#### News, key to information and education

The decline of local news has resulted in "news deserts," areas with limited or no access to reliable local news sources Millions of Americans now rely on social media or other online platforms for regional information, which may be less reliable or even misleading. Unfortunately, this has contributed to a lack of factual information, which fails to educate individuals about issues that should concern them.

They are vital for an informed and educated community. They are a crucial link between residents, local governments, schools, and businesses. They provide a platform for sharing information about local events, issues, and community stories, fostering civic engagement and bringing communities together. Furthermore, through fact-checking, they serve as a trusted source of information, holding local officials accountable for their actions and combating the spread of misinformation.

The Fluvanna Review has survived in the desert. It continues to inform its community on all levels by fostering civic engagement, promoting community involvement, connecting neighbors, highlighting local achievements, sharing history, culture, local stories, and economic development. But these are not normal times we live in, and local news, once the cornerstone of communities, is threatened with extinction

While some national outlets have been able to maintain viable newsrooms through subscriptions, smaller local newspapers have struggled to attract enough online subscribers to compensate for lost print revenue. Local news depends mostly on ad revenue.

There has also been a shift in readership habits, with many going online for news. We are at a pivotal point in how we receive information. The larger networks have always survived, even with cable news coming on the scene. But now, with more online presence with podcasters and other news outlets

vying for viewers and readers' attention, even big-name media is re-thinking how they will survive.

Local newspapers are more than just sources of information; they are essential pillars of a thriving community, fostering civic engagement, strengthening social bonds, and supporting local businesses and culture. They bring us together for celebrations and to rally around an important issue. They are a lifeline for factual community information.

Nowadays, it is important to not only support local news but also be aware of issues that trickle down to localities and have an effect, such as government funding of schools, the arts, and libraries, which are important to local communities. Experts have agreed that the local press is important to maintaining democratic principles. It begins with local information. Our news is the first to sound the alarm on an issue, but it is also important to know where to find more information.

When looking up information or researching an issue, here are some key tips for locating factual information and rooting out bias. By using these diverse sources and adopting critical evaluation strategies, you can intensify your ability to find and rely on factual information. Sharing what you learn with others is also helpful.

Always cross-check information with multiple sources rather than relying on a single one. Investigate the source, look into the author's credentials, affiliations, and potential biases. This is important. Finally, check the URL, and look for reliable domains like ".edu" (educational), ".gov" (government), and reputable ".com" websites, while noting that even these may require further

Accessing factual information about your local community is crucial for civic engagement and informed decision-making. Begin by knowing about your local government. It is amazing how many Fluvanna residents are

unaware of their government officials and where to get information. Fluvannacounty.org has information on the Board of Supervisors, meetings, agenda, and packets, as does the Planning Commission. It also has Economic Development information, community events, and Parks and Recreation information. One of the best sources of information for local, regional, state, and federal is the Fluvanna County Public Library. The Fluvanna Historical Society also has local information and archives.

Another item used by those who ask questions but may not be getting any answers is the The Freedom of Information Act, or FOIA. This allows citizens to request access to government records, providing a deeper understanding of local government operations.

Nearby educational institutions, including UVA, often host events related to issues and conduct research, making them a valuable tool for indepth analysis. Local non-profit and advocacy groups focus on specific community issues and may publish reports, studies, and advocacy materials. This is where cross-checking comes in to weed out bias and maintain the facts.

When going outside, local to state or federal, be aware and start by researching using fact-checkers. With the use of high-tech voodoo influencing websites and information, it is important to know who is behind the information. One of the oldest and largest fact-checking websites, Snopes, investigates rumors, urban legends, and online misinformation. FactCheck.org is a non-partisan, non-profit consumer advocate for voters, a project of The Annenberg Public Policy Center of the University of Pennsylvania. Others for checking politicians' statements are PolitiFact.com, created by the Tampa Bay Times newspaper, which rates the accuracy of claims by politicians, and The Washington Post Fact Checker. Always a good resource worldwide is the AP Fact Check.

#### The Fluco fall sports season is upon us

As usual, the Fluco fall sports schedule is full of activity. Due to its short season, the golf team leads off. Its first meet of the season is on Aug. 5 at home on the Lake Monticello course. hosting Madison County. Two days later they host the multi-team George Bockman Memorial tournament. After that, on Aug. 11 and 12 they play at Charlottesville and at home against Lousia County. The golf team's regular season ends with a meet at Western Albemarle on Sept. 16. At that time, the Fluco football team has only played three regular season games.

The Fluco football team begins its regular season traveling to Spotsylvania High on Aug. 29. Its first home game is Sept. 5 against Buckingham County. They then travel to Chancellor High and after their bye week they go to Louisa High, a perennial Jefferson District powerhouse. The football team's second home game is not until Oct. 3 against Western Albemarle. There are ten regular season games on the schedule this season with five at home and five on the road. Last year the Fluco varsity finished 4-6, and could easily have been 6-4. The JV team was undefeated and won the Jefferson district title. This is good news, but not decisive, as other schools may have had more underclassman playing at the varsity level last season than the Flucos did. Fach week the JV football team plays the same opponent as the varsity, only earlier in the week.

The Fluco volleyball team has traditionally been quite strong. It really should attract bigger crowds; the game is fast and usually exciting. The girls varsity volleyball team opens its

regular season this year the day before the football team does. They host M. Godwin High. On Aug. 30, they host the multi-team Farruggio tournament. The Flucos then play three matches away. Traveling to M. Godwin, Charlottesville and Western Albemarle on Sept. 4, 9 and 11. The volleyball schedule is daunting with 20 matches between Aug. 28 and Oct. 23.

Cross country is a sport with boys and girls teams competing on the same schedule. The teams run over the same course, with the girls running first. This year's schedule includes a mix of two team and multi-team meets. On Aug. 27, the Flucos run at home against William Monroe High and Madison County. On Sept. 10 they travel to Western Albemarle. On Sept. 13, they travel to Fork Union Military Academy. On Sept. 17, the Flucos host a multi-team meet and that is followed by the even bigger Fluvanna Invitational on Sept. 24. The final contest of the regular season is a multi-team event on Oct.15 at Ragged Mountain.

Field hockey is a fairly new sport for the Flucos, but the season is busy. The varsity and JV normally play the same opponent on the same day. The opening game is on Aug. 28 at home against Kettle Run High. On Sept. 4 the Flucos travel to Kettle Run. Most of the teams' schedule is against Jefferson District opponents, but in addition to Kettle Run the Flucos also play home and away against EC Glass High.

The competitive cheer team has three meets in a short period of time late in Sept. and early in Oct. The Jefferson District competition is scheduled for Oct. 18 at Louisa High.

news, Reuters and BBC, the British Broadcasting Corporation, although it's perceived as left-center biased by some, and the Wall Street Journal, also viewed as conservative, the news is regarded as reliable and factual, particularly for business news.



#### Suspect in Bremo Road assault arrested in Charlottesville

A man who eluded law enforcement despite an intensive search near Bremo Bluff on June 26 has been apprehended.

Michael Wayne Morris, 42, was arrested near the Clarion Pointe hotel on Emmet Street in Charlottesville on Wednesday (July 30) and charged with possession and transportation of firearms by a convicted felon, brandishing a firearm, felony eluding, driving on a revoked license, reckless driving, and felony hit-and-run.

He was wanted in Fluvanna on charges stemming from an alleged assault and battery that took place in the 2000 block of Bremo Road on June 26.

Much of Bremo Road was shut down for several hours as deputies from the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office and the Virginia State Police searched for Morris, at one point even deploying a helicopter and an armored tactical unit.

Since June, law enforcement from Louisa, Albemarle, and Charlottesville were on the lookout for Morris. The Charlottesville-based 3A Regional Drug and Gang Task Force finally apprehended him on Wednesday.

Morris is currently being held without bond at the Albemarle Charlottesville Regional Jail. His initial arraignment date of Aug. 4 has been delayed until Aug. 26.

#### Global disaster ahead

Ever since the human race discovered fire we have been burning carbon in the form of wood, coal, oil and gas. But now through the lens of empirical science we know that as we continue to spew tons of CO2 into the atmosphere we will destroy the delicate balance that allows our planet to thrive. According to cli-mate activist Christiana Figueres our actions have altered the atmosphere, land and oceans to such a de-gree that damage to the life-sustaining systems we depend on have reached a tipping point. Figueres be-lieves that to avoid global disaster we must cut our global greenhouse gas emissions in half by 2030 and repair and protect the planet's ecosystems.

On Tuesday Trump proposed repealing the federal government's scientific declaration on the dangers of greenhouse gases which would end most of the EPA's climate regulations. This includes a proposal to end all limits on CO2 pollution from cars and trucks. Oil industry profits will soar and the greedy will cel-







#### **Hydrant Flushing May Cause Discoloration**

Aqua Virginia will flush hydrants from August 4 to 14, between 9 AM and 4 PM on weekdays. No flushing will occur on Fridays through Sundays. This may cause water discoloration and pressure drops. The utility has let us know they will use their Water Alert system to inform affected areas. Discolored water can stain laundry, so to prevent staining, they recommend doing laundry in the evenings and on weekends. Aqua Virginia assures us that the water is safe to drink despite

the discoloration, but if you feel uncomfortable, keep bottled water at home. We recommend you do this regardless due to the severe weather conditions in the area.

- Some streets will only have parking on one side.
- Bunker Bistro is taking dinner reservations for August 28, making it possible to come early, dine, and walk to the 18th Fairway to watch the show.
- Please be mindful not to enter private properties to reach the golf course; marked walking paths will guide you.

#### What to Expect

- The Golf Course will operate under a modified schedule.
- Fireworks will be launched from the dam near the 9th Fairway.
- A mandated safety zone around the launch site will be clearly

- marked and monitored.
- For your own safety, please do not try to enter any marked restricted areas.
- The greens will be marked as restricted areas, and our volunteers will be watching over them.
- Please use the provided trash bins.
- The fireworks display is for our residents and their guests.

#### What to Bring

- We suggest bringing along blankets instead of chairs to prevent damaging the fairways.
- Don't forget to carry a flashlight and wear bright clothing!

While tubing or water skiing, there are specific responsibilities that the driver must take to ensure a safe and fun experience. They should ensure that the tuber/skiers are wearing a Coast Guard-approved life jacket, appoint a responsible observer who can communicate through the use of hand signals, review hand signals before starting, recover a downed rider by approaching on the driver side at no wake speed, and never allow a rider to board the boat with the engine running!
