



Tax revenue not worth the risk

I love hearing my kids laugh and play in the creeks and streams near our home. They chase tadpoles and come home soaked and muddy. These moments remind me how lucky we are to live in a place with clean water and fresh air.

That's why I'm deeply concerned about Tenaska's proposed natural gas power plant. Tenaska is a billion-dollar gas company that stands to make millions while putting our children's health at risk. I understand and share the desire for new revenue for Fluvanna County. I want to see our schools thrive and public services be well-funded, too! But not at the cost of our air, water, and kids' safety.

Tenaska has done little to earn our community's trust. Company representatives have dodged questions and won't even commit to conducting a full environmental impact study before jamming through their special use permit. If this project is as safe as they claim, why are they avoiding

transparency? The people who live here deserve honest answers before being asked to shoulder the risks.

What Tenaska is hiding is that this plant would emit pollutants known to worsen asthma and respiratory problems, create constant noise and light pollution, and bring heavy truck traffic through our community. Once our air and water are compromised, there's no going back.

One of my children struggled with breathing issues after a bad RSV infection as a baby. Even though they're healthy now, the thought of my children breathing air that could make them sick again terrifies me. Every parent in this county should be asking if this is worth the risk. To me, the answer is a clear no.

I urge the Board of Supervisors to reject Tenaska's special use permit. We can grow our local economy without selling out our health. Our children's future is worth far more than Tenaska's profit.

Residents blast Tenaska plans as supervisors remember Mozell Booker

The plan by Nebraska-based energy giant Tenaska to build a second massive natural-gas fired electrical plant on Branch Road in the Cunningham district dominated public comments at the start of the Board of Supervisors meeting on Wednesday night (Oct. 1).

Multiple speakers urged the board to make sure the public was informed about the Tenaska project, asking the supervisors to hold a countywide town hall or launch an official information webpage.

"This is the biggest company in Fluvanna's history, and nobody knows about it," said Calvin Hickman, former public works department head. He criticized what he called a lack of transparency and public notice. "You're supposed to be working for us."

"Keep Fluvanna informed," he said. "We can make good decisions. We can make good decisions together."

Gary France echoed that frustration. "I only found out about this a week ago. I mean, this is ridiculous. Absurd."

At the town hall hosted by supervisors Chris Fairchild and Mike Goad, "we heard that there would not be an environmental impact statement available until well after the zoning approval," he noted. "In my strong opinion, that is regrettably backwards."

Jennifer Kingrea Ruffner said the town hall had shown the anger, frustration, and pain already surrounding the company.

"You heard valid concerns from neighbors who've been ignored or dismissed by Tenaska," she said. "And you saw Tenaska's response, often dismissive, relying on semantics versus real answers."

She listed off the potential health impacts of two natural-gas-fired plants operating close to the county's most densely populated areas. "Tenaska keeps saying they are compliant, but compliance is not the same thing as safe," she said. "Cigarettes are legal and regulated, but they're still the leading cause of preventable death."

Fairchild, who represents Cunningham, said he had spoken with Tenaska officials after the town hall on Tuesday night, and they had told him they would not be making any mechanical changes to reduce noise at the original plant, nor would they take further steps to mitigate noise levels from a second, larger plant.

Worst, he had learned from an engineer from Tenaska that the two plants likely would not fire up in unison, but run on their own schedules, meaning there could be " a 50 percent increase in noise, in how much you're going to hear it during the day."

Suspects in two separate shootings in recent months have been located, said Major David Wells of the Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office).

Rolling Road

Brando C. Carter is being held at the Albemarle Charlottesville Regional Jail on charges stemming from an Aug. 28 shooting on Rolling Road South near Dixie.

The victim, who has not been named, is recovering from multiple gunshot wounds and has been cooperating with investigators.



"Evidence appears to confirm this was a targeted act of violence between individuals who knew each other, not a carjacking as initially reported," said Wells.

Lake Monticello

The woman sought in connection with a shooting victim found at Lake Monticello last month has also been located.

Wells said Shirley Marie Brown of Palmyra is cooperating with investigators.

Aloys Hopfensperger of Palmyra remains hospitalized after being found near the main gate at Lake Monticello at around 2 a.m. on Sept. 15.

"There is no indication of an ongoing threat to public safety related to this incident," he said.

Tips

Both cases remain under investigation, and Wells encouraged the public to reach out with any information on either case, no matter how minor it may seem.

The Fluvanna County Sheriff's Office may be reached at 434-589-8211.

Tenaska will need a majority vote from both the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors on several special use permits before the project can move forward.

REMEMBERING MRS. BOOKER

Supervisors paused to note the passing of Mozell Booker, who represented Fork Union for 16 years before retiring at the end of 2023.

Booker, 83, passed away on Sept. 30 at her home in Fork Union.

Her husband, Jerome Booker, also served on the Board of Supervisors for many years before his death in 2004.

"I will go out on a limb and say, I bet I know who was standing at the gate to meet her," said Columbia Supervisor Mike Sheridan.

They will soon issue a resolution honoring her service to the county over more than four decades, and Palmyra Superintendent Tim Hodge proposed renaming the Fork Union Community Center the "Mozell and Jerome Booker Community Center."

Mike Goad, who currently represents Fork Union, said he was in favor of having a conversation about a way to honor her, perhaps in consultation with her family.

New Tax Law Opens the Door to Tax-Saving Opportunities

October has one major tax filing deadline! filers) whether you itemize deductions or take October 15th! For most individuals, October 15 is the final deadline to file a federal income tax return if they requested an automatic sixmonth extension in April. The extension provided more time to file your tax return but did not extend the time to pay any taxes you owe.

The recently passed One Big Beautiful Bill Act of 2025 unlocks a mix of permanent tax rate certainty, estate and gift tax preservation, and adjusted deductions. With all the changes in the bill, it places a premium on tax planning. Here are several tax planning moves to consider with the changes now in place.

- Consider the higher SALT deduction. The amount of state and local taxes (SALT) you can deduct is now capped at \$40,000 through 2029. Because this cap is scheduled to return to \$10,000 in 2030, consider bunching state tax payments (and other itemized deductions such as charitable contributions) into one year to take advantage of this temporary higher threshold. Further, if you have a small business that is a flow thru entity (taxed on your personal tax return), conduct a planning exercise to see the impact of this change.
- Review expanded 529 plan benefits. The annual tax-free withdrawal limit for K-12 tuition is doubled to \$20,000 per student beginning in 2026. In addition, eligible expenses now go far beyond tuition. You can now use 529 funds for books, online learning materials, tutoring, homeschooling costs, and educational therapies for children with disabilities. By contributing strategically and timing withdrawals, families can fund a wider range of educational needs while keeping growth and withdrawals
- Understand the new charitable contribution rules. Starting in 2026, charitable deductions only apply to the portion of your donations that exceeds 0.5% of your income. For example, if you earn \$100,000 and give \$20,000 to charity, the first \$500 (0.5% of your income) isn't deductible. You can deduct the remaining \$19,500 if you itemize your deductions. The new law also reintroduces above-the-line charitable donations beginning in 2026 of \$1,000 (\$2,000 joint

the standard deduction. So take a pencil to your charitable giving to account for these changes.

- Fine-tune your step-up basis strategy. With the higher estate tax exemption now permanent, many families now won't face federal estate taxes. This news makes crafting step-up in basis strategies far more important. Consider focusing on how to structure your assets to minimize capital gains taxes by maximizing the step-up basis after you pass away, which can erase unrealized gains for your heirs. Strategies like holding appreciated assets until death, carefully timing asset sales, and using trusts designed for basis management can deliver longer-term tax savings.
- Keep an eye on state tax changes. Many states conform, either fully or partially, to the Internal Revenue Code, but they don't always update their rules immediately or in the same way. Some states may adopt the new bill's provisions, while others may reject or modify them to protect revenue or align with local policy goals. These differences can directly affect your tax planning, as the interaction between federal and state rules can impact the value of your deductions and the timing of income.
- Reevaluate your estimated taxes. If you're self-employed or own a business, consider reviewing your estimated tax liability for 2025. With the new tax law increasing many deductions, you may owe less tax than you originally projected. Adjusting your third and fourth quarter estimates can free up cash flow, prevent overpayments, and ensure your money isn't sitting with the IRS interest-free.

The IRS says it will publish more guidance by mid- to late October. So, stay tuned as these and other questions will hopefully be answered long before you must file your 2025 tax return. As I mentioned in our last Tax Talk Article, we are learning more about the implementation and timelines of the new tax law weekly and will focus on these changes for the remainder of the calendar year. 

Joining the tour this year is jewelry designer Dale Nomura, whose pieces blend Japanese influence with polished stones and scrollwork.

James and Dianna Roberts, also new to the tour, have built a photography business focused on real estate, weddings, and their passion—outdoor and nature photography.

"Our background in photography goes back a long way for both of us. We've always enjoyed taking photos, and as time went on, the interest stayed with us," said James Roberts. "The passion for photography grew enough as we got older that the investment in the equipment was made. Our hobby turned into a business three years ago, and we've been making it work while keeping it fun ever since."

Their nature photos capture the stillness, beauty, and peace in nature.

"We shoot mostly in nature, so our inspiration comes from God's beauty that's all around us. It doesn't take long to find wonderful images to capture if you're out there and your eyes are open," he said. "We also have loving family's who support us and who genuinely like to hear about our adventures and see what we've seen through the lens."

Like most photographers nowadays, the Roberts use some modern software and a computer to store and enhance their images.

"We've always maintained that we want to keep post-processing work to a minimum and leave the pictures the way we saw them when we took the picture. A little cropping to remove some unwanted and sometimes unavoidable artifacts, and maybe a tweak here and there. He added that the one exception to this is that they have recently discovered AI software that turns photos into different styles of artwork. "It's been fun to explore this option, and people have largely responded well to the look...

"Our photos are then professionally printed, and from there we show them in a variety of ways. For example, I've discovered that there are many old and sometimes ornate frames out there that just need a little TLC, and they show our work well. We have also gotten some old wooden windows that we've restored and used to frame some pictures."

As for Dianna, James says she enjoys this work.

"It's been a fun and learning experience being out there showing and selling our work and meeting and talking to all the people we've met along the way. It's humbling and satisfying when someone likes the work you've done enough to want to give it as a gift or look at it in their home for many years to come." James and Dianna sum it up for all the artists on the tour.














Mozell Booker, longtime Fluvanna leader and trailblazer, dies at 83

Mozell Lee Booker, a lifelong educator and 16-year member of the Fluvanna County Board of Supervisors whose leadership helped shape the county's schools, infrastructure, and civic life, died Sept. 30 at her home in Fork Union. She was 83.

Booker's political career was defined by a determination to bridge divides and build for the future. Over four

terms on the Board of Supervisors, including two sessions as chair in 2014 and 2023, she championed projects that reshaped the county, from the construction of a new high school to the long-awaited James River water pipeline.

She was never one to shy away from controversy, but she approached even the most divisive issues with patience and purpose.

During the lengthy debate over what to do with Confederate symbols in Fluvanna, she pushed to rename "Confederate Park" as "Civil War Park" and to add, rather than remove, monuments.

"We're not saying pull the Confederate statues down," she said in 2017. "We're saying, add to it. Let's tell the whole story."

Her stance reflected her broader philosophy of leadership: inclusion over erasure, conversation over confrontation. Even when her inbox was filled with hostile messages, she remained steady, urging her colleagues and constituents toward common ground.

In 2019, she helped dedicate a new monument in the renamed park honoring the Emancipation Proclamation and the thousands of enslaved Fluvannans.

"It is not a taboo subject anymore," she

Born in Fluvanna County in 1941, Booker graduated from Abrams School and went on to earn her bachelor's degree from Virginia Union University and a master's degree from Michigan State, and later pursued further study in administration at the University of Virginia.

Before entering politics, she spent decades in education, first teaching in Washington, D.C., then abroad while her husband, Jerome J. Booker, served in the Air Force. After returning to Fluvanna, she led Cunningham and Fork Union Elementary schools before spending 13 years in the Charlottesville school system. Even after retiring in 2001, she continued working part-time in Fluvanna classrooms.

The Bookers were pioneers in Fluvanna government. Jerome was the first African-American member of the Board of Supervisors. After he died in 2004, she became the first African-American woman elected to office in the county and the first female chair.

Together, they promoted what she once called "smart growth," supporting the arts, affordable housing, and services for working families. They were champions of the Fork Union Sanitary District water system, bringing municipal water and wastewater to an underserved part of the county. She went on to be a strong supporter of the James River Water Project.

Even in retirement, Booker never fully stepped back. She served on several regional boards, including JABA and the Fluvanna-Louisa Housing Foundation. She lectured on African American history and the county's Rosenwald Schools, mentored new leaders, and advocated for collaboration over partisanship.

She is survived by her children, Kimberley Hundley and Jerome Booker Jr., and four grandchildren, as well as her brother, Steven A. Booker.

According to DD Watson Funeral Home in Fork Union, the family plans to hold a public celebration of her life and legacy in the spring of 2026.

"In honoring Mozell's memory," her obituary concludes, "we remember a woman of strength, grace, and unwavering dedication—a true leader, mentor, and friend."

"At what cost?": Fluvanna residents push back on Tenaska expansion

For nearly 20 years, the low thrum of Tenaska's gas-fired power plant has been the unwanted soundtrack of life for many who live on and around Branch Road, a persistent reminder, they say, of promises broken and noise complaints brushed aside.

On Monday night, as Tenaska pitched a second gas-fired plant across the road from its existing site, nearly 100 residents packed the Fluvanna County High School auditorium, not to debate economic benefits, but to ask why they should trust a company they say never fixed the first one.

The town hall, organized by Cunningham Supervisor Chris Fairchild and co-hosted with Fork Union Supervisor Mike Goad, gave residents a chance to voice frustrations and questions about Tenaska's proposed Expedition Generation Station, a

\$2 billion project the company says could generate \$250 million in local tax revenues over the next three decades.

Tenaska representatives sat mostly in the background, rising occasionally to respond to questions. But it was clear that many in the audience were less interested in hearing reassurances than in being heard.

Noise complaints

The persistent issue of noise dominated the evening.

Residents who have lived near the original plant for years said company officials had long dismissed their complaints, insisting that the sound levels met state guidelines - or denying that the noise even existed.

Fairchild recalled when a sound study was conducted some years ago, the final report said that the

noise, in part, "said it was because of the bugs. Because bugs were making noise."

That history, audience members said, made it hard to believe the company's latest study, presented at an August community meeting, which claimed that a second plant would cause only minimal noise impacts.

Environmental impacts

The second fault line of the evening was environmental.

Several residents pressed company representatives about the project's potential impact on air quality and particulate emissions, asking repeatedly to see environmental impact studies before the county grants a special use permit.

Their frustration grew when Jerrod Pitts, Tenaska's senior director of development, explained that the studies

would only be conducted after local approval was secured. That admission drew groans and jeers from the audience.

The conversation soon shifted from air to land.

Suzy Morris, a longtime advocate for preserving Fluvanna's rural character, pressed Tenaska officials on their promise to place roughly 350 acres south of the project site into "conservation."

Her questions drew a quick distinction: was the company talking about putting the land in conservation, or placing it under a conservation ease-

"We have to be very careful that we do have a conservation easement, and one that is in perpetuity," she



said. Anything less than that could allow to later develop for their own purposes.

Morris was also concerned about the impacts of withdrawing millions of gallons of water from the James River to cool the two plants and discharging millions of gallons of heated water into the Rivanna.

The Rivanna, she said, "is a national treasure," and needed to be protect-

Her comments cut to the heart of the community's unease: that once the permits are approved and the bulldozers arrive, any assurances about sound, water, and land protection could prove fleeting.

"Sacrificing the peace of mind of the few for the wealth of the many is morally wrong," said KP, who operates Grass or Grain Beefhouse near the site. "This is being fast-tracked before anyone says, 'Hey, let's wait.' I'm not asking you to say no - this could benefit our community profoundly. But at what cost?"



shipped his extra bushel gourd plant to Hall, which grew into Hall's first blue ribbon winner at 174.4 pounds. Jarosh's giant bushel gourd claimed second place at 149.6 pounds.

While Hall plans on experimenting with other giant produce, his No. 1 priority is setting a new State Fair record for the heaviest pumpkin. And for 15 minutes, he did. His 1,507-pound pumpkin topped the fair record of 1,340.7 pounds set by Hank Houston of Spotsylvania County in 2015. But then the Meehan family of Broomhall, Pennsylvania, set a new fair record at 1,983 pounds.

Both growers and audience members honored Hall with the Prettiest Pumpkin Award.

Hall knew he'd grown his heftiest pumpkin yet before getting it off the ground.

"I went through three pieces of equipment at home trying to lift it—my tractor, my brother's tractor, then we had to go get the neighbor's tractor," he laughed.

New fair records abound as growers showcased giant produce of all shapes, colors and sizes, including Jarosh's 22.8-pound rutabaga; Tony Corbin of Culpeper County's 7-pound eggplant; and Jason Loris of Rappahannock County's daikon radish weighing 5.6 pounds, carrots stretching 32 inches long, and his 7.2-pound beet.
