

### Church, world, school

Dear Sue Morris, thank you for your 'Wake up call' letter to the editor in the Oct. 16-22 issue of the Fluvanna Review.

Your words profoundly echo my own concerns surrounding the increasingly partisan nature of our educational system. And I applaud your insistence that education and character formation cannot and should not be separated. As you so forcefully point out, that's not the purpose of the separation of church and state in this nation. And moral formation, not the transmission of information, was education's original and primary purpose.

Having acknowledged our common ground, I must point out where we seem to differ. As Christians, we do not look to the larger, fallen culture - including schools - to disciple our children. The gospel witness is exactly otherwise. Jesus' last words to us, the Great Commission, send us forth to make disciples of all the world, empowered by the promise of

Jesus' presence - not school board take overs or partisan politics.

We send our children to public school for the benefit of the world, not to make our children better Christians. It is evangelization, not economics - not what we can or cannot afford - that calls us to participate in public life and public schooling. We seek the welfare of the city to which God has sent us in exile – not our own welfare or that of a particular party or faction. Forming our kids into faithful disciples takes place at home and at church, not in the stadiums, marketplaces, and academies of empire.

If you feel that you and your family aren't being sufficiently supported in your faith walk of prayer and discipleship, you all are warmly invited to explore Grace & Glory – we are right here on Rt.53, just across from the public library. In the meantime, I wish you and yours peace and all good.

### Historical Society wins funding for preservation project

The Fluvanna Historical Society was one of seven organizations awarded grant funding by the Virginia Department of Historic Resources (DHR) and the Virginia Board of Historic Resources to conduct further archaeological investigations at historic Free Hill Cemetery in Columbia. The funding comes from the Virginia Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) Historic Preservation Grant Program, established in 2022 by the Virginia General Assembly. This work will be done in enthusiastic collaboration with the members of Columbia Baptist Church and other descendants of those buried at Free Hill.

The \$110,490 grant will fund ground penetrating radar and other archaeological investigations which will recover information about the cemetery, established by David Ross in 1805 as a burial place for the members of the community of Free People of Color in Columbia. Described by an historian in the

1930s as "being so full they are burying people one atop the other," the cemetery now contains few surface features to show where individual burials lie. In 1965, the Columbia Town Council had the cemetery logged to fund a road-building project. The space was also graded, removing stone markers and the visible patterns of grave-sized depressions in the soil typically used to locate burials. Ground penetrating radar will help determine the number and location of graves in the cemetery.

Columbia Baptist Church Pastor Bruce Boling said members of his congregation are excited about the project. "This work will help us all better understand our own history and honor the lives of the people buried at Free Hill in unmarked graves," he said.

Fluvanna Historical Society President Kathleen Kilpatrick is eager for the work to begin. "This kind of project is exactly why the BIPOC fund was initiated by the General Assembly," Kilpatrick said. "To better study, understand, and ultimately preserve important sites of history like Free Hill Cemetery." Kilpatrick noted the historical importance of the extraordinary community of free Black people who had called Columbia

Because of that historical importance, the church and cemetery have already been determined by DHR to be eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Place; part of this grant award will also fund the drafting of an application to the National Register for formal determination and listing.

### Fluco volleyball captures Jefferson District title



The Fluvanna County volleyball squad demonstrated depth and tenacity on Oct. 30 when they topped the Patriots from Albemarle High three games to one in the Jefferson District play-off championship game. The Flucos finished the regular Jefferson District season in second place with an 11-3 record in District play. To reach the final, the Flucos topped third seeded Monticello High, Albemarle was fourth seeded and reached the final by topping Western Albemarle, which was undefeated in regular season District play.

As this match began, it looked like Albemarle might continue its success as an underdog. The first game was back and forth and incredibly tight. There were ties at 9-9, 14-14, 18-18 and 20-20. In the final moments Albemarle outscored the Flucos 5-2 to win the opening game 25-22. The Flucos were playing with their outstanding Division 1 senior captain Molly McCall in a limited role due to injury. Coach Christi Harlowe did not start McCall and substituted her sparingly. It definitely looked like the four seed could win the tournament.

Despite McCall's limited role, the Flucos came roaring back in game two. They demonstrated all around depth and talent. The second game started with the Patriots scoring early. But, with sophomore Norah Ferrell serving the Flucos tied the score at 6-6. Ferrell then served two aces and the Fluco took their lead to 9-6 on a powerful kill shot. From that point the Flucos maintained their lead of three or four points and kicked their lead to six points at 18-12 Senior Elizabeth Garrett ended the game with a kill shot as the Flucos won 25-16, evening the match at one game each.

The third game was all Flucos. With Junior MaryAlyce Kidd serving, the Flucos scored three points in a row

including a service ace. The Flucos led 8-4. They still led by four at 12-8. Ferrell and McCall had kill shots and it was suddenly 21-10. Albemarle called a time-out, but to no avail. The Flucos won by a convincing thirteen-point margin 25-12. The Flucos looked like the clearly superior team. Wins by nine and thirteen points are impressive in highly competitive play-offs. Multiple players were contributing in multiple ways.

In the fourth game, the Patriots rallied and a close game ensued. The score was tied early at 5-5 and 10-10. With senior Taylor Stringer serving the Flucos recorded three straight points to open a five point lead at 19-14. McCall had a couple of kill shots including the winner at 25-21. With their three games to one win, the Flucos avoided the heart challenging fifth game to 15 points.

The Fluco statistics demonstrate how balanced the team was in this match. Junior Allyssa Lewis had eight kill shots, McCall and Ferrell had seven kill shots, Senior Mariah Quinn had six kills, Garrett had five and senior Carson Johnston had four. Ferrell and Garrett each had 19 assists. Johnston and Quinn had three and two blocks respectively.

With the Jefferson District championship in hand, Harlowe's, team moves on to Region play. The first game was played on Nov. 4 at Fluvanna.

# How to eat for brain function and health

Cynthia Moore, a registered dietitian and nutritionist, presented on Oct. 18 another topic during her monthly wellness programs, focusing on how to eat for optimal brain function and health. She spoke about dementia, its causes, and finding and how it is affected by diet and overall health.

Science suggests dementia is promoted by oxidative stress, metabolic dysregulation, and abnormal protein buildup. Yet, a diet rich in antioxidants, controlled blood sugar and blood pressure, regular physical activity, and sufficient sleep can help intervene and maintain cognitive function. Antioxidants combat oxidative stress by neutralizing harmful molecules, while stable blood sugar levels help brain cells function properly and may be aided by controlling hypertension and insulin resistance.

Oxidative stress occurs when the brain is vulnerable to damage from high levels of free radicals, or reactive oxygen species (ROS), which can be exacerbated by poor diet and chronic stress. Chronic stress can trigger an inflammatory response in the brain, leading to the release of inflammatory molecules that damage neurons.

Dementia is often characterized by the abnormal accumulation of proteins in the brain, such as amyloid-beta plaques, which can disrupt normal brain function. Metabolic dysregulation occurs when aging disrupts metabolic pathways, including glucose metabolism. Improper sugar metabolism in brain cells can lead to the buildup of toxic proteins like tau, which accelerates brain degeneration, such as in Alzheimer's disease.

Lifestyle plays a crucial role in aging. We've heard often enough that regular exercise is linked to better cardiovascular health, but it also supports brain health and reduces the risk of dementia. Maintaining healthy sleep habits is important, as sleep allows the brain to consolidate memories and may help in reducing dementia. Treating high blood pressure with medication and lifestyle changes can lower the risk of dementia, particularly vascular dementia.

Finding ways to manage chronic stress can help reduce inflammation in the brain. There are many other ways people find to manage stress, including but not limited to meditation, yoga, taking a walk in nature, hiking, kayaking on a quiet afternoon, creating art, or playing music are just a few things that slow us down and calm the mind and body.

Moore discussed various diets, including those rich in antioxidants and nutrients which can be easy to follow because they focus on foods that can be added, rather than omitting or limiting foods. It emphasizes plant-forward meals, healthy fats, whole grains, herbs, and lean proteins. Anti-inflammatory diet foods also align closely with the Mediterranean diet, which focuses on fruits, veggies, nuts, seeds, whole grains, fish, and olive oil. Both diets emphasize eating foods rich in omega-3 fatty acids, polyphenols, fiber, and antioxidants.

The DASH diet is low in salt and rich in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, low-fat dairy, and lean protein. DASH stands for Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension. The diet was first created to help

lower high blood pressure. It is also a healthy way to lose weight.

The MIND diet features ten brainhealthy food groups: green leafy vegetables, other vegetables, nuts, berries, beans, whole grains, seafood, poultry, olive oil, and wine. It recommends limiting five unhealthy food groups, including red meat, butter and stick margarine, cheese, pastries and sweets, and fried or fast food.

There are more upsides than downsides with changing diets to accommodate better eating habits that in the long term, benefit all of us as we age.

# Aqua to merge with American Water; Lake customers unaffected – for now

The parent company of Aqua Virginia, which operates the water and sewer systems for Lake Monticello and surrounding subdivisions, will soon merge with one of the nation's largest water utilities.

American Water Works announced on Oct. 27 that it will acquire Essential Utilities, the parent company of Aqua, in an all-stock deal valued at about \$40 billion

The deal, unanimously approved by both companies' boards, combines two of the nation's largest regulated utilities into a \$63 billion enterprise operating water and wastewater facilities serving 4.7 million customers in 2,000 communities across 17 states and more than two dozen military bases.

The combined company will operate under the American Water Works name and will be headquartered in Camden, New Jersey.

"This merger enhances our ability to invest in critical infrastructure and deliver superior service at affordable rates," American Water Works CEO John C. Griffith said in a statement.

"There will be no change in customer rates as a result of the merger," both companies said in a joint statement.

However, in September, Aqua Virginia filed a rate increase request with the SCC seeking approval for a 26.42 percent hike in water rates and a 29.95 percent increase in wastewater rates across its Virginia systems, including the Lake Monticello units.

That request is still under SCC review. The SCC will also review the merger itself once a formal application is filed. The agency has 60 days to approve or disapprove the transaction; if it takes no action, the deal is automatically approved.

Assuming the SCC regulators approve, the companies must then obtain other state and federal approvals. The merger is currently expected to close by the end of the first quarter of 2027.

Essential Utilities shareholders are expected to receive about 10 percent more value per share than recent trading prices.



### Film premier to tell hidden stories of Fluvanna African Americans

A film highlighting some of the hidden stories of Fluvanna's early African Americans will premier Nov. 16 at West Bottom Baptist Church. The film, "Engraved: Finding Family at Oak Hill Cemetery," was funded by Virginia Humanities and is a Fluvanna Historical Society project.

The 32-minute "Engraved" documents the efforts to identify African Americans buried in unmarked graves at the cemetery. Researchers have found

more than 200 unmarked graves there, and managed to identify about 140 people who weren't previously known to be buried there, though they couldn't be connected to individual graves.

The project includes the erection of a four-by-six-foot granite slab engraved with the names of the 140 previously unidentified people buried there. Room was left to add more names as discov-

Engraving the names has been special for the descendants of those people, said Horace Scruggs, producer of the film and a descendant of enslaved Fluvannans. "It gives us a sense of place and grounding and belonging," he said. "We have a great deal of pride in seeing our ancestors named."

"It means more than words can express" to have her ancestors memorialized, said Nadine Armstrong, one of the descendants featured in the film. "Working on and seeing this Oak Hill Cemetery Memorial completed has made me even more grateful and

prouder of my ancestors for what they went through."

The untended cemeteries, many without even a surviving grave marker, are "a reflection of the racist policies" of the past, Scruggs said. "It really demonstrates the second-class citizenship that African Americans lived with post-Emancipation. They didn't have the resources to maintain the cemeteries."

Researching cemeteries such as Oak Hill and Columbia's Free Hill Cemetery also "brings back into focus the fact that African Americans have been living in Fluvanna since the beginning," Scruggs said, noting that African Americans were nearly 50 percent of the county population in 1860." These are some of their hidden stories

The cemetery project also is important because "it shows people the reality and truth of slavery," Armstrong said. "it happened in the past and now today we have the opportunity to come together as one and make our lives and our children live free of prejudice, hatred and all

other obstacles that stands in our way."

Oak Hill Cemetery in Fork Union dates from at least 1865, when it likely functioned as the burial ground of men, women, and children enslaved at two adjacent plantations - Glenarvon and Cleveland. Community historians identified names of 110 people buried in unmarked graves using funeral home records and death certificates.

Working for the Fluvanna Historical Society, Rivanna Archaeological Services did a survey that identified 218 unmarked burials. The work was partially funded by the Virginia Department of Historic Resources, BAMA Works, the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation, Virginia Humanities and private donors

"Engraved: Finding Family at Oak Hill Cemetery" will be shown at 2:30 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 16, at West Bottom Baptist Church. Admission is free and open to the public. Scruggs said he hopes to show the film around central Virginia, beginning at PVCC in February, because "it's a common story for African Americans all over."




