting had been difficult, and he hadn't found anything suitable.

"On my way down to see Debbie, I had a long talk with God and asked him to make it clear to me if this was something I should pursue. He did."

When he arrived at Fail's house, it turned out she lived a stone's throw from his parents and where he grew up, knew all the same people, and went to the same school.

And who doesn't want a wholesome homemade dog treat for our

furry friends?

"As I age, I'm beginning to realize I can't do this forever and have started looking at the future." He says he may turn to a subscription model. A limited number of customers, based on how much he can bake with each receiving a quarterly shipment of the flavors they want. "The thing I love most is the dogs I meet and their owners. Dog people are the nicest people."

Scottsville man denied bond in sexual battery case

A Scottsville man arrested in late June on charges of aggravated sexual battery and indecent liberties with a child under 13 was denied bond in Fluvanna County Circuit Court on Friday (July 11), despite being granted bond in a similar case in Albemarle County this spring.

Brett Larose surrendered himself to the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office following his indictment in late June. He has been held at the Central Virginia Regional Jail since June 26.

Attorney Scott Goodman presented multiple witnesses who attested to Larose's good character.

His employer, Scottie Tate, said that over the past 20 years, Larose had gone from "a good friend to a brother." He told Circuit Court Judge David Barredo that Larose was a vital part of his business and could live with him if he were released on bond.

"I need him back," said Tate.

Larose's current romantic partner said she had known him for several years and described him as a thoughtful person who believed in the power of positive thinking. During their time together, she said he had shown "no interest in children whatsoever."

A former girlfriend began to cry during her testimony, saying, "My heart and soul say this is not him."

Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Amanda Galloway presented a different picture of Larose. Both the Fluvan-

na and Albemarle cases involve the very young daughters of his then-girlfriends. The Albemarle offenses allegedly took place in 2016, and the Fluvanna case in 2020.

Larose was originally charged in 2021, but Galloway said the victim's family was facing some difficulties and the case was not pursued at that time. The Albemarle charges were revived in April 2025, and the Fluvanna charges in June.

Since his arrest was announced, Galloway said her office had been contacted by a Fluvanna woman who said her relationship with Larose had been abusive. Her allegations are being investigated, and he is likely to face additional charges.

Goodman said he was unaware of the potential new charges, but argued the women in both cases knew each other and had made the allegations in 2021 because they were "upset because he left each relationship."

Larose was "never, ever, ever alone" with the children, and he "has no contact with these people and hasn't for years," he added.

The Albemarle judge had been "floored" by the way he had been "yanked out of his life" on these old charges, Goodman said.

Judge Barredo acknowledged that "these offense dates have some age on them," and that Larose was not a flight risk.

However, between the nature of the accusations and the potential for new charges, he did believe Larose posed a potential danger to the community, and denied bond.

Larose is scheduled to return to court on August 25.

Heavy rains bring tenfold increase in *e.coli* levels in Rivanna

Thinking of splashing around in the Rivanna this summer? Don't.

The Rivanna Conservation Alliance conducts weekly water testing along the river in both Albemarle and Fluvanna counties during the summer months.

They are looking for e.coli, a bacteria

common in animal and human waste. Heavy summer rains push all that waste into area waterways and increase the risk of nasty gastrointestinal illness for swimmers and boaters.

The Virginia Department of Health sets the "safe" level of e.coli at 253 MPN

A test sample at the Palmyra Boat Launch on July 10 found the e.coli level was 2419.6 MPN, almost ten times above the safety level.

The previous test on July 3 found 1299.7 MPN.

By comparison, June testing found levels ranging from 83.6-178.5 MPN.

The best way to protect yourself from potential e.coli contamination is to wait at least 48 hours after a heavy rain before going into area rivers, lakes, or ponds, including Lake Monticello.

The July 10 test was conducted the same day the area received rainfall of about 0.5 inches of precipitation.

"If the water looks muddy, the bacteria levels are generally high as well, so it's best to avoid contact with the water until the water clears up," Rivanna Conservation Alliance Director of Monitoring Claire Sanderson recently told NBC29 News. "If you've been in the water, then rinse off with tap water afterwards."

School Board debates phone policy

Fluvanna County School Board members spent some time at its recent meeting focusing on the district's cell phone policy in light of a Virginia Department of Education directive to restrict student cell phone use as much as possible during the school day. The board met on July 9.

They were skeptical that the VDOE's preferred "bell-to-bell" policy, which would prohibit use not only in the classroom but in the hallways and during lunch and recess, was even feasible, particularly among high school students.

"I think it is a fool's errand and unnecessary to bar students in the high school from having their phones in between classes," said James Kelley (Palmyra), who was participating in the meeting remotely.

"Every time I'm at the high school, my phone doesn't work," said Andrew Pullen (Columbia). "So I don't understand who's using their phones at school, unless they're on the internet, and then that's restricted."

Danny Reed (Fork Union) argued that the policy was not robust enough, as it did not deal with other distractions. like Chromebooks and smartwatches.

"If this bill included that, I'd be fantas-

tically supportive of doing that because kids email all day long on their Chromebooks in the classroom," he said. "So great, cell phones are gone. When are we going to address kids at the middle school emailing kids at Carysbrook?"

No final decisions were made, and work on refining the policy will continue in future meetings.

Soares replaces Grasser

Gemma Soares has been appointed as the executive director for instruction and finance, replacing outgoing administrator Brenda Grasser.

A 20-year veteran of Fluvanna County Public Schools and currently the director of elementary and federal programs, Soares stood out among a statewide slate of candidates.

Three new assistant principals will also be joining the district: Pam Wishert at Central Elementary, and Ron Silverman and Keith Ellen at Fluvanna Middle School

The announcements came midway through the July meeting of the Fluvanna County School Board, its first since early May.

The June 11 meeting was cancelled at the last minute for lack of a quorum, as
